## Chicago Cubs (9-9)

Fifth Place, NL Central, 1.5 GB

**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets enjoyed a day off yesterday...On Wednesday, the Mets fell to the Dodgers, 8-2, in California...The Mets are in the midst of their second trip of the season...The team is on a six-game seven-day trip (0-3) against the Dodgers (0-3) and the Cubs (three games)...The Mets are off on Monday before the start of a 10-day, nine-game homestand against the Twins (three games), Rockies (three games) and Nationals (three games).

**EIGHT DAYS A WEEK:** The Mets are on a season-long eight-game losing streak...The Mets have posted a 5.74 ERA (44 ER/69.0 IP) in that span with 28 walks and 71 strikeouts...As a team, they are batting .175/.213/.257...They have been outscored 44-12 in the current streak...This is their longest losing streak since the team last eight straight from September 6-13, 2025...The last time the team lost nine or more games was an 11-game streak from August 28-September 8, 2004.

**NEW BEGINNINGS:** Yesterday, the New York Mets today officially opened a newly renovated, state-of-the-art performance center at their Dominican Republic Academy, marking a significant investment in the organization's player development infrastructure...The Mets have had a presence in the Dominican Republic for several decades, and this milestone project builds on that longstanding commitment to developing elite, homegrown international talent...The new facilities include a 10,000-square-foot weight room and nutrition bar, 18 suite-style bedrooms with dedicated workspace, two new classrooms and an expanded training room featuring hot and cold plunge pools... Additional upgrades include a 16,900-square-foot agility field, a 5,200-square-foot open-air batting cage expansion, and a fully renovated locker room...The project also added 12 new player rooms within the existing complex.

**DAY-MAN:** The Mets are 4-5 with a 3.63 ERA (35 ER/86.2 IP) with 32 walks and 91 strikeouts in day games this season...Their 91 strikeouts in the daytime are fourth in the National League.

**ODDS & ENDS:** Mets relievers are eighth in the NL and 12th in the majors with a 3.58 ERA...They have issued 23 walks, the fifth-fewest in the majors...Carson Benge is leading off for the first time in his career...He is hitting .250 (5-20) over his last six games.

**SENGA GENESIS:** Kodai Senga is set to take the bump for his fourth start of the season...He is 0-1 with a 3.09 ERA (4 ER/11.2IP), five walks and 16 strikeouts in two starts on the road...This will mark his third career start against the Cubbies...He is 1-1 with a 4.09 ERA (5 ER/11.0 IP), seven walks and 12 strikeouts against them.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Mets are in the midst of their second road trip of the season...They are 4-6 in 2026...Last season, the Mets went 34-47 on the road.

**IN A PINCH:** The Mets have recorded an MLB leading eight RBI from their pinch-hitters this season...In 2025, the Mets recorded a total of nine RBI from their pinch-hitters...Overall this year, Mets pinch hitters are batting .364 (4-11) with two runs, one double, one home run and eight RBI...Their .364 average is the MLB lead.

**THE HUASCAR GOES TO:** Huascar Brazobán has not allowed an earned run in 11 multi-inning appearances since 2025... He has yet to allow a run over 8.1 innings this season, the seventh-most innings without allowing a run in the Majors by a relief pitcher.

**WE REMEMBER:** The New York Mets announced that the club will wear a memorial "Davey" patch on the sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2026 season...Johnson passed away on September 5, 2025 at the age of 82...He finished his Mets career with the most managerial wins in franchise history (595) and the best winning percentage (.588)...In 1986, Johnson guided the team to a franchise-record 108 regular season victories and capped the year off with a dramatic World Championship...From 1984-1990, under his helm, the Mets averaged more than 95 wins.

**THIS DAY IN 1986:** The Mets were rained out on this day in 1986... This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions New York Mets...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 World Champion Mets on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information regarding programming for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration will be available at a later date at [Mets.com/1986](https://mets.com/1986).

**LAST TIME OUT:** Allowed a career-high seven runs over a career-low 2.1 innings...Senga's previous career high runs allowed was five on three separate occasions (last: 8/31/25 vs. Miami) and his previous career low innings pitched in a start was 2.2 on June 4, 2023 vs. Toronto...Gave up a career-high-tying two home runs for the sixth time (last: 7/27/25 at San Francisco).

**SPRING TRAINING:** In three Spring outings (three starts), Senga recorded a 1.86 ERA (2 ER/9.2 IP) with 11 strikeouts...Held Spring batters to a .176 (6-34) average...Last pitched on March 19 at Houston, tossing a spring-high 4.0 innings (2R, 6H, 1BB, 4K).

**VS. CUBS/NL CENTRAL:** Today, Senga will make his third career start against the Cubs and his second in Chicago...On May 24, 2023, Senga allowed three runs and struck out six across 5.0 innings at Wrigley...Senga threw 6.0 scoreless innings and earned the win on August 7...Across 11 career starts against NL-Central opponents, Senga is 4-5 with a 2.84 ERA (20 ER/63.1 IP)

**2025 SEASON RECAP:** Senga finished last season going 7-6 with a 3.02 ERA (38 ER/60.2 IP), 55 walks and 109 strikeouts in 22 starts...Started the season going 7-3 through June 12, with a 1.47 ERA (12 ER/73.2 IP)...He had thrown at least 5.0 innings in all 13 starts and allowed three earned runs or fewer in all of those starts...Following his return from the IL, posted a 5.90 ERA (26 ER/39.0 IP) in nine starts...Allowed three or more earned runs in three consecutive games before being sent to Triple-A.

**KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST:** Senga picked up 71 of his 109 strikeouts on the ghost fork last season...Held batters to a .130 average with his ghost fork this season, which was the second-lowest opponents' batting average among any qualified pitcher throwing a split-finger pitch and the seventh-lowest opponent batting average among any qualified pitcher throwing any pitch...His 41.8% whiff rate was the fourth highest...In his rookie year (2023), Senga's "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts...The pitch had a 59.5% whiff rate and a 28.2% put away rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average.

**GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES:** Has allowed three or fewer runs in 46 of his first 54 career starts...His 46 such starts are tied with Dwight Gooden for the second-most in franchise history through a starter's first 54 career games...He had allowed three earned runs or less in 31 consecutive starts from June 23, 2023 to July 11, 2025, which tied with deGrom (from 4/16/18-4/3/19) for the second-longest such streak in franchise history...At the time, it was the longest active such streak in the majors...He trailed only Jacob deGrom's 40 starts (from 9/9/19-9/18/22).

**SENGA GENESIS:** Through Senga's first 54 career starts he has posted 336 strikeouts...His 320 strikeouts through his first 52 Major League games are the fifth-most in Mets history behind Dwight Gooden (449), Noah Syndergaard (374) Matt Harvey (373) and Jacob deGrom (358)...His 320 strikeouts are also the fifth-most among Japanese-born pitchers through their first 54 starts, trailing only Yu Darvish (446), Hideo Nomo (425) and Shohei Ohtani (379)...His career 3.00 ERA (99 ER/296.2 IP) is the eighth-best in franchise history through a player's first 54 starts with the club.

**CRUISING AT CITI:** In 29 career games at Citi Field, he has gone 12-5 with a 2.80 ERA (49 ER/157.1 IP), which is the 11th best in the history of the ballpark (min. 90.0 IP)...He has allowed just 15 home runs to 653 batters faced, recording a 0.86 HR/9.0IP ratio at home...His 11.27 K/9.0IP is the third-highest among pitchers at Citi Field behind Edwin Diaz's 15.10 K/9.0IP and Jacob deGrom's 11.52 K/9.0IP (min. 400 BF).

**2024 REWIND:** He missed nearly the first four months of the 2024 season with a right shoulder capsule strain...Returned and made one regular season start on July 26 vs. Atlanta, throwing 5.1 innings and allowing two runs on two hits with nine strikeouts and one walk before exiting with an injury...Missed the rest of the regular season with a strained left calf...He made it back for the Postseason and he made his first career Postseason start on October 5 in Game 1 of the NLDS against the Phillies...Threw 2.0 innings allowing one run, a home run in the first inning, and recorded one walk and three strikeouts...Finished the Postseason making three appearances and pitching 5.0 innings while striking out four.

**REMARKABLE ROOKIE:** During his rookie campaign in 2023, Kodai Senga recorded 202 strikeouts and became the 18th rookie pitcher in the Modern Era (Since 1900) to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Senga's 202 punch outs were the second-most by a Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden's 276 strikeouts in 1984...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsusaka (201) as the only Japanese-born rookie hurlers to reach 200 strikeouts...Senga's 12 wins were tied with Ron Darling (1984) for the seventh-most wins in a single season by a Mets rookie and was the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee (13, 2011)...His 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP) was the fifth-lowest in a single season by a Mets rookie behind only Jerry Koosman (2.08, 1968), Jon Matlack (2.32, 1972), Dwight Gooden (2.60, 1984) and Tom Seaver (2.76, 1967)...He finished seventh in NL Cy Young voting.

**HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR:** In 2023 Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver (1967) as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He was the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

**METS-JAPAN CONNECTION:** Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

- Fired 2.2 scoreless innings in relief on April 11 vs. the Athletics (2.2 IP, 2 H, 3 K)...Marked his 9th scoreless relief appearance of at least 2.0 innings since the beginning of last season...Is tied for the sixth-most such games among NL relievers during that span.
- Hasn't allowed an earned run over nine career appearances vs. Chicago-NL (11.0 IP).
- Earned his first win of the season after tossing 1.1 scoreless innings on April 5 at San Francisco (1.1 IP)...Since the start of last year, he has recorded four or more outs without allowing an earned run in 16 relief appearances, which is the eighth-most appearances among NL relievers.
- Dating back to September 20, 2025, he hasn't allowed an earned run in each of his last 11 appearances (14.2 IP).
- Made his third career Opening Day roster and his second consecutive with the Mets.
- Pitched in three games for the Dominican Republic in the World Baseball Classic...He tossed 4.0 scoreless innings and struck out seven of the 13 batters he faced.
- Appeared in three Grapefruit League games and he threw 3.0 scoreless innings...He struck out five of the 11 batters he faced during the spring.
- Last season, he made a career-high 52 appearances and finished with a 5-2 record, two saves, 12 holds, 57 strikeouts, and a 3.57 ERA (25 ER/63.0 IP).
- In 2025, he allowed just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April, and May (1.34 ERA)...His ERA through his first 25 games of the season is the 11th-best in franchise history.
