METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Angels, 3-2, via walkoff on Sunday...The Mets continue a 10-day, nine-game homestand (1-2) against the Angels (1-2), Rangers (three games) and Mariners (three games).

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME: The Mets are encouraging all fans attending the games taking place August 25 - September 3 to take the train to the game...With the capacity crowds expected at both Citi Field and the US Open, using mass transit and rideshare will be the most efficient ways to arrive to the ballpark...The LIRR and the 7 train have added additional trains for baseball and tennis fans...If you drive, please arrive early to avoid traffic delays.

MINOR LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE GAME: Congrats to Binghamton Rumble Ponies OF Agustin Ruiz and RHP Tyler Stuart who were named the Eastern League Player and Pitcher of the week...In five games last week, Ruiz batted .500 (8-16) with seven runs, one double, three home runs, eight RBI, six walks with a 1.761 OPS...Stuart allowed only two hits in his start on August 23, hurling 6.0 innings and striking out six...In seven starts with Binghamton, Stuart is 3-2 with a 3.60 ERA (14 ER/35.0 IP) with nine walks and 28 strikeouts...He has posted 7-2 record with a 2.20 ERA (27 ER/110.2 IP) with 32 walks and 112 strikeouts in 21 starts across two levels this season...The 17th-best prospect in the Mets system was selected in the sixth round of the 2022 Draft from University of Southern Mississippi.

LINSANITY: Lindor is on a 13-game hitting streak, batting .358 (19-53) in that span with 13 runs, four doubles, two home runs, nine RBI, three walks and four steals...It is tied for his longest streak as a Met, which he also accomplished from September 14-28, 2022...His career-best is 15 games, from April 29-May 14, 2018...Over his last 59 games, he is batting .306 (68-222) with 47 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, 12 home runs, 35 RBI, 28 walks, 17 steals with a .391 OBP, a .541 SLG and a .931 OPS...Lindor has stolen 23 bases in 129 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals 158 games in 2018.

I DECLARE fWAR: Francisco Lindor ranks fifth in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 5.2 fWAR...Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 16.0 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (18.6) and Mookie Betts (17.7) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit...His 16.0 fWAR since 2021 ranks fifth in the majors in that span.

OUCH: The Mets have been hit by 85 pitches this season...That is the second-most in the majors and the most in the National League...Since the start of last season, the Mets have been plunked 197 times, that's 16 times more than the second-place team the Mariners...It's 31 more times the next place team in the NL, the Cincinnati Reds who have been hit by 166 pitches in that span.

RETURN OF THE BACH: Daniel Vogelbach has recorded five home runs over his last 14 games...He is batting .308 (12-39) in that span with seven runs, 12 RBI, eight walks with a .438 OBP and a .692 SLG...He has posted an .830 OPS in 30 games following the All-Star break.

ADAM'S SONG: In 17 games following the All-Star break, Adam Ottavino is 1-1 with one save and a 1.72 ERA (3 ER/15.2 IP) with nine strikeouts...In 21 games since the start of July, Ottavino has posted a 1.40 ERA (3 ER/19.1 IP) with 12 strikeouts.

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is tied for second in the majors and is second in the NL with 96 RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...He is seeking to become the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry recorded three seasons each.

STEAL MY SUNSHINE: New York has recorded 93 steals in 104 attempts...The team's 89.4 percent success rate is the best in the majors...It is the best percentage in franchise history...The last time the Mets stole more than 100 bases in a season was in 2014 when the team swiped 101 bags.

GIMME A BREAK: Alonso is hitting .248 (36-145) with 21 extra-base hits, 35 RBI, 23 runs, 20 walks and a .938 OPS in 41 games following the All-Star break...He batted .211 (64-304) with 50 runs, seven one triple, 26 home runs, 61 RBI and an .807 OPS in the 82 games before the break.

RANGERS-METS NOTES: The Mets have not lost back-to-back games against the Rangers since the two teams began playing each other in 2003.

THIS IS ALMOST 40: Pete Alonso is third in the majors and second in the National League with 39 home runs...Alonso is one home run shy of recording his third season of 40 or more home runs...He socked 53 in 2019 and 40 last season...He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...Since he entered the league in 2019, only two other players have recorded multiple seasons with 40 or more home runs (Shohei Ohtani and Mike Trout)... Only one active player (Nelson Cruz, four) has more than three 40-HR seasons...Alonso's 185 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues...With one more long ball, he'll become the fifth player in MLB history with three or more seasons with 40+ home runs in a player's first five years...He would join Ralph Kiner (4), Ryan Howard (3), Albert Pujols (3) and Eddie Matthews (3).

MONTHLY REPORT: Pete Alonso has recorded nine home runs in 26 games this month...His career-best for any single month is 11 home runs, which he recorded in 27 games in September of 2019...He has recorded five months with at least 10 home runs in his career...His next home run would mark the second time this year that Alonso has hit 10 homers in a single month...He hit 10 home runs in May...He also hit one home run in March and nine in April.

JEFF McHITS: Jeff McNeil has safely hit in 19 of his last 22 games, batting .337 (29-86) with 15 runs, four doubles, three home runs, 13 RBI, and five walks with a .488 SLG in that span...In 41 games following the All-Star break, McNeil is batting .292 (47-161) with 24 runs, seven doubles, one triple, three home runs, 21 RBI, eight walks with a .343 OBP...He has struck out only 13 times in 175 plate appearances following the All-Star break.

I DON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ: In 32 games this year, DJ Stewart is batting .263 (21-80) with nine runs, five doubles, six home runs, 13 RBI, nine walks, a .341 OBP and a .550 SLG...Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1989, East Meadow, NY native Frank Viola threw a complete game shutout as the Mets defeated the Dodgers, 1-0, in L.A...Viola allowed three hits and struck out five to improve to 10-15 on the season...He out-duced Orel Hershiser who went 8.0 innings in the loss...Viola went 38-32 with a 3.31 ERA in three seasons with the Mets.

DOWN ON THE FARM: OF Brandon McMillain collected his third straight two-hit game for the Syracuse Mets yesterday...He finished 2-4 with two doubles, one walk, an RBI and was hit by a pitch...In 21 games at Triple-A McMillain is batting .282 (20-71) with 14 runs, seven doubles, four home runs, 15 RBI and seven steals...In 106 games between two levels this season, he is slashing .264/.361/.422 with 26 doubles, one triple, 11 home runs and 62 RBI...The 25-year-old was signed as a non-drafted minor league free agent following the 2020 draft...He played both football and baseball at the University of South Carolina and the University of California, Berkeley.

MEGILL NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered his seventh loss of the season on August 22 against the Braves at Truist Park...Allowed three run over 4.2 innings...Surrendered eight hits, issued two walks and recorded five strikeouts.

ADD ANOTHER ONE TO THE LIST: Tonight, Megill will face the Texas Rangers for the first time in his career...The Rangers mark the 21st opponent that Megill has faced in his career and the eighth from the American League...In eight career Interleague games (seven starts), Megill is 3-1 with a 4.11 ERA (16 ER/35.0 IP)

NO PLACE LIKE NEW YORK: This season, Megill is 5-2 with a 3.49 ERA (19 ER/49.0 IP) in nine home starts this season...In 10 road starts this season, Megill is 2-5 with an 7.93 ERA (37 ER/42.0 IP)...In 25 career home games (23 starts), Megill is 9-5 with a 4.14 ERA (55 ER/119.2 IP) and in 27 career road games (23 starts), Megill is 6-10 with a 6.06 ERA (73 ER/108.1 IP).

THE FRANCHISE HAS COMPANY: On April 7, the Mets home opener vs. Miami, Megill threw 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed three hits...Megill joined Tom Seaver (April 5, 1983) as the only other pitcher in franchise history to throw 6.0 shutout innings and allow three hits or fewer in a home opener...Courtesy of Elias.

COMBINED NO-NO: Megill threw the first 5.0 innings of MLB's first no-hitter of the season on April 29 at Citi Field...It was the second no-hitter in team history (also, Johan Santana, June 1, 2012 vs. St. Louis)...The Mets combine no-hitter against the Phillies marked the 17th time a team has thrown a combined no-hitter and the 10th time in the Wild Card Era...Drew Smith (1.1 IP, BB, 4 K), Joely Rodríguez (1.0 IP, 2 BB), Seth Lugo (0.2 IP) and Edwin Díaz (1.0 IP, 3 K) finished the job with 4.0 hitless innings out of the bullpen.

2022 RECAP: Was the Mets Opening Day starter and earned the victory after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings against the Nationals...Did not allow a run over 5.1 innings and earned the victory in his following start against the Phillies on April 12...Started the Mets combined no-hitter against the Phillies on April 29 and threw 5.0 innings with three walks and five strikeouts...Struck out a season-high nine batters in his following start against the Braves on May 4...Was on the 15-Day Injured List with right biceps inflammation from May 12 - June 10...Made two starts in his return from the IL before beginning another stint on the Injured List with a right shoulder strain on June 17...Was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 27 and returned to action on September 19...Made his final six appearances of the season in relief and allowed four earned runs over 6.0 innings in those appearances.

OPENOR: Last year, Tylor Megill was named the Mets Opening Day Starter...With 89.2 career innings pitched entering the 2022 season, Megill had the fewest major league innings of any Mets Opening Day starting pitcher in franchise history...Became the 28th different Opening Day starting pitcher in Mets history.

RUNS IN THE FAMILY: His brother, Trevor, is a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization...They both made their MLB debut in 2021...According to *Elias*, they are the fourth pair of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000 (2019, Scott & Tyler Heineman, 2017, Joe & A.J. Jimenez and 2012, Donovan & Jhonatan Solano).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP JOSÉ QUINTANA (1-5, 3.73)

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered the loss on August 23 at Atlanta...Allowed five earned runs, snapping a streak of 20 straight starts allowing three earned runs or fewer...Was the longest such streak in the majors among starters (excluding openers).

LIMITING THE LONG BALL: Since the start of the 2022 season, Quintana has allowed eight homers, the second-fewest during that span behind Sonny Gray (six)...From August 4, 2022 - August 17, 2023, Quintana did not allow a homer over 97.1 consecutive innings...It was the longest homerless inning streak since Tyson Ross tossed 100.0 homerless innings in 2015...Courtesy of Elias
