TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners begin the second half of the season and a 6-game homestand tonight with the first of 3 games against the San Francisco Giants (7/17-7/19), with Seattle also welcoming the Cincinnati Reds (3 G, 7/20-7/22) to T-Mobile Park on the homestand...tonight's second-half lid lifter will be televised live on **Mariners TV** and **KING5** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call, with **Angie Mentink** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners come into play tonight with a 48-49 record, but 27-20 in their home ballpark, T-Mobile Park...Seattle owns a 9-5-1 series record in 15 home series this season...Seattle is 18-13 in series openers this season...the Mariners are 40-24 (.625) when homering and 8-25 (.242) when they do not.

- **Programming Alert** - Tomorrow's game against the Giants will air live on **FOX** (exclusively) with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Eric Karros** on the call...first pitch is scheduled for **5:08 p.m. PT**.
- **Round Numbers** - Tomorrow's starting pitcher **Bryan Woo** has 500.0 career innings pitched, allowing 400 hits, 100 walks, and posting an even 1.000 WHIP.
- **Unsung Hero** - Right-handed reliever **Eduard Bazarido**'s next appearance will mark his 150th in a Mariners uniform...in 149 games with Seattle, he's 10-2 with a 2.90 ERA, 184 strikeouts and 59 walks.
- **Hot In Herre** - With his next home run, **Cal Raleigh** (currently at 162 career HR) would tie Nelson Cruz (163 HR with Seattle) for 6th on the franchise's all-time home runs list.

THE BRYCE IS RIGHT...tonight's starter **Bryce Miller** has shined in 10 games (9 starts) this season...among pitchers with at least 50.0 innings pitched this year, he ranks 2nd in WHIP (0.832) behind only Jacob Misiorowski-MIL (0.757), 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (7.22) behind only Tarik Skubal-DET (8.09) and 6th in ERA (2.18)...Miller has 65 strikeouts and 9 walks across 57.2 innings pitched.

PITCHING DURING THE FIRST HALF...the Mariners pitching staff led the way or ranked highly in several major categories during the first half of the season...as a unit, they ranked 1st in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.41), 1st in fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.5), 1st in fewest home runs allowed per 9 innings (0.9), 1st in fielding independent pitching (3.53), 4th in *FanGraphs* wins above replacement (13.4), 4th in WHIP (1.182), 4th in opponent OPS (.677) and 6th in ERA (3.61).

RUN PREVENTION...the Mariners have allowed 3-or-fewer runs in 50 games this season, tied for 5th-most such games in the big leagues...Seattle is 39-11 (.780) in those contests, ranking 17th in the league...Seattle is 9-38 (.191) when allowing 4+ runs in a game.

MUÑ I NEED...closer **Andrés Muñoz** has been flawless in his last 10 appearances (6/16-c), not allowing a run with 14 strikeouts and 4 walks, limiting opponents to a .147 batting average (5x34).

NAYLOR SWIFT...first baseman **Josh Naylor** is 18-for-22 in stolen base attempts this season and is 37-for-41 with the Mariners after going 19-for-19 in SB attempts with Seattle last year...since Naylor made his Mariners debut on July 25, 2025, his 37 stolen bases rank T-4th in the Majors with José Ramírez-CLE, trailing Jazz Chisholm Jr.-NYY (47 SB), Bobby Witt Jr.-KC (41) and Jose Caballero-TB/NYY (38).

LAST TIME...the last time the Giants played at T-Mobile Park was a 3-game series from Aug. 23-25, 2024, which marked the first series of **Dan Wilson**'s managerial tenure...the Mariners took 2 out of 3 in the series and on Aug. 23 in Dan's first game as skipper, Seattle overcame a 5-1 deficit to win by a 6-5 score in 10 innings...**Leo Rivas** supplied the walk-off single in the Mariners triumph.

COLE WORLD...second baseman **Cole Young** has 11 defensive runs saved this season, tied for most among MLB second basemen with JJ Wetherholt-STL...Young has swung the bat well over the last month, posting an .815 OPS across his last 28 games (6/11-c) with a .510 slugging percentage and 7 home runs over 108 plate appearances during that span.

RANDY THE ALL-STAR...left fielder **Randy Arozarena** went 1-for-2 for the American League as Seattle's sole representative in the 2026 MLB All-Star Game...Arozarena is batting .286 (93x325) with 59 runs, 21 doubles, 1 triple, 11 home runs, 45 RBI, 37 walks and 19 stolen bases, getting on base at a .380 clip, slugging .458 with an .838 OPS in 89 games this season...he is a three-time All-Star (2023, '25-'26) and has made the Midsummer Classic in each of the last two seasons with Seattle and is the 15th player in Mariners history to make multiple All-Star teams with the club.

LEFTIES SWINGIN' IT...a pair of left-handed hitting outfielders rank as two of the top three home run hitters on the team this year: **Dominic Canzone** (15 HR) and **Luke Raley** (14 HR)...**Julio Rodríguez** also has 14 HR...Canzone ranks as the best hitter on the team this year by OPS (.863), slugging percentage (.529) and OPS+ (144)...Raley has a .741 OPS (109 OPS+) and has appeared at all 3 outfield positions.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners finished the first half of the season with a 48-49 record, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...since 2021, the Mariners have the **best second half record in the American League?**...over the last 5 seasons (2021-25), Seattle has compiled a 196-147 record (.571) after the All-Star Break, which ranks 1st in the AL and 4th in MLB, trailing only the Dodgers (.656/227-119), Brewers (.587/200-141) and Braves (.585/203-144) in the second half.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - JULY 17

- **1979** - The Mariners hosted the All-Star Game in the Kingdome before a record Seattle Baseball crowd of 58,905. The crowd greeted Mariners representative Bruce Bochte with a standing ovation, and Bochte responded with an RBI single. The National League eventually edged the American League, 7-6.
- **1986** - **Mark Langston** tossed a career-high 10 innings, as the Mariners topped Boston, 5-1. Jim Presley's grand slam in the bottom of the 11th inning was the game winner.
- **1999** - **Raúl Ibáñez** hits the first grand slam in Safeco Field/T-Mobile Park history.
- **2018** - **Jean Segura** hit a 3-run home run in the All-Star Game to put the AL team ahead, ultimately helping the team win 8-6.
- **2022** - The Mariners close out the first half of the season with their 14th-consecutive win, one shy of matching the franchise-best mark of 15-consecutive wins during the 2001 season. It marks the longest streak going into the All-Star Break in MLB history (since 1933).

ABOUT BRYCE MILLER...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 11th appearance (10th start) of the season and the 85th (84th start) of his career...it marks his 2nd career start against the Giants and 1st of the season.
- Is in his 4th season with Seattle; selected by Seattle in the 4th round (113th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Derek Miller on July 20, 2021.
- Played 3 seasons at Texas A&M from 2019-21.
- Was born in Mount Pleasant, Texas and attended New Braunfels High School in New Braunfels, Texas.

LAST TIME OUT...L#3 on July 9 at Miami, tossed 5.0 innings, allowing 6 runs (4 ER) on 9 hits and 4 walks while striking out 3 batters in his last start before the All-Star break.

KING OF THE HILL...his 0.832 WHIP this season leads the AL and ranks 2nd in MLB (min. 50.0 IP), just trailing Jacob Misiorowski-MIL (0.757) while he ranks 2nd in MLB in BB/9 (1.4), K/BB (7.22), BB% (4.2), just behind Tarik Skubal-DET in all 3 categories...also ranks 6th in MLB in ERA (2.18), T-6th in opponent batting average (.190), and 6th in strikeout percentage (30.2).

WHAT A STRETCH...is 1-of-6 pitchers since 2023 to record 65+ strikeouts to 9-or-fewer walks through their first 10 starts of the season, joining Tarik Skubal-DET (2025, 2026), Joe Ryan-MIN (2025), Nathan Eovaldi-TEX (2025), Jack Flaherty-DET (2024) and Chris Sale-ATL (2024)...is the 7th pitcher in MLB all-time to have 14-or-fewer earned runs, 9-or-fewer walks, 57.0+ IP and 65+ strikeouts through their first 10 games of the season.

HOME AT LAST...in 22.2 innings over 4 starts at home, has allowed only 1 run (1 ER)...in all 4 starts at home, has allowed 3-or-fewer base runners while striking out 6+ batters over 5.0+ IP...is the first pitcher in MLB history to record 4 consecutive home games with 3-or-fewer base runners allowed over 5.0+ IP...leads MLB starting pitchers in home games this season in WHIP (0.397), ERA (0.40), and K/BB (14.0) this season (min. 20.0 IP)...owns the 8th best WHIP in home games in MLB since 2023 with a 0.987 WHIP (min. 200.0 IP)...also ranks 8th in opponent batting average (.208) and 10th in ERA (3.16) since 2023 while ranking 10th in K/BB (4.24) among AL pitchers.

MASTER OF THE CRAFT...logged 11 strikeouts and 0 walks on June 25 at Pittsburgh for the 2nd time in his career (also: 9/11/25)...he is 1-of-6 Mariners pitchers all-time to record multiple such starts and he is 1-of-10 pitchers in MLB to have recorded multiple such starts since 2025...logged 6 consecutive games of 6+ strikeouts for the first time in his career (5/31-7/2)...is the first Mariners pitcher to do so this season (last: **Bryan Woo**, 8/5/25-8/27/25)...he has recorded 6+ strikeouts and 2-or-fewer walks in 7 appearances this season, tied 6th most in the AL since the start of May...his 7.22 K/BB in 2026 ranks 2nd in MLB (min. 50.0 IP) while his career 3.76 K/BB ranks 10th best in the AL since 2023 (min. 400.0 IP).

KEEPING THE PATHS CLEAN...owns a career 10.06 base runners per 9, ranking 10th lowest in MLB since 2023 (min. 400.0 IP)...his 7.49 base runners per 9 this season leads the AL and ranks 2nd in MLB in 2026 (min. 55.0 IP)...his 23 career games with 4-or-fewer base runners allowed over 5.0+ IP (last: 7/2 vs. LAA) rank 4th in MLB since 2023, joining rotation-mates **Bryan Woo** (T-2nd, 25 G) **Logan Gilbert** (T-2nd, 25 G), and **Luis Castillo** (T-8th, 18 G) in the top 10 most such games in MLB over that span...he is 1-of-3 pitchers with 6+ such games this season.

CRACKING THE WHIP...ranks 2nd in MLB with a 0.832 WHIP in 2026 (min. 50.0 IP)...ranks 3rd among Mariners all-time WHIP leaders (min. 400 IP) with a 1.090 WHIP...his 114 walks are the 6th fewest through a starting pitchers first 84 games with the Mariners (min. 400.0 IP) while his 387 hits allowed are T-3rd fewest, trailing **Bryan Woo**'s 371 hits allowed and Paul Abbot's 347...has recorded 3 outings of 2-or-fewer hits and 1-or-fewer walks over 5.0+ IP this season (last: 7/2 vs. LAA)...he is 1-of-5 pitchers to have 3+ such games this season, along with **Logan Gilbert** (3 G), Paul Skenes-PIT (4 G), Drew Rasmussen-TB (3 G), and Cam Schlichter-NYY (3 G).

BRYCE BESTS ALL...is dominating lefty batters through his first 10 appearances this season ranking 5th in WHIP (0.86) and 9th in opponent batting average (.189) against left handed hitters in MLB (min. 30.0 IP)...also owns a 5.2 K/BB, ranking 6th in MLB, and a 9.2 K/9...historically matches up better against right handed batters...ranks 4th in WHIP (0.96) and 9th in K/BB (5.9), just trailing **Logan Gilbert**, against right handed batters among MLB pitchers since 2023 (min. 200.0 IP)...ranks 5th in K/BB (11.3) and T-11th in WHIP (0.80) in MLB against RHH this season (min. 25.0 IP).

WHAT THE NUMBERS ARE SAYING...through 10 outings this season, is posting career-high marks in whiff rate (28.8), chase rate (37.0), strikeout rate (30.2), and hard hit rate (28.4), which is 15.56 points lower than his average hard hit rate over the previous 3 seasons...his hard hit rate ranks in the top 2% of pitchers this season, while his walk rate (4.2) is sitting 4.5 points better than his 8.7 mark last season...through his 10 appearances this season, he has increased the average velocity of his 4-seamer to 96.3 mph compared to 94.8 mph last season.

QUICK AND SNAPPY...owns a 14.2 pitches per inning, ranking 2nd in MLB in 2026 (min. 50.0 IP)...is the lowest season mark in his career thus far, just ahead of his 15.2 pitches per inning in 2024...records a first pitch strike 64.5% of the time while he earns a first pitch swing 43.0% of the time, highest in MLB...owns 28 strikeouts to 2 walks while holding batters to a .169 (15x89) batting average when the they swing at the first pitch.

ALL IN THE FIRST HALF...became 1-of-2 MLB pitchers all-time to have recorded 8+ consecutive games (5/19-7/2) of 5-or-fewer base runners allowed over 5.0+ IP in a season, joining Jacob DeGrom (2x, last: 8/2/22-9/18/22)...recorded 4 consecutive starts of 7+ strikeouts and no walks (6/12-7/2) to become the first player in Mariners history to do so...recorded 5.0+ innings with 2-or-fewer runs allowed in each of his first 7 appearances in 2026, marking the 1st time a Mariners pitcher has accomplished the feat.
