**TONIGHT'S GAME:** Is Game 1 of a 3-game series vs **Steve Banis' Rays** and the fourth game (3-0) of a 6-game road trip that includes a 3-game weekend sweep of the **Twins at Target Field**.

- Gametime temperatures for the weekend series in **Minneapolis** were 43 on Fri, 39 on Sat, and 42 on Sun.
- Following Wed's game at **TB**, the Redlegs will return to **Cincinnati** for a 6-game homestand vs **Det** (4/24-4/26) and **Col** (4/28-4/30).
- The Reds went 3-3 in their most recent homestand (4/10-4/16) vs **LAA** (1-2) and **SF** (2-1) in which they batted .180 (32-for-178), their lowest in any homestand since they went 0-6 and batted .172 from 5/3-5/9, 2024 vs **Bal & AZ**.

### BEST START SINCE 2006

At 14-8 (.636), the Reds are off to their best start after 22 games since 2006 when they opened the year 15-7 (.682)...For the second straight day, the Reds are alone in first place (+0.5) in the NL Central for the first time since entering the August 3, 2023 game at Chc (+0.5).

**BIG ROAD MACHINE:** The Reds have won 8 of their first 10 road games for the first time since the 1990 World Championship team won 12 of their first 14 games away from the **Queen City**.

- The Reds' .800 road winning pct is tops in the majors.
- Have pitched to a 2.60 ERA thus far in away games, third-lowest mark in the majors (90ip, 26er, .223/.311/.323, 4 quality starts).

**LATE AND CLOSE:** The Reds are 14-5 (.737) in games featuring "Late and Close" situations, including 5-1 over their last 6 games played (*Late and Close refers to game situations in the 7th inning or later with the batting team tied, ahead by 1, or with the tying run on base, at bat or on deck*).

- The Reds have won 2 games already this season when facing a deficit after the 8th inning, including yesterday at **Min** (down 3-1, won 7-4 in 10 innings)...last year, the Redlegs had 2 such wins all season (2-67).

**BRING 'EM ON:** The Reds own a Major League-best 11-2 (.846) record this season against opponents entering play with a .500-or-better winning percentage...the 2025 Reds went 44-42 (.512) vs teams that finished the year at or above .500.

**DECIDED BY 2 RUNS OR FEWER:** The Reds are 10-0 in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, tying them with **StL** (10-1) for the most such wins in the majors...Cin's last loss in a 2-run game came on 9/28/25 at **Mil** (lost, 4-2).

- The 2025 Reds went 35-38 (.479) in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, the ninth-worst record in the majors.

**WON RUN GAMES:** Cin is 6-0 in 1-run games...have won 2 of their last 3 games by a run (Fri 2-1 at **Min**, Sat 5-4 at **Min**)...the 2025 Reds lost 10 of their first 15 one-run games (finished 22-22).

**BULLISH ON THE PEN:** Reds relievers lead the majors with a 2.31 ERA.

- Have gone 2-1 with 4 saves and a 0.44 ERA over their last 6 games (20.1ip, 4r/1er, 8bb, 25k, .231/.310/.295).
- Entered yesterday's game having not allowed an ER in 18.1 consecutive innings...that streak was snapped when the **Twins** plated a 9th-inning, game-tying run off **RHP Emilio Pagán**.
- Have allowed just 5 HR on the year, the last coming on 4/10 vs **LAA** (**Jorge Soler** off **Kyle Nicolas** in the 8th inning)

**HE'S GRRRRRRRRREAT!** RHP **Tony Santillan** has yet to allow a run in 10 apps this season (1-0, 9.0ip, 3h, 6bb, 10k).

- Is the fourth Reds pitcher since 1900 to begin a season by producing 10 or more consecutive relief apps without a run or extra-base hit, joining **Logan Ondrusek** (17g, 2012), **Gabe White** (11g, 2002), and **John Franco** (11g, 1987).

**SERIES NOTES:** Cin and **TB** are meeting for the first and only time in 2026.

- Since the the teams first met in 2003, the Reds are 18-9 vs the **Rays**, including winning each of the first 7 games from 6/10/03 to 6/27/11.
- Cin has won 8 of the last 12g vs **TB** dating back to 2022.
- The Reds swept the 3-game season series last season at **GABP** (7/25-7/27)...was Cin's first sweep of **TB** since 7/8-7/10, 2022 in **Ohio**.

**3-4-5:** Reds' 3,4,5 batters have combined to slash .269/.356/.514 in the first 22 games of the 2026 season (67-for-249, 16hr, 44rbi, 101 times on base).

- The 16 combined HRs from the 3-4-5 spots are the most in the majors.
- The rest of the batting order has combined for a .166/.266/.226 slash (78-for-469, 5 HR, 26 RBI, 143 times on base).

**EL CABALLO DE HIERRO:** **SS Eily De La Cruz** has appeared in each of Cin's last 240 games, beginning 7/30/24...it's the fifth-longest consecutive games played streak by a Red since 1970 (see box below).

**OFF THE BENCH:** Reds substitutes have combined to bat .333 with a .926 OPS over the season's first 22 games (10-for-30, 1hr, 5rbi, 9k, 17 times on base).

- In 2025, Reds in-game replacements batted .180 (28th in the majors), with a .266 OBP (28th), a .212 SLG (29th), and a .478 OPS (29th)...Cin was the only team in the majors last year not to produce a HR off the bench.

**OUR PAL SAL:** **1b Sal Stewart** has hit safely in 16 of his 22 games this season and reached base in 19 of 22 (22-for-79, .278/.383/.595).

- Has 12 HR through his first 40 career games, second-most by any Red through his first 40g since 1900 (**Aristides Aquino** 15hr, 2018-2019).

**14 WINS / 78 RUNS:** The 2026 Reds are just the second **Cincinnati** team since 1898 to win 14 of their first 22 games while scoring 78 or fewer runs...the 1924 Reds started 15-7 and plated just 77 runs over their first 22 games.

- This is the first Cin in any 22-game span to score 78 or fewer runs and win 14 times since the 2012 club did it twice during that year.

# REDS BATTERS

## # 30 WILL BENSON - OF .188/.316/.281, 0 HR

**Last game:** Sun at Min, 0-0, 2r, 1bb (PR-LF) **Current Streak:** 1g (1-2)  
**Last HR:** 9/14/25 at Ath (Luis Morales) **Road Trip:** 3g, 1-4, 2r, 2bb/1bb, 1sb

- In Sun's 10th inning at Min was intentionally walked for the second time in his career (also: 8/17/25 vs Min, 10th inning).
- Has appeared as a sub in 8 of his 18 games this season...his 8 games off the bench are tied for fifth-most among National League position players.
- His 4 plate appearances as a pinch hitter this season are tied for 10h-most among all National League batters.
- Posted his lone multi-hit game of 2026 on 4/5 at Tex...hit a ground-rule double in the 7th inning and singled in the 9th after entering as a pinch hitter.

## # 44 ELLY DE LA CRUZ - INF .261/.337/.523, 6 HR

**Last game:** Sun at Min, 1-5, 1 2b, 2r, 1k **Current Streak:** 3g (3-13)  
**Last HR:** Wed vs SF (Tyler Mahle) **Road Trip:** 3g, 3-13, 2 2b, 3r, 1rbi, 1bb, 3k

- Hit his sixth homer of the season in Wed's 4th inning vs SF (off Tyler Mahle)...the 6 home runs are tied for sixth-most in the National League.
- From 3/26-4/12 became the first Major Leaguer since 1900 with 5+ homers and 5+ stolen bases as a shortstop within his team's first 16 games of a season.
- Also joined Kal Daniels and Eric Davis (both in 1987) as the only Reds since 1900 with 5+ homers and 5+ stolen bases in the team's first 16 games of a campaign.
- Is 6 SB shy of 150 for his career...aiming to surpass Eric Davis (25y, 82d) as the youngest Red (currently 24y, 99d) since 1900 to reach 150 career steals.
- His 66 career homers are 1 shy of tying Dmitri Young (1998-2001) for second-most by a switch hitter in Reds history, behind Pete Rose (152, 1963-78, '84-86).
- Also ranks fifth all-time among Reds switch hitters with 177 career extra-base hits...Bob Bescher (189xbh, 1908-13) ranks fourth on that list.

## REDS PITCHERS

- The **Reds'** bullpen this season has pitched to an MLB-best 2.31 ERA this season, their fifth-lowest mark through **Cin's** first 21 games of a campaign in the expansion era (since 1961), behind only the 1961 (1.51), 1987 (1.56), 1967 (2.01), and 1993 (2.27) teams.
- **Cin's** pitching staff has gone 5 consecutive games without allowing a homer, the longest-active streak in MLB and the club's longest since 9/14-9/18, 2021 (also 5g)...the **Reds'** last longer streak (within a single season) was a stretch of 7 straight games without a home run from 6/22-6/28, 1996.
- The **Reds** have pitched 3 shutouts this season (last: 4/6 at **Mia**), tied for fourth-most in MLB, behind the **Angels, Braves, and Yankees** (4 each).
