RHP DAKOTA HUDSON (8-7, 4.07 ERA) vs. RHP JT BRUBAKER (3-12, 4.58 ERA)

THE PIRATES:...have won five of their last seven and six of their last nine games...Have won four straight games at PNC Park for the first time 9/24-27, 2019 (a win tonight would give the Bucs their longest winning streak at home since taking seven straight from 6/19 to 7/3, 2019).

TODAY'S TRANSACTIONS: Prior to tonight's game the Pirates reinstated right-handed pitcher JT Brubaker from the 15-day injured list (right lat discomfort) and recalled infielder/outfielder Tucupita Marcano from Triple-A Indianapolis...To make room for Brubaker and Marcano on the 28-man active roster, right-handed pitcher Roansy Contreras and catcher José Godoy have been optioned to the minor leagues.

24: Pirates rookie Oneil Cruz is celebrating his 24th birthday today...Cruz has hit 18 home runs in his first 87 games in the big leagues...That's tied for the second-most by a Pirate in his first 87 games since Garrett Jones hit 18 homers in his first 56 games in 2009...According to Baseball Reference, the only Pirate to hit more home runs through his first 87 games in the big leagues was Dick Stuart with 19 in 1958.

KE' AND SCRAP IRON: Ke'Bryan Hayes enters today with a National League-leading .9714 fielding percentage after playing in total of 131 games (126 starts) this season at third base...Coming into today, that's .02 percentage points ahead of Phil Garner in 1977 (.9712) for the highest fielding percentage among Pirates third basemen with at least 100 games played at that position...Special thanks to the Elias Sports Bureau.

HONORING ALBERT AND YADI: Albert Pujols and Yadier Molina will be recognized by the Pirates for their on-field achievements prior to the game tonight... Molina made his Major League debut at PNC Park on June 3, 2004, and singled off Oliver Perez in his second at-bat...Pujols played in his first game at PNC Park on May 15, 2001...In addition, Roberto Clemente Jr. and his brother Luis will be present to honor Pujols and Molina for their community efforts as previous Clemente Award winners.

HOIST THE COLORS: Oneil Cruz' bases-loaded walk gave the Pirates their ninth walkoff win of the season last night in the opener of their season-ending series against St. Louis...That's now the fifth walkoff walk since PNC Park opened in 2001 and the first since Bryan Reynolds walked off the Braves on July 6, 2021.

ROOKIE BALL: Jack Suwinski enters today tied with Atlanta's Michael Harris II with a National League-leading 19 home runs among rookies...Suwinski's 19 home runs are the sixth-most in a single season by a Pirates rookie, trailing only Jason Bay (26 in 2004), Josh Bell (26 in 2017), Ralph Kiner (23 in 1946), Johnny Rizzo (23 in 1938) and Garrett Jones (21 in 2009).

CASHING IN AT PNC: Jack Suwinski has gone deep five times in his last 10 games at PNC Park while hitting .333 (9-for-27) with a 1.420 OPS in those contests...Suwinski's 16 home runs at home are also the most in a single season by a Pirates rookie, surpassing Jason Bay (15 in 2004) and Al Martin (15 in 1993).

MILESTONE WATCH: Bryan Reynolds enters today two hits shy of 500 in his career...Since the beginning of the 2019 season, Reynolds' 498 hits are the ninth-most among all National League players, trailing Freddie Freeman (625), Trea Turner (620), Paul Goldschmidt (568), Nolan Arenado (544), Manny Machado (543), Charlie Blackmon (528), Pete Alonso (509) and Dansby Swanson (509)...Coming into today, Reynolds also ranks sixth in all of MLB and second in the National League among center fielders with an .876 OPS.

THE MATURATION OF MITCH: Mitch Keller ended the season with a 3.91 ERA after posting a 6.17 ERA in 2021...Below is a list of the largest drop in ERA from one season to the next for Pirates pitchers since the NL started tracking earned/unearned runs in 1912 (minimum 20 starts) according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

- Has reached base safely in five of his first seven games with the Pirates...Went 0-for-3 with a walk in the ninth inning Monday night.
- Knocked in a run in three straight games from 9/26-28; his first time to do that since recording an RBI in four straight from 8/17-21, 2018.
- Broke a 1-1 tie with a three-run double in the seventh inning on 9/27 for his first three-RBI game since 9/27/18 at Tampa Bay.
- Was claimed off waivers on 9/25 from the Yankees after being designated for assignment on 9/22.
- Recorded multiple hits for the third time in five games on Sunday after going 2-for-4 with a stolen base and run scored.
- Has reached base safely in five of his first seven games...Has made four starts at second base, two in center field and one in left.
- Singled off Chicago's Erich Uelmen in the 9th inning on 9/23 in MLB debut for his first career hit while also recording a pair of stolen bases.
- Is currently rated as Pittsburgh's No. 11 prospect according to MLB Pipeline...Was named Indianapolis' 2022 MVP.

Has hit nine of his 11 home runs off southpaws; his last homer off a righty came against Corey Kluber at Tampa Bay on 6/25.
