METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Brewers, 7-6, yesterday at Citi Field...The Mets have lost the first two games of the season for the first time since 2014, when they lost three straight to start the year...The Mets finish their first series of the season today against Milwaukee...The team continues their opening homestand with three contests against the Detroit Tigers beginning on Monday...Following this stand, the Mets head out on the road for the first time in 2024, visiting Cincinnati (three games) and Atlanta (four games).

HAPPY EASTER: The Mets are 16-23 when playing on Easter Sunday.

HOW SWEEP IT ISN'T: The Mets are looking to avoid their first sweep of the season...The Mets were last swept by the Crew from April 3-5, 2023 in Milwaukee...The team was last swept by the Crew in New York from August 19-21, 2011.

SILVER SLUGGER: Prior to today's game, Francisco Lindor will receive his 2023 Louisville Silver Slugger Award...Lindor became the Mets fourth member of the 30-30 club last year when he swiped 31 bases and hit 31 homers...His 31 home runs set the franchise record for a Mets shortstop...He was tied for eighth in the NL with 108 runs scored and drove in 98 runs...This marks Francisco's third Silver Slugger Award.

BRETT THE MET: Brett Baty connected for his first home run of the season yesterday...It was his first career pinch-hit home run...It was his second career home run off of a left-handed pitcher (Also: May 1, 2023 vs. Atlanta's Dylan Lee).

MEGILL, MY BELLE: Tylor Megill is set to make his first start of the season today...In 29 career appearances (27 starts), Megill has posted an 11-6 record with a 3.88 ERA (62 ER/144.0 IP) with 55 walks and 146 strikeouts at Citi Field...He went 7-3 with a 3.19 ERA (26 ER/73.1 IP) with 29 walks and 61 punchouts in 13 starts in Flushing last year...In 12 road starts of 2023, Megill went 2-5 with a 6.79 ERA (40 ER/53.0 IP)...Among pitchers with 10 or more starts both at home and on the road, Megill's 3.60 home/road differential was the fourth largest in the majors behind teammate David Peterson (4.58), Julio Urías (4.28) and Alex Cobb (3.75)...Courtesy of Elias.

ONE AWAY: Pete Alonso is one RBI away from 500 for his career...He would become the 10th player in Mets history to record 500 RBI...He has collected 118 RBI last season the sixth-most by a Met in a single season...He became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry also recorded three seasons each...Alonso's 498 RBI since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

ATTABOY ALVAREZ: Francisco Alvarez connected for his first home run of the season yesterday...He finished 3-4 with two runs with two RBI...He has 15 multi-RBI games since May 1, 2023, tied for fifth-most in the majors by a catcher during that span.

BREWERS-METS NOTES: Dating back to September 21, 2022, the Mets have lost nine of their last 10 games against the Crew.

SOUND THE TRUMPETS: Yesterday, Edwin Díaz made his first appearance for the Mets since 2022...He tossed 1.0 scoreless inning with a strikeout...The closer suffered a season-ending ruptured patella tendon in March of 2023...In 2022, Díaz was named the Trevor Hoffman National League Relief Pitcher of the Year after posting a 1.31 ERA (9 ER/62.0 IP) with 32 saves and 118 strikeouts...A two-time All-Star, Díaz has pitched to a 2.93 ERA (130 ER/400.1 IP) and has recorded 205 saves over seven major league seasons.

MENDOZA LINES: Carlos Mendoza was named the 25th manager in franchise history...The 44-year-old spent the previous 15 seasons with the Yankees organization, including the last four as the club's bench coach...From 2018-2019, Mendoza served as the Yankees' quality control coach...Prior to joining the big league coaching staff, Mendoza served as a manager and coach in the Yankees farm system...A native of Barquisimeto, Venezuela, Mendoza is the second full-time Venezuelan-born manager in big league history, joining Ozzie Guillén.

IN THE CITI: Despite their 0-2 record, New York earned a winning season at Citi Field in 2023, going 44-37 at home last season...The Mets have earned a winning season at Citi Field in each of the last three seasons...The Mets have smashed 115 home runs at Citi Field in 2023...That is the second-most home runs at home in team history...Only the 2019 team (126) hit more at home.

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES: The 2024 Mets enter the season with several new players on the roster...These include: free agent signings OF Harrison Bader, LHP Jake Diekman, RHP Jorge López, LHP Sean Manaea, RHP Luis Severino, RHP Michael Tonkin and INF Joey Wendle; trade acquisitions RHP Adrian Houser, RHP Yohan Ramirez and OF Tyrone Taylor as well as waiver claim INF Zack Short

THIS BUD'S FOR YOU: In January, Mets Hall of Famer Buddy Harrelson passed away at age 79 after a lengthy battle with Alzheimer's...Harrelson played for the Mets from 1965-1977 and was a member of the 1969 Miracle Mets, a two-time All-Star (1970 and 1971) and earned the 1971 Gold Glove at shortstop...He later would serve as a coach with the Mets in 1982 and again from 1985-1990. Harrelson took over the managerial duties early in the 1990 season and led the Mets through the 1991 campaign...In honor of his life and legacy, the Mets will wear a patch commemorating him all season long.

THE GOOD DOC: On Sunday, April 14 the New York Mets will retire Doc Gooden's number 16... Gooden spent 11 years with the Mets, winning the 1984 NL Rookie of the Year Award while setting a major league rookie record with 276 strikeouts and was the youngest player ever named to an All-Star team at age 19...The following year, Doc became the youngest pitcher ever to win Cy Young honors when he captured the "Triple Crown" of pitching, leading the majors in wins (24), strikeouts (268) and ERA (1.53)... Gooden was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in 2010...He ranks second in franchise history in wins (157) and strikeouts (1,875) and third in innings (2,169.2), complete games (67), starts (303) and quality starts (209).

MEGILL NEWS & NOTES

2023 RECAP: Megill finished last year earning a 9-8 record for the Mets with a 4.70 ERA (66 ER/126.1 IP), adding 58 walks against 105 strikeouts...Megill also made six starts with Triple-A Syracuse from June 29-July 29 and went 0-3 with an 8.67 ERA (26 ER/27.0 IP)...The right-hander recorded a pair of quality starts while with Syracuse; July 9 at Worcester and July 29 at Lehigh Valley.

CAREER HIGHS: In 2023, Megill established career bests in starts (25), innings (126.1), strikeouts (105) and quality starts (six) surpassing his previous highs of 18 starts, 89.2 innings, 99 strikeouts and four quality starts set in 2021.

NO PLACE LIKE NEW YORK: Last season, Megill went 7-3 with a 3.19 ERA (26 ER/73.1 IP) in 13 home starts this season...In 12 road starts of 2023, Megill went 2-5 with a 6.79 ERA (40 ER/53.0 IP)...Among pitchers with 10 or more starts both at home and on the road, Megill's 3.60 home/road differential was the fourth largest in the majors behind teammate David Peterson (4.58), Julio Urias (4.28) and Alex Cobb (3.75)...Courtesy of Elias.

STARTING OFF ON THE RIGHT FOOT: Megill earned the win in each of his first three starts of the 2023 season...It was the 28th time in franchise history that a starting pitcher won each of their first three starts to begin the season.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Megill reached a career-high 7.1 innings pitched on September 30, 2023 against the Phillies...It marked the first time in his career that he has pitched 7.0 or more innings...Prior, his longest out was 6.0 innings, which he accomplished five times, all of which came in 2023.

ADDING TO THE LIST: Last season, Megill faced 10 opponents for the first time in his career...From August 28 -September 16, Megill faced four straight opponents for the first time in his career and pitched to a 2.45 ERA (6 ER/22.0 IP) during that span...The right-hander has faced 24 of 30 major league teams at least once in his career.

AMAZIN' IN APRIL: Megill went 3-1 with a 3.96 ERA (11 ER/25.0 IP) last April...Since 2022, Megill's seven wins in April are tied with Gerrit Cole for the third-most in the majors...Only Clayton Kershaw and Joe Ryan (eight each) have more wins in April over the last two seasons...Megill's 2.89 ERA (17 ER/53.0 IP) in April since 2022 is the fifth-lowest mark in the NL and the 16th-lowest mark in the majors, while his .216 opponent's batting average is the sixth-lowest mark in the NL and the 16th-lowest mark in the majors during the month over the last two seasons (min. 45.0 IP).

ENDING THE SEASON STRONG: Megill allowed three runs or fewer in each of his final eight starts of the 2023 season dating back to August 16, the longest such streak of his career as a starter...During that span, Megill pitched to a 3.00 ERA (15 ER/45.0 IP), the fifth-best mark in the NL (min. 45.0 IP)...In September, Megill pitched to a 2.76 ERA (9 ER/29.1 IP), the ninth-best mark in the NL during the month (min. 25.0 IP)...On August 28 vs. Texas, Megill struck out a season-high eight batters, his most in a start since striking out nine on May 4, 2022 vs. Atlanta...In his final two starts of the season, both against Philadelphia, Megill tossed back-to-back quality starts for the second time in his career (Also: July 17-23, 2021)...In his final start of the season, Megill threw a career-high 7.1 innings surpassing his previous high of 7.0 innings on September 10, 2021 vs. New York-AL.

THE NL EAST IS A BEAST: In eight starts against NL East opponents last season, Megill went 4-2 with a 3.60 ERA (18 ER/45.0 IP)...Megill allowed three or fewer runs in seven of those starts and three of his six quality starts this past season came against NL East opponents.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP SEAN MANAEA (0-0, 0.00)

METS DEBUT: Manaea will make his Mets debut tomorrow when he takes the mound against the Detroit Tigers...He comes to New York after starting his career in Oakland and making stops with San Diego and San Francisco

2023 RECAP: Appeared in a career-high 37 games, splitting the season between the starting rotation (10 starts) and bullpen (27 games)...Established a career-high strikeout rate (9.8 K/9)...Had a 3.43 ERA (23 ER/60.1 IP) over 17 second half appearances compared to a 5.49 ERA (35 ER/57.1 IP) over 20 first half appearances in 2023.
