RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their six-game road trip to California against the Angels (0-1, two to play) and the Dodgers (three to play) tonight at Angel Stadium...despite dropping 11 of their last 17 games, are off to their fifth-best start in team history...the 6-11 skid comes on the heels of a 22-4 stretch (April 22-May 23)...are 24-13 (.649) vs. clubs currently below .500, second in the AL to the Yankees (32-16/.667)...have owned the AL's best record for each of the last 35 days (May 9-pres.), including eight consecutive days leading the majors from May 18-25...have the best winning pct. in the AL East (.606), slightly ahead of the Yankees (.603), and have spent 41 days leading the division, 25 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...with a loss tonight and a Yankees win in Toronto, the Rays would fall to second for the first time since May 8 (25-13).

- ★ The Rays fell in the series opener, 4-3, against the Angels...hold a 16-7 record in series openers, including 7-5 away from Tropicana Field.
- ★ **Jonathan Aranda** went 2-for-5 with 3 RBI, his seventh multi-hit, multi-RBI game of the year, tied for eighth most in the AL...entering this season he has 13 such games in his career, including 11 in 2025 (see most in "Spare Ribbies" note below).
- ★ **Mason Englert** made his first appearance since June 3 vs. DET...Angels hitters were 0-for-4 against the right-hander with runners in scoring position.
- ★ Despite the loss, the Rays are still a MLB-best 15-5 (.750) in games vs. left-handed starting pitchers.
- ★ The Rays have committed zero errors in their last four games, tied for their second-longest errorless streak of the season (5x, last: June 1-5)...the only longer streak they put together came between May 1-6 (6G).
- ★ The Rays staff has allowed 21 runs over the last seven games (3.0 R/G) after permitting 72 runs across their previous nine contests (8.0 R/G, May 25-June 3).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays reinstated RHP **Craig Kimbrel** (right wrist strain) from the 15-day IL (May 31 [retro May 28]-June 12) and optioned RHP **Mason Englert** to Triple-A Durham. Kimbrel made one scoreless appearance for the Rays on May 26 at BAL prior to his stint on the IL...he signed with the Rays on May 26 as a free agent after being designated for assignment (May 22) by the Mets and electing free agency on May 25.

ALWAYS ON—AL batting average leader **Yandy Díaz** (.331) is slashing .367/.438/.653 (36-for-98) with 7 2B, 7 HR (three leadoff HR), 23 RBI, 12 BB, 14 R, and a 1.091 OPS during a 25-game on-base streak, the longest active run in the majors, longest by a Ray since his 27-game streak between June 3-July 4, 2025, and four games shy of his career-best 29-game stretch from May 26-June 28, 2024...during his 29-game streak, he set a franchise record with a 20-game hitting streak (June 7-28, 2024) that was later tied by **Brandon Lowe** (June 11-July 5, 2025)...it marks Díaz's third on-base streak of 25 games or more in his career, tied for the most in franchise history with **Evan Longoria**...it is also tied for the majors' fifth-longest streak this season and marks the AL's third longest, trailing runs by **ATH Nick Kurtz** (48G, April 3-May 25) and **DET Riley Greene** (26G, April 18-May 16)...since the streak began on May 12, he ranks second in the majors in average to **LAD Shohei Ohtani** (.412) and is fourth in on-base pct., slugging pct., and OPS.

- ★ During his active streak, he has reached base multiple times in 16 games, including 10 multi-hit games...since the start of June, he has four contests with three hits or more, most in the majors.
- ★ Díaz's four leadoff homers are tied with Ohtani and **WSH James Wood** for second most in the majors to **MIN Byron Buxton** (6)...three of those blasts have come during his on-base streak...he needs two more leadoff homers over the Rays final 96 games to match **Corey Dickerson's** club record set in 2017 (6).

SPARE RIBBIES—**Jonathan Aranda** drove in 3 RBI last night, bringing his season total to 48, fifth most in the AL...he is tied for fifth in MLB with 13 multi-RBI contests, with seven of the 13 including multi-hit efforts...he is 2 RBI shy of becoming the 23rd player in franchise history to reach 50 RBI before the All-Star break...with 28 games remaining before the break, he is 21 RBI behind **Jose Canseco's** club record of 69 RBI before the Midsummer Classic.

- ★ The left-handed bat is nearing single-season career highs in home runs (11, 14 in 2025), RBI (48, 59 in 2025), and walks (40, 41 in 2025)...he is 19 games away from 300 in his career.
- ★ With runners in scoring position, Aranda is hitting .323 (20-for-62) with seven doubles and a .400 on-base pct. ...his .323 average is 11th in the AL with RISP...he is hitting .375 (9-for-24) with RISP and two outs, sixth best in the AL and 11th in the majors.
- ★ Aranda has tallied 140 career RBI within his first five big league seasons, becoming the 10th Mexican-born player to turn the trick and the 22nd Ray in club history.

GET 'EM ON, GET 'EM IN—The Rays have plated 300 runs in 2026, with 78 (26.0%) crossing the plate after a home run...the Rays rank first in pct. of runs scored not via a home run (see table on the right) and have the third-most manufactured runs in the majors at 222 (MIL - 256, LAD - 224)...Rays hitters have been reached base at a .336 clip, the best OBP in the AL and third best in the majors behind the Dodgers (.345) and the Brewers (.340)...with runners on, they rank second in the majors in average (.274), including a .279 average with runners in scoring position which ranks third...they have an MLB-best-tying 20 sacrifice hits (also CWS) and have tallied the fifth-most productive outs (73) in the AL...the club has the fourth highest run scoring pct. (30%) in the AL (percentage of times a baserunner eventually scores a run).

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN'—The Rays are in the middle of a six-game stay in Southern California against the Angels and Dodgers...the Rays hosted the Angels between May 29-31 and claimed the series, 2-1...the club has won or split seven of eight (6-1-1) and 15 of its last 17 sets (12-2-3) against the Angels (May 22, 2017-pres.), including back-to-back series wins (Aug. 4, 2025-pres.)...since the start of the 2010 season, the Rays are 39-18 at Angel Stadium.

- ★ **Yandy Díaz** launched leadoff home runs in back-to-back games from May 29-30 vs. LAA, the second time in his career he has done so (also: April 13-14, 2025)—he is the only Ray to turn the trick in team history...on May 29, he hit a pair of home runs, his fifth career multi-home run game (last: Aug. 2, 2025 vs. LAD - 2HR), including a postseason effort on Oct. 2, 2019 at OAK.
- ★ In 10 career games against the Angels, **Junior Caminero** has hit .371 (13-for-35) with 4 2B, 3 HR, 6 RBI, an .743 slugging pct., and a 1.208 OPS...Caminero has multiple hits in four of his last five games opposite the Angels (Aug. 6, 2025-pres.).

WE'LL NEVER LOSE AGAIN—Class-A Charleston earned its 12th straight win last night in walk-off fashion, its fourth walk-off during the stretch and second in the last four days...it is the longest streak in minor league baseball this season and the longest by the RiverDogs since at least 2005...they hold a 4.0-game lead in the Carolina League South Division and can secure a spot in the postseason with a win this evening...since the MiLB restructure in 2021, the RiverDogs have won three Carolina League championships and made the postseason four of five years.

- ★ Class-A Bowling Green already locked up a postseason spot on June 9 after being crowned South Atlantic League South Division champions in the first half...it marks their third straight postseason appearance and fifth since joining the SAL in 2021...they have won three of the last five SAL championships.
- ★ Double-A Montgomery leads the Southern League South Division by 1.5 games with nine to play in the first half...they have made the Southern League postseason every year since 2015 (excluding the cancelled 2020 season).
- ★ At the Rookie-level, the FCL Rays and DSL Tampa Bay both lead their respective divisions.
- ★ This season, Rays affiliates are a combined 166-129 (.563), third best among all MLB organizations...Rays affiliates have combined for a top-six winning pct. every season since 2017.

THIS DAY IN RAYS HISTORY—On June 13, 2003, Rays pitchers **Victor Zambrano**, **Travis Harper**, **Jesús Colomé**, and **Al Levine** combined to throw a one-hitter in a 7-1 win over the Pirates...it was the fourth time in franchise history the staff combined to allow one or zero hits in a game, a feat that has only happened 22 times in club history...**Zack Littell**, **Edwin Uceta**, and **Garrett Cleavinger** were the last group to turn the trick on Sept. 19, 2024 vs. BOS (also 1H).

TONIGHT'S START—Griffin Jax will toe the rubber today for his ninth start and 20th appearance of the year, including his fifth start and 13th outing on the road...marks his ninth straight start after pitching out of the bullpen in each of his first 11 appearances...is the 25th start of his major league career...is seeking his first win since April 18 at PIT and first since joining the Rays starting rotation...acquired from the Twins for RHP Taj Bradley on July 31, 2025.

LAST TIME OUT—Did not receive a decision despite tossing 5.0 scoreless innings in a 4-1 loss on June 7 at MIA (5.0IP, 3H, 2BB, 4SO)...marked Tampa Bay's third consecutive loss in his starts...allowed just two of his first 10 batters faced to reach base (BB, 1B)...worked around a pair of singles and a walk over his final two frames to record his second scoreless outing of 5.0 innings or more in 2026 and the third of his career (last: May 13 at TOR)—all three of those appearances have come on the road.

CALLING ALL ANGELS—Jax has appeared in eight games opposite the Angels in his career, all as a relief pitcher...he holds a 1-1 record and a 2.57 ERA (7.0IP, 2ER), with 14 strikeouts in those outings...has limited opponents to a .222 (6-for-27) clip and his teams have gone 6-2 in those affairs.

✦ Jax has a 6-4 record with four saves and a 3.50 ERA (61.2IP, 24ER) with 81 strikeouts across 58 appearances (one start) against AL West clubs...has not faced an AL West foe since Sept. 2, 2025 vs. SEA, when he allowed 1 ER on 1 H and 2 BB in a 6-5 win...AL West opponents have hit .198 (45-for-227) against him in his career.

✦ Will be making his fifth career appearance (first start) at Angel Stadium, his first since tossing a scoreless inning on Aug. 6, 2025...is 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (3.0IP, 2ER) and seven strikeouts, with the Angels going 5-for-14 (.357) against him in those contests.

HIT THE ROAD, JAX—Away from Tropicana Field this season, Jax is 1-3 with a 3.63 ERA (22.1IP, 9ER) and 15 strikeouts across 12 appearances (four starts) compared to 0-1 with a 4.86 ERA (16.2IP, 9ER) with 21 strikeouts in seven appearances (four starts) at home...in his career, he has a lower ERA on the road (3.58 ERA/196.1IP, 78ER) than at home (4.52ERA/199.1IP, 100ER).

✦ Since joining the Rays, he has a 1.59 ERA (17.0IP, 3ER) in five road starts.

✦ He has allowed one or zero earned runs in 10 of his 12 road outings this season, pitching to a 1.96 ERA (18.1IP, 4ER) with 12 SO in those games...however, the Rays are 4-6 in those contests.

GET JAX UP AND MOVING—This marks the first time Jax has been a regular starter since his 2021 rookie season with the Twins, when he made his final 14 appearances as a member of the Twins rotation after his first four came in relief...he started two games for the Rays last season, working as an opener for Ian Seymour on Sept. 5 vs. CLE before starting a bullpen game on Sept. 10, 2025 at CWS...both starts lasted 1.0 scoreless frame...for his career, he is 3-7 with a 5.33 ERA (96.1IP, 51ER) in 23 starts compared to 21-28 with a 3.70 ERA (294.1IP, 121ER) in 294 relief appearances.

✦ Jax spent his first five professional seasons (2016-19, 2021) as a starter...he first transitioned to a full-time relief role in 2022...from 2016-21, 50 of his 55 minor league appearances were starts.

CAPTAIN JAX—Jax is currently a Captain in the U.S. Air Force Reserve, earning the promotion in June 2021, and remains the only Air Force Academy graduate to play in the majors...after his graduation from the Academy in 2017, he made five starts with Class-A Cedar Rapids and Rookie-level Elizabethton during his 60-day leave ahead of his first active duty assignment, departing on July 22 to begin his role as an acquisitions officer working with civilian contractors such as SpaceX and Boeing...the following year, he was accepted into the Air Force World Class Athlete Program, which allows soldiers to train for the upcoming Olympic Games as their active duty job responsibility for a two-year period, allowing him to continue his baseball career while completing his active duty requirement...became eligible for the program when baseball was readmitted for the scheduled 2020 Tokyo Olympics.

✦ He completed his active duty requirement and was admitted to the Air Force Reserve in November 2019...was notified of his promotion to Captain on June 5, 2021, the same day he was selected to the Twins major league roster ahead of his MLB debut three days later.

MLB CAREER RECAP—Last season, made a career-high 73 appearances (2 starts), tied for sixth most in the AL, between the Twins (50G) and Rays (23G), going a combined 1-7 with a 4.23 ERA (66.0IP, 31ER)...also set career bests in strikeouts (99) and holds (28)...acquired at the July 31 trade deadline for RHP Taj Bradley...of his 99 strikeouts, 97 came as a reliever, fourth most in the AL behind HOU Bryan Abreu (105), CLE Cade Smith (104), and teammate Edwin Uceta (103)...min. 250 BF, ranked second in the majors in chase rate (38.1%) behind CIN Graham Ashcraft (38.3%) and was fifth in whiff rate (37.3%)...joined Abreu as the only pitchers in the majors to make 70 appearances or more each season from 2023-25...his 216 appearances in that timeframe ranked third to SF/NYM Tyler Rogers (226G) and Abreu (220G).

✦ In 2024, received the Joseph W. Haynes Award as Twins Pitcher of the Year, as voted on by the Twin Cities chapter of the BBWAA...became the first Minnesota pitcher to record 10 saves and 20 holds in a season.

✦ In 2023, made the Twins Opening Day roster for the first time and spent the year in the club's bullpen...tied for ninth in the AL with a team-leading 23 holds...led the majors with a 3.3 pct. barrel rate (min. 250BF).

✦ In 2022, transitioned to a relief role for the first time after spending his first six professional seasons (2016-21) as a starter...led the Twins bullpen in innings (72.1), tied for the team lead in holds (18), and ranked second in appearances (65)...began the season with Triple-A St. Paul after spending spring training with the Twins...made one appearance before being recalled April 12 when Jorge Alcala was placed on the injured list, remaining with the big-league club through season's end.

✦ Made his major league debut in 2021 across four stints with the Twins: June 5-16, June 24-July 7, July 19-20, and July 30-end of season...maintained a regular spot in the rotation during his season-ending stint with the club...named the recipient of the Bob Feller Act of Valor Award, given annually to the major leaguer who best embodies the spirit of the late Hall of Famer, both in terms of commitment to country and love for baseball.
