AROUND THE HORN

\$100 MILLION IN GIVING: On March 9, the D-backs and Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation celebrated earning a place among professional sports' most impactful philanthropic organizations, in fewer than three decades, reaching a historic milestone of \$100 Million In Giving through their signature "D-backs Give Back" investment in communities across Arizona...March 9 will forever be celebrated annually as "D-backs Give Back Day" as proclaimed by Arizona Governor Katie Hobbs ensuring the organization's longstanding statewide commitment will be recognized each year.

HERE'S THE STORY: The D-backs' 7-4 road record (.636) since April 8 is the NL's fifth-best winning pct., behind the Padres (.667, 6-3), Nationals (.692, 9-4), Cardinals (.818, 9-2) and Braves (.875, 7-1).

- The D-backs have won 4 of their last 7 series (4 straight between April 7-19) and won/split 7 of their last 9 (6 straight from March 30-April 19).
- Ildemaro Vargas'** career-best 26-game hitting streak since Sept. 26, 2025 is MLB's longest active streak and tied for the second-longest streak (2 others) since 2021, behind Trea Turner's 27-gamer from Sept. 12, 2021-April 16, 2022).
- Nolan Arenado** has reached base 17 times in his last 8 games, hitting .480 (12-for-25)/1.327 OPS with 1 double, 2 homers, 6 RBI and 5 walks (3 K).
 - In his last 15 games, is hitting .380 (19-for-50)/1.129 OPS with 1 double, 5 homers, 15 RBI and 5 walks (7 K).
- Jose Fernandez** has an 11-game on-base streak as a starter, hitting .357 (15-for-42)/.876 OPS with 2 doubles, 1 homer, 5 RBI and 3 walks (8 K).
 - In his last 17 starts, is hitting .348 (23-for-66)/.816 OPS with 3 doubles, 1 homer, 8 RBI and 3 walks.
- Corbin Carroll** in his last 7 games, is hitting .320 (8-for-25)/.974 OPS with 1 double, 1 triple, 1 homer, 2 RBI, 3 walks and 2 stolen bases.

LAST GAME: The D-backs lost 13-1 @ Brewers yesterday.

- Ildemaro Vargas** extended his career-best 26-game hitting streak with a fourth-inning single.
- Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** went 2-for-4 with 1 RBI.
- Corbin Carroll** went 2-for-3 with 1 double.

ROSTER MOVES: Today, the D-backs recalled **LHP Brandy Garcia** (No. 55) from Triple-A Reno, reinstated **C Gabriel Moreno** (strained left oblique) from the 10-day injured list, optioned **LHP Philip Abner** to Reno following yesterday's game and designated **C Aramis Garcia** for assignment.

VARGY'S HOT STREAK: **Ildemaro Vargas'** 23-game hit streak to start a season is tied for MLB's second-longest streak since 1940 [source: Elias Sports Bureau]:

30 Ron LeFlore/DET April 17-May 27, 1976

23 Ildemaro Vargas/AZ March 30-present

23 Edgar Rentería/ATL April 3-May 9, 2006

- During the span, is hitting .378 (34-for-90)/1.087 OPS with 6 doubles, 2 triples, 6 homers (team high), 20 RBI (team high) and 3 walks, including a team-high-tying 9 multi-hit efforts (also: Corbin Carroll).

A BAKER'S DOZEN: The D-backs' 13 comeback victories lead the Majors, ahead of the Braves (11) and Dodgers (11) [source: MLB Research].

- They are a MLB-best 12-7 in games when they allow the first run.

PRODUCING AT THE BOTTOM: Since April 13, the D-backs' 7-9 hitters in the lineup rank among MLB leaders in combined homers (T-1st, 9), extra-base hits (T-1st, 19), SLG (1st, .552), RBI (1st, 33) and OPS (3rd, .831).

ROAD SNAKES: **Ildemaro Vargas'** 19-game road hitting streak since Sept. 8, 2025 is MLB's longest active streak and the franchise record.

- Vargas** is batting .347 (26-for-75)/.812 OPS with 4 doubles, 1 homer, 6 RBI and 3 walks during the span.
- Adrian Del Castillo** has reached base in 8 of his last 9 road games (9 H, 2 BB) with 1 double, 2 homers and 9 RBI.
- Ketel Marte** has reached base in 11 of his last 13 road games (13 H, 4 BB)/.842 OPS with 5 homers and 8 RBI.

- Corbin Carroll** has reached base in 11 of his 13 day games, hitting .356 (16-for-45)/1.097 OPS with 6 doubles, 2 triples, 1 homer, 4 RBI and 7 walks.
- Ketel Marte** has reached base in 11-straight day games, batting .273 (12-for-44) with 2 doubles, 1 homer, 4 RBI and 3 walks.
- Nolan Arenado** in his last 7 day games, is hitting .333 (8-for-24)/.346 OBP with 2 RBI and 1 walk.
