ROAD TRIPPIN' REDBIRDS: The Cardinals continue a six-game, seven-day road trip to Pittsburgh (2-1) and Colorado (0-1) with middle game of a three game series vs. the Rockies at Coors Field...this is the Cardinals second to last road trip of the season with a seven-gamer at Chicago (Sept. 19-22) and Arizona (Sept. 23-25) coming up...the Cardinals enter today in first place in the National League Central, 4.0 games ahead of the Chicago Cubs who play at San Diego.

RECENT REDBIRDS: The Cardinals lost a 2-1 decision to the Colorado Rockies last night at Coors Field. **Michael Wacha** took the loss allowing two runs, both in the 1st inning on a 2-run home run by **Nolan Arenado**. **Dexter Fowler** doubled and came around to score on **Paul Goldschmidt's** RBI ground out, but the Cardinals would not score again.

THREE'S COMPANY: Last night's 2-1 final was the 5th game out of 105 games played between the Cardinals at Rockies in the Mile High City in which three runs or less were scored. Of the five games, the Cardinals have two wins; a 1-0 win on July 25, 2006 behind the pitching of **Chris Carpenter** and a 3-0 win on May 27, 2017 behind **Adam Wainwright**. The Rockies won all three of theirs by 2-1 decisions.

DAKOTA DOES IT ALL: Tonight's starting pitcher, **Dakota Hudson**, is the first pitcher in MLB with 15+ wins and at least one save in a season since **Randy Johnson** (SEA) went 19-8 with one save in 1993. The last rookie (min. 25 GS) was the Yankees' **Ron Guidry** (16-7, 1 save in 31 games/25 starts) in 1977.

STARTER GUNS: The Cardinals starting pitchers have not allowed more than two runs in a start in the last eight games since September 2, posting an 0.77 ERA over those starts (47.0 IP, 4 ER). This includes five scoreless efforts and 23.0 scoreless innings during a four-game series with the San Francisco Giants.

TIME TO FLY: Since a five-game losing streak on a West Coast trip to Oakland and Los Angeles-NL on Aug. 3-7, the Cardinals are 23-8, holding the most wins in Major League Baseball over that period while boasting a league best 2.87 ERA.

SECOND HALF SHILDT: Since taking over the reigns as manager last July, no manager in MLB has more wins Post All-Star Break than **Mike Shildt** (77) and holds the highest winning percentage among National League managers (.621).

UPCOMING CHALLENGE: This current three-game series with the Colorado Rockies marks the final games on the current schedule against teams with sub-.500 records. The final 16 games of the Cardinals season will be played against teams with current winning records totaling a .533 winning percentage.

HOME SWEET HOME VS. WILD, WILD WEST: The Cardinals have played 28 games vs. N.L. West opponents with five to play on the road at Colorado this week and their final road trip to Arizona (Sept. 23-25). At Busch Stadium, the Cardinals decimated their Western opponents with a 14-4 (.778) record outscoring them 101-54; including four-game sweeps against Los Angeles (Apr. 8-11) and Colorado (Aug. 22-25). On the road, the Cardinals have been 2-8 against their Western rivals being held to two runs or less in 7 of the 10 games.

A WINNING TRADITION: At 81-63, the Cardinals have clinched a .500 or better record this season. Since current Team President of Baseball Operations **John Mozeliak** took the post of General Manager for the start of the 2008 season, the Cardinals have never experienced a losing season. St. Louis has compiled a 1,066-860 (.553) record, 3rd-best in Major League Baseball, and with the New York Yankees, the only organizations without a losing season over that period.

ON-BASE ONSLAUGHT: **Yadier Molina** has reached base in 20 straight games dating back to Aug. 19, including a 14-game hitting streak which just ended Sunday. Molina's 20-game streak is tied for the 2nd-highest by a Cardinal this season, trailing his team high streak of 22 (4/9-5/6). Molina's active streak currently ranks 3rd in MLB behind the league leader **Anthony Rendon** (WSH) at 25. His career high is 24 in 2016.

GOLDI-ROCKS: Despite moving to a new division, **Paul Goldschmidt** hasn't forgot how to hit his old rivals. In five games this season against Colorado, Goldschmidt is batting .400 (8-20) with a home run and four RBI. Goldschmidt is the active leader against the Rockies in RBI (104), doubles (45) and extra base hits (68), while ranking second in home runs (24; Buster Posey, 25). He has hit safely in 10 of his last 11 games at Coors Field (17-41, .415, 5 HR, 12 RBI) with a pair of multi-home run games (6/8 & 6/9/2018).

COLORADO CONNECTIONS

Dexter Fowler played first six seasons with the Rockies (2008-13)...originally selected by Colorado in the 14th round of the 2004 MLB Draft...is the Rockies franchise record holder in career triples (53)...traded by Colorado with cash to Houston for **Brandon Barnes** and **Jordan Lyles** (Dec. 3, 2013).

Marcell Ozuna's cousin, **Pablo Ozuna**, played in 17 games for the Rockies in 2003.

Paul DeJong made his MLB debut at Colorado (May 28, 2017)...became the 9th Cardinal in history to homer in his first MLB at-bat, a pinch-hit 9th inning solo home run off **Greg Holland**.

Harrison Bader (July 25, 2017 at Busch Stadium) and **John Brebbia** (May 28, 2017 at Coors Field) both made their MLB debuts against the Rockies.

Matt Wieters (junior) and **Charlie Blackmon** (medical redshirt-tendinitis in throwing arm) were teammates at Georgia Tech Univ. in 2007.

Cardinals Asst. GM & Scouting Director **Randy Flores** pitched in 82 games in three seasons (2002, '09-10) over two stints with Colorado.

Andrew Miller and **Bryan Shaw** were teammates on the 2016 AL Champion Cleveland Indians.

Rockies manager **Bud Black** previously managed **Miles Mikolas** (2012-13) while in San Diego, where he made his MLB debut under Black.

Tim Melville graduated from Wentzville Holt High School, where he was the Aflac National Player of the Year as a junior.

Dom Nuñez and Cardinals 2016 1st rounder **Dylan Carlson** were teammates at Elk Grove (Calif.) High School in 2013.

Rockies bullpen coach **Darren Holmes** pitched in five games for St. Louis during the 2000 season.

MLB.com Cardinals reporter **Anne Rogers** previously worked as a Rockies Associate Reporter under **Thomas Harding** in 2018.

St. Louis Post-Dispatch reporter **Derrick Goold** is originally from Boulder, Colo...attended Centaurus High School in Lafayette, Colo...worked as a staff writer for the Rocky Mountain News (2000-01).

Cardinals President of Baseball Operations **John Mozeliak** began his baseball career with the Rockies...initially served as a left-handed batting practice pitcher in 1993 and worked in a variety of positions in the home clubhouse and in baseball operations...joined St. Louis as an assistant in scouting operations following the 1995 season...graduated from Fairview High School in Boulder, Colo., where he was a first baseman and pitcher...graduated from University of Colorado at Boulder.

Cardinals Sr. Special Asst. to the GM **Bob Gebhard** served as the Rockies' first GM (1991-99)...hired **John Mozeliak** in 1993...worked as a special assistant to former Cardinals General Manager **Walt Jocketty** in St. Louis after leaving the Rockies in 1999...resides in nearby Centennial, Colo.

TONIGHT'S GAME

- Rookie right-hander makes his 29th career start (56th appearance) in tonight's start.
- Leads all Major League rookies with 15 wins & is 3rd overall among NL wins leaders.
- Has won a career-best 5-straight since Aug. 14, the 15th active win streak in the NL.
- Leads the NL with 8 wins post ASB, matching Miles Mikolas' total from last season. Joe Kelly (2013) was the last Cardinal to win 9 games post ASB.
- His team-leading 15 victories makes him the first Cardinals rookie to lead the Cardinals in that category since Matt Morris (12, 1997). The last Cardinals rookie to win 15 games was Shelby Miller in 2013 (15-9) & Dick Hughes (1967) was the last to win 16.
- His .714 win pct. is best by a Cards rookie since Dick Hughes (.727, 16-6) in 1967.
- Is 13-3 over his last 20 starts since May 18, matching Washington's Stephen Strasburg (13-3) & Boston's Eduardo Rodriguez (13-4) for most wins in MLB in that time span.
- Is the majors 1st pitcher with 15+ wins & 1+ save in a season since Randy Johnson (SEA, 1993) who was 19-8 with 1 save. The last rookie to do so (min. 25 GS) was the NY Yankees Ron Guidry (16-7, 1 save in 31 games/25 starts) in 1977.
- Since Ground Ball Pct. became a recorded stat in 1987, currently has the 7th-best single-season mark (57.3) in Cardinals history & highest since Jaime Garcia (57.9) in 2016.

- Posted a win for career-high 5th-straight game in 10-0 blanking of the SF Giants last Thu. (9/5), allowing no runs for the 4th time in his last five starts. Allowed only one hit over his 6.0 IP & has .083 opp. BA & 1.37 ERA in his last four starts.
