RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals continue their initial road trip of the season tonight with the middle game of a three-game series against the Washington Nationals at Nationals Park in Washington D.C... the Cardinals dropped a 9-6 decision in last night's series opener as the Nationals rallied with 6 runs in their 8th, including a trio of homers...the loss evened the Cardinals season mark at 5-5 and they are 1-3 on the current road trip (1-2 at DET, 0-1 at WSH)...the Cardinals went 4-2 on their opening homestand, winning series against the Rays and Mets.

NATIONAL NEWS: Since relocating from Montreal to the Nation's Capitol and re-branding as the Nationals in 2005, the Cardinals .592 win pct. (77-53) against "Natitude" is the 2nd-highest in MLB among annual opponents behind the Dodgers (80-44, .645).

TRADE NEWS: The Cardinals and Baltimore Orioles completed a trade earlier today with St. Louis acquiring minor league INF/OF **Brayden Smith** in exchange for LHP **Nick Raquet**, who was designated for assignment on Sunday...Smith, 22, was originally selected by the Baltimore Orioles in the 13th round of the 2025 MLB Draft out of Oklahoma State University. The 6-0, 190-pound left-handed hitting Smith has played at Delmarva (A) and Frederick (A+) to begin his professional career.

NO QUIT: Four of the Cardinals five wins this season have been in games during which they came back from a deficit, including a comeback win of 6 runs vs. Tampa Bay on Opening Day.

KEEP IT ROLLING: Rookie **JJ Wetherholt** has reached base safely in each of his first 9 games started, including a single & two walks last night... he's the 1st Cardinals LHB rookie to begin his career with a games started on-base streak of 9 games or more since **John Rodriguez**, who did so in 17-straight starts to open his career with the Cardinals in 2005. Wetherholt, who has scored runs in 7 of his 9 starts, is tied with the White Sox **Munetaka Murakami** for the MLB lead among all rookies with 8 runs scored.

GOOD EYE GUY: With a successful ABS batter challenge and catcher challenge last night, **Ivan Herrera** improved to 4-0 in his ABS challenges as a batter and 1-1 as a catcher...he leads all MLB batters with 4 successful challenges.

CROOKED NUMBERS: Of the 46 runs scored by the Cardinals this season, 36 have come duing multi-run innings...the Cardinals have yet to score runs in more than three innings in any of their first 10 games.

BIG FLY GUY: With his 1st career grand slam and a career-high 5 RBI on Saturday at Detroit, **Jordan Walker** hit the longest HR (459 ft) by a Cardinal since **Pedro Pagés'** 462 ft blast against the Dodgers on 8/16/24...Walker's slam matched **Miguel Cabrera** for the 8th longest HR in the history (2000-26) of Comerica Park (Sarah Langs).

TOP GUN: **Jordan Walker** nailed Javier Baez at the plate in 3rd inning on Friday with his 100.6 MPH strike from RF - his 2nd throw of 100+ MPH this season to lead all MLB outfielders, including an MLB-best 102.0 MPH throw on 3/29 vs. TB; CF **Oniel Cruz** of PIT has a 101.1 MPH throw...Jordan recorded his 2nd OF assist of the series & season in Saturday's game.

YOUTH MOVEMENT: According to *Baseball America*, the Cardinals entered the 2026 season with the youngest Opening Day roster across Major League Baseball with an average age of 27.3 and the Nationals roster was the youngest (25.6).

Alec Burleson made his MLB debut vs. the Nationals (Sept. 8, 2022 at Busch).

JJ Wetherholt was born in Baltimore, Md., and grew up a fan of the Baltimore Ravens.

George Soriano was acquired by St. Louis from Washington in exchange for Andre Granillo on Feb. 10, 2026 after the Nationals claimed Soriano off waivers from Atlanta on Jan. 30, 2026.

Andre Granillo pitched in 14 games for St. Louis in 2025...selected by St. Louis in the 14th round of the 2021 MLB Draft.

Miles Mikolas made a team-high 203 starts (204 app.) for the Cardinals from 2018-25 before he signed with the Nationals as a free agent on Feb. 11, 2026.

Drew Millas was born in Swansea, Ill...graduated from Belleville East (Ill.) High School...played college baseball at Missouri State Univ. (2017-19).

Hunter Dobbins and **Clayton Beeter** were teammates at Texas Tech from 2019-20.

Cardinals President of Baseball Operations **Chaim Bloom** worked with Nationals President of Baseball Operations **Paul Toboni**, as well as Nationals Assistant GMs **Justin Horowitz** and **Devin Pearson**, and Special Assistant to the President of Baseball Operations **Andrew Wright**, in the Boston Red Sox front office while Bloom was the Chief Baseball Officer for four seasons from 2020-23... Toboni served as director of amateur scouting, and VP of amateur scouting and player development (2020-23)...Horowitz was a special assistant in amateur scouting...Pearson was assistant director of amateur scouting (2020-22) and director of amateur scouting (2022-23), and Wright was the minor league field coordinator (2023).

Nationals hitting coach **Matt Borgschulte** was a coach for the 2017 Florida State League co-champion Palm Beach Cardinals...played college baseball at Drury University in Springfield, Mo., from 2012-13.

Cardinals broadcaster **Ricky Horton** played college baseball at the Univ. of Virginia (1978-80).

Nationals Assistant Hitting Coach/Assistant Director of Hitting **Andrew Aydt** played baseball at McKendree University in Lebanon, Ill., from 2017-19.

Nationals Social Media Marketing Dir. **Matt Turer** previously worked for the Springfield Cardinals (AA).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Vince Coleman** made his Major League debut vs. Montreal (Apr. 18, 1985 at Busch II).

Nationals broadcaster **Charlie Slowes** worked three years at KMOX in St. Louis (1984-86).

Nationals.TV reporter **Alexa Datt** covered the Cardinals as a studio host and reporter for Bally/FanDuel Sports Midwest from 2022-25.

Nationals Communications Manager **Daniel Kurish** was born in St. Louis.

Cardinals Communications Gameday Associate **Sean Rocca** was born and raised in Norfolk, Va., and often attended Cardinals-Nationals games at Nationals Park.

TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Cardinals 26-year-old Opening Day southpaw starting pitcher makes his team-leading 3rd start of the season tonight.
- Ranks 11th among National League pitchers in ERA (1.64).
- Has pitched 5.0+ innings allowing one run or less in his first two starts of a season, first Cardinals pitcher since **Sonny Gray** (4/9-15/24) and first left-hander since **Jordan Montgomery** (8/6-22/22 - 4 starts).
- Received one run of support in both starts. Last Cardinals win when he received one or less run of support was 8/6/25 at LAD (5-3 STL win).
- Making his 123rd career Major League appearance and his 56th career start.
- Was 2-7 on the road last season. Last road win recorded was at CLE (6/29/25). Allowed 11 of 19 HR in road starts in 2025.
- The Cardinals are 14-13 in his 27 career starts at Busch Stadium, where he has gone 10-9 with a 3.68 ERA (137.0 IP/55 ER) with 10 quality starts.

LAST TIME OUT (Tuesday, March 31 vs. New York-NL): ND, W, 2-1; 6.0 IP, 3 H, 1 R, 1 ER, HR, 1 BB, 2 SO, 76 pitches).

2026 HIGHLIGHTS:

- Received a no decision on Opening Day vs. TB (3/26) despite pitching 5.0 innings and allowing just one run. Cardinals rallied for a 9-7 win (exited at 1-1).
- Made his 1st career Opening Day start last vs. TB (3/26), becoming the 1st Cardinals lefty to start on Opening Day since **Donovan Osborne** (4/5/99) vs. MIL - the same year that he was born. He became one of just 16 LHP's to make the Opening Day start for the Cardinals since 1901 (MLB).
- Held the Mets to one run in his second start, a day after **Andre Pallante** and company shut out New York. Retired the first 12 Mets batters (first time a Cardinals pitcher vs. NYM since 1968) and carried a no-hitter through 4.2 innings, longest of his career.
- Has allowed two hits to left-handed batters (**Juan Soto**, **Jonathan Aranda**), both home runs (2-8, .250). Right-handers batting .229 (8-35) with one extra base hit (double, **Mark Vientos**-NYM)

2025 HIGHLIGHTS:

CAREER YEAR: Joined the starting rotation in a full-time capacity and established career highs in wins (8), decisions (20), starts (29), quality starts (11), strikeouts (122), and innings pitched (151.2). Libby's 151.2 innings surpassed his 149.2 combined in 2022 between St. Louis (34.2 IP) and AAA-Memphis (115.0 IP), while his eight wins matched his Major League combined total from his first three seasons (2022-24).

ST. LOUIS SOUTHPAWS: Libby's 29 starts in 2025 were the most by a St. Louis southpaw since **Jaime Garcia** (32 in 2011), and the most by any Cardinals left-hander age 25 or younger since the same 24-year-old Garcia in 2011.

SOUTHPAW SUCCESS: Became the youngest Cardinals lefty to win eight games since 23-year-old **Jaime Garcia** (13 wins in 2010), while Libby's eight victories were the most by any Cardinals left-hander since Garcia's 10 wins in 2016.

LEFT IS RIGHT: Led all Major League left-handers age 25 or younger in strikeouts (122), co-led in quality starts (11), and ranked 2nd in wins (8) and starts (29).

THREE'S COMPANY: Limited his opposition to three runs or fewer in 21-of-29 starts, and two runs or fewer in eight consecutive from April 13-May 24, the longest streak by a Cardinal since **Jack Flaherty** ran off nine straight (July 7-Aug. 23, 2019). Worked 6.0 innings or more in 12 starts (11 quality).

LIMITING LEFTIES: Over his initial 13 starts of the season, held opposing left-handed batters to a .190/.254/.207 slash line (11-58) with one extra-base hit.

CAREER:

- Chose to switch to uniform No. 32 prior to 2026 season in honor of Hall of Fame left-handed pitcher **Sandy Koufax**, whom he grew up admiring.
- Was acquired by the Cardinals from the Rays in a four-player trade in 2020, with a compensation pick that netted the Cardinals RHP **Tink Hence**.
- Is a career 13-21 with a 4.81 ERA (258.0 IP) in his 55 career starts opposed to 3-3 with a 3.89 ERA (81.0 IP) in 67 career relief appearances.
- Has limited left-handed batters to a .237/.297/.349 (80-338) with a .646 OPS average over his Major League career.
- 2021 Cardinals Minor League Pitcher of the Year, his first season of play in the Cardinals organization.

LIBERATORE vs. WASHINGTON:

- Making his 1st career start and 4th appearances vs. the Nationals. All three previous appearances were in 2024.
- Recorded two scoreless outs in his first appearance (7/5 at WSH) before getting hit for two runs (7/6 at WSH) and four runs (7/24 at STL).
- Allowed a home run to **Keibert Ruiz** (7/24), his only home run allowed to his 21 career Nationals batters faced.
- Threw a 2024 season-high 49 pitches as a reliever vs. WSH on July 6, 2024.
