METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action on Friday and defeated the Astros 7-2...The Mets have won four straight games...The Mets are now above . 500 for the first time since they were 16-15 on May 2...The have won 12 of their last 14 and 16 of their last 20...New York is seeking their 14th series victory of the season...The Mets have either won or split each of their last eight series...New York is in stretch of 17-straight games before the All-Star break..They are 1-0 in that span...The Mets continue a five-game, sixday homestand ( $3-0$ ) against the Yankees (2-0) and Astros (1-0)...Following this series, the Mets travel to Washington D.C. for a four-game series and to Pittsburgh, PA for a four-game series.

PATCHING THINGS UP: The New York Mets today announced the club has added memorial uniform patches honoring the lives of Jerry Grote and Willie Mays...The patches will be debut prior to today's $4: 10$ p.m. game vs. Houston...Grote's family will be on hand today at Citi Field to celebrate his career and available in the press conference room following Carlos Mendoza's availability at 1:30 p.m.

DOUBLE VISION: The Mets have recorded a double in 25 consecutive games...That is tied for the third-longest streak in franchise history...New York has recorded 57 doubles in that span...The last time the team had a longer streak was a franchise record 36 games from May 7 -June 14, 2012...The Mets are fourth in the National League in doubles.

AM I SEEING DOUBLE?: Francisco Lindor recorded another double last night, bringing his season total to 24...That places him tied for second in the majors...With one more doubles, Lindor would record 25 or more works in three straight years...Since he entered the league in 2015, Lindor has collected 289 doubles, which is the 11th-most in the majors Rican born player...Next up is Vic Power (290), followed by Jose Valentin (302).

JEFF McHITS: Jeff McNeil recorded the 220nd multi-hit game of his career last night... He ranks 15th in franchise history in multi-hit games...Carlos Beltrán is next up with 223 multi-hit games, followed by Bud Harrelson at 231...McNeil's 778 career hits are the 17thmost in franchise history...Kevin McReynolds is next at 791, followed by Lee Mazzilli at 796...Brandon Nimmo is right below McNeil with 759 hits entering today...McNeil has recorded 157 career doubles...That is 13th on the Mets all-time list, two behind Keith Hernandez (159) and 13 behind Mookie Wilson (170).

HOME IS WHEREVER I'M WITH YOU: The Mets have won eighth straight games at Citi Field...It's the longest winning streak at Citi Field since an eight-game span from May 17-June 1, 2023...The last time the Mets won nine straight at Citi Field was May 18-June 14, 2022...The Mets have posted a 2.75 ERA ( 22 ER/72.0 IP) with 31 walks and 73 strikeouts in that span....They are hitting .299/.391/.586 with 18 doubles, 19 home runs, 35 walks with a. 977 OPS in those eight games...The Mets have outscored their opponents $59-25$ over the streak...Overall, the Mets are 21-23 as the home team and 21-22 at Citi Field in 2024.

LET'S GO STREAKING: The Mets have homered in 11 straight games, bashing 27 home runs in that span...It is their longest streak of the season and their longest since an 11game span from June 27-July 8, 2023...The last time the Mets recorded a longer streak was a 15 -game streak from May 16 -June 1,2023 ...The 15 -game streak was the secondlongest in franchise history...The Mets record is a 21-game streak from July 16-August 5, 1996...The Mets have hit 39 home runs this month, which is tied for the second-most in the majors and the most in the National League.

THREE'S COMPANY: The Mets have recorded three home runs in each of their last four games...That ties a franchise record, done from July 1-4, 2004...The Mets also hit 13 home runs in that span.

HANG 10: Francisco Alvarez is on a career-best 10-game hitting streak, batting . 595 (1733) with seven runs, five doubles, three home runs, 10 RBI , eight walks with a .595 OBP and a .939 SLG...He is batting $.316 / 387 / .531$ with 15 runs, nine doubles, four home runs, $20 \mathrm{RBI}, 12$ walks and a . 918 OPS in 31 games this year...The Mets are 23-8 when Alvarez plays...This includes a $23-4$ record over the last 27 games and an 12-3 record since he returned from the IL.

JUNE BLOOM: The Mets own a 16-6 record in June...The team went 9-19 in May...The team's .727 winning percentage this month is the best in the majors... The Mets are hitting .289/.363/.520 this month...They lead the majors in average, OPS and OBP and are second in SLG...The Mets have outscored their opponents 142-91 this month...Their 142 runs are second in The Show, while their 6.45 runs/game is the best.

OUR HOUSE: Adrian Houser earned his first career save on Wednesday night.... He tossed 3.0 innings and allowed two hits, one walk and struck out three...In 10 appearances as a reliever this year, Houser is $1-0$ with a save and a 1.46 ERA ( 4 ER/24.2 IP) with nine walks and 15 strikeouts...In 42 career appearances as a reliever, Houser is 6-0 with a 1.67 ERA (16 ER/86.0 IP) with 34 walks and 68 strikeouts.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets are in a stretch of five straight games against the American League...They are 3-0 in that span...They are 8-10 in Interleague Play this year...Last year introduced the new schedule format which had New York playing a total of 46 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets went 19-27 against the American League...Overall, New York owns a 262-264 record in Interleague play.

INTERLEAGUE PETE: Pete Alonso has hit 50 home runs in Interleague Play... His 50 home runs against the American League is a franchise record, and the most among any player since he entered the league 2019...Mike Piazza was the previous record holder with 28 Interleague home runs.

HAPPY MEALS: The Mets are 12-2 over their last 14 games...The Mets are batting $.300 / .378 / .563$ with 34 doubles, 31 home runs, 54 walks and a .941 OPS in that span... New York has posted a 3.19 ERA (44 ER/124.0 IP) in that period with 47 walks and 130 strikeouts...The Mets have outscored their opponents 100-49 over the last 14 games.

MEET THE METS: Following a loss on May 29, the Mets have played 24 games, going $18-6$ in that span...Their 18 wins and .750 winning percentage are the best in the majors... The Mets have hit .294/.366/.526 in that period with 56 doubles, five triples, 42 home runs, 84 walks, 17 steals and an 892 OPS...They have outscored their opponents 155-102 during those 24 games...The Mets lead the majors in average, OBP, SLG and OPS in that span...Their 155 runs are tied for the second-most in the majors in that span, while their 6.46 runs/game are the most in The Show.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: In 36 games batting in the leadoff spot the this year, Francisc Lindor is hitting .309/.375/.537 with 27 runs, 16 doubles, six home runs, 20 RBI, 11 walks, eight steals with an . 912 OPS...He ranks 10th in the majors and sixth in the NL with a 3.3 fWAR...Francisco Lindor has posted a 2.7 fWAR since May 1...That is third in the National League in that span, behind only Bryce Harper (3.3 fWAR) and Shohei Ohtani (2.8 fWAR)... It is seventh in the majors in that period...In 50 games since May 1 , Lindor is batting .279/338/.495 with eight home runs and 29 RBI.

AMF HOSTS JUNIOR METS CLINIC: As part of the Amazin' Mets Foundation's commitment to supporting programs that directly impact youth baseball athletes, the Foundation invited local little leaguers, aged 8 to 12 , to Citi Field for a baseball clinic earlier today...Mets Front Office staff conducted drills and exercises to introduce the game to the children and provide them with the opportunity to enjoy the Citi Field experience... To date, the Foundation has committed over $\$ 1.7$ million to support baseball and athletic programs.


LAST TIME OUT: Recorded the loss on June 22 at Chicago-NL, throwing 3.0 innings and allowing six earned runs on five hits with three walks and six strikeouts.

WHAT AN OUTING: Recorded his longest outing of the season, working 7.0 scoreless innings against the Dodgers on May 28 ...Allowed just three hits and three walks, while recording a seasonhigh nine strikeouts.

MINOR LEAGUE REHAB: After his first start of the year on March 31 (L, $4.0 \mathrm{IP}, 3 \mathrm{H}, 2 \mathrm{R} / \mathrm{IER}$, 3 $\mathrm{BB}, 4 \mathrm{~K}$ ), was placed on the 15-Day IL with a right shoulder strain...Over four minor league rehab appearances, Megill has posted a 0.64 ERA ( 1 ER/14.0 IP) with one walk and 23 strikeouts... He has never faced the Guardians..

2023 RECAP: Megill finished last year earning a 9-8 record for the Mets with a 4.70 ERA (66 ER/126.1IP), adding 58 walks against 105 strikeouts...Megill also made six starts with Triple-A Syracuse from June 29-July 29 and went 0-3 with an 8.67 ERA ( 26 ER/27.0 IP)...The right-hander recorded a pair of quality starts while with Syracuse; July 9 at Worcester and July 29 at Lehigh Valley.

CAREER HIGHS: In 2023, Megill established career bests in starts (25), innings (126.1), strikeouts (105) and quality starts (six) surpassing his previous highs of 18 starts, 89.2 innings, 99 strikeouts and four quality starts set in 2021.

NO PLACE LIKE NEW YORK: Last season, Megill went $7-3$ with a 3.19 ERA ( $26 \mathrm{ER} / 73.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in 13 home starts this season...In 12 road starts of 2023, Megill went 2-5 with a 6.79 ERA ( 40 ER/53.0 IP)...Among pitchers with 10 or more starts both at home and on the road, Megill's 3.60 home/road differential was the fourth largest in the majors behind teammate David Peterson (4.58), Julio Urías (4.28) and Alex Cobb (3.75)...Courtesy of Elias.

STARTING OFF ON THE RIGHT FOOT: Megill earned the win in each of his first three starts of the 2023 season...It was the 28th time in franchise history that a starting pitcher won each of their first three starts to begin the season.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Megill reached a career-high 7.1 innings pitched on September 30, 2023 against the Phillies...It marked the first time in his career that he has pitched 7.0 or more innings... Prior, his longest out was 6.0 innings, which he accomplished five times, all of which came in 2023.

ENDING THE SEASON STRONG: Megill allowed three runs or fewer in each of his final eight starts of the 2023 season dating back to August 16, the longest such streak of his career as a starter... During that span, Megill pitched to a 3.00 ERA (15ER/45.0 IP), the fifth-best mark in the NL (min. 45.0 IP)...In September, Megill pitched to a 2.76 ERA ( $9 \mathrm{ER} / 29.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ), the ninth-best mark in the NL during the month (min. 25.0 IP)...On August 28 vs. Texas, Megill struck out a season-high eight batters, his most in a start since striking out nine on May 4, 2022 vs. Atlanta...In his final two starts of the season, both against Philadelphia, Megill tossed back-to-back quality starts for the second time in his career (Also: July 17-23. 2021)...In his final start of the season, Megill threw a career-high 7.1 innings surpassing his previous high of 7.0 innings on September 10, 2021 vs. New York-AL.

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP LUIS SEVERINO (5-2, 3.29)

NO WAY: Luis Severino carried a no-hitter into the eighth inning on April 29 against the Cubs...Threw 8.0 innings, allowing one run on one hit with two walks and five strikeouts... The outing was tied for the longest no-hit bid of his career...Threw 7.0 hitless innings on October 3, 2022 at Texas with the Yankees...Courtesy of Elias....Marked his longest start since June 16, 2018 vs. Tampa Bay (Also: 8.0 IP)...Became the first Mets pitcher to throw at least 8.0 innings and allow one or zero hits since Marcus Stroman accomplished the feat on July 21, 2021 at Cincinnati...Ranks fourth in the NL among qualifiers in ERA with a 2.31 ( $9 \mathrm{ER} / 35.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) mark.
