METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Royals, 16-12, last night at Citi Field...Their 16 runs allowed last night were the most in a game since August 12, 2023 (G1), when they allowed 21 to Atlanta at Citi Field...Their 19 hits allowed were the most they allowed in a game since they allowed 22 to Atlanta on August 12, 2023 (G1)...It marked the first time New York scored double-digit runs in a game and lost since June 8, 2023 at Atlanta (10-13)...It was the first time the Mets scored double-digit runs and lost at home since April 30, 1994, when they fell, 12-10, against Los Angeles-NL...Their 12 runs scored last night tied a franchise record for the most runs scored in a loss (also: 5/24/22 at San Francisco, 12-13)...The Mets are in the midst of their final homestand before the All-Star break, a six-game homestand (0-1) against the Kansas City Royals (0-1) and Boston Red Sox (three games).

AMF LEGACY AWARD: The Amazin' Mets Foundation, the philanthropic arm of the New York Mets led by Foundation President and Mets Owner Alex Cohen, will award the fourth annual Amazin' Mets Foundation Legacy Award to Kelsie Whitmore...The Award celebrates the people and organizations in the baseball community that are making a difference and driving impactful change, on and off the field...As a pitcher who has competed for USA Baseball's Women's National Team and in professional baseball, Whitmore has spent her career challenging expectations, expanding representation, and helping create a more visible pathway for girls and women in the sport...She was the first overall pick in the Women's Pro Baseball League's (WPBL) inaugural draft in 2025, selected by San Francisco...She joins a distinguished group of AMF Legacy Award honorees that includes Maybelle Blair, the Louisville Slugger Warriors Amputee Baseball Team and Sarah Langs.

MILITARY APPRECIATION NIGHT: In honor of Military Appreciation Night, the Citi Field scoreboard will highlight a veteran along with the headshot of each starting Mets player...In addition, the first 15,000 fans through the gates will receive a Mets Camo Trucker Hat, presented by Tunnel to Towers Foundation.

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to tonight's game, the Mets announced the following roster moves - RHP Xzavion Curry (#53) has been selected to the Major League Roster...RHP Tobias Myers has been recalled from Triple-A Syracuse...RHP Austin Warren has been placed on the 15-Day IL with right forearm soreness...RHP Matt Seelinger was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse.

DO NOT CONNECT FOUR: The Mets have allowed 45 runs over their last four games, the second-most in franchise history over any four-game span (most: 49, 9/10-14/17).

A.J. IN STYLE: A.J. Ewing went 4-4 with one HR, three RBI, four runs, one walk and a steal last night...Five of his six career home runs have come at home where he has posted a .310/.406/.552 slashline with 10 extra-base hits, 16 RBI and a .958 OPS at Citi Field...Over his last 22 games since June 14, has a .311/.400/.568 slashline with five home runs, four doubles, 16 RBI, 12 runs and a .968 OPS...Last night, he became one of eight players in the majors this season to reach base four or more times, record an extra-base hit and a stolen base in the same game on multiple occasions.

FOR SCORE: A.J. Ewing and Carson Benge are the first pair of Mets rookie teammates to record four or more hits in a game over the course of the same season since Justin Turner and Lucas Duda in 2011...Ewing became the ninth Mets rookie ever and the first since Michael Conforto (7/25/15) to score four runs in a game.

7 FOR 7: Last night, Brett Baty extended his hitting streak to seven games with a double in the second inning...He is one game shy of matching the longest hitting streak of his career (also: 7/18-26/25 and 5/9-18/26)...He's batting .308 (8-26) with four runs, four doubles, two RBI, one walk and a .772 OPS during the hitting streak.

HOW NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Major League Baseball announced that outfielder Juan Soto was named to the National League All-Star team...The 96th All-Star Game will take place on Tuesday, July 14 in Philadelphia...Soto was selected by the fans and will make his second career All-Star starting nod...He also started the 2024 All-Star Game for the AL...Soto was named to his fifth overall All-Star team and first as a member of the Mets.

20/20 VISION: Soto has reached 20 home runs prior to the All-Star Break for the fourth time in his career (also: 2022, 2024, 2025)...He joins Pete Alonso (4 times), Darryl Strawberry (3 times), Howard Johnson and Dave Kingman as the only Mets to hit 20 or more home runs before the All-Star Break on multiple occasions...Joins Matt Olson and Kyle Schwarber as the only players in the majors to have eight seasons of 20+ home runs since 2018.

ROYALS-METS NOTES: The Mets are hosting the Royals at Citi Field for the first time since April 12-14, 2024.

RED SOTO CUPS: Soto is 7-19 over his last five games with four runs, three homers, 10 RBI, five walks, a steal, a .500 OBP, an .842 SLG and a 1.342 OPS...Over his last 46 games since May 14, has a .321/.442/.654 with 16 home runs, 38 RBI, 31 runs, 35 walks and a 1.096 OPS...His 16 home runs are tied for the second-most in the majors during that span.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has 264 career home runs...That is the 11th-most in MLB history prior to turning 28...Giancarlo Stanton's next with 267...His 264 homers are 24th among active players...It is 21st all-time amongst players born in the Dominican Republic...George Bell is next with 265.

BO KNOWS: Bo Bichette recorded his 1,000th career hit with a single in the first inning last night...He is one of five players to record 1,000 or more hits since his Major League debut, July 29, 2019...The others are Freddie Freeman, Trea Turner, Luis Arraez and Vladimir Guerrero Jr...Bichette has reached base safely in 14 of his last 15 games, batting .317 (19-60) in that span with nine runs, three doubles, two homers, eight RBI, four walks, a .364 OBP and a .467 SLG...Over his last 31 games since June 3, he has a .346/.368/.543 slashline with 20 runs, eight doubles, one triple, five homers, 22 RBI with a .911 OPS.

THE BENGE: Carson Benge reached on an infield single in the first...Benge, Ewing and Bichette around to score on the play after the Royals committed three throwing errors...It marked only the second instance in the last 10 years of a team having committed three errors on a single play (also: 9/14/25, Miami vs. Detroit)...Courtesy of Elias...He laced an RBI single in the eighth...Reached base four times in a game for the third time this season (also: 5/18 at Washington and 6/7 at San Diego)...His 71 hits since May 3 are tied for the second-most in the majors.

DREAM WEAVER: Luke Weaver allowed an unearned run in the 10th inning of last night's contest...Weaver ranks seventh amongst relievers in the National League in ERA (1.89) and is 20th with 42 strikeouts.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets fell to the Reds, 5-4, in 10-innings...New York went ahead 3-0, but allowed two in the ninth and one in the 10th to fall 5-4...Ron Darling made the start and allowed two runs (one earned) on six hits with two walks and six strikeouts over 7.0 innings...Lenny Dykstra hit his third homer in the defeat...The team moved to 55-23 on the season...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration is available at Mets.com/1986.

LAST TIME OUT: Tossed 4.0 innings on July 3 against Atlanta (4.0 IP, 2 H, 3 ER, 4 BB, 7 K, 2 HR) and allowed three earned runs while recording strikeouts...Allowed a pair of home runs and has given up six homers in his last three starts...He only allowed one home run over his first eight starts of the season and hadn't allowed a home run in each of his previous six starts dating back to May 7...He recorded six or more strikeouts for the sixth time this season.

FOUR IS THE MAGIC NUMBER: Through 20 career Major League starts, Christian Scott has allowed four or fewer runs in each of them...Scott is the only starting pitcher in franchise history to allow four or fewer runs in his first 20 Major League games...Three other Mets starters allowed four or fewer runs in 19 of their first 20 Major League games: Matt Harvey, Kodai Senga and Zack Wheeler...Scott is only the ninth starter in Major League history to allow four or fewer runs in each of their first 20 career outings.

VS. ROYALS: Will face Kansas City for the first time in his career tonight...Lane Thomas is the only Royal with previous at-bats against Scott (0-3).

NO BIG FLY ZONE: Prior to his previous three starts, Scott had only allowed one home run on the season...From his season debut, April 23 - June 10, Scott was one of eight pitchers in the majors to log 30.0 innings and allow one or zero home runs...Across nine starts (47.1 IP) in 2024, Scott allowed eight home runs.

ADD A W TO HIS LEDGER: Scott has earned a win in two of his last five starts...Scott's career-opening streak of 15 games without a win was the second-longest such streak by a starter (no relief appearances during span) behind Liam Hendriks' 17 straight career-opening winless streak from 2010-2011.

2024 SEASON RECAP: Scott finished his rookie season going 0-3 with a 4.56 ERA (24 ER/47.1 IP), adding 39 strikeouts and 12 walks before being placed on the IL with a sprained UCL in his right elbow...Made his MLB debut on May 4 in Tampa Bay, throwing 6.2 innings and allowing just one run, adding six strikeouts and one walk...Recorded a career-high eight strikeouts on May 11 against Atlanta, throwing 6.0 innings and allowing just three runs.

WHAT A DEBUT: Scott made his Major League debut on May 4 in Tampa Bay...He recorded a no decision in the Mets 3-1 loss, throwing 6.2 innings and allowing just one run on five hits with one walk and six strikeouts...He became the third Mets player to make his major league debut this year...Scott is the first Mets pitcher to toss at least 6.0 innings in their debut since Steven Matz did so on June 28, 2015 vs. Cincinnati.

SLIDE TO THE RIGHT: While seeking a third pitch, looked at Pitching Ninja video and discovered the slider grip used by Max Scherzer...It's still the grip he uses today... Was predominately a reliever throughout his career at the University of Florida and transitioned to a starting role after he was selected by the Mets.

MINOR LEAGUE BACKGROUND: Was Named the New York Mets 2023 Pitcher of the Year after making 19 starts this across three levels season and posting a 5-4 record with a 2.57 ERA (25 ER/87.2 IP) with 12 walks and 107 strikeouts...In 2023, held opposing hitters to a .199 batting average and posted 10.98 strikeouts per nine innings...Started for the Rumble Ponies in Game One of the Northeast Division Series...In 2022, he split his time between A St. Lucie and A+ Brooklyn with a combined 4.45 ERA in 18 appearances...In 2021, he had three relief outings for FCL Mets and threw 12 strikes out of 16 total pitches.

- Threw 2.0 innings in relief and didn't allow a run (2.0 IP, 3 H, 2 K, 2 BB) on July 7 vs. Kansas City (2.0 IP, 3 H, 2 K, 2 BB)...Has completed at least 2.0 innings six times this season and has only allowed an earned run in one of those appearances.
- Recorded one out and allowed a career-high-tying five runs on July 5 at Atlanta (0.1 IP, 4 H, 5 ER, K, BB)...The only other time he has allowed at least five runs in an outing was June 26, 2024 at Kansas City while with Miami.
- 28 of his 37 appearances this season have been scoreless.
- Since joining the Mets in 2024, he has made 51 appearances (four starts) at Citi Field...In those contests, he is 3-2 with 11 holds, a 2.70 ERA (19 ER/63.1 IP) and 60 strikeouts.
- Threw a scoreless seventh inning on June 27 vs. Philadelphia (1.0 IP, H).
- Suffered his second loss of the season after allowing one run in the seventh inning on June 26 vs. Philadelphia (1.0 IP, 2 H, ER, K, BB).
- Entered with no outs and two men on in the fourth inning on June 24 (G2) vs. Chicago-NL (2.0 IP, 4 K) and struck out the side...He also threw a scoreless fifth inning while recording one more strikeout...Is the ninth time in his career he has recorded at least four strikeouts in an outing and has done so twice this season (also: 6/12 vs. ATL).
- Made his sixth start of the season on June 7 at San Diego and he threw a scoreless first inning (1.0 IP, 2 BB)...Over 7.0 innings as a starter this season he has allowed four earned runs and four of his six starts have been scoreless...For his career as an opener, he has pitched to a 3.27 ERA (4 ER/11.0 IP) over nine starts.
- He throws his changeup 41.6% of the time and opponents are hitting .181 (13-72) in at-bats ending in his changeup....He has recorded 21 of his 41 strikeouts via the changeup...His changeup produces a 17.3% hard-hit rate, which is the second-best mark in the majors among qualified changeups.
- Dating back to September 20, 2025, he hasn't allowed an earned run in 33 of his last 41 appearances...He is 4-2 with a 2.50 ERA (14 ER/50.1 IP) and is holding opposing batters to a .180 batting average (32-178) over that span.
- Made his third career Opening Day roster and his second consecutive with the Mets.
- Pitched in three games for the Dominican Republic in the World Baseball Classic...He tossed 4.0 scoreless innings and struck out seven of the 13 batters he faced.
- Last season, he made a career-high 52 appearances and finished with a 5-2 record, two saves, 12 holds, 57 strikeouts, and a 3.57 ERA (25 ER/63.0 IP).
- In 2025, he allowed just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April, and May (1.34 ERA)...His ERA through his first 25 games of the season is the 11th-best in franchise history.
