AT HOME: The Brewers are 29-17 at home, going 10-4-1 in series play.....the team has lost its last two home series (1-2 vs. PIT, 1-2 vs. WSH) after winning nine home series in a row.....the team has gone 25-10 in its last 35 home games after a 5-7 start.....the Brewers had a season-high 6-game home winning streak from May 29-June 10.

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers are 27-25 on the road, going 7-7-2 in series play.....the team has gone 14-21 in its last 35 road games after a 13-4 start.....the team had a season-high 4-game road winning streak from April 9-13.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.....Murphy spent the previous eight seasons (2016-23) as bench coach....his only Major League managerial experience previously came in 2015 as interim manager of the Padres, replacing Bud Black in June [42-54].....he enjoyed a 25-year college head coaching career primarily at the University of Notre Dame (1988-94) and Arizona State University (1995-2009).....Murphy went 1,000-457-4 as a college coach and was on pace to be the winningest coach in NCAA history before he transitioned into the professional ranks.

COACHES: First base coach Quintin Berry (4th season), field coordinator Néstor Corredor (2nd season/1st in current role), hitting coach Connor Dawson (3rd season), assistant pitching coach **Jim Henderson** (3rd season/1st in current role), pitching coach Chris Hook (6th season), third base coach Jason Lane (9th season/4th in current role), run prevention coordinator Walker McKinven (5th season/1st in current role) and hitting coach Ozzie Timmons (3rd season) all returned from the 2023 staff..... Rickie Weeks (associate manager), Daniel de Mondesert (assistant coach) and Charlie Greene (bulloen coach) are in their first seasons on the coaching staff, all Major League coaches for the first time.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made 23 replay challenges this season, going 13-10.....their last challenge (lost) came on 7/20 at Minnesota as a safe call at home plate involving Willi Castro was confirmed.

TODAY'S STARTER: #32 - RHP AARON CIVALE (19gs, 2-7, 4.94)

CIVALE AT A GLANCE: Aaron Civale, 29, will make his 20th start of the season and third with the Brewers.....Civale last started on 7/11 vs. Pittsburgh and took a 1-0 defeat [6.1ip, 6h, 1r, 1er, 2bb, 6k, 100 pitches].....he made his debut with Milwaukee on 7/5 at Los Angeles-NL and received no decision in the Brewers' 8-5 loss [5ip, 5h, 4r, 4er, 3bb, 8k, 3hr, 102 pitches]......Civale was acquired from Tampa Bay on July 3 in exchange for INF Gregory Barrios.....he went 2-6 with a 5.07 ERA in 17 starts with the Rays [87ip, 93h, 51r, 49er, 27bb, 84k].....he has 4 quality starts.....his teams are 5-14 in his starts.....opponents are batting .266 [104-for-391, 19hr].....name is pronounced "sih-VAH-lee."

LAST SEASON: Civale went 7-5 with a 3.46 ERA in 23 starts between Cleveland and Tampa Bay.....he made 7 quality starts.....his teams went 13-10 in his starts.....opponents batted .235 (109-for-463, 12hr).....he began the season with the Guardians, going 5-2 with a 2.34 ERA in 13 starts.....he was traded to the Rays on July 31 in exchange for first baseman Kyle Manzardo and went 2-3 with a 5.36 ERA in 10 starts.

CAREER: Has gone 33-33 with a 4.09 ERA in 105 starts (573.2ip, 261er).....is in his sixth Major League season pitching for Cleveland (2019-23), Tampa Bay (2023-24) and Milwaukee (2024).....Civale was selected by Cleveland in the third round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out of Northeastern University.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Civale made his first career appearance in Milwaukee in his last start.

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 16-15 with a 3.97 ERA in 55 starts (296.2ip, 131er).....is 1-2 with a 6.23 ERA in 9 starts this season (43.1ip, 30er).

CAREER vs. TWINS: Is 1-4 with a 4.19 ERA in 10 starts against the Twins (53.2ip, 53h, 25r, 25er, 12bb, 57k, 7hr), including a no-decision this season with the Rays on 6/18 at Target Field (3.2ip, 7h, 4r, 4er, 2bb, 5k)....Tampa Bay lost, 7-6.
