AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will play their home opener today to start a three-game set vs. the Miami Marlins...is part of a six-game homestand, also featuring a three-game series against the Athletics (Tues.-Thurs.)...went 5-1 on their season-opening road trip after sweeping San Francisco in a three-game series and going 2-1 at Seattle.

- ▶ Have won at least five of their first six games of a season for the third time in the last 23 years since 2004 (also 5-1 in 2020 and '24)...matches their third-best record through their first six *decisions* of a season, trailing only their 6-0 starts in 1927, '33 and '92.
- ▶ *With a win today*, would match their second-best start through their first seven *decisions* in franchise history (went 7-0 to start the 1933 season)...would also mark just the third time in the last 23 years (since 2004), ninth time in the last 68 years (since 1959) and the 14th time in franchise history the Yankees started a season with a record of 6-1 or better through their first seven *decisions* (went 7-0 in 1933 and 6-1 in 1927, '49, '56, '58, '86, '88, '92, '99, 2002, '03, '20 and '24).
- ▶ Their 5-1 (.833) record is tied with Milwaukee and Miami for the best record in the Majors.

WHEREWE LEFT OFF: The Yankees clinched a series win with a 5-3 victory over the Mariners on Wednesday at T-Mobile Park...**RHP Cam Schlichter** (6.1IP, 2H, 0R, 0BB, 7K) earned the win after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings...**DH Ben Rice** (2-for-3, 2R, 1 double, 1HR, 2RBI, 1BB) reached base three times, including an RBI double in the first inning and a solo HR in the ninth inning...**1B Paul Goldschmidt** (1-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 3RBI) hit his first home run of the season with a three-run shot in the sixth inning...**RHP David Bednar** (1.1IP, 3H, 1R/ER, 1K) recorded his third save of the year.

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers have allowed only 6R over their first six games...are only the third team in Major League history to allow only 6R-or-fewer over their first six games of a season, joining the 2002 San Francisco Giants (5R) and 1915 Philadelphia Phillies (5R).

- ▶ Yankees pitchers have not surrendered a HR this year, marking their longest season-opening streak in 83 years (since 1944) and their longest since posting a franchise-record 21-game streak without allowing a HR to start the 1943 season...are the only pitching staff to not allow a HR yet this season.
- ▶ Lead the Majors in ERA (1.01), opponents' BA (.174), opponents' OBP (.230), opponents' SLG (.205), opponents' OPS (.436) and HR/9.OIP (0.00), rank second in WHIP (0.84) and BB/9.OIP (2.03), and third in K/BB (4.58).

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have allowed only 2R total through the club's first six games, marking the fewest runs by any Major League team's starting rotation through their first six games of a season (since 1900)...their 0.53 ERA is also the lowest by any Major League team through their first six games since ER became an official stat in 1913.

- ▶ Yankees starters have allowed only 1R-or-fewer in each of the Yankees' six games...marks only the third time since 1900 that a team's starting rotation allowed 1R-or-fewer in each of their first six games of a season, joining the 2023 Minnesota Twins (first seven games) and 2018 Boston Red Sox (first seven games).
- ▶ Have held opponents to a .147/.202/.172 (17-for-116) slash line...have allowed only 3XBH to 124BF (3 doubles).
- ▶ Lead the Majors in ERA (0.53), opponents' SLG (.172) and opponents' OPS (.374), tied for first in HR/9.OIP (0.00), rank second in opponents' BA (.147, second in AL), opponents' OBP (.202, second in AL), WHIP (0.68, second in AL), third in K/BB (5.83, second in AL) and fourth in BB/9.OIP (1.60, third in AL).

RISPY BUSINESS: Yankees batters have hit .317/.356/.585 (13-for-41) with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 2HR, 18RBI, 3BB and 1SF with RISP this season.

CRUZ CONTROL: RHP Fernando Cruz retired both of his batters faced on Wednesday at Seattle...has retired 6-of-7BF in three games this year (1BB, 3K).

SAVED BY THE BELL: INF/OF Cody Bellinger has reached base in five of six games, batting .286/.400/.381 (6-for-21) with 5R, 1 triple, 4BB and 2SB in six games this season.

HOME OPENER FESTIVITIES: The Yankees will play their 124th home opener in franchise history today vs. Miami, marking their first home opener all-time vs. the Marlins...festivities will begin at approx. 1:00 p.m. with baseline introductions, followed by the presentation of colors by the **U.S. Army West Point Honor Guard**, including a giant American flag unfurled in the outfield by **Yankees season-ticket holders...Team USA Men's Olympic hockey gold medal game overtime hero Jack Hughes and Team USA Women's Olympic hockey gold medal-winning goalie Aerin Frankel will throw out the ceremonial first pitches...Tony Award winner Nikki M. James** will perform the national anthem...**U.S. Army Sergeant Major Carla Loy Song** will sing "God Bless America," and the Yankees will honor **U.S. Air Force Senior Master Sergeant Mayra Winnie** as the "Veteran of the Game"...the Albany, N.Y., native has been in active duty since 2005, and served in Operation Deep Freeze, Operation Inherent Resolve, Operation Freedom Sentinel and Operation Spartan Shield.

- ▶ Are 82-40-1 (.672) all-time in home openers...are 7-2 in home openers since 2017, 22-6 since 1998, 27-7 since 1992 and 33-9 since 1984...are 11-6 in home openers at the current Yankee Stadium.

STANTON ISLAND: DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton has recorded multiple hits in each of his first five games, batting .500/.500/.750 (10-for-20) with 2R, 2 doubles, 1HR and 4RBI...is only the fourth Yankee in franchise history to record multiple hits in each of his first five games of a season, joining Alfonso Soriano (first 6G in 2003), Bill Skowron (first 6G in 1956) and Bob Meusel (first 6G in 1928).

- ▶ His five-game multi-hit streak matches the longest streak of his career (also 5G from 8/3-7/21)...is only the fourth Yankee in the last five years (since 2022) to record multiple hits in at least five straight games, joining Gleyber Torres (6G from 7/8-17/23), Aaron Judge (5G from 4/28-5/3/25) and Anthony Volpe (5G from 6/27-7/1(G2)/23).
- ▶ His 10H mark his most hits through his first five games of a season in his career (previous: 8H in 2020)...is only the second Yankee in the last 23 years (since 2004) to record at least 10H through his first five games of a season, joining DJ LeMahieu (10H in his first 5G in 2020).
- ▶ Has hit safely in each of his last 10 games dating back to last season (since 9/24/25)...matches the fourth-longest hitting streak of his career, trailing only his 17-game streak from 4/29-5/15/14, and 12-game streaks from 4/23-5/6/21 and 9/23/10-4/1/11 (also had 10-game streaks from 7/25-8/4/25, 6/11-22/24 and 4/28-5/7/12).
- ▶ Ranks second in the Majors in BA (.500, first in AL) and tied for third in hits (10, tied for second in AL).
- ▶ Has gone 4-for-6 with 1 double and 3RBI with RISP this year.

RICE RICE BABY: C/INF Ben Rice reached base three times on Wednesday at Seattle, including an RBI double in the first inning and a solo home run in the ninth inning...has reached base safely in 7-of-8PA over his last two games, going 4-for-5 with 4R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 3RBI and 3BB...has reached base at least three times in back-to-back games for the fourth time in his career (also 2G from 4/3-4/25, 8/25-27/25 and 9/21-23/25).

- ▶ Has hit safely in each of his five games this season, batting .412/.524/.765 (7-for-17) with 6R, 3 doubles, 1HR, 5RBI and 4BB.
- ▶ His 1.289 OPS ranks eighth in the Majors (fourth in AL).

THE RIGHT CALL: The Yankees are 13-for-16 in ABS challenges through their first six games...have posted an 81.2% success rate (the Major League average success rate is 55.4%)...their 16 challenges are the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Minnesota (26).

SCHLITT'S CREEK: RHP Cam Schlichter earned the win on Wednesday at Seattle after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings (2H, 0BB, 7K)...retired his final 15BF...has gone 2-0 over 11.2 scoreless innings this season...is the first pitcher in franchise history to not allow a run or a walk and record at least 15K over a two-game span.

STARTING OFF STRONG: Since 2017, the Yankees have gone a Major League-best 134-90 (.598) in March/April.

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 3, 2018: Didi Gregorius goes 4-for-4 with 1 double, 1BB and 8RBI in the Yankees' 11-4 home opener win vs. Tampa Bay, setting single-game franchise records for RBI by a shortstop and RBI by any Yankee in a home opener.

April 3, 2006: The Yankees win, 15-2, at Oakland on Opening Day. Alex Rodriguez goes 3-for-5 with a grand slam and 5RBI and Hideki Matsui goes 4-for-4 with a solo HR and 4RBI.

April 3, 1919: New York Yankees outfielder Ping Bodie competes against an ostrich named "Percy" in a spaghetti-eating contest in Jacksonville, Florida. Bodie wins the competition when Percy passes out after his 11th plate of pasta (credit: SABR Baseball Biography Project).

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 4, 2008: In the bottom of the third, Hideki Matsui (HR), Jose Molina (double), Derek Jeter (triple) and Alex Rodriguez (single) hit for a team cycle vs. Tampa Bay. Jason Giambi adds another double in the 4R inning, but the Yankees lose, 13-4.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP WILL WARREN (0-0, 2.08 ERA)

RHP Will Warren will make his second start of the season in today's series opener vs. Miami...the 26-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest...made his season debut on Saturday at San Francisco, tossing 4.1IP (5H, 1R/ER, 2BB, 3K, 0HR) without recording a decision...went 2-1 with a 1.42 ERA (25.1IP, 13H, 5R/4ER, 3BB, 22K, 1HR) in six spring starts...among Grapefruit League pitchers, ranked first in innings pitched, opponents' BA (.148) and WHIP (0.63), was tied for first in starts, second in ERA and fourth in strikeouts...last season, went 9-8 with a 4.44 ERA (162.1IP, 158H, 90R/80ER, 65BB, 171K, 22HR) in 33 starts, allowing 2ER-or-fewer in 22 of those starts...**according to Elias, his 22 starts of 2ER-or-fewer were the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season**, trailing only Stan Bahnsen (25GS in 1968)...**according to Elias, his 171K were tied with Luis Gil (171K in 2024) for the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history**, trailing only Russ Ford (209K in 1910)...his first Major League action with the Yankees in 2024, going 0-3 with a 10.32 ERA (22.2IP, 33H, 27R/26ER, 10BB, 29K, 5HR) in six games (five starts) over five stints with the club (7/30, 8/7, 8/14, 8/21-31, 9/28)... was selected by the Yankees in the eighth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of Southeastern Louisiana University.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his season debut on Saturday at San Francisco, tossing 4.1IP (5H, 1R/ER, 2BB, 3K, 0HR) without recording a decision.

HOME SWEET HOME: In 16 starts at Yankee Stadium, went 7-4 with a 3.50 ERA (87.1IP, 71H, 36R/34ER, 34BB, 96K, 12HR) in 2025...allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 13 of those starts, including 2ER-or-fewer in 11 starts.

- ✦ Allowed 2R-or-fewer in seven consecutive home starts from 6/22-8/11/25, tied for the seventh-longest such streak by a Yankees starter in franchise history (excluding openers), trailing only Luis Severino (9GS from 9/27/17-6/16/18), Bob Shirley (9GS from 8/17/83-6/16/85), Adam Warren (8GS from 8/21/13-9/26/15), Orlando Hernández (8GS from 7/22/98-4/23/99), David Cone (8GS from 5/29-8/12/98) and Fritz Peterson (8GS from 5/29-9/10/73)...Chad Green had eight such starts as an opener from 6/11/17-8/12/19-G2...his seven-start streak was also tied for the fourth-longest by a Yankees starter at home in a single season, trailing only Severino (8GS from 4/14-6/16/18), Cone and Peterson.

VS. MIAMI: Will make his first career appearance vs. the Marlins today.

2025: In his first full Major League season, went 9-8 with a 4.44 ERA (162.1IP, 158H, 90R/80ER, 65BB, 171K, 22HR)...opponents batted .250/.320/.418 (158-for-631, 22HR); LH .266/.350/.436 (91-for-342, 12HR); RH .232/.283/.398 (67-for-289, 10HR).

- ✦ Was tied for second in the Majors in starts (33, tied for first in AL)...also ranked eighth in the AL in K/9.0IP (9.48).
- ✦ Was just the third Yankees rookie to make at least 33 starts in a season, joining Stan Bahnsen (34GS in 1968), and Russ Ford (33GS in 1910)...was also the first Major League rookie to make at least 33 starts in a single season since 2009 (Nick Blackburn, 33GS with Minnesota in 2008).
- ✦ Among Major League rookies, ranked first in strikeouts, starts and innings pitched, and was tied for fourth in wins (tied for third in AL).
- ✦ Went 5-5 with a 3.94 ERA (105.0IP, 46ER) over his final 20 starts (6/12-9/26) after going 4-3 with a 5.34 ERA (57.1IP, 34ER) over his first 13 starts of the season (4/1-6/6)...allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 14 of his final 20 starts and one-or-zero ER in eight of those starts.
- ✦ Surrendered one-or-zero home runs in 29 of his 33 starts and did not allow a home run in 15 of those starts...his 29 starts of one-or-zero home runs allowed were tied for the fourth-most in the Majors (tied for first in AL).
- ✦ Allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 24 of his 33 starts, including 2ER-or-fewer in 22 of those starts...according to Elias, his 22 starts of 2ER-or-fewer were the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season, trailing only Stan Bahnsen (25GS in 1968).
- ✦ According to Elias, his 171K were tied with Luis Gil (171K in 2024) for the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history, trailing only Russ Ford (209K in 1910).
- ✦ Tossed five scoreless starts: 5.2IP on 5/20 vs. Texas, 6/12 at Kansas City and 7/8 vs. Seattle, and 5.0IP on 6/27 vs. the Athletics and 8/5 at Texas...according to Elias, his five scoreless starts were tied for the third-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history, trailing only Russ Ford's eight such starts in 1910 and Luis Gil's six such starts in 2024 (Hippo Vaughn also had five such starts in 1910).
- ✦ In 16 starts at Yankee Stadium, went 7-4 with a 3.50 ERA (87.1IP, 71H, 36R/34ER, 34BB, 96K, 12HR)...allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 13 of those starts, including 2ER-or-fewer in 11 starts.
- ✦ His 112K prior to the All-Star break were the third-most strikeouts by a rookie in franchise history (since the All-Star Game was established in 1933), trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (135K in 2014) and Luis Gil (118K in 2024).
- ✦ Recorded at least 7K in five of his six starts in May, posting a 13.82 K/9.0IP ratio during that stretch...recorded 7K in five straight starts (5/4-25), matching the second-longest such streak by a Yankees starter age 25-or-younger in franchise history...trailing only Luis Severino's six-game streak from 8/17-9/15/17...during the month of May, ranked second among all Major League pitchers in K/9.0IP ratio (13.82, first in AL), third in strikeout rate (33.9%, second in AL) and was tied for third in strikeouts (43, second in AL).
- ✦ Went 2-1 with a 2.70 ERA (26.2IP, 8ER) and 41K over a five-start span from 5/4-25...allowed 3ER-or-fewer in each of those five starts...allowed just 1HR to 113BF over that stretch.
- ✦ The Yankees went 13-6 in his 19 starts from 5/9-8/17...his 13 team wins over that span were tied with Boston's Lucas Giolito for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Detroit's Tarik Skubal (14 team wins).
- ✦ Recorded a career-high 11K on 6/17 vs. Los Angeles-AL (L, 6.0IP, 6H, 3R/ER, 0BB, 0HR)...became the third Yankees rookie in franchise history to record at least 11K in a game without surrendering a walk, joining Chad Green (11K and 0BB on 8/15/16 vs. Toronto) and Stan Bahnsen (12K and 0BB on 8/1/68 at Boston)...is one of only two Yankees rookies in the last nine years (since 2017) to record at least 11K in a game, joining Luis Gil (14K on 5/18/24 vs. Chicago-AL).
- ✦ Made his postseason debut in ALDS Game 2 at Toronto (4.2IP, 7H, 6R/ER, 1BB, 4K, 4HR, 1WP)...was on the Yankees' ALWCS roster but did not pitch.
- ✦ Following the season, was named to *Baseball America's* MLB All-Rookie Team.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Has made 40 career Major League appearances (39 starts), going 9-11 with a 5.09 ERA (189.1IP, 196H, 118R/107ER, 77BB, 203K, 27HR).

- ✦ His 203K over his first 40 career games (39 starts) are tied with Russ Ford (203K in 40G/35GS) for the fifth-most in franchise history, trailing Masahiro Tanaka (256K in 40G/GS), Al Downing (237K in 40G/33GS), Luis Gil (231K in 40G/GS) and Orlando Hernández (217K in 40G/GS).
