TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 7 -day, 6 -game homestand (2-2) with the 2 nd of 3 games against the Los Angeles Dodgers ( $0-1 \ldots$ Seattle opened the homestand with a series win over the Los Angeles Angels (2-1)...following Sunday's series finale vs. the Dodgers, the Mariners will embark on their final road trip of the season to Oakland (3 G, Sept. 18-20) and Texas (3 G, Sept. 22-24)...tonight's game will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS with Dave Sims and Mike Blowers on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on Seattle Sports (710 AM) and Mariners.com with Rick Rizzs and Aaron Goldsmith on the call.
ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners lost last night's series opener vs. the Dodgers by a $6-3$ score...despite the loss, the Mariners are 18-11 over their last 29 games, 26-14 over their last 40, 28-15 over their last 43, 31-16 over their last 47, 34-18 over their last 52 and 43-24 over their last 67 games...the Mariners are 6224 when scoring at least 4 runs and 19-42 when scoring 3-or-fewer...the Mariners are 41-31 at T-Mobile Park and 40-35 on the road this season...they are 27-25 in day games and 54-41 at night.

- Déjà Vu All Over Again - The Mariners were also 81-66 after 147 games during the 2022 season.
- Interleague Play - This weekend's series vs. the Dodgers is the final interleague series of the 2023 regular season for Seattle...the Mariners are 22-22 (.500) in interleague games this season.
- Long Division - Of Seattle's 15 remaining regular season games, 12 are against AL West Division opponents (OAK 3, TEX 7, HOU 3).
- Clemente Award Nominee - Marco Gonzales was named yesterday as the Seattle Mariners nominee for the 2023 Roberto Clemente Award...it's Gonzales' 2nd-consecutive year being nominated for the award, which is presented annually in recognition of a Major League player who best represents the game of baseball through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy and positive contributions, both on and off the field.
TEOSCAR HERNÁNDEZ EXTENDS ON-BASE STREAK TO 29...Teoscar Hernández went 1 -for- 5 with 1 RBI in last night's game, extending his on-base streak to 29 games (8/15-c), longest active on-base streak (via H, BB or HBP) in the Majors and the longest streak by a Mariners player this season, surpassing Julio Rodríguez (27 G, July 1-Aug. 2)...Teo's 29-game on-base streak is Seattle's longest on-base streak since Robinson Canó's 34-game on-base streak from April 30-June 5, 2016...Hernández during his streak is batting .361 ( $43 \times 119$ ) with 16 runs, 8 doubles, 8 home runs, 29 RBI, 6 walks and 1 stolen base, while getting on base at a .392 clip and slugging .630 with a 1.023 OPS.
STREAKING BACK FROM THE IL...Jarred Kelenic went 2 -for- 3 with 1 walk in last night's game, extending his hitting streak to 9 games, 1 shy of his career-high 10-game hitting streak from April 5-16, 2023...during his active 9 -game streak, Kelenic is batting .344 ( $11 \times 32$ ) with 3 runs scored, 3 doubles, 6 RBI, 2 walks and 1 stolen base, while reaching base at a .382 clip and slugging .438 with a .820 OPS.. with a hit tonight, Jarred would be the third Mariners player this season with multiple hitting streaks of 10+ games, joining Julio Rodriguez ( 15 G \& 11 G) and Ty France ( 14 G \& 11 G)...the Mariners have not had 3+ players with multiple 10-game hitting streaks in a season since 2015: Kyle Seager ( 12 G \& 12 G ), Robinson Canó ( 16 G \& 11 G) and Nelson Cruz ( 21 G \& 10 G).
WELCOME TO THE J-ROD SHOW...Julio Rodríguez went 2 -for-5 with 1 run scored in last night's game...Julio has hit safely in 7 consecutive games, including multiple hits in 5 of 7 games during that span ( $9 / 8-\mathrm{c}$ )...during the 7 -game hitting streak, he is batting . 467 ( $14 \times 30$ ) with 9 runs, 2 doubles, 3 home runs, 6 RBI and 1 walk, while reaching base at a .484 clip and slugging .833 with a 1.317 OPS...overall this season, Julio leads the American Leaque in hits (173), ranking ahead of Marcus Semien-TEX (169)...Julio ranks 2nd in the AL in total bases (301) behind Shohei Ohtani-LAA (325), 3rd in RBI (99), 4th in extra-base hits (66), 7 th in home runs (30), T-4th in runs (95) and 3rd in stolen bases (36).
- 30/30 Club - Julio ( $30 \mathrm{HR}, 36 \mathrm{SB}$ ) is the 4th player age 22-or-younger with $30+$ home runs and 30+ stolen bases in a season, joining Alex Rodriguez-SEA (1998), Mike Trout-LAA (2012) \& Ronald Acuña Jr.-ATL (2019)...Julio, who wears \#44, is the 44th individual to join the 30/30 club in MLB history.
- Keeping It 100 - Rodríguez is 1 RBI away from a $100-\mathrm{RBI}$ season...Julio would join Alex RodriguezSEA (1998) \& Ronald Acuña Jr.-ATL (2019) to become just the 3rd player age 22-or-younger with a 30/30 season and 100 RBI in the same year...Julio would join Ken Griffey Jr. (2x, 1991-92) and A-Rod ( $2 x, 1996, ~ ' 98$ ) as the only Mariners with $100+$ RBI in age 22-or-younger seasons.
PITCH PERFECT...the Mariners pitching staff leads the Maiors in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.60), walks-per-9 innings (2.53) and ERA (3.73), while ranking 2nd in fewest runs allowed (600), 2nd in fWAR (19.9), T2nd in WHIP (1.18), T-1st in FIP (3.81), 2nd in quality starts (69), 5th in opponent batting average (.238), 7th in strikeouts, 7th in strikeouts-per-9 innings (9.12).
THE BRYCE IS RIGHT...Bryce Miller is 1 of 11 rookie pitchers in the Majors this season to have made $20+$ starts...among MLB rookies with at least 20 starts this season, Bryce ranks 1st in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.74), 1st in WHIP (1.11), 3rd in opponent batting average (.243), 5th in ERA (4.05), 5th in wins (8), 7th in strikeouts (109), 9th in innings pitched (117.2).
CAREER YEAR FOR CRAWFORD...J.P. Crawford went 1 -for-5 with 1 double in last night's game and remains 1 RBI shy of his career-high 54 RBI registered during the 2021 season...the Mariners shortstop this year has already tallied career-highs in home runs (15) and walks (83) and is on pace to set careerhighs in on-base percentage (.376), slugging (.421) and OPS (.797).
CATCHING ON...Mariners catcher Cal Raleigh has 16 home runs over his last 48 games (7/22-c), leading Major League catchers with 28 home runs overall this season...with 2 more homers this season, \#29 would become the 29th catcher in MLB history (min. $60 \%$ of games at catcher) with a $30+$ home run season... Cal already has 57 career home runs in 297 games, ranking 7th-most in MLB history by a catcher over their first 300 games (min. 60\% games as catcher)...he trails only Gary Sánchez ( 86 HR ), Rudy York ( 77 HR), Mike Piazza ( 68 HR ), Will Smith ( 62 HR ), Earl Williams ( 60 HR ) and Wilin Rosario ( 59 HR ).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...both games this weekend against the Dodgers are sold out, with last night's game drawing 43,823 fans, and...AS YOU MAY ALSO KNOW...the Mariners have drawn 35,000+ fans in 7 of their last 10 home games and 30,000+ fans in 9 of their last 10, but...DID YOU KNOW?...the Mariners lead the American League with a $.625(20-12)$ winning percentage in home games with $35,000+$ fans in attendance?...Seattle ranks ahead of Toronto (.522/28-24) and Texas (.522/12-11) among AL teams with at least 2 home games drawing $35,000+$ fans...Seattle is $21-19$ (.525) this season with less than 35,000 fans at T-Mobile Park, 8th-best winning percentage in the AL in home games before $<35,000$ fans.

- The 24-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 23rd career start, and his 1st against the Los Angeles Dodgers.
- Selected by Seattle in the 4th round (113th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Derek Miller.
- Spent 3 seasons at Texas A\&M from 2019-21...also spent 2 seasons playing for Brazos Valley Bombers of the Texas Collegiate League in 2018 and 2020, and 1 season with the Falmouth Commodores of the Cape Cod League in 2019.
- Was born in Mount Pleasant, Texas and attended New Braunfels High School in New Braunfels, Texas.

LAST TIME OUT...L\#5 on $9 / 10$ at TBR after tossing 5.0 innings and allowing 5 runs on 9 hits and 1 walk with 7 strikeouts.
VS. NATIONAL LEAGUE...owns a 2.60 ERA (5 ER, 17.1 IP) against National League opponents this season...through 3 starts against the NL Miller has allowed 5 walks and 1 home run while striking out 12 and he currently has a 0.981 WHIP against interleague opponent.

THE CENTURY MARK ...recorded his 100th career strikeout in his outing against Oakland on 8/30 after striking out Ryan Noda in the 5th inning...his 100 strikeouts in his first 20 career games is tied for the 5th fastest to 100 strikeouts in franchise history (also: Roenis Elías).
TEXAS HEAT...his 4-seam fastball has the 5th most rise of any pitcher in MLB this season...Miller's heater has 2.9 inches of vertical movement above average, tied with José Urquidy-HOU.
KEEPING THE BASES CLEAN...recorded his 5th start of the season where he has pitched 6.0+ innings and allowed 2-or-fewer hits in his start against Houston on 8/18...he is tied for the 5th most such starts in the Majors this season (also: Kodai Sen ga-NYM and Shohei Ohtani-LAA).
WINNING NUMBERS...his 8 wins are tied for the 6th most in the Majors among rookie starting pitchers this season...in games where Miller gets the win opponents are batting .158 ( $27 \times 171$ ) against him.
MAKING MORE HISTORY...became the 1st pitcher since at least 1901 to go 6.0+ innings pitched and allow 2-or-fewer hits in at least 4 of his first 10 career appearances.
ROOKIE DOMINATION...allowed 141 runners to reach base safely through his first 22 career starts which is tied for the 3rd the fewest in a pitcher's first 22 starts in franchise history ( min .90 .0 IP )...he is currently tied with George Kirby
WATCH ME WHIP...his 1.113 WHIP ranks 9th in the American League among pitchers with at least 22 starts...he currently ranks behind Framber Valdez-HOU (1.095).

KEEPING THE BATS QUIET...has allowed 108 hits through his first 22 career starts which ranks tied 4th among all rookie starters (min. 100.0 IP ).
ON THE LEADERBOARD...his 109 strikeouts through his first 22 career starts ranks tied 7th in franchise history...his 23 walks allowed rank tied for the 3rd fewest in franchise history in a pitcher's first 22 career starts with Logan Gilbert.
FIRST 5 STARTS...became the 4th pitcher in franchise history to not allow a home run over his first 5 career starts, joining Michael Pineda, Jim Converse and Brian Snyder...his 4 earned runs allowed are tied for the fewest in a pitcher's first 5 career starts in franchise history, joining James Paxton (4 ER, 31.1 IP) and Justin Dunn (4 ER, 9.2 IP).
AN ALMOST PERFECT BEGINNING...took a perfect game into the 6 th inning in his first career Major League start at Oakland on $5 / 2$ before a Tony Kemp 1-out single broke up the no-hit bid...the 16-consecutive batters retired in a pitcher's MLB

WHAT A DEBUT...became just the 3rd pitcher in MLB history to strike out 10 batters without issuing a walk in their Major League debut, joining RHP Johnny Cueto-CIN (4/3/08) and Stephen Strausburg-WSN (6/8/10)...became the 30th pitcher in MLB history to strikeout 10+ in their ML debut...also set a franchise record for most strikeouts in a debut moving ahead of Enrique Romo, who struck out 9 on 4/7/77.

NO RUNNERS ALLOWED...became the only pitcher in MLB history to have 3-or-fewer baserunners allowed in each of their first 3 career starts...his 8 baserunners allowed were the fewest in a pitcher's first 3 career appearances since at least 1901 (min. 15 IP),

MAKING IT LOOK EASY...he became the only pitcher in MLB history to have 6.0+ innings pitched and allow 3-or-fewer baserunners in his first 3 career starts...his 3-game streak of 6.0+ innings pitched and 3-or-fewer baserunners allowed is tied for the longest since 1901...Blake Snell-SDP and Corbin Burnes-MIL were the most recent pitchers to achieve this feat, both doing so in 2021.
HISTORY IN THE MAKING...became the 2nd pitcher in MLB history to go at least 6.0 innings and allow 2-or-fewer hits in each of his first 2 career games joining Ken Cloude-SEA (1997)...via Sarah Langs.

IT'S BEEN 21 YEARS...he became the first pitcher with a sub-1.00 ERA \& 15 strikeouts over his first 2 career games since Kazuhisa Ishii-LAD (2002). he is the only pitcher in MLB history to do that while allowing no more than 1 walk.


## SEATTLE BULLPEN
