PITTSBURGH PIRATES (68-89) vs. CINCINNATI REDS (80-77)

Sept. 24, 2025 - Great American Ball Park - Cincinnati, OH - 6:40 EDT - Game #158/Road #77 RHP Paul Skenes (10-10, 2.03 ERA) vs. RHP Hunter Greene (7-4, 2.74 ERA)

THE PIRATES: began this season-ending, six-game road trip to Cincinnati and Atlanta with a 4-2 win on Tuesday at Great American Ball Park...Have won three straight games (since Saturday vs. the Athletics) after dropping 12 of 13 games from September 5-19...Are 56-63 since Don Kelly made his managerial debut on May 9 vs. Atlanta...Have recorded

at least one extra-base hit in 56 consecutive games (since July 22 vs. Detroit), the second-longest active streak in all of Major League Baseball (the Athletics, 74 games, rank first) and their longest single-season streak since a 64-game streak from June 1-August 14, 2019...Have played in a Major League-high 58 one-run games (are 24-34 in those games), their most in any season since 2014 (60).

NO CY OF RELIEF: Paul Skenes enters today with a Major Leaguebest 2.03 ERA...Since joining the National League in 1887, a Pirate has led the National League in ERA eight times (the last to do it was John Candelaria with a 2.34 in 1977)...The last Pirates righthander to do it was Bob Friend, who had a 2.84 ERA in 1955.

REYNOLDS AND THE REDS: Bryan Reynolds has gone deep 16 times in his career against Cincinnati, including 12 times here at Great American Ball Park (his most in any away ballpark)...Since the start of 2019 (his debut season), Reynolds' 16 home runs against the Reds are tied with Paul Goldschmidt for the fourthmost among all Major League players...They are behind only lan Happ (22), Willy Adames (19) & Christian Yelich (18) on that list.

20-20 VISION: Oneil Cruz hit his 20th home run on Tuesday at Cincinnati, a two-run shot off Brady Singer (he has also stolen a National League-best 38 bases)...Cruz became the second

Pirate (fourth instance) to have at least 20 home runs and 35 stolen bases in a season (Barry Bonds did that in three straight seasons from 1990-92)...Cruz also had 21 home runs and 22 stolen bases last season (his 20th and 21st home runs came on September 20 and 22, respectively, here at Great American Ball Park)...The only other Pirates to have at least 20 homers/20 steals in at least two seasons were Dave Parker (1978-79), Bonds (1987, 1990-92), Andy Van Slyke (1987-88), Andrew McCutchen (2011-13) and Starling Marte (2018-19).

RELIABLE RELIEVERS: Pittsburgh's bullpen tossed 4.1 scoreless innings on Tuesday at Cincinnati and now has a 0.42 ERA (21.1ip/1er) in five games since September 17 vs. Chicago (NL)...The bullpen's 0.42 ERA in that time is first in MLB (Cincinnati, 0.46, is second)...Their bullpen has pitched 18.1 straight scoreless innings (last run allowed was in the eighth inning on September 17).

IN THE NICK OF TIME: Nick Yorke went 2-for-4 with an RBI and a run scored in Tuesday's win at Cincinnati, extending his hitting streak to a career-high five straight games (since September 17 vs. Chicago-NL)...He is batting .389 (7-for-18) with two extra-base hits, two RBI, four runs and a 1.032 OPS on the streak.

57 BUCS: When Hunter Barco made his Major League debut on Tuesday at Cincinnati, he became the 57th different player to appear in a game with Pittsburgh this season...He earned the win, making him one of only four Pirates left-handed relievers in the Modern Era (since 1901) to earn the win in his debut, along with Bill Werle (April 22, 1949 vs. Cincinnati), Joe Gibbon (April 17 [G2], 1960 vs. Cincinnati) and Frank Carpin (May 25, 1965 vs. Chicago).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

<u>September 24, 1968</u>: Steve Blass pitched his third straight shutout, blanking the Reds, 2-0, at Forbes Field. Maury Wills led off for Pittsburgh and went 2-for-3 with a run. Willie Stargell gave the Pirates the lead with his solo shot off Cincinnati's Gary Nolan leading off the bottom of the seventh inning. Matty Alou extended their lead with his run-scoring double in the eighth inning.

TONIGHT'S STARTER RHP PAUL SKENES #30

2025 RECORD: 10-10, 2.03 ERA

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes allowed three runs on a career-high-tying seven hits (also August 7 vs. Cincinnati and August 29 at Boston), three walks and six strikeouts in 3.2 innings on September 16 vs. Chicago (NL), losing a 4-1 decision...He allowed the fourth leadoff home run of his career and second this season (also Sal Frelick, August 12 at Milwaukee) to Michael Busch...It was the second-shortest start of his career (he pitched 2.0 innings last September 28 at Yankee Stadium).

AGAINST THE REDS: Skenes is 4-0 with a 0.39 ERA (23.0ip/1er) and 33 strikeouts (isused two walks) in four career starts against Cincinnati...In his only start against the Reds this year, which came on August 7 at PNC Park, he allowed seven hits for the first time in his career while striking out eight batters in 6.0 scoreless innings (won a 7-0 decision vs. Brady Singer)...In his only career start here at Great American Ball Park, which came on September 22, 2024, Skenes allowed two hits and struck out nine batters in 5.0 scoreless innings (won a 2-0 decision vs. Hunter Greene)... The only run he allowed vs. Cincinnati came on a first-inning double from Spencer Steer that scored Jeimer Candelario on June 17, 2024 at PNC Park (was Skenes' first start against the Reds).

AWARD-WORTHY: Skenes, who won the National League Rookie of the Year Award in 2024, has pitched to a 2.03 ERA (181.2ip/41er) and 209 strikeouts while issuing only 42 walks through his first 31 starts of the season...He is the only Major League pitcher since earned runs became an official statistic in both leagues in 1913 to post those stats or better through his first 31 starts of a season...Should Skenes win the National League Cy Young Award this season, he would become only the second pitcher in Major League history to win the Rookie of the Year Award in his first season and the Cy Young Award in his second season (New York-NL's Dwight Gooden accomplished that from 1984-85)...He would also become just the third Pirates pitcher in team history to take home the Cy Young Award, joining Vernon Law in 1960 and Doug Drabek in 1990.

SUPER SKENES: Skenes has pitched to a 2.00 ERA (314.2ip/70er) with 379 strikeouts and a .199 batting average against through the first 54 starts of his Major League career (since May 11, 2024 vs. Chicago-NL)...That is the fourth-lowest ERA by a pitcher through the first 54 starts of his bigleague career since earned runs became an official statistic in both leagues in 1913...He trailed only Al Mamaux (1.94, 1914-16), Ernie Shore (1.97, 1914-16) & Dutch Ruether (1.98, 1917-20).

HEY, BABE: Skenes enters today with a 0.96 WHIP...Since Pittsburgh joined the National League in 1887, the only Pirates pitcher with a lower WHIP in a season was Babe Adams (0.90) in 1919.

SIX PACK: Skenes has at least six strikeouts in 25 starts (last on September 16 vs. Chicago-NL), tied with Bob Veale (1965) for the most such starts by any Pirate in a season since at least 1901.

THE 200 CLUB: Skenes eclipsed the 200-strikeout mark with his third-inning strikeout of Coby Mayo on September 10 at Baltimore...He became one of just seven Pirates pitchers (10 instances) to record at least 200 strikeouts in a season, joining Bob Veale (1964-66, 1969), Oliver Pérez (2004), A.J. Burnett (2013), Gerrit Cole (2015), Francisco Liriano (2015) and Mitch Keller (2023).

NO-RUN FUN: Skenes made back-to-back scoreless starts where he allowed two or fewer hits, one or zero walks and had at least eight strikeouts on September 4 vs. Los Angeles (NL) and September 10 at Baltimore...The only other Major League pitchers in the Modern Era (since 1901) to do that were Boston (AL)'s Cy Young (1905), Los Angeles' Orel Hershiser (1984), Boston's Pedro Martínez (2002), Washington's Max Scherzer (2015), Milwaukee's Corbin Burnes and Freddy Peralta (2021), New York (NL)'s Jacob deGrom (2021), Chicago (AL)'s Michael Kopech (2023) and Detroit's Tarik Skubal (2023)...Skenes' 11 scoreless starts this season are tied with Trevor Williams (2018) for the most by any Pittsburgh pitcher in a season during the Modern Era.

- **®** Has hit 11 of his 20 homers out of the leadoff spot...His 20 homers as a center fielder are the second-most in the National League at the position. **®**
- Has each of the top three and five of the six farthest home runs hit by a Pirate this season (Tommy Pham hit the fourth-farthest homer this year).
- Š Has a career-high 38 stolen bases...Would become the first Pirate to lead the National League in steals since Tony Womack had 58 steals in 1998.

- **®** Threw out his 14th runner attempting to steal against him (Nico Hoerner) on 9/16 vs. Chicago-NL (most by a Pirate since Elias Díaz had 14 in 2019).
- **®** His 2.91 catcher's ERA (652.2ip/211er) so far this year is the lowest by any Pittsburgh catcher with at least 600.0 innings caught in a single season.

- Š Was acquired from Kansas City on 7/16 for infielder/outfielder Adam Frazier...Hit .266 (101-for-379) in his 103 total games at Triple-A this season.
