METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off yesterday...On Sunday, the Mets fell to the White Sox, 2-1, in walk-off fashion...The Mets have dropped two of their last three games...Their .667 winning percentage since August 4 is the third-best in the majors...Tonight, the Mets start a six-game homestand against the Brewers (three games) and Astros (three games).

ZAC ATTACK: Through nine career starts, Zac Thornton is 3-4 with a 3.04 ERA (17 ER/50.1 IP) and is holding opposing batters to a .240 (37-161) average...His ERA is the 19th-best in franchise history through a player's first nine career starts, and it is the fourth-best mark by a left-hander in franchise history...Since allowing four earned runs in his debut, he has allowed three or fewer earned runs in each of his last eight starts dating back to June 26 vs. Philadelphia; he is the first Mets rookie to do so since Nolan McLean did so in nine straight games from March 29 - May 14 this season....The longest streak of consecutive starts with three earned runs or fewer by a rookie belongs to Kodai Senga, who made 16 straight such starts from June 23 - September 27, 2023...Per Elias...He is one of eight pitchers in franchise history to allow three or fewer runs in eight of his first nine career starts...Three of his first nine starts have been scoreless and at least 5.0 innings...He joins Nolan McLean as the only two players in franchise history to throw at least 5.0 scoreless innings in three of their first nine career starts.

FOREVER YOUNG: In 31 games following the All-Star break, Jared Young is .309/.364/.485 with 15 runs, seven doubles, two triples, two homers, 13 RBI, seven walks with an .849 OPS...Overall, he is batting .280/.342/.475 with 13 doubles, one triple, eight homers and an .817 OPS against right-handed pitching this year.

AUGUST BOOM: The Mets are 12-8 in August...Their .600 winning percentage is the fourth-best in the National League...New York has hit 31 homers this month, tied for the third-most in the Majors...Only the Cubs (42) have hit more in the National League this month ...Their .445 SLG is the second best in the NL.

GOTTA GO TO BOS: Bo Bichette snapped his on-base streak at 12 games on Sunday...He is batting .316 (25-79) with 11 runs, five doubles, one triple, four homers, 13 RBI and an .929 OPS in 20 games in August...In 71 games since the start of June, he is batting .305/.343/.470 with an .813 OPS.

BIT TORRENS: Over his last 10 games, Luis Torrens is 11-28 (.393) with six home runs, eight runs, 13 RBI, four walks, one steal, three walks, a .469 OBP, a 1.036 SLG and a 1.504 OPS.

BLAME IT ON THE BENGE: After batting .189/.247/.278 with four extra-base hits and six RBI in his first 28 games of the season, since May 1, he is slashing .298/.358/.463 with 32 extra-base hits (15 2B, 3 3B, 14 HR), 47 RBI and an .821 OPS...He has stolen 19 bases this year...Mookie Wilson (1981) owns the franchise record for most steals by a rookie with 24...His 131 hits are tied with Gregg Jeffrieds (1989) for the eighth-most by a Mets rookie...Pete Alonso owns the record with 155 (2019).

CREW-METS NOTES: The Mets have dropped four of their last five to the Brewers...They have won two straight against the Crew in New York after dropping six straight to them at Citi Field.

Ewing, LHP Nate Lavender, OF Nick Morabito, RHP Matt Seelinger, LHP Zac Thornton, RHP Jack Weisenburger and LHP Jefry Yan...The Mets had nine players make their Major League debut in 2025.

IN THE CITI: The Mets have won five of their last six games after dropping three straight at Citi Field...Overall, they are 30-35 at home this season...The team has posted a 3.95 ERA in New York, while batting .233/.309/.381.

LINSANITY: In 34 games following the All-Star break, Francisco Lindor is batting .258/.351/.470 with 18 runs, five doubles, one triple, seven homers, 18 walks, 20 RBI and an .821 OPS...This compares to a .216/.298/.373 with 22 runs, three doubles, three triples, five homers, 12 RBI, 16 walks and a .671 OPS in 40 games in the first half of the season.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets defeated the Padres, 5-2, at Jack Murphy Stadium...Ron Darling made the start and allowed both runs on seven hits with two walks and two strikeouts over 6.2 innings...Mookie Wilson recorded his fourth triple, while Kevin Mitchell doubled for the 21st time...The Mets scored three runs thanks to Keith Hernandez who finished 2-4 with two RBI...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title today.

NEW SKIPPER: Andy Green has been named Interim Manager for the remainder of the 2026 season...Green, who joined the Mets organization in 2023 and previously served as Senior Vice President, Baseball Development, managed the San Diego Padres from 2016-19, guiding the club to a 274-366 (.428) record...The 48-year-old played parts of four Major League seasons with the Diamondbacks (2004-06) and appeared in four games with the Mets in 2009...He will wear #70...The Mets are 25-25 since Green took the helm.

- Allowed a run in the eighth inning and recorded three strikeouts on August 23 at Chicago-AL (1.0 IP, 2 H, ER, 3 K).
- Has pitched to a 1.17 ERA (3 ER/23.0 IP) over 18 appearances this season...16 of his 18 appearances have been scoreless...His ERA is the sixth best in the majors among relievers who have thrown at least 20.0 innings this season.
- Picked up his second save of the season and the third of his career after tossing a scoreless ninth inning and striking out two on August 17 vs. San Diego (1.0 IP, 2 K).
- Has pitched 2.0 or more innings four times this season and during those 8.1 innings hasn't allowed a run and only two hits.
- Earned the win on August 10 at Atlanta (2.0 IP, BB) with 2.0 shutout innings.
- Notched his second career save and first as a Met on August 5 at Cleveland (1.0 IP, BB) when he tossed a scoreless 10th inning...His only other Major League save up until that point came on August 13, 2023, at Pittsburgh while with Cincinnati.
- Tossed 2.1 scoreless innings in his season and Mets debut on May 19 at Washington (2.1 IP, H, K)...Marked his longest Major League appearance.
- Was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse prior to their game on July 21...Marks his fourth stint with the team this season.
- In 24 appearances (seven starts) with Syracuse this season he is 3-2 and has pitched to 4.75 ERA (16 ER/30.1 IP) with 30 strikeouts...His last appearance came on July 17 vs. Buffalo where he tossed a scoreless inning and stuck out the side on 15 pitches.
- Pitched in the WBC for Mexico, and over two appearances, he allowed one run over 2.0 innings.
- Before this season, his last Major League appearance came on April 3rd, 2024, at Milwaukee while with Minnesota...He pitched in two games for the Twins that season.
- Made 31 appearances for the Reds in 2023 and pitched to a 3.69 ERA (13 ER/31.2 IP) with three wins and one save...Over 34 Major League appearances between Cincinnati and Minnesota from 2022-2024, he went 3-0 with one save, a 3.99 ERA (17 ER/38.1 IP) and 28 strikeouts.
