To clinch a spot in the postseason for the 10th time in team history and the first time since 2023.

RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their seven-game, eight-day road trip against the Rangers (1-1, two to play) and Braves (three to play) tonight in Arlington...are on a stretch of 14 road games within their final 23 games of the season (Sept. 3-27), going 1-1 thus far...are 10-11 in their last 21 contests (Aug. 14-pres.) in the wake of an 18-4 run between July 20-Aug. 12...despite the 10-11 stretch, they are still an MLB-best 28-15 since July 20...have the toughest remaining schedule in the AL with an opp. winning pct. of .527...in their seven remaining series (including current set), the Rays will face five opponents that are currently in position to qualify for the postseason...hold a 4.0-game lead over the second-place Yankees in the AL East standings, marking the third-latest date in franchise history they have held a lead of 4.0 games or more (Oct. 3, 2021 - 8.0GA; Sept. 27, 2020 - 7.0GA)...have spent 110 days leading the division, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...this includes a season-high 70 consecutive days in first place (June 27-pres.)...are seeking their fifth AL East division title, first since winning the division in back-to-back seasons from 2020-21...have held the AL's best record outright for 109 days, the most in franchise history, according to Stats Perform.

★ The Rays snapped a 10-game losing streak at Globe Life Field with a 7-6 win over the Rangers...it marked the fourth-longest road losing streak against any opponent in franchise history (see table on the right).

★ **Chandler Simpson** registered his 50th multi-hit game of the campaign (see more in "The Leading Chan" note below).

★ **Nick Martinez** made his 27th start of the year and earned his 14th quality start, marking single-season career highs in both categories.

★ The Rays improved to 75-0 when leading after the 8th inning the season...they are attempting to become the third team since 2021 to finish a season 75-0 or better when leading after the 8th frame, joining the 2024 Guardians (82-0) and 2022 Mets (89-0), per Elias.

★ With a win tonight, the Rays would claim the season series over the Rangers for the first time since 2022 (4-3) and secure at least a split of their current four-game set...additionally, the Rays would return to a season-high 28 games above .500 for the fourth time (last: Sept. 1) this season with a win.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays placed **LHP Garrett Cleavinger** (left forearm tightness) on the 15-day IL and selected **RHP Ty Johnson** from Triple-A Durham...to make room on the 40-man roster, **INF Oliver Dunn** was designated for assignment...Johnson will wear No. 55.

★ Johnson would become the fifth player (fourth pitcher) to make his MLB debut with the Rays this season, joining **C Kenny Piper** (Aug. 3 at COL), **RHP Alex Cook** (July 31 vs. CWS), **RHP Chase Solesky** (May 18 vs. BAL), and **RHP Trevor Martin** (April 20 vs. CIN)...he would be the first Rays pitcher to debut on the road since **LHP Joe Rock** on June 28, 2025 at BAL and the first right-hander since **RHP Justin Sterner** on May 31, 2024 at BAL.

ALL RAS, NO BRAKES—Tonight's probable starter, **Drew Rasmussen**, enters play with 146.1 innings on the season, 3.2 innings shy of his 2025 career high, the two-time All-Star has already set career highs in wins (14), strikeouts (149), and quality starts (15) this season...he holds a 2.95 ERA (146.1IP, 48ER) and a 0.93 WHIP, putting him on pace to become the third pitcher in Rays history to finish a season with 142.0 innings pitched, a sub-3.00 ERA, and a sub-1.00 WHIP...he would join **Shane McClellan** (2022, 166.1IP, 2.54ERA, 0.93WHIP) and **Blake Snell** (2018, 180.2IP, 1.89ERA, 0.97WHIP)...prior to 2026, only 60 different pitchers (99x) in the history of the AL have accomplished the feat.

THE LEADING CHAN—**Chandler Simpson** (.311) is six points behind **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (.317) for the AL's best batting average...he is attempting to join **Yandy Diaz** (2023) as the only AL batting champions in Rays history...he could also become the sixth player in AL/NL history to win a batting title in one of his first two MLB seasons, including the third since 1942 along with **SEA Ichiro Suzuki** (.350, 1st season) in 2001 and Rays Hall of Famer **BOS Wade Boggs** (.361, 2nd season) in 1983...after posting a .295 (122-for-109) average last season, he is attempting to become the fifth player in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to bat .295 or better in each of his first two MLB seasons (min. 400AB in each season), joining **CHC Starlin Castro** (2010-11), **NY Y Robinson Cano** (2005-06), **STL Albert Pujols** (2001-02), and **Suzuki** (2001-02)...Simpson leads the AL in singles (135) and triples (6)—no Ray has ever paced the AL in the former category over a full season, and only **Carl Crawford** (4x, last: 2010) and **Mallex Smith** (2018) have finished atop the Junior Circuit's leaderboard in the latter...since 1983, only two AL hitters have led the league in both singles and triples: **CLE Amed Rosario** in 2022 and **KC Whit Merrifield** in 2019...Simpson needs 10 singles over the Rays final 21 games to match Crawford's club record from 2003 (145).

★ Simpson registered his 50th multi-hit game of the season last night, becoming the 11th Ray (19x) in franchise history to reach that mark in a single season...he is nine multi-hit games shy of tying **Carl Crawford's** 2006 franchise record of 59 multi-hit contests.

★ He tallied another infield hit last night, bringing his season total to 57 infield hits...he is tied with **Suzuki** (2008) for the fifth-most infield hits in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008), per Baseball Reference (see table on the right).

★ Over his last 63 games (June 19-pres.), Simpson paces the majors in batting average (.365/89-for-244), hits, and stolen bases (24).

★ With 38 SB, third most in MLB, Simpson is two steals shy of joining **CAL Chad Curtis** (1992-93), **MON Delino DeShields** (1990-91), **STL Vince Coleman** (1985-86), and **NY Y Bert Daniels** (1910-11) as the only players in the modern era (since 1900) to reach 40 stolen bases in each of their first two major league campaigns.

HOME RUN DERBY—With 37 HR, **Junior Caminero** is tied with **HOU Yordan Alvarez** for the most homers in the AL, trailing only **PHI Kyle Schwarber** (40) and **CHC Pete Crow-Armstrong** (39) across all of MLB...the 37 HR marked the third most by a Ray before the end of August, trailing Caminero last season (39) and **Carlos Peña** (38) in 2009...he is three long balls shy of becoming the first player in franchise history with multiple 40-HR campaigns (45HR in 2025) and needs 9 HR over the Rays final 21 games to tie Peña's franchise record from 2007 (46HR).

THE YANDY MAN—During his active four-game hitting streak, **Yandy Diaz** has slashed .500/.556/.813 (8-for-16) with 2 2B, 1 HR, 1 RBI, 3 R, and a 1.368 OPS...since Aug. 1, Diaz has collected multiple hits in 15 of his 31 games—in all of MLB, only teammate **Chandler Simpson** (17) has more multi-hit efforts in the majors and no other player in the majors has more than 13 (ATH **Henry Bolte** & MIN **Luke Keaschall**)...Diaz is looking to become the second player in franchise history to finish back-to-back seasons with a .300 average or better (min. 502PA)...he would join **Carl Crawford**, who turned the trick twice in his career, doing so in three straight seasons between 2005-07 and in back-to-back seasons from 2009-10...Diaz also finished the 2023 season with an AL-best .330 average...he and Crawford are the only players in team history to have multiple qualified .300 or better seasons.

PITCHER'S PARADISE—The Rays staff has yielded 3 ER or fewer in nine of the last 13 games (Aug. 22-pres.), turning in a 3.23 ERA (117.0IP, 42ER) while holding opponents to a .205/.258/.323 (88-for-429) line—they lead the AL in opp. AVG, opp. OBP, opp. SLG, WHIP (1.00), hits per 9.0 IP (6.77), walks per 9.0 IP (2.23), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.48) over that span...entering that stretch, Rays pitchers had permitted five runs or more in a season-high six consecutive games (Aug. 16-21)...the starting rotation has a 2.99 ERA during the 13-game span, going 6-3 with 59 SO against 10 BB...eight of their last 12 starts have been quality.

THE RAY WAY—The Rays clinched a winning season before the end of August for the fourth time (excl. 2020), joining 2023 (82-52), 2021 (84-48), and 2008 (84-51)...this marks the 13th winning season across 29 campaigns in franchise history, all of which have come in the last 19 seasons becoming the Rays in 2008 after the Devil Rays had none across the franchise's first decade of existence (1998-2007)...including results thus far from this season, the 13 winning seasons since 2008 are tied with the **Braves** and **Brewers** for fourth most among all major league clubs, trailing the **Dodgers** (18), **Yankees** (17), and **Cardinals** (16)...the **Astros**, **Guardians**, and **Red Sox** (all 11) are the next closest AL teams over that timeframe.

★ This marks the fourth time the Rays entered September atop the AL East, joining 2021 (84-48), 2020 (25-11), and 2008 (84-51)...they went on to win the division crown in each of those seasons, including World Series appearances in 2020 and 2008 and a club-record 100 wins in 2021.

★ The Rays are approaching their first postseason berth since 2023 and sixth in the last eight seasons since 2019...as it stands, their five postseason appearances since 2019 are sixth most in the majors, trailing the **Dodgers** (7), **Astros** (6), **Braves** (6), **Brewers** (6), and **Yankees** (6)...they have made the postseason nine times since becoming the Rays in 2008, tied with the **Astros** and **Brewers** for fifth most in MLB behind the **Dodgers** (15), **Yankees** (13), **Braves** (10), and **Cardinals** (10).

A LONE STAR SATURDAY—The Rays continue their four-game set in Texas against the Rangers tonight...they took two of three contests in their home series against the Rangers this season (July 28-30) and need to win one of the remaining two games to claim their first season series against Texas since 2022 (4-3)...last night's win snapped a 10-game losing streak at Globe Life Field dating back to July 17, 2023...they are 7-17 overall in their last 24 contests vs. the club over that span...prior to that stretch, they went 12-7 between 2016-22 in Arlington.

★ In 44 career games vs. the Rangers, **Yandy Diaz** has hit .340 (55-for-162) with 8 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR, 13 RBI, and 23 R...he has multiple hits in each of his last three games against the club (July 30, 2026-pres.).

TONIGHT'S START—**Drew Rasmussen** will toe the rubber tonight for his 27th start of the campaign and his 157th career appearance (108th start)...he ranks highly among AL arms (min. 100.0IP) in strikeout-to-walk ratio (1st, 5.52), WHIP (1st, 0.93), opp. on-base pct. (T1st, .249), opp. OPS (2nd, .558), walks per 9.0 innings (2nd, 1.66), opp. SLG (3rd, .309), and opp. AVG (4th, .203), quality starts (T5th, 15), and ERA (7th, .295).

- ★ Rasmussen's active seven-game winning streak is tied for the ninth longest in TB history, three shy of the record (**Jalen Beeks** - 10W) and the longest since **Shane McClanahan**'s eight-game streak in 2023.
- ★ Since 2021, his 2.83 ERA (585.2IP, 184ER) ranks fourth among MLB pitchers (min 500.0IP) behind **LAD Shohei Ohtani** (2.68), **ATL Chris Sale** (2.78), and **MIL Brandon Woodruff** (2.79).
- ★ Is 5.0 innings shy of tying **Ryan Yarbrough** (579.2 IP) for the ninth most in franchise history...**Matt Garza**'s 592.1 innings rank eighth.
- ★ Rasmussen boasts a 0.96 WHIP across 66 career outings (53 starts) at stadiums with domes or retractable roofs, the lowest mark in franchise history (min. 300.0IP)...his 2.83 ERA (302.1IP, 95ER) under the same criteria is the second-lowest clip in club history behind **Snell**'s 2.62 mark.
- ★ When pitching the day following a Rays win, Rasmussen is 10-4 with a 2.99 ERA (102.1P, 34ER)...he is the only pitcher in the majors with 10 wins or more following a team win; he's 27-15 lifetime in such games.
- ★ The Rays have won each of his last eight starts since July 21 and 17 of 26 this year...the eight-game team winning streak in his outings is tied for the fourth-longest by a Rays starter in club history, including the longest since **McClanahan** in 2023 (8), with **Snell**'s club-record 10-start streak in 2018 being the last longer stretch.

LAST TIME OUT—Twirled his 15th quality start of the season despite not factoring into the decision on Aug. 30 vs. SD (6.0IP, 4H, 2ER, 2BB, 6SO)...retired 11 of his first 14 batters faced before walking **Ty France** and allowing a single to **Jackson Merrill** prior to a two-run single by **Xander Bogaerts**...set down eight of his final nine batters, including three strikeouts, before handing the ball over to **Cam Booser** to start the 7th inning.

- ★ Surpassed **Tyler Glasnow** (526) for the ninth-most strikeouts in franchise history with a strikeout of **Freddy Fermin** in the 2nd inning.
- ★ Was the sixth time this season Rasmussen was the starting pitcher in a series finale to complete a sweep.
- ★ Marked his first start without receiving a decision since July 4 at HOU, snapping a streak of seven wins in as many outings.

IT'S BASEBALL TIME IN TEXAS—Across three career starts against the Rangers, Rasmussen has pitched to a 1-1 record with a 4.15 ERA (13.0IP, 6ER) and 15 strikeouts, with opponents going 9-for-47 (.191) against him...his last outing against Texas came on June 3, 2025 at Steinbrenner Field, tossing 5.0 shutout innings of one-hit ball (W, 5.0IP, H, OER, 8SO)...the Rays are 1-2 lifetime when Rasmussen starts against the Rangers.

- ★ He is 11-4 with a 3.29 ERA (101.1IP, 37ER), 107 strikeouts, and a .212 (79-for-373) opp. average in 18 starts against AL clubs this season.
- ★ Rasmussen has made 25 career appearances (21 starts) against AL West clubs, pitching to an 11-4 record with a 3.20 ERA (112.2IP, 40ER), 105 strikeouts, and a 0.91 WHIP in those contests...his career WHIP against the AL West is the fourth lowest by any pitcher (min. 100.0IP) since the division was established in 1969, trailing **Chris Sale** (0.89), **Clayton Kershaw** (0.90), and **Nick Pivetta** (0.91)...in four starts this season against the division, he is 2-1 with a 5.14 ERA (21.0IP, 12ER), 17 strikeouts, and a .208 (16-for-77) opp. average.
- ★ Has a career 2-1 record with a 4.68 ERA (25.0IP, 13ER), a 1.00 WHIP, and 14 strikeouts over five starts while pitching in the state of Texas...will mark his second start in the Lone Star State this season after getting the ball on July 4 at HOU (5.0IP, 6H, 5ER, BB, 2SO, 2HR).

THIS ROAD (GLOBE) LIFE—The right-hander is making his 14th road start of the season tonight, fashioning a 6-2 record with a 2.69 ERA (73.2IP, 22ER), a 0.87 WHIP, and 70 strikeouts away from Tropicana Field...his road ERA is the fifth-lowest clip in the AL and ninth-lowest mark in the majors (min. 70.0IP), which would be the third-lowest road ERA by a starter in franchise history under the same criteria behind **Nick Martinez** (2.15 - 2026) and **Blake Snell** (2.45 - 2018).

ALL THE STARS—Since the All-Star break, Rasmussen has gone 7-0 with a 2.30 ERA (47.0IP, 12ER) across eight starts...despite not factoring into the decision during his most recent outing on Aug. 30 vs. SD, he is the first pitcher in franchise history to win his first seven starts following the All-Star break and he is the only pitcher in the majors to do so this season.

- ★ His .769 (20-6) winning percentage after the All-Star break as a Ray is the highest in franchise history (min. 30GS) and the third-highest mark since the inaugural All-Star Game in 1933, trailing **Julio Urias** (.844), and **Johnny Beazley** (.826)...his seven wins following the break are the most by a Ray since **Tyler Glasnow** (8) in 2023.
- ★ Rasmussen boasts a career 2.37 ERA (252.0IP, 68ER) across 63 games (46 starts) following the Midsummer Classic...it is tied with Clayton Kershaw (2.37) for the second-lowest clip by a starting pitcher (min. 200.0IP) since 1933 behind **Blake Snell** (2.28) and is the sixth-lowest mark by any pitcher behind **Billy Wagner** (2.07), **Snell** (2.28), **Julio Urias** (2.28), and **Aroldis Chapman** (2.36)...Rasmussen's 0.95 WHIP under the same parameters is the lowest mark by all pitchers during that span.
