**BACK IN BLACK:** The Mets are encouraging fans to wear black tonight when the Mets host the Cincinnati Reds at 7:10 p.m. The Mets will wear their black Nike jerseys that night and all Friday nights at Citi Field for the remainder of the 2021 regular season. In celebration of the return, the first 12,000 fans in attendance July 30 will receive a Black Francisco Lindor Mets T-Shirt presented by New Balance. Tickets are on sale now at [Mets.com/Tickets](http://Mets.com/Tickets).

**METS HALL OF FAME:** LHP Jon Matlack, RHP Ron Darling and infielder Edgardo Alfonzo will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame tomorrow, Saturday, July 31 in an on-field ceremony at Citi Field that begins at 6:45 p.m. The three new additions will bring the total membership of the Mets Hall of Fame to 30. Al Jackson will be posthumously honored with the Mets Hall of Fame Achievement Award for contributions to the organization. This group was scheduled to be celebrated in 2020, but due to the pandemic, the ceremony was moved to this year. Tickets for Saturday are on sale at [Mets.com/Tickets](http://Mets.com/Tickets).

**METSELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Braves, 6-3, yesterday. The Mets are 7-7 since the All-Star break. The Mets continue a 10-day, 11-game homestand (4-4) against the Blue Jays (2-1), Braves (2-3) and Reds (three games). Following this homestand, the Mets head to Miami for four games and Philadelphia for three.

**C IS FOR COOKIE:** Prior to tonight's game, the Mets are expected activate RHP Carlos Carrasco has been reinstated from the 60-Day IL. Carlos Carrasco is set to start and make his Mets debut tonight. Carrasco was acquired along with Francisco Lindor from Cleveland for infielders Andrés Giménez and Amed Rosario as well as minor leaguers Isaiiah Greene and Josh Wolf on January 7. He has been on the 60-Day IL with a right hamstring injury. He owns a career record of 88-73 with a 3.77 ERA with 321 walks and 1,305 strikeouts across 11 seasons and 242 games (195 starts). In 2020, he ranked among AL leaders in starts (12, tied for second), strikeouts (82, sixth), ERA (2.91, seventh), innings pitched (68.0, eighth), opponent average (.221, ninth) and HR/9 (1.06, 10th).

**REPLACE-METS:** Entering today, the Mets have used 56 players through 101 games this season. That ties the franchise record for most players used in a season, also done by the 2018 Mets. The Mariners enter the day leading the majors with 57 players used. The MLB record for players used in a season is 67 by the 2019 Mariners. Carlos Carrasco is set to become the 57th player used and the 17th pitcher to start a game for the Mets. This would be the second most starters the team has used in a season in team history. The team used 16 starters in 1964-66 and used a franchise-record 20 in 1967. The Mets enter the day leading the majors for the most starters used this season at 16.

**WE FOUND NIMMO:** Brandon Nimmo is batting .297/.425/.412 with 25 runs, 11 doubles, two home runs, 15 RBI, 31 walks and an .838 in 44 games this season. He has safely reached base in 37 of his 44 games this season. His .425 OBP is second in the majors (min. 150 PA). He is batting .333/.443/.494 in 24 games at home this season with 11 extra-base hits.

**TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT:** Brandon Nimmo is batting .348 (16-46) with three extra-base hits and a .464 OBP against left-handed hitters this year. That tops the majors (min. 50 PA). Dominic Smith ranks fourth, batting .330 (29-88) with eight extra-base hits and a .384 OBP. As a team, the Mets are batting .245/.323/.393 vs. southpaws. This compares to a .234/.313/.385 slash line against righties.

**FELIZ QUINCEAÑERA:** Jeff McNeil is on a career-high 15-game hitting streak, batting .382 (21-55) with eight runs, four doubles, two home runs, 13 RBI, five walks and a 1.006 OPS in that span. It surpasses his previous best 11-game hitting streak, which he accomplished from August 16-26, 2018. He has safely reached base in each of his last 16 games, putting up a .443 OBP in that span. He is batting .357 (25-70) with 11 runs, four doubles, two home runs, 13 RBI and seven walks with a .923 OPS in 21 games this month.

**WHAT A RELIEF:** The Mets bullpen has posted a 2.04 ERA (13 earned runs/57.1 innings) with 14 walks and 64 strikeouts over their last 12 games. Overall, the Mets bullpen owns a 3.95 ERA (160 earned runs/364.1 innings) with 151 walks and 403 punchouts. That is 12th in the majors and seventh in the NL.

**THREW ME FOR A LOUP:** Aaron Loup has posted a 0.40 ERA (one earned runs/22.1 innings) over his last 23 games. Since May 22, he is 2-0, walked five and struck out 25. Overall in 38 games this year, he is 3-0 with a 1.04 ERA (five earned runs/33.2 innings) with seven walks and 38 strikeouts. Left-handed hitters are batting .196 (10-51) this year. He has not allowed an extra-base hit to a lefty this year. He has posted a 0.44 ERA (one earned run/20.2 innings) with two walks and 23 strikeouts in 19 games at Citi Field in 2021.

**IT'S GONNA BE MAY:** Trevor May has posted a 1.56 ERA (three earned runs/17.1 innings) with 11 walks, seven walks and 23 punchouts in 18 games since June 16. He is 2-0 in that span and has converted both save opportunities. Overall, he is 4-2 with three saves and a 3.23 ERA (14 earned runs/39.0 innings) in 42 games this season. He has struck out 51, while walking 13 giving him a 11.77 strikeout per 9 IP ratio. That is second on the team and 15th in the National League.

**METS-REDS NOTES:** The Mets and Reds have alternated wins and losses between each other at Citi Field over their last eight games. The Mets won the previous nine home games against the Reds.

**HOME, SWEET HOME:** The Mets are in a stretch of 11 home games in 10 days. New York has alternated wins and losses for their last 14 home games. The Mets have lost back-to-back games at home only twice this year (April 27-28 and June 21-22). The team is 15-2 at home following a home loss this season. The team owns a 32-18 record with a 2.78 ERA (132 earned runs/427.0 innings) with 149 walks and 466 strikeouts at home. The team's 2.78 ERA at home is the best in the majors and their .640 winning percentage is the fourth-best. This compares to 22-29 with a 4.39 ERA (207 earned runs/424.1 innings) with 146 walks and 453 strikeouts on the road this year.

**IN A PINCH:** The Mets pinch-hitters are batting .266/.338/.497 with 12 doubles, seven home runs, 33 RBI and 13 walks. Their .266 batting average is the fourth-best in the majors and is the best in the NL. Their .834 pinch-hit OPS is also the best in the NL. The team's seven pinch-hit home runs is tied for the third-most in the majors.

**HOMER BOUND:** The Mets have homered in 14 of their last 18 games, hitting 31 home runs in that span. The team's 31 home runs since July 9 are the tied for the most in the majors. The Dodgers have also hit 31 home runs. By comparison, the Mets hit 13 home runs in their previous 17 games.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Pete Alonso launched a two-run homer into the third deck in left-center field in the fifth inning yesterday. The home run had a Statcast-estimated distance of 453 feet, his longest of the season and his MLB-leading 11th home run of 450+ feet since 2019. He is batting .321 (18-56) with nine runs, two doubles, six home runs, 12 RBI, six walks, a .387 OBP and a .679 SLG in 14 games after the All-Star break. He is batting .276/.338/.551 with 25 runs, six doubles, 16 home runs, 38 RBI, 16 walks and an .889 OPS in 53 games since the start of June.

**PONY EXPRESS:** Alonso has 92 home runs through 309 career games. Despite Alonso's second year in the majors being last year's 60-game season, he currently ranks tied for 15th all-time in home runs through his third career season. He is now tied for the 12th-most home runs through three big league seasons with Jose Abreu, Bob Horner and Ted Williams. Only seven players have hit 100+ homers through their first three major league seasons. Only 14 players in franchise history have hit 100 or more home runs with the Mets. He leads the major leagues in home runs since he entered the league in 2019.

**MOVIN' ON UP:** Michael Conforto has hit 124 home runs and is now tied with Todd Hundley for eighth on the team's all-time home run list. Lucas Duda is seventh with 125. Pete Alonso is now 20th on the Mets all-time home run list with 92 blasts. Cleon Jones is next with 93 home runs.

**FIRST THINGS FIRST:** The Mets have been in first place since Saturday, May 8, a streak of 83 days. This is their longest run atop the East in the last 14 seasons. The 2007 Mets (135 days in a row) were the last iteration of the club to be in first longer than 83 days in a row, per Elias. The team has been in first place for 99 days overall this season, the most of any team in 2021.

**JULY! JULY! JULY!:** As a team, New York is batting .268/.345/.449 with a .793 OPS in 25 games this month. This is their highest batting average, OBP and SLG in any month this season. The team is third in the majors in batting average, OBP and OPS and sixth in SLG. The team has hit 37 home runs this month, the third-most in the majors and their highest total of any month this year. New York is 13-12 this month.

**ACT II:** The Mets are batting .277/.349/.474 with 62 runs, 23 doubles and 23 home runs since the break. The team's 23 home runs after the All-Star break are tied for the most in the major leagues, while their .824 OPS is the fourth-best in MLB and second-best in the NL. The team's .349 OBP is fourth in the majors in that span as is their .272 batting average is fifth-best. The Mets hit .231/.310/.373 in the first half.

**36 DAYS OF NO. 36:** There are 29 days until the Mets retire Jerry Koosman's number 36 in a pregame ceremony on August 28. In honor of the event, the team is on a 36-day countdown noting the most memorable moments of his historic career. On this day in 1976, Koosman tossed a complete game as the Mets defeated the Phillies, 3-2, at Shea Stadium. Kooz had a shutout with one out left in the ninth, but the Phillies scored twice to break it up. Nonetheless, Koosman earned his 12th win going the distance and allowing two earned runs on four hits with three walks and struck out five. ### CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

**REHAB:** Carrasco has missed the entire season to this point with a right hamstring injury...He made three rehab starts, one with Brooklyn (A) on July 15 and two with Syracuse (AAA) on July 20 & 25...In his last start at Buffalo, he fired 3.0 shutout innings and allowed just two hits with six strikeouts...He had as many Ks as he did balls thrown (38 pitches, 32 for strikes).

**#59 IS #57:** Carrasco will become the 57th player used by the Mets this season, breaking the previous franchise record of 56 players used in 2018...He will be the 17th starter used by the Mets this year...Only the 1967 Mets used more starters.

**2020 REVIEW:** In his 11th big league season, Carrasco finished with a 3-4 record and a 2.91 ERA (22 earned runs/68.0 innings), seventh best in the American League... Carrasco ranked sixth in the AL in strikeouts with (82), eighth in innings pitched (68.0), ninth in opponent average (.221), and tenth in HR/9 (1.06)...In his final six starts of the season, Carrasco went 1-1 with a 1.66 ERA (seven earned runs/38.0 innings).

**CAREER REVIEW:** In 11 major league seasons, Carrasco is 88-73 with a 3.77 ERA (520 earned runs/1242.1 innings) in 242 career games (195 starts), all with Cleveland... Carrasco was tied for the American League lead with 18 wins in 2017 and finished 4th in AL Cy Young voting that season...Since 2015, Carrasco is one of ten pitchers to have at least three seasons of 200+ strikeouts (2015, 2017, 2018)...From 2015-2020, Carrasco had 69 wins, tied for the 10th-most during that span.

**VS. CINCINNATI:** In seven games against the Reds, six starts, Carrasco is 4-0 with a 3.43 ERA (15 earned runs/39.1 innings)...In his last three outings against the Reds, Carrasco is 3-0 with a 1.59 ERA (three earned runs/17.0 innings), with his last win coming on August 6, 2020...Carrasco joined RHP David Burba and RHP Corey Kluber as the only Cleveland Indian pitchers to earn four wins against the Reds.

**AT HOME:** For his career, Carrasco is 39-40 with a 4.29 ERA (289 earned runs/607.0 innings) in 120 home games (90 starts)...Since 2013, Carrasco is 35-31 at home with a 3.98 ERA (228 earned runs/515.1 innings) in 104 games (82 starts) and has 576 strikeouts during that span...This will be Carrasco's first career game at Citi Field.

**STRUCK HIM OUT:** From 2013-2020, Carrasco has the seventh best K% among starting pitchers in the American League with a 27.4% clip...His highest total came in 2013 at 29.6%, where he ranked in the top 93rd percentile according to baseball savant...During that span Carrasco has the second most strikeouts by a pitcher that has never made an All Star game, just six behind the leader Rick Porcello...He is one of only seven pitchers to have a season with 200+ strikeouts and not make an All Star Game during that span and is the only pitcher to accomplish that feat multiple times.

**A COURAGEOUS COMEBACK:** After making an odds-defying comeback on September 1, 2019 just three months after being diagnosed with chronic myeloid leukemia Carrasco earned the 2019 AL Comeback Player of the Year Award... Carrasco routinely visited cancer patients at the Cleveland Clinic following his diagnosis and still keeps in touch with many of them to this day.

**C IS FOR COMMUNITY:** In 2019, Carrasco earned the Roberto Clemente Award for his numerous community endeavors...Formed two foundations in 2016, one in the U.S. and one in his native Venezuela...He and his family have raised nearly \$2.7 million, primarily sending medical supplies to his native Venezuela, the Dominican Republic and Puerto Rico...Has donated thousands of books via his book drive in Cleveland and in his offseason home of Tampa, he helps to feed and clothe immigrants from Venezuela...Collected thousands of books through the United Way Stuff The Bus initiative, as well as collecting food items for the Step Up To The Plate Campaign.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP RICH HILL (6-4, 3.95 ERA)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Hill made his Mets debut against the Blue Jays on July 25...The southpaw allowed three earned runs on five hits in 5.0 innings...Hill became the second oldest starting pitcher to make his Mets debut at 41 years old.

**WELCOME TO THE METS:** Rich Hill, a 41-year-old lefthander from Boston, was acquired by the Mets on July 23 from Tampa Bay in exchange for RHP Tommy Hunter and minor league catcher Matt Dyer...The Mets are the 11th major league franchise for which he's played.
