- Today: Selected from AAA-Louisville RHP Sam Benschoter (BEN-scooter, #63); recalled from Louisville LHP Sam Moll (mall, #50); optioned to Louisville LHP Joe La Sorsa & RHP Connor Phillips (post-game, 6/30); transferred the rehab assignment of INF Noelvi Marte to AAA-Louisville.
- Yesterday: Placed on the 15-day injured list, retroactive to 6/29, RHP Ian Gibaut (right shoulder impingement); recalled from AAA-Louisville LHP Joe La Sorsa (#66).

TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Is Game 2 (0-1) of a 3-game series vs Abby Murphy's Red Sox and the second game (0-1) of Cin's final road trip before the All-Star break, a 7-day/6-game excursion that includes an upcoming weekend series against the Phillies at Citizens Bank Park.
- The Reds are coming off a 4-2 homestand in which they won 2 of 3 against both the Yankees (6/23-6/25) and Padres (6/27-6/29).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds and Red Sox are meeting for the only time this season...Bos won 2 of 3 games vs Cin at Great American Ball Park in 2024.

- The Reds won 2 of 3 games here at Fenway Park in 2023...it was the first time the Reds won a series vs the Red Sox since the 1975 World Series, and the first regular season series win against a team from Boston since a 2-1 series victory vs the Braves in September 1952 (was the opening series of the Braves' final homestand in Boston).
- Bos won 8 straight games vs Cin from 6/14/08-9/24/17.
- The Reds' 2-1 win on 5/31/22 was their first victory at Fenway Park since Game 7 of the 1975 World Series.

NATIONAL LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: INF/OF Spencer Steer on Mon was named National League Player of the Week for 6/23-6/29, marking his second career weekly honor (also: 4/1-4/7, 2024) and the second by a Red in 2025 (also: Will Benson, 5/12-5/18).

- During the week, slashed .444/.448/.815 (12-for-27) with 3 homers, 8 RBI, and 5 runs in 7 games...in that time, led qualified Major Leaguers in batting average (.522), slugging percentage (.957), OPS (1.477), hits (12), and total bases (22).
- In Fri's 8-1 win vs SD, he produced his first career 3-homer game, the first by a Red since OF Jesse Winker did it on 6/6/21 at StL...the second of his 3 HR on the night marked his 150th career XBH.
- Has hit safely in 8 of his last 9 games and in 10 of his last 12g (19-for-47, .404/.408/.766, 4hr, 11rbi).
- Beginning 5/11, is slashing .304/.335/.487 (48-for-158) across 44 games, raising his batting average from .185 to .250.

DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK: Cin on Sun vs SD plated 2 runs in the 9th inning to secure its third walkoff victory of 2025 (also: 6/6 vs AZ, 6/24 vs NYY).

- Was also its first win this season in which they trailed after 8 innings...prior to Sun, hadn't won a game in which it trailed entering the 9th inning since 6/5/24 at Col (trailed 7-6, won 12-7).
- OF Will Benson delivered the win with an RBI single off Robert Suarez...marked his second career walkoff hit (also: solo HR, 6/7/23 vs LAD).
- Of Cin's 15 wins in June, 10 were in comeback fashion...those 10-such victories ranked second to only the Dodgers (14) for the most among all Major League teams during the month.

WREAKING HAVOC IN THE FIRST: The Reds have scored at least 1 run in the 1st inning 27 times this season, including Sat vs SD (1r, 3h, 1bb).

- Cin leads the majors with 63 runs in the 1st inning (Bos, 62r)...this includes the 10 runs plated in the 1st inning on 5/10 at Hou.
- The Reds have plated multiple runs in the opening frame of a game 18 times this season (last: Fri at SD), the most-such instances in MLB.
- Cin has outscored opponents 63-36 in the first inning and are slashing .269/.349/.420 with 10 home runs.

HISTORIC

Fri's 8-1 win vs SD marked the first time in the expansion era (since 1961) that any MLB team had a pitcher throw 8.0+ no-hit innings (Martinez) in the same game in which a teammate (Steer) hit 3 or more homers (Elias).

FRANCONA CLOSING IN ON 2000 WINS: Terry Francona enters tonight's game 6 wins away from reaching 2,000 as a Major League manager.

- He'd become the 13th manager to reach the 2,000-win milestone.
- Would be the second active manager in the majors with 2,000 wins (Tex' Bruce Bochy 2,212).
- Each big league skipper with 2,000 career wins, except for Bochy and Dusty Baker, are in the Hall of Fame.
- Baker (2,183) and Sparky Anderson (2,194 wins) are the only 2,000-win skippers to manage the Reds.
- Leo Durocher is the only 2,000-win manager to play for Cin (1930-33).
- Would be the fourth manager to earn his 2,000th win for a team he once played for (1987), joining Bochy (SF), Bucky Harris (Det), and John McGraw (NYG).

ELECTRICITY: Over his last 37 games dating back to 5/19, SS Elly De La Cruz is slashing .324/.405/.633 (45-for-139, 10hr, 21xbh, 37r, 19bb, 26rbi).

- Has scored at least 1 run in 49 of Cin's 85 games this season.
- Is batting .297/.382/.548 this season vs RHP (65-for-219, 13hr, 42rbi).
- Against LHP in June, slashed .338/.442/.646 (3hr).
- Beginning 6/9, vs. relief pitchers is batting .469/.541/.938 (15-for-32, 4hr, 10rbi, 11r, 20 times on base, 30tb).
- Beginning 6/13, with 2 strikes, is batting .313/.353/.531 (10-for-32, 16g).
- Is 2 HR shy of joining Eric Davis (23hr/33sb, 1987) as the only players in Reds history with at least 20 HR and 20 SB before the All-Star break.
- Swiped his 20th base of 2025 in the 4th inning of the 1-0 win on 6/10 at Cle, making him the first player in Reds history with 20 or more steals in each of his first 3 seasons in the majors (courtesy Elias).

NO ROOM FOR THE BROOM: The Reds have not been swept in any of their first 27 series this season.

- Marks their longest streak of consecutive series without being swept to open a season since 1989, when they went 30 straight series before getting broomed in a 3-game set from 7/17-7/19 vs Phi.
- Cin is the only Major League team that has yet to be swept this season.

THE FUTURE IS HERE: C Alfredo Duno and INF Sal Stewart on Mon were selected to represent the Reds organization in the 26th edition of the All-Star Futures Game, which will take place on 7/12 at Truist Park in Atlanta, GA.

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered the 7-1 loss on Wed (6/25) vs NYY (5.0ip, 6h, 4r/4er, 3bb, 9k, 1hb, 1hr, 103TP).

- His 9 strikeouts were a season-high and his most since 8/12/24 for KC at Min (9k).
- Entered the game having allowed 3 runs or fewer in 7 consecutive starts...matched the longest-such streak of his career (also: 6/6-7/7, 2021 for KC).

JUNE 20 at StL: Suffered the 6-1 loss on 6/20 at StL (6.0ip, 4h, 1r/1er, 1bb, 7k, 1hb, 102TP).

- It was his second consecutive quality start.
- Was his seventh consecutive start of allowing 3 earned runs or fewer, matching his career-best for the third time.

JUNE 14 at DET : Earned the 11-1 win on 6/14 at Det (6.0ip, 4h, 1r/1er, 3bb, 4k, 1hb, 96TP).

- It was his fifth quality start of the season and the 54th of his career.
- It marked his fifth start this season in which he didn't allow a home run...has been reached for 2 home runs total over his last 5 starts (28ip).

JUNE 8 vs AZ: Didn't factor in the decision in the 4-2 win vs AZ on 6/8 (5.0ip, 5h, 2r/2er, 3bb, 3k, 1hr, 77TP).

- When he left the game at the end of the 5th, the score was tied, 2-2.
- Was hit in the right arm by a line drive comebacker off the bat of Lourds Gurriel Jr. in the 4th inning.

JUNE 2 vs MIL: Suffered the 3-2 loss vs Mil on 6/2 (5.0ip, 4h, 3r/3er, 3bb, 4k, 1hr, 97TP).

- Gave up a 2nd-inning double to Andruw Monasterio, his first XBH allowed in 13.0ip and 52 BF.
- Threw 70 pitches through 3.0 innings.
- Threw 16 first-pitch strikes to his 21 batters.

MAY 27 at KC: Earned the 7-2 win at KC on 5/27 (7.0ip, 7h, 2r/2er, 1bb, 3k, 99TP).

- Was his first career appearance vs the Royals...was drafted by KC in the first round in 2018 and made 127 apps there from 2020-2024...has now faced all 30 teams.
- Matched a season-high with 7.0 innings.
- Retired 10 straight batters before allowing a 2-out single in the 6th inning (Drew Waters).
- Did not allow a home run for the second straight outing after giving up at least 1 HR in all 7 of his previous starts.
- Hasn't given up an XBH in any of his last 12.0ip (50 BF, last: Pit's Kiner-Falefa double in 1st inning on 5/21).

LAST TIME OUT: Earned the 8-1 win on Fri (6/27) vs SD...carried a no-hitter into the 9th inning before allowing a double to the inning's second batter, **Eliás Díaz** (8.0+ip, 1h, 1r/1er, 2bb, 6k, 112TP).

- The 8-inning no-hit bid marked the longest of his career.
- Was the longest no-hit bid by a Reds pitcher since LHP Wade Miley's no-hitter on 5/7/21 at Cle and the longest by a Reds pitcher at Great American Ball Park since RHP Homer Bailey's no-hitter on 7/2/13 vs SF.
- Pitched into the 9th inning for the first time in his career, as a starter.
- Matched his career-high with 8.0 inning pitched (also: 9/27/24 at Chc).

WITH 2 STRIKES: Enters tonight's game having not allowed a hit to any of the last 25 batters with which he's reached 2 strikes...the last 2-strike batter to whom he allowed a hit was StL's Thomas Saggese in the 2nd inning on 6/20.

ANSWERS THE CALL: Since his 2020 debut his 140 starts rank T14th in the majors while his 771.0 innings rank 17th.

PERSONAL: Played collegiately at the University of Florida where he was named 2018 SEC Pitcher of the Year and winner of the Dick Howser Trophy...was named *Baseball America* College Player of the Year in 2018 and a finalist for the Golden Spikes Award...helped lead the Gators to the school's first NCAA College World Series championship in 2017...struck out 12 vs LSU in Game One of the CWS finals, the most strikeouts in the championship round since at least 2003...was teammates at Florida with another 2018 first-round pick, Jonathan India, for whom he was traded in 2024...Graduated from Eustis High School (FL), the same school attended by 1972 Nobel Prize winner John Robert Schrieffer, former NASA astronaut David Walker, and former Reds catcher Chris Okey.
