BREAK IT UP: The Detroit Tigers and Philadelphia Phillies this afternoon play the rubber match of their three-game set at Comerica Park, the final game for each club before folks scatter far and wide for the four-day All-Star Break ... last night's 4-2 loss snapped Detroit's six-game winning streak, but the club has still won nine of its last 11 games, 10 of its last 14 and 14 of its last 21 since June 19.

- The Tigers have gone 22-13 in 35 games starting June 1, good for a .629 winning percentage, the best record in the American League and the second-best mark in baseball in this span.
- The Tigers last posted a .629 winning percentage or better from June 1 until an All-Star Break in 2007 when the club went 22-11 (.667) from the start of June until that season's respite.
- Detroit's 2.95 team ERA is the best in all of baseball starting June 1, while Tigers batters rank second in the A.L. with a .783 team OPS in this span, trailing only the Twins (.801 team OPS).
- Detroit's 3.24 home ERA is pacing to be its best home mark ever prior to the All-Star Break at Comerica Park and its best home mark overall in 42 years since a 2.97 home ERA in 1984.

HIT PARADE: Kevin McGonigle (99 hits) and Riley Greene (98) are the first Tigers teammates to each reach 98 hits prior to the All-Star Break in 10 years when three Tigers reached the mark before the Break in 2016: Ian Kinsler (103), Nick Castellanos (99) and Miguel Cabrera (98) ... Greene and McGonigle are the only pair of left-handed hitting Tigers teammates to do so in the last 50 years.

- Since 1947, McGonigle is the fifth rookie, aged 21-years-old or younger, to reach 99 hits prior to the All-Star Break, joining TB's Rocco Baldelli (109 hits in 2003), Phil's Richie Ashburn (106 hits in 1948), StL's Albert Pujols (101 hits in 2003) and Hou's Greg Gross (101 hits in 1974).
- Since the advent of the All-Star Game in 1933, McGonigle is only the second 21-year-old or younger Tiger to reach 99 hits prior to the Break, joining Mr. Tiger Al Kaline (122 hits in 1955).
- Greene has reached 96 hits before the Break three-straight seasons, the third Tiger to do so in the last 50 years, joining Miguel Cabrera (nine, 2008-16) and Ron LeFlore (four, 1976-79).

YOU DOWN WITH OPS? (YEAH YOU KNOW US): Tigers pitchers have limited foes to a .682 OPS against, which is pacing to be Detroit's lowest team OPS allowed at the Break in more than 40 years ... the club's last lower team OPS allowed at the break was in 1985 with a .662 team OPS against ... the club is pacing to post its fourth-lowest team OPS against at the Break in the last 50 years.

GET ON WITH IT: Kevin McGonigle has reached base safely 161 times this season, tied for sixth-most in all of baseball ... since the advent of the All-Star game in 1933, only two players 21-years-old or younger have reached base safely more than Kevin McGonigle and his 161 times prior to the All-Star Break: Mike Trout (170 times in 2013) and Mr. Tiger Al Kaline (169 in 1955).

WHO SAYS YOU CAN'T GO HOME?: Shortstop Kevin McGonigle is the third Tiger to make the All-Star team at 21-years-old or younger, the first in 50 years when pitcher Mark Fidrych started the game at 21 ... Mr. Tiger Al Kaline is the only Tigers position player to previously do so when he made the club in 1954 and 1955 at the ages of 20 and 21 ... McGonigle is the first Tigers rookie to make the team since Matt Nokes in 1987, the first to do so in his first season since Fidrych in 1976.

IT'S GOOD FOR SOMETHING: 21-year-old Kevin McGonigle boasts a 4.9 bWAR this season, the best mark by any position player in the A.L. (ahead of Bobby Witt Jr., 4.8 bWAR) and trailing only Chicago's Pete Crow-Armstrong (5.7 bWAR) for the top mark by any position player in the majors.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Homegrown catcher Dillon Dingler, outfielder Riley Greene and shortstop Kevin McGonigle were all named to the American League All-Star team by way of the player vote while pitcher Justin Verlander has been named to the All-Star team as a "Legend Pick" ... the Tigers have three homegrown position players on the All-Star team for the first time in 41 years since catcher Lance Parrish and infielders Alan Trammell and Lou Whitaker in 1985.

GREENE WITH ENVY: Riley Greene has been named to his third-career All-Star team, joining 2024 and 2025 (last year he was a starter) ... Greene is only the second outfielder in the history of the Tigers franchise to make the All-Star team in three-straight seasons, joining Mr. Tiger Al Kaline.

- Only four position players have made the A.L. All-Star team the last three years in a row: Vladimir Guerrero Jr, Aaron Judge, Bobby Witt Jr and Riley Greene.

IT HAS BEEN A GRIND: Through their first 26 games of 2026, the Tigers went 14-12 and woke up on April 24 with a share of first place in the A.L. Central ... in 69 games since, the Tigers have gone 30-39 to drop to 44-51 and fourth place in the division ... Detroit's 30-39 (.435) record starting April 24 is the eighth-lowest winning percentage in baseball in this span.

- Despite going 22-13 starting June 1, the Tigers have lost 26 of their last 50 games, 29 of their last 54 games and 34 of their last 60 games starting May 4.

AND FINALLY: Kevin McGonigle is one hit shy of 100 for his career ... with a hit today, he would become the 24th player in club history to reach 100 hits in his first 93 career games, but only the ninth Tiger ever all within one/the same season, and just the second in the last 60 years, joining Austin Jackson in 2010 ... McGonigle would be the third at 21-years-old or younger in club history to reach 100 hits within his first 93 games, joining Lou Whitaker (1977-78) and Ty Cobb (1905-06).

- Earned his fifth win of the season and second consecutive victory last time out, allowing just one earned run (solo home run) on five hits and two walks while striking out nine over 5.0 innings...marked the second consecutive start in which the only run he has allowed was a solo home run...has allowed at least one home run in each game since returning from injury.
- Activated off the injured list on June 13, making his first start since April 29 that afternoon against Cleveland...allowed two earned runs over 4.2 innings, striking out four.
- Placed on the 15-day injured list on May 4 with loose bodies in his elbow and underwent surgery two days later...just over one month later, made a rehab start with West Michigan, striking out six batters over 5.0 innings.
- Made his 2026 home debut on April 12 against Miami after his first three starts of the season came on the road...earned his second win of the year, going 6.2 one-run, two-hit innings, allowing two walks while striking out seven...last year, he went 9-1 with a 2.13 ERA (24 ER/101.1 IP) in 16 starts at Comerica Park, the lowest home ERA in the A.L. and the fourth-lowest home mark in the majors.
- Suffered losses in back-to-back starts (April 1 at ARI, April 7 at MIN) for the first time since his first two starts of the 2025 season at Los Angeles (NL) and Seattle.
- Earned his first win of the season on Opening Day against San Diego, allowing no earned runs over 6.0 innings.
- The 29-year-old became Detroit's first starter to open the season in three consecutive years since his current rotation-mate Justin Verlander made seven consecutive Opening Day starts for the Tigers from 2008-2014...with the start, the Tigers have deployed a left-hander on Opening Day in seven consecutive seasons, marking the longest active stretch across the Majors.
- Posted a career-best 2.21 ERA (48ER/195.1IP) and 241 strikeouts last season...led the AL in ERA (second overall behind Paul Skenes), and second amongst all pitchers in strikeouts (Garret Crochet led with 251 K).
- Won the American League Cy Young Award for a second consecutive season, receiving 26 out of 30 first place votes (four for Garrett Crochet)...became the first repeat AL Cy Young winner since Pedro Martinez in 1999 and 2000...joins Denny McLain as the only Tigers to win multiple Cy Youngs with Detroit...while he did not receive the Triple Crown title, his 6.5 bWAR was a career best that topped Crochet (6.3) and Hunter Brown (6.1). His 7.3 strikeout-to-walk ratio outpaced Crochet's at 5.54, and Skubal's 187 ERA+ was the best by an AL pitcher since Justin Verlander in 2022.
- The back-to-back reigning AL Cy Young winner, who became the 12th pitcher in MLB history to win consecutive Cy Young Awards, will become the ninth pitcher to start on Opening Day following consecutive award-winning seasons, joining Hall of Famer Jim Palmer (1976-77); Hall of Famer Greg Maddux (1993-96); Roger Clemens (1998-99); Hall of Famer Randy Johnson (2000-03); Hall of Famer Pedro Martinez (2000-01); Tim Lincecum (2009-10); Clayton Kershaw (2014-15); and Jacob deGrom (2019-20).
- Set an MLB Postseason record with seven consecutive strikeouts on Oct. 10, 2025, against the Seattle Mariners...became MLB leader in single-postseason strikeouts per nine innings pitched, posting 15.677K/20.2 IP.

- Was an emergency starter on June 15 against Houston, allowing just one earned run on two hits and two walks while striking out five over 2.2 innings pitched.
- Blew back-to-back save opportunities on May 29 and May 31 against Chicago-AL...allowed three earned runs on five hits over 1.1 innings between the two outings.
- Tossed 3.0 perfect innings and earned the win on May 27 against Los Angeles-AL...continued a stretch of 14.0 consecutive innings over five games dating back to May 13 in which he has not allowed an earned run...has allowed just five hits and four walks compared to 16 strikeouts over this span.
- Earned a six-out save on May 24 against Baltimore, striking out four over his two scoreless frames.
- Made the third big league start of his career on May 20 against Cleveland, his first since Aug. 7, 2021, with the Texas Rangers against the Athletics...tossed 4.2 scoreless frames, allowing just two hits and two walks while striking out a career-high seven batters.
- Earned his first win of the season and second of his major league career on April 30 against Atlanta, tossing 2.0 scoreless frames.
- Earned his first career major league save with 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing two walks while striking out two in a victory over the Marlins on April 11.
- Signed with Detroit on a one-year major league contract with a club option for the 2027 season on Dec. 16, 2025.
- Spent each of the previous two seasons with the SSG Langers of the KBO League...went 12-7 with a 2.25 ERA (43 ER/171.2 IP) in 30 starts for SSG last season, recording 245 strikeouts in his 171.2 innings pitched, an average of 12.8 strikeouts per nine innings.
- In his two seasons with SSG, went 23-10 with a 2.91 ERA (93 ER/287.1 IP) in 54 appearances (53 starts)...released by Detroit after nine appearances with Triple-A Toledo in 2024 prior to signing with the Langers.
- Has spent parts of five seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies (2017-19), Chicago White Sox (2020) and Texas Rangers (2021) prior to joining the Tigers this year...also pitched with Hiroshima in the NPB for the 2022-23 campaigns.

- Entering play on July 2, has a career-best 19 home runs and 59 RBI to go along with 18 doubles and two triples through 80 games this season...Dingler is only the third player in the 126-season history of the Tigers franchise to reach those totals within his first 80 games of a season, joining Hank Greenberg (3x, 1935, 1937 and 1946) and Rocky Colavito (1961), and is the only player in all of baseball to have reached those totals so far this season.
- Notched his 34th RBI with two outs this season on June 23, the most in the majors this year...in the last 50 years, only one Tiger has recorded more two-out RBI prior to the All-Star Break: Miguel Cabrera and his 37 RBI with two outs in 2013 amidst his second of back-to-back MVP campaign.
- Hit his 17th home run of the season on Saturday and followed it with his 18th of the year on Sunday, giving him home runs in back-to-back games for the first time in his career.
