To clinch a spot in the postseason for the 10th time in team history and the first time since 2023.

RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their six-game homestand against the Padres (2-0, one to play) and Mets (three to play) today, their shortest homestand since June 8-10 vs. BOS (3G), despite dropping seven of nine between Aug. 14-22, they are 16-8 in their last 24 games (Aug. 3–pres.) and have MLB's best record since July 20 at 25-12 (.676)...have the hardest remaining schedule in the AL with an opp. winning pct. of .513...have spent 104 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...this includes a season-high 64 consecutive days in first place (June 27–pres.)...only the Dodgers (151), Braves (149), and Brewers (119) have spent more time leading their divisions...have held the AL's best record for 103 days, second most in team history behind 2023 (106), according to Stats Perform.

- ✦ The Rays overcame one-run and three-run deficits to earn their 33rd come-from-behind victory of the season, 7-6 over the Padres...33 comeback wins are tied for the third most in the AL (also: BOS & KC) behind the White Sox and Yankees (both 34).
- ✦ **Junior Caminero** is on a career-best 12-game hitting streak (Aug. 17–pres.), the longest streak by a Ray in 2026 and the longest active streak in the majors...he extended his hitting streak with a solo home run yesterday that snapped a career-long-tying, 15-game streak without a blast (also: Sept. 1-15, 2024).
- ✦ They won their 81st game of the season and secured a .500 record or better before the end of August for the fifth time in team history (see table on the right).
- ✦ The Rays won their eighth straight at Tropicana Field against the NL West, improving to 10-1-1 in their last 12 series against the NL West at the ballpark (Aug. 15, 2016–pres.).
- ✦ On the heels of dropping a season-high three straight series (Aug. 14-23), the Rays have won back-to-back sets (Aug. 24–pres.).
- ✦ The Rays scored first for the seventh straight game and have plated the opening run in 27 of their last 40 games (July 17 [G2]–pres.)...they have held a lead in each of their last three losses, tied for their second-longest streak this season (also: July 17 [G2]-19) behind March 26-April 3 (5G).
- ✦ With 17 wins in August, the Rays have secured their fifth straight month with a winning record...it marks the second time in franchise history the club has begun a season with five straight winning months, joining 2008...the 2008 Rays went 13-14 in September.
- ✦ Today's probable starter, **Drew Rasmussen**, takes the mound with the club aiming to claim their 14th sweep of the season (see more in "What's At Stake" note below)...Rasmussen has been the Rays starter in the series finale in five of their 13 (38.5%) previous sweeps this season...Rasmussen is 5-0 in August, with a win today, he would become the first pitcher in Rays history to win six games in a month.

WHAT'S AT STAKE—With a win today, the Rays would:

- ✦ Earn their MLB-best 14th sweep of the season, the most in franchise history before the calendar flips to September and tie the most in franchise history across a whole season (also 2021)...14 sweeps would be tied for the 12th most in a single season by an AL club since 2000.
- ✦ Complete their fourth sweep of the season against the NL West...paired with being swept by the Dodgers (June 15-17), all five sets against the NL West this season would end in sweeps.
- ✦ Win their third straight game at home, their longest streak since sweeping the Guardians between July 24-26 (3G).
- ✦ Claim their fourth straight contest, their longest winning streak since their nine-game winning streak on their West Coast road trip (Aug. 3-12).

RAY VS. RAY—Padres probable starter, **Robbie Ray**, is one of five "Ray" pitchers to pitch against the Rays in team history, alongside **STL Ray King**, **SD/ATL Ray Kerr**, **BOS Raynel Espinal**, and **BAL/TEX/SF/SEA Chris Ray**...he is the only "Ray" to start on the mound against the Rays and would be making his 11th start against the franchise today...**Robbie Ray** is also one of five "Ray" players to have a plate appearance against the Rays (2PA - June 6, 2016 vs. TB, w/AZ), alongside **HOU Raynel Delgado**, **CWS Ray Durham**, **SD Ray Lankford**, and **CIN/TOR/CWS Ray Olmedo**...with a start today, the Padres will have used more "Ray" named players against the Rays than any other organization (3; **Robbie Ray** - Aug. 30, 2026; **Ray Kerr** - June 16, 2023; **Ray Lankford** - June 7-9, 2002).

THE CHAN, THE MYTH, THE LEGEND—Since breaking out of a 3-for-44 skid (May 30–June 17), **Chandler Simpson** has hit safely in 48 of his last 58 games (June 19–pres.), pacing the majors in average (.371), hits (82), multi-hit games (27), and steals (23) over that timeframe—**CLE Steven Kwan** (.340) is the only other player batting .330 or better in that span...the .371 average is the third best by any Ray across any 58-game span within a single season (min. 150AB) in franchise history, behind overlapping spans by **Aubrey Huff** from July 18–Sept. 17, 2002 (.371; behind by decimal points) and July 19–Sept. 18, 2002 (.373)...on the year, Simpson leads the AL with 47 multi-hit games, ahead of **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (45G)—he could join **Yandy Diaz** (2025, T1st) as the only Rays to pace the AL in the category...Simpson leads the majors in infield hits (55; Baseball Savant) and is tied for the major league lead in bunt hits (14, also **MIL David Hamilton**)...he is tied for the AL lead in triples (6) and is second in stolen bases (37)...he owns the majors' second-lowest strikeout rate (8.2%) and third-lowest whiff rate (10.2%).

- ✦ Simpson (.311) is nine points behind Alvarez (.320) for the AL's best batting average...he is attempting to join Diaz (2023) as the only AL batting champions in Rays history...he has previously won an NCAA Division I batting title at Georgia Tech in 2022 (.433) and a Minor League Baseball batting crown in 2024 (.355)...Simpson and Diaz (.304) are on pace to become the third pair of qualified Rays teammates to both bat .300 or better—they would join Bartlett (.320)/**Carl Crawford** (.305) in 2009 and Crawford (.315)/**B.J. Upton** (.300) in 2007.
- ✦ With 81 career stolen bases, Simpson is the 14th player in the modern era (since 1900) to swipe 80 SB across their first two major league seasons...he joins **CIN Ely De La Cruz** (2023-24, 102SB) and **SEA Ichiro Suzuki** (2001-02, 87SB) as the only players in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to turn the trick...he is three stolen bases shy of joining **CAL Chad Curtis** (1992-93), **MON Delino DeShields** (1990-91), **STL Vince Coleman** (1985-86), and **NYB Bert Daniels** (1910-11) as the only players to reach 40 stolen bases in each of their first two major league campaigns in the modern era.
- ✦ The outfielder paces the majors in both hits (39) and stolen bases (10) in August...per Elias, he would become the first Rays player in franchise history to lead the majors in both categories across a month...he is also hitting .390 (39-for-100) this month, second in the majors to KC **Jac Caglianone** (.418).
- ✦ Simpson plated the go-ahead run with an RBI-single in the 7th inning last night, the second go-ahead base hit in the 7th inning or later of his career (also: Sept. 17, 2025 vs. TOR - 1B).

THE BAKE SHOW—**Bryan Baker** converted his 28th consecutive save opportunity yesterday, extending the longest streak in franchise history...he is tied for the longest streak in the majors this season with **SD Mason Miller** (March 28–July 29) and is the longest single-season streak by an AL pitcher since **CLE Emmanuel Clase** converted 34 straight saves from May 20–Sept. 25, 2024...his MLB-leading 39 saves are seventh most in a season in team history, including the most since **Alex Colomé** had 47 in 2017...his 39 saves are more than 21 clubs have had as a team this season...Baker is on pace for 47 saves, which would tie Colomé (2017) for the second most by a Ray behind **Fernando Rodney** (48) in 2012...he's already the fifth Ray to hold the outright MLB lead in saves at any point after the calendar flips to August, joining Colomé (2017, led MLB), Rodney (2012, latest date: Sept. 18), **Rafael Soriano** (2010, latest date: Sept. 21), and **Roberto Hernández** (1999, latest date: Sept. 4), according to Stats Perform...with two games to play, Baker is one save shy of tying Colomé (40) in 2017 for the most in club history before the end of August.

THE ARMORY—Over their last seven games (Aug. 22–pres.), Rays starting pitchers have turned in a 1.70 ERA (37.0IP, 7ER) with a .159 (21-for-132) opp. average, .419 opp. OPS, and 28 strikeouts to three walks...it marks the sixth time this season they have gone seven straight starts with three earned runs or fewer allowed (last: 10G, July 20-30)...the Rays staff as a whole, have produced a 2.32 ERA (62.0IP, 16ER) over those seven games with opponents are slashing .172/.206/.278 (39-for-227) in that span with 52 strikeouts against nine walks, and Rays pitchers have produced a 0.77 WHIP.

- ✦ The Rays have issued three walks or fewer in 25 of their last 27 games (July 31–pres.), producing streaks of 11 games (Aug. 17-28) and 14 games (July 31–Aug. 15) during that stretch...over that 27-game span, they have issued 49 free passes.

FRIARS IN FLORIDA—The Rays conclude their three-game set against the Padres today at Tropicana Field...the Rays swept the Padres in their three-game series at Petco Park last season (April 25-27), outscoring them 9-3 on the heels of dropping two straight series (2-4) from 2023-24...the Rays have won 16 of their last 21 games vs. San Diego dating back to 2010 and are 12-8 all-time when facing the club at Tropicana Field, including wins in 10 of their last 12.

- ✦ In the five career games against the Padres, **Chandler Simpson** went 10-for-19 (.526) with 1 2B, 2 RBI, 2 BB, and 4 R...he has four straight multi-hit games against the Padres, the longest streak against the club in Rays history.

THE UNSLEEPING CITY—Tomorrow, the Rays welcome the Mets to Tropicana Field for a three-game set...it marks the first time they have visited the ballpark since 2024...last season, they swept the Mets in New York (June 13-15, 2025) and have won six straight over them dating back to 2024...the Rays have won eight straight at Tropicana Field against the Mets (Aug. 8, 2015–pres.), including sweeps over them in 2024 (May 3-5) and 2021 (May 14-16).

TODAY'S START—**Drew Rasmussen** will toe the rubber today for his 26th start of the campaign and his 156th career appearance (107th start)...he leads AL arms (min. 100.0IP) in opp. on-base pct. (.249), **strikeout-to-walk ratio** (5.72), **WHIP** (0.93), and ranks highly in opp. OPS (2nd, .564), walks per 9.0 innings (2nd, 1.60), opp. SLG (3rd, .315), and opp. AVG (4th, .204)...is one **strikeout shy** of tying **Tyler Glasnow** (526) for ninth most in franchise history and is two starts shy of tying seventh-ranked **Jeremy Hellickson** and **Blake Snell** (108GS) for the most starts in franchise history.

- ★ Has a career-high, seven-game winning streak, the second-longest winning streak in franchise history behind **Blake Snell's** nine-game run from Aug. 10–Sept. 23, 2018...is the longest active streak in the majors.
- ★ Rasmussen is 5-0 in August, and with a win today would become the first Rays pitcher in team history to have six wins in a month and join MIA **Sandy Alcantara** (6W, June) as the only major league pitchers to turn the trick this season.
- ★ Since 2021, his 2.83 ERA (585.2IP, 184ER) ranks fourth among MLB pitchers (min 500.0IP) behind LAD **Shohei Ohtani** (2.68), ATL **Chris Sale** (2.74), and MIL **Brandon Woodruff** (2.79).

LAST TIME OUT—Earned his 14th win of the season, his seventh straight, after tossing 6.0 innings of one-run ball on Aug. 24 at DET (W, 6.0IP, 3H, ER, OBB, 5SO)...set down each of the first eight batters he faced before allowing a single in the 3rd inning...the only other two baserunners (2B, 1B) came in consecutive plate appearances in the 4th inning before the lone run scored on a sac fly...retired his final seven batters faced to conclude the outing.

- ★ Marked his 14th career start going 6.0 innings or more while allowing no walks (last: June 16 at LAD)...has pitched to a 0.69 ERA (91.1IP, 7ER), while the Rays have gone 12-2 across those starts.
- ★ Was his seventh win across seven straight starts since the All-Star break (July 21–pres.)...the Rays have won 16 of his 25 starts this year.
- ★ He became the second Rays pitcher to win seven consecutive starts, joining **Blake Snell** (9GS, Aug. 10–Sept. 23, 2018)...also became the first MLB starter this year with seven wins or more without a loss following the All-Star break.

STAY CLASSY, SAN DIEGO—Across two career appearances (both in relief) against the Padres, Rasmussen has pitched to a 6.00 ERA (3.0IP, 2ER) with one **strikeout**, and opponents going 4-for-12 (.333) against him...his last outing came on Aug. 31, 2024 at Tropicana Field, when he worked 2.0 innings of relief while allowing 2 ER on 4 H and 1 BB in an 11-4 victory over the Padres.

- ★ He is 3-1 with a 2.08 ERA (39.0IP, 9ER), 36 **strikeouts**, and a .183 (26-for-142) opp. average against NL clubs this season.
- ★ Rasmussen has made nine career appearances (five starts) against NL West clubs, pitching to a 2-1 record with a 2.27 ERA (31.2IP, 8ER) with 31 **strikeouts** and a 1.04 WHIP in those contests...in two starts this season against the division, he is 1-1 with a 0.69 ERA (13.0IP, ER), 12 **strikeouts**, and a .191 (9-for-47) opp. average...the ERA is tied for the second-lowest by an AL pitcher (min. 10.0IP) vs. the NL West in 2026...in his five career starts against NL West clubs, has posted a 1.78 ERA (25.1IP, 5ER) with 25 **strikeouts** and a .198 (18-for-91) opp. average.

TROP DAY—The right-hander is making his 13th start at home this season...is 8-3 with a 3.24 ERA (66.2IP, 24ER) and more than five times as many SO (73) than BB (14) in 12 starts at the Trop this year...Rasmussen has logged a career 2.84 ERA (196.2IP, 62ER) at Tropicana Field, the second-lowest ERA in the venue's history (min. 150.0IP), behind **Blake Snell** (2.70).

- ★ With a win tonight, Rasmussen would earn his ninth home victory of the year, which would tie for third most in the majors...the Rays are the only team in the AL with three starting pitchers owning seven home wins or more: **Nick Martinez** (7-3), **Shane McClanahan** (8-1), and Rasmussen.
- ★ Since 2021, Rasmussen's 20 career home wins with the Rays are second most behind McClanahan's 29 wins...boasts a .606 (20-13) winning pct. at home with Tampa Bay.

ALL THE STARS—Since the All-Star break, Rasmussen has gone 7-0 with a 2.20 ERA (41.0IP, 10ER) across seven starts...he is the first pitcher in franchise history to win his first seven starts following the All-Star break and he is the only pitcher in the majors to do so this season.

- ★ His .769 (20-6) winning percentage after the All-Star break as a Ray is the highest in franchise history (min. 30GS) and the third-highest mark since the inaugural All-Star Game in 1933, trailing **Julio Urias** (.844), and **Johnny Beazley** (.826)...is the first pitcher in franchise history since **Tyler Glasnow** (2023) to record seven wins following the All-Star break.
- ★ Rasmussen boasts a career 2.36 ERA (252.0IP, 66ER) across 62 games (45 starts) following the Midsummer Classic...it is the third-lowest clip by a starting pitcher (min. 200.0IP) since 1933 behind **Blake Snell** (2.28) and **Julio Urias** (2.28), and is the fifth-lowest mark by any pitcher behind **Billy Wagner** (2.07), **Javier Lopez** (2.28), Urias (2.28), and Snell (2.28)...Rasmussen's 0.95 WHIP under the same parameters is the lowest mark by a starting pitcher and the third-lowest clip among all pitchers during that span behind **Darren O'Day** (0.94), **Kenley Jansen** (0.95; by decimal points).
