**PITTSBURGH PIRATES (46-62) vs. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (54-54)**  
**July 30, 2025 - Oracle Park - San Francisco, CA - 12:45 PDT - Game #109/Road #53**  
**RHP Mike Burrows (1-3, 4.15 ERA) vs. RHP Logan Webb (9-8, 3.38 ERA)**

**THE PIRATES:** have won four straight and seven of their last eight games (since July 21 vs. Detroit)...Are one of four teams in Major League Baseball that has yet to lose when leading after eight innings this season (39-0)...Are 34-36 since Don Kelly made his managerial debut on May 9 vs. Atlanta...Have played a season-high 79.0 consecutive innings (since July 20 vs. Chicago-AL) without committing an error (their 19 errors since Kelly's managerial debut are the second-fewest in all of Major League Baseball)...Are looking to win four straight road games for the first time since doing that from July 11-14, 2024.

**LET'S MEET AGAIN SOON:** Pittsburgh will welcome San Francisco to PNC Park for three games next week (August 4-6) to kick off a seven-game homestand (will also host Cincinnati for four games from August 7-10)...The series against the Giants at PNC Park will conclude a stretch for the Pirates of 12 consecutive games played against the National League West.

**CHECKING THE BROOM CLOSET:** With a win today, Pittsburgh would secure its first series sweep of San Francisco since August 15-17, 2016 at AT&T Park.

**ROCK ON:** The Pirates will depart for Denver following today's game to begin a three-game series at Colorado on Friday...The Rockies are the only National League team that Pittsburgh has yet to face this season...The Pirates have won five of their six games at Coors Field since the beginning of the 2023 season.

**CALM IN CALIFORNIA:** Bailey Falter, Braxton Ashcraft and Dennis Santana combined to limit San Francisco to just two hits in Tuesday night's 3-1 win, tied for the fewest allowed by the Pirates in a game this season...The other two instances also came in California, on April 23 at Los Angeles (AL) and May 31 at San Diego... According to OptaStats, Pittsburgh is the first Major League team since at least 1901 to allow two hits or fewer in a game in three different road stadiums in the same state during the same season.

**FROM THE ASHES:** Braxton Ashcraft earned the win on Tuesday night at Oracle Park, tossing 3.0 perfect innings in relief of starter Bailey Falter...He became just the second Pirates rookie reliever since at least 1901 to earn a win while tossing 3.0 perfect innings, joining Babe Adams (5.0ip) on August 18 [G2], 1909 vs. St. Louis...Ashcraft's 2.42 ERA (26.0ip/7er) as a reliever since making his Major League debut on May 26 at Arizona is tied with Milwaukee's Abner Uribe for the seventh-lowest mark among all National League relievers with at least 26.0 innings pitched in that span.

**PHAMTASTIC RUN:** Tommy Pham went 3-for-4 with a double and a run scored on Tuesday at San Francisco, extending his hitting streak to a season-high nine straight games (since July 19 vs. Chicago-AL)...It's Pham's longest hitting streak since a 15-game run from August 8-25, 2023 (with Arizona)...Over his last 26 games (since June 22 vs. Texas), he is batting .411 (37-for-90) with 13 extra-base hits, 20 RBI, and 13 runs scored...Pham's average during that stretch is the best among all Major League players with at least 95 plate appearances...It's Pham's highest career average over a 26-game span and the highest by a Pirates batter over a 26-game span (minimum 95 plate appearances) since Andrew McCutchen hit .430 (40-for-93) in 26 games from June 10-July 8, 2017.

**PITCHING PROWESS:** Pirates pitchers have allowed one or zero runs in 30 games this season (last on Tuesday at San Francisco), the most-such games in all of Major League Baseball and Pittsburgh's most in a season since 2018 (36)...Over their last eight games (since July 21 vs. Detroit), Pirates pitchers have a 1.46 ERA (74.0ip/12er), the lowest mark in all of Major League Baseball.

## ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

July 30, 2017: Andrew McCutchen recorded the third three-home run game of his career, as the Pirates picked up a 7-1 win over the Padres at Petco Park. McCutchen's first home run was his 20th of the season, making him one of just three Pirates, along with Willie Stargell (13, 1964-76) and Ralph Kiner (seven, 1946-52) to hit 20 home runs in seven straight seasons (since 2011).

**LAST TIME OUT:** Burrows allowed three hits and one walk while striking out five batters and not allowing a run over a career-high 6.0 innings on Friday vs. Arizona, having a no-decision in the team’s 1-0, 11-inning loss...His only other outing of at least 6.0 innings in his professional career came with Double-A Altoona on May 26, 2022, when he tossed 7.0 scoreless innings at Harrisburg...He had a no-hit bid through 4.1 innings for the second consecutive start (also July 19 vs. Chicago-AL)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Burrows became the first Pirates pitcher with a no-hit bid of at least 4.0 innings in back-to-back starts since Mitch Keller from September 19-25, 2020.

**ROOKIE RANKS:** Since making his season debut on May 22 vs. Milwaukee at PNC Park, Burrows’ 53 strikeouts are the sixth-most among Major League rookies, trailing only the Athletics’ Jacob Lopez (70), Kansas City’s Noah Cameron (65), New York (AL)’s Will Warren (64), Chicago (AL)’s Sean Burke (60) and Texas’ Jack Leiter (56)...His 11 starts this season are the fourth-most among National League rookies, behind Milwaukee’s Chad Patrick (18), Colorado’s Chase Dollander (15) and Chicago’s Cade Horton (12).

**START ME UP:** Burrows earned his first win as a starter in the big leagues on June 4 vs. Houston, allowing just five hits and zero walks while striking out six batters over 5.1 scoreless innings of work...He was one of 10 Pittsburgh rookies (11 instances) since at least 1901 to pitch at least 5.1 scoreless innings with six strikeouts and zero walks.

**RISPY BUSINESS:** Burrows has limited opposing hitters to a .189 batting average against (7-for-37) with runners in scoring position...In his last nine starts (since June 4 vs. Houston), he’s allowed five hits in 30 at-bats (.167 average) with RISP, tied for the fifth-lowest mark in the National League in that span (minimum 35 batters faced).

**JUNE BLOOM:** Burrows recorded a 2.73 ERA (26.1ip/8er) in six appearances (five starts) during the month of June, tied with Los Angeles (NL)’s Justin Wrobleski for the second-lowest ERA among all Major League rookies with at least 26.0 innings pitched in the month...The only pitcher with a lower ERA was the Athletics’ Jacob Lopez (2.64).

**PROVIDING RELIEF:** Burrows made his only relief appearance of the season in the 4-2 loss on June 25 at Milwaukee, tossing 2.1 scoreless innings in relief of Paul Skenes.

**DEBUT DAY:** Burrows made his MLB debut in relief of Paul Skenes last season on September 28 at Yankee Stadium...In that game, he earned the win, allowing two runs (one earned) on two hits, three walks, two strikeouts and one home run in 3.1 innings...He was recalled from Triple-A Indianapolis this April 24, but did not pitch before being optioned back to Triple-A after the team’s April 25 victory in Los Angeles.

**DOWN ON THE FARM:** Burrows went 2-1 with a 2.51 ERA (32.1ip/9er) and 41 strikeouts over his eight appearances (seven starts) at Triple-A Indianapolis...At the time of his promotion to Pittsburgh on May 21, Burrows ranked second in the International League with a 1.02 ERA, 28 strikeouts and a 0.85 WHIP, as well as third with a .175 batting average against, in the month of May (four games/three starts).

**THE BURROWS FILE:** Burrows was drafted by Pittsburgh in the 11th round of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of Waterford High School (Waterford, Connecticut)...Burrows has a 3.58 ERA (291.1ip/116er) in 78 career minor-league outings (73 starts).
