IDNIGHT'S STARTING PTICHER: RHP GERRTI COLE (13-4, 2.81 ERA) RHP Gerrit Cole will make his 32nd start of the season in tonight's series finale vs. Toronto...the 33-year-old will start on extended five days' rest due to Monday's team off day...last started on Friday at Pittsburgh and did not record a decision in the Yankees' 7-5 win despite allowing 2R/ER in 5.0IP (6H, 3BB, 4K, 0HR)...**is** 13-4 with a 2.81 ERA (192.0IP, 60ER) and 208K in 31 starts this season...owns the lowest ERA in the American League and the second-lowest in the Majors. trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell (2.33)... has allowed 2R-or-fewer in 24 of his 31 starts this season, tied with San Diego's Blake Snell for the most such starts in the Majors</u>...started for the American League in the 93rd Midsummer Classic on 7/11 and retired all 3BF, becoming the 12th pitcher in franchise history (20th time) to start an All-Star Game...was named to his sixth career All-Star team via the player ballot...reached 10 years of Major League service on 5/29... recorded his 2,000th career strikeout on 5/23 vs. Baltimore (Jorge Mateo swinging), becoming the third-fastest pitcher in Major League history to reach the milestone (in terms of games and innings pitched)...his Major League-leading 257K last season were the most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season in franchise history, surpassing Ron Guidry's previous record of 248K in 1978... the six-time All-Star (2015, '18-19, '21-23) has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting five times (second in 2021, fourth in 2020, second in 2019, fifth in 2018, fourth in 2015)...his career 10.45 K/9.0IP ratio (2.138K/1,842.0IP) is the eighth-highest in Major League history (min. 1,000.0IP)...in 106 starts with the Yankees, is 49-23 with a 3.14 ERA (647.0IP, 226ER) and 802K....since 2018, leads the Majors in wins (84), strikeouts (1,404), and innings pitched (1,059.2), ranks second in K/9.0IP (11.92), tied for second in WAR among pitchers (27.6 - FanGraphs), third in winning percentage (.718, min. 6

LAST START: Did not record a decision despite allowing just 2R/ER in 5.0IP on Friday at Pittsburgh (6H, 3BB, 4K, 0HR)...marked his first start at PNC Park as an opposing pitcher...allowed a run in the first inning on a sac fly to Jack Suwinski and a run in the second inning on an RBI single to Bryan Reynolds.
