TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 2 (1-0) of a 3-game series vs Jack Eidelberg's Brewers and Game 2 (1-0) of a 9-game road trip that includes upcoming visits to SD's Petco Park (4g) and Min's Target Field (2g)...the Redlegs are coming off a 4-2 homestand vs these first-place Brewers (1-2) and Rockies (3-0)...was Cin's first series sweep of the Rockies since July 2012 at Coors Field and its first sweep in the Queen City since July 2006...following this road trip the Redlegs return to Great American Ball Park for their longest homestand of the season (11g), their final homestand of the season's first half (4g vs Atl, 1g vs Phi, 3g vs SD, 3g vs Cubs).

TRANSACTION: 3B Mike Moustakas (right heel contusion) today was sent to Class AAA Louisville on a rehabilitation assignment...he last played for the Reds on 5/18 vs SF and last started on 5/14 at Col

SERIES NOTES: In this series, the Reds and Brewers will finish a stretch over which they will play 6 times in 9 days...the Reds suffered a pair of 2-1 series losses in the teams' previous meetings this season...Cin went 2-2-2 in 6 series vs Mil in 2019 (8-11 record) and 2-0-1 in last season's 3 series

MILLER HIGH LIFE: In 93 career apps at American Family Field, Joey Votto is batting .325 (109-335, 21hr, 63rbi, .444obp, .579slg, 1.023ops)...his 21 HR and 63 RBI here are his highest totals in any road ballpark...for visiting players with a minimum of 200 plate apps, he entered this series ranked among all Brewers opponents at this ballpark in on-base percentage (2nd, Albert Pujols .448), slugging percentage (4th), walks (70, 1st), hits (1st), batting average (2nd, Pujols .332), HR (2nd), doubles (22, T3rd) and RBI (T3rd)...in 200 career apps vs Mil, Votto's 40 HR is his highest total vs any opponent and his 123 RBI his second-highest vs any opponent (125 vs Cubs).

PADRES UP NEXT: The Reds went 5-2 vs SD in 2019, the teams' most recent meeting...was Cin's first season series win vs the Padres since 2012 (6-2)...between the 2012 & 2019 season series wins, the Reds went 15-24 vs SD...beginning in 2013, Cin is 8-14 at Petco Park.

MORE VOTTO: Joey Votto on 4/30 vs Cubs hit his 300th career HR (2-run off Jake Arrieta)...he has 1,939 career hits and 995 career RBI...Votto is trying to become only the second Major League player ever to record in the same season his 2,000th hit, 300th home run and 1,000th RBI (Billy Williams, 1971)...courtesy @EliasSports.

DOT, DOT, DOT ...: The Reds went 9-8-4 in their 21 completed series, including 5-4-2 at GABP and 4-4-2 on the road...have 3 series sweep wins (3g vs Pit, 4g at StL, 3g vs Col) and 3 series sweep losses (3g vs Ari, 3g at StL, 4g vs SF)...are 2-21 when recording fewer hits than the opponent, their only wins an 8-7 victory on 6/6 at StL and Wed's 7-3 win vs Mil...are 28-19 when hitting at least 1 HR, 19-9 when hitting at least 2 HR and 5-12 when they don't homer...the game time on Thu at SD has been changed to 8:40et (from 10:10et) to accommodate "San Diego's Opening Day" ceremonies and a post-game fireworks show as the Padres celebrate **Petco Park's** first game back at full capacity...minor league SS Jose Garcia has changed his last name to Barrero in honor of his mother, who died in May...Barrero appeared in 24 games for the Reds last season.

FIRST SACKERS: Reds have used 9 players at first base, including Joey Votto (37g, 36gs), Alex Blandino (17g, 8gs), Tyler Stephenson (13g, 11gs), Mike Moustakas (9g, 7gs), Kyle Farmer (5g, 2gs), Mike Freeman (4g, 1gs), Max Schrock (2g), Scott Heineman (1g) and Tucker Barnhart (1g)...the Reds used as many as 9 first basemen as recently as 2019 (Aristides Aquino, Barnhart, Blandino, Curt Casall, Derek Dietrich, Farmer, Brian O'Grady, Josh VanMeter, Votto).

YOUNG GUNS: The Reds have used 10 rookie players so far this eason, including **IF Jonathan India** (54g), **C Tyler Stephenson** (50g), OF Mark Payton (24g), RHP Ryan Hendrix (20g), IF Max Schrock (12g), RHP José De León (9g), RHP Art Warren (5g), RHP Ashton Goudeau (4g), RHP Vladimir Gutierrez (4gs) and RHP Tony Santillan (1gs).

BONUS BASEBALL: The Redlegs have played 9 extra-inning games (7-2), including eight 10-inning games before the 12-inning, 6-5 win on 5/15 at Coors Field...the Reds won their last 5 extra-inning games...scored the runner on second base in 10 of the 11 extra innings while outscoring opponents, 19-14...in extra innings, the Reds are hitting .425 with a staff ERA of 8.18.

/ TWO PUNCH: Reds batters in the leadoff and No. 2 positions in the starting lineup combine to lead the Major Leagues in batting average (.322), on-base percentage (.388), slugging percentage (.591), hits (174), HR (38), runs (99), RBI (96), extra-base hits (68) and total bases (320)...Jesse Winker leads the club with 27 starts batting leadoff, while Nick Castellanos has 32 starts batting second...the Reds are 10-14 in the 24 games in which Winker leads off and Castellano hits behind him...Winker and Castellanos haven't hit in the top 2 spots of the Reds' lineup since 5/28 at Cubs, the only instance in the last 19 games.

## Tonight's Pitcher - #58 Luis Castillo, RHP

### **RED HOTS**

- The Reds' 2019 and 2021 Opening Day starting pitcher tonight is making the 104th start of his Major League career.
- In Thu's 7-2 loss vs Mil came back following a 37-minute rain delay after the fourth inning...left the game with 2 outs and 2 runners on base, leading 2-1, and became the victim of a blown save when both runners scored off Lucas Sims.
- His 6-4 win on 6/4 at StL snapped his 7-game and 7-start losing streaks, both the longest of his career...was the first Reds pitcher to lose 7 straight decisions or lose 7 consecutive apps, all as a starting pitcher, since Homer Bailey lost 7 consecutive starts from 7/31-9/5, 2018...per @EliasSports, no Reds pitcher ever, in a single season, has lost 8 consecutive apps, all as a starting pitcher.
- That 6-4 win at StL was his first since his second start of the season, an 11-4 win on 4/7 vs Pit...in 9 starts between winning decisions went 0-7, 7.29 (.330oba), including 0-7, 7.91 over 7 consecutive starts (.324obp).
- This season has posted ERAs of 13.15 in the first inning (13ip, 22r, 19er) and 4.76 after the first inning (51ip, 32r, 27er)...his 22 runs allowed and 19 earned runs allowed in the first inning are the most in the Major Leagues...in 2020, allowed 6 runs in the first inning of his 12 starts.
- On 5/18 vs SF produced a season-high 8 strikeouts through the first 3 innings...became the first Reds pitcher with 10 strikeouts through a game's first 4 innings since Jim Maloney did it on 5/21/1963 at Mil.
- Suffered an 11-6 loss vs StL in the second Opening Day start of his career...was the coldest Opening Day in Reds history (37 degrees).
- In that Opening Day loss failed to record a strikeout for the first time since 4/28/18 at Min (1ip)...prior to Opening Day recorded at least 1 strikeout in 69 consecutive starts (5/2/18 9/26/20)...allowed a career-high 10 runs, including 6 runs in the top of the first inning, and tied his career high by allowing 8 earned runs...the Reds allowed 6 runs in the top of the first inning of an Opening Day game for the first time in their history.
- In the 9-4 loss on 5/23 vs Mil made his 100th career start.
- Since his Major League debut in 2017 leads the Reds' pitching staff in wins (34), starts (103), IP (583.2) and strikeouts (638).
- In 2019 averaged 10.67 strikeouts per 9 innings, the highest ratio in Reds history for pitchers with a minimum of 125 innings...in the shortened 2020 season averaged 11.44 strikeouts per 9 innings over 70 innings pitched...in 2021 is averaging 8.44 strikeouts per 9 innings.

### **RED HOTS**

- Has won 4 straight starts for the first time in his career (4-0, 2.31, .167oba)...is the first Reds pitcher to win 4 consecutive starts since RHP Luis Castillo did it from 9/4-9/21 of last season...no Reds pitcher has won 5 consecutive starts since Johnny Cueto went 5-0 with 1 complete game over 5 apps from 7/26-8/15, 2014.
- Over the last 2 seasons, opponents are hitting just .209.
- Is 2-1, 6.93 in 5 starts at Great American Ball Park (.273oba) and 4-1, 1.65 in 8 starts on the road (.181oba).
