**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets lost 6-4 on Sunday vs. the Yankees at Citi Field...The loss snapped a four-game losing streak...New York finished the homestand 4-2...The Mets hit the road for the final time before the All-Star break, heading to Baltimore (three games) and Kansas City (three games).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York is 19-25 on the road this year...The .432 winning percentage is the eighth-worst in the majors.

INTERLEAGUE: The Mets are 13-14 in Interleague play this season as opposed

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: On Sunday, Major Leage Baseball announced that first baseman Pete Alonso and RHP Edwin Díaz will join starting shortstop Francisco Lindor on the National League All-Star team...The 95th All-Star Game will take place on Tuesday, July 15 in Atlanta...Alonso was named to the All-Star team for the fifth time in his career, the most by any first baseman in team history - two more than Keith Hernandez..Alonso becomes the sixth player in franchise history to be named to five or more All-Star teams, joining Tom Seaver (nine), David Wright (seven), Mike Piazza (seven), Darryl Strawberry (seven) and Carlos Beltrán (five)...Díaz was named to an All-Star team for the third time in his career and second as a member of the Mets (also in 2022)...He was an American League All-Star in 2018 with Seattle...Lindor was announced as the National League starting shortstop on July 2. Lindor will make his first trip to the Midsummer Classic as a member of the Mets and his fifth overall after making four straight American League All-Star teams with Cleveland from 2016-19.

PITCHING IN: On Sunday, RHP Rico Garcia became the 35th different pitcher the Mets have used this season which is the most pitchers that any team in the majors has used this year.

IF I COULD WALK 500 MILES: Brandon Nimmo drew his 500th career walk on Sunday... He is the fifth Met to reach the milestone...His 500 walks only trail David Wright (762), Darryl Strawberry (580), Bud Harelson (573) and Howard Johnson (556).

**BRANDON BASHES SLAMS**: Brandon Nimmo has three grand slams this year, tying a franchise record with John Milner (1976), Robin Ventura (1999), Mike Piazza (2000) and Carlos Beltrán (2006)...Joins Milner (6/26-7/1/76), Ventura (5/20/99 GI and G2) and Beltrán (7/16-18/06) as the only Mets to hit two grand slams in a span of four or fewer games...Courtesy of *Elias...*Joins Eugenio Suárez as the only player in the majors with three grand slams this

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo's 18 home runs are his most prior to the All-Star Break in any season...Over the last 38 games, Nimmo is batting .3 (45-146) with 23 runs, seven doubles, 10 homers, 25 RBI, 11 walks, eight steals and a .931 OPS...Nimmo scored his 552nd career run on Juan Soto's home run on Friday...He passed Carlos Beltrán for sole possession for place eighth place in franchise history...Five of Nimmo's last seven hits have gone for extra-bases

**ONLY JUAN:** Since May 30. Juan Soto is tied for first in the majors with 31 runs scored, second with a 1.173 OPS, .470 OPS, fourth with a .703 slugging percentage and tied for third with 13 homers during that span.

JUAN-DERFUL: Overall, Soto leads the majors with 72 walks, leads the NL in times on base (157), is second in the NL with a .403 OBP and third with 65 runs scored, and seventh in the NL with a .904 OPS and 21 homers.

20 FOR THE POLAR BEAR: Pete Alonso hit his 20th home run on Saturday vs. the Yankees...It was the sixth time in his career he's had 20 or more homers in a season, tying Mike Piazza and David Wright for the second-most such seasons in franchise history...Darryl Strawberry is first with eight seasons with 20 or more homes.

**DYNAMITC DUOS:** Juan Soto and Pete Alonso became the third pair of teammates to each reach the 20-home run plateau through the team's first 90 games...They joined David Wright, Carlos Delgado and Carlos Beltrán in 2006 and Darryl Strawberry and Howard Johnson in 1987.

PEAK PETE PERFORMANCE: Alonso is second in the majors with 25 doubles, tied for eighth in the NL with 20 homers, eighth with a .380 OBP and ninth with a .543 slugging percentage

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: According to Elias, Francisco Lindor has hit 257 home runs and stolen 197 bases as a shortstop...Only two players in major league history had 200/200 (HR/SB) as a shortstop  $\dot{\bar{}}$  Derek Jeter (255 HR, 351 SB) and Jimmy Rollins (229 HR, 469 SB).

**KEEPIN' IT 100:** Francisco Lindor picked up his 100th stolen base as a Met on Saturday becoming the 12th player in franchise history to reach the milestone... He is the sixth player to accumulate 100+ home runs and 100+ stolen bases as  $a\,Met...The\,others\,are\,Darryl\,Strawberry, Howard\,Johnson,\,Carlos\,Beltr\'an,\,David$ Wright and José Reyes...He is also one stolen base away from 200 in his career.

**THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT:** Congrats to RHP Jonah Tong and OF Carson Benge have been selected to participate in the 2025 All Star Futures Game on Saturday, July 12 at Truist Park in Atlanta...Tong, the Mets #4 prospect and #92 prospect in MLB Pipeline's Top 100 prospects leads all of minor league baseball with 115 strikeouts and is second in the minors with a 1.73 ERA in 14 starts... He is also second in MiLB and first in all of Double-A with a .137 opponent's batting average, while his strikeout percentage (K%) of 40.5% is second in all of MiLB...Tong was selected by the Mets in the seventh round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Georgia Premier Academy...Benge, the Mets #3 prospect and #81 prospect in MLB Pipeline's Top 100, was promoted to Binghamton on June 23 after starting the year with High-A Brooklyn...Benge slashed .302/.417/.480 with an .897 OPS in 60 games with the Cyclones...He was selected by the Mets with the 19th overall pick in the 2024 draft out of Oklahoma State

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has recorded 18 saves in 19 chances...The one blown save in LA on June 2, Díaz picked up the win as the Mets rallied for a 4-3 win in 10 innings...He is tied for fourth in the NL and tied for ninth in the majors with 18 saves...He has not allowed a run in 23 of his last 24 games dating back to April 26 with 36 strikeouts covering 24.0 innings.

JEFF McHITS: Is batting .283 (32-113) with 14 runs scored, five doubles, seven homers. 19 RBI and a .859 OPS over his last 32 games dating to May 27.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Allowed two runs over 5.1 innings in the Mets' 7-2 loss vs. Milwaukee on July 2 (G1)...Allowed a lead-off homer to Sal Frelick and then tossed 4.1 scoreless innings...He left the game with one on in the sixth; the runner eventually scored...Struck out Christian Yelich in the first inning, his sole strikeout was a season low...Has allowed 14 walks over his last three starts compared to two walks in his three prior starts...Has allowed four hits or fewer in each of his last four starts, his longest such streak of the season.

WHAT UP HOLMES?: Holmes is one of eight pitchers in franchise history to win eight or more games and strike out 75 or more batters, while sporting a sub-3.00 ERA in their first 17 games with the franchise...The others are Dwight Gooden, Al Leiter, Pedro Martínez, Steven Matz, Max Scherzer, Tom Seaver and Frank Viola...Since 2015, Holmes is just one of four Mets pitchers to sport a sub-3.00 ERA in his first 17 career starts with the club...The others are Matz, Taijuan Walker and Scherzer.

GOOD EVENING BALTIMORE: Tonight, Holmes will face the Baltimore Orioles for the 23rd time in his career, first time as a starter...Through his first 22 career outings against the Orioles, Holmes has pitched to a 1.11 ERA (3 ER/24.1 IP), a 0.82 WHIP and has held Baltimore batters to a .189 average (17-90)...His ERA and WHIP against Baltimore are both his second-best marks against any opponent for his career, while his opponent batting average against Baltimore is his fifth-best mark against any club (min 10.0 IP)...Additionally, Holmes has an 11.84 SO/9 (34 SO/24.1 IP) rate against Baltimore, his second-highest mark against any opponent for his career (min. 10.0 IP)...Holmes did not allow an earned run in his first 17 career games (20.0 IP) and has yet to allow an earned run in 10 career games (12.2 IP) at Oriole Park at Camden Yards.

**THE GAME OF RISP:** This season, Holmes has held opposing batters to a .111 (7-62) average with runners in scoring position, tied for the fourth-best mark in the majors trailing only Eduard Bazardo, Scott Barlow and teammate Kodai Senga (min. 50 batters faced w/RISP)...Out of the seven hits Holmes has allowed this season with runners in scoring position, only one has gone for extra bases...He is one of 19 pitchers in the majors to allow one or zero extra-base hits with runners in scoring position (min. 50 batters faced w/RISP).

**STAYING GROUNDED:** Since 2019, Holmes' 64.2% groundball rate is the third-highest mark in the majors during that span behind Aaron Bummer's 66.3% clip and Andre Pallante's 65.7% rate (min. 1000 BF)...In each of the last four seasons, Holmes' groundball rate has ranked in the top five in the majors, including a league-leading 77.0% mark in 2022 (min. 250 BF each season).

**ALLOWING HOLMES RUNS:** Over his last 10 starts, Holmes has allowed 11 home runs...In his first seven starts of the season, Holmes did not allow a homer and became the sixth pitcher in franchise history to not allow a home run through their first seven starts with the team...Holmes allowed two home runs in three of his four starts from May 14 - June 1 after he had never surrendered multiple home runs in his first 319 career Major League games...At the time, it was the fifth-longest active such streak by a pitcher to begin their Major League career.

**10 K CLAY:** On April 8 vs. Miami, Holmes made his Mets Citi Field debut...The right-hander allowed four runs over 5.1 innings, issued three walks and struck out a career-high 10 batters...Holmes became the fifth Met all-time to record 10 or more strikeouts in their home pitching debut joining Dennis Ribant (10 K on 8/17/1964 vs. PIT), Dick Selma (13 K on 9/12/65 vs. HOU), Aaron Harang (10 K on 9/12/13 vs. WAS) and Max Scherzer (10K on 4/19/22-G2 vs. SF)...Courtesy of *Elias*...Holmes struck out five straight batters starting at his final batter of the third inning until the first batter he faced in the fifth...His 5.1 innings were the second-most he has ever thrown in an outing behind his 6.0 innings pitched in his second career big league start on July 14, 2018 with Pittsburgh.

**ROAD IMPROVEMENT:** In 160 road outings, Holmes has pitched to a 4.11 ERA (93 ER/203.2 IP)...In 100 road games since 2022, Holmes has posted a 2.72 ERA (41 ER/135.2 IP), a 4.16 earned run average improvement from his first 56 career road games...Since 2022, Holmes ranks 11th in the majors in road ERA (min. 100.0 IP).

**NEW ROLE WHO DIS:** In his new role as a starting pitcher, Holmes has established a career-high 93.1 innings pitched and has earned a career-high-tying eight wins...He is two strikeouts away from matching his career high (78, 2021)...Holmes started for the Mets on Opening Day (3/27 at HOU) in just his fifth career major league start...The first four starts of Holmes' career came in his first big league season, 2018 with Pittsburgh...Holmes is 9-6 with a 3.66 ERA (44 ER/108.1 IP) in 21 career starts...He is just the 10th pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to start Opening Day having made four or fewer career starts prior, joining Marty Pattin (4, 1969), Tom Hall, (4, 1969), Fernando Valenzuela

LET'S TAKE A LOOK BACK AT LAST SEASON: In 2024, Holmes made 67 relief appearances with the Yankees and pitched to a 3.14 ERA (22 ER/63.0 IP)...His career-high 30 saves ranked fourth in the American League and eighth in the majors...In his final outing of 2024, September 29 vs. Pittsburgh, Holmes locked up his 74th career save and moved into a tie with John Wetteland for seventh-most in Yankees history (since saves became an official stat in 1969)...Did not allow an earned run in his first 20 games of the season from March 28 - May 19, marking the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history, trailing only Dellin Betances' season-opening 26-game streak in 2015 (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...His 20.0IP over that span were the most by any major league reliever who had not allowed an earned run during that stretch...Also did not allow an earned run in 23 games from September 25, 2023 - May 19, 2024, the second-longest streak of his career, trailing only a 29-game stretch from April 9 - June 18, 2022...Did not allow an earned run in 29 of his first 30 appearances of the season from March 28 - June 9, going 1-1 with 19 saves and a 1.23 ERA (4 ER/29.1 IP) over that stretch...His 19 saves were tied with Cleveland's Emmanuel Clase (19) for the second-most over that span, trailing only St. Louis' Ryan Helsley (21)...Allowed 14 runs (10 ER) in 14 games from June 13 - July 30... Was named to his second career All-Star team (also: 2022)... Over his final 22 appearances of the year, held opponents to a .188 (12-64) average and was unscored upon in 17 of those appearances... Appeared in 13 Postseason games and went 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA (3 ER/12.0 IP) and 12 strikeouts...Pitched in the Yankees first eight Postseason games...Became the fifth pitcher in major league history to appear in each of their club's first eight postseason games, joining Tyler Matzek (2021 with Atlanta), Greg Holland (2014 with Kansas City), Wade Davis (2014 with Kansas City) and Jesse Orosco (1996 with Baltimore)...Became the 11th relief pitcher in major league history with three or more wins in a single Postseason and the third Yankee to accomplish the feat (also: Sparky Lyle, 1977 and Mike Stanton, 2000).

REELIN' IN THE YEARS: Holmes was selected by Pittsburgh in the ninth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Slocomb High School (AL)...He was signed by Pirates scout Darren Mazeroski, the son of Hall of Famer Bill Mazeroski...The 6-5, 245-pounder made his major league debut on April 6, 2018 with Pittsburgh vs. Cincinnati and appeared in 91 career games with the Pirates from 2018-2021...Was acquired by the Yankees on June 26, 2021, in exchange for INF Hoy Park and INF Diego Castillo...Established career highs in games (69), innings (70.0 IP), wins (8) and strikeouts (77) during the 2021 season...Became the Yankees closer in 2022 and recorded 74 saves from 2022-2024, the third-most in the AL and the 11th-most in the majors during that span...Earned a career-high 30 saves in 2024 and became the 11th pitcher in Yankees franchise history to record 30+ saves in a season...Is a two-time American League All-Star (2022, 2024) and was twice named American League Relief Pitcher of the Month (May 2022, Sept./Oct. 2023)...Over 16 career Postseason appearances, is 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA (3 ER/20.0 IP), a 0.90 WHIP and a .172 (11-64) batting average.
