**2025 POSTSEASON SUMMARY:** In their first Postseason appearance since 2020, the Reds were swept in the **Wild Card Series** by the **Dodgers** in **Los Angeles**, 10-5 and 8-4.

- Have lost each of their last 8 Postseason games dating back to 2012...
   are 2-15 over their last 17 playoff games dating back to 1995.
- Have dropped each of their last 6 Postseason series since sweeping the Dodgers in the 1995 National League Division Series (3-0).

**TAKE A WALK ON THE WILD SIDE:** For the first time in franchise history, the Reds clinched a playoff berth on the final day of the regular season (Elias).

- The Reds and Mets entered the regular season finale vying for the National League's final Wild Card spot...both teams finished the year with identical 83-79 records but Cin earned the trip to the Postseason by virtue of winning 4 of 6 vs NYM during the regular season.
- Following the 5-4 loss to the Mets on 9/5, the Reds trailed NYM and SD by 6.0 games for the final WC position with 21 games remaining.
- From that point on, the Reds went 13-8 while the Mets finished 7-14.
- The Redlegs climbed to within a <u>half-game</u> of that last spot on 8/22 before losing 10 of 13 to fall 6.0 games off the pace...they entered the 9/23 game vs Pit tied with NYM, marking the first time after the All-Star break that they held a Postseason position.
- Had been "the first team out" until they were leapfrogged in the Wild Card standings by both SF and AZ during a 3-11 run.
- The Reds and Mets finished the 1999 season with matching 96-66 records and tied for that year's final Wild Card spot...the Mets defeated the Reds, 5-0 at Cinergy Field in a 1-game playoff on 10/4 (game 163) to eliminate Cin from contention...had today's tiebreaker rules applied that year, the Reds would've earned the Postseason berth.

**EXCEEDING EXPECTATIONS:** The Reds entered the 2025 season as a long shot to clinch a Postseason berth.

- ESPN's preseason preview projected the Reds to finish 76-86 with a 14.6% chance of making the playoffs.
- FanGraphs forecasted a 78-83 record with a 20.2% Postseason chance.
- **PECOTA** simulated a 74-88 record with a 4.6% playoff chance.

MONTHLY REVIEW: The Reds posted a winning record in 4 of their 6 months (March/April 16-15, May 13-15, June 15-11, July 13-12, August 12-15, September 14-11)...went 33-32 after the All-Star break, their first winning mark in the "second half" since 2013 (37-30).

TERRY'S TEAM: Terry Francona became the fifth manager in club history to lead the Reds to the Postseason in his first year at the helm, joining Lou Piniella (1990), John McNamara (1979), Sparky Anderson (1970), and Patrick Moran (1919)...he also reached the Postseason in his first year as manager with Bos (2004) and Cle (2013)...is only the third skipper in Major League history to accomplish this feat with 3 different franchises, joining Joe Torre (1982 w/ Atl, 1996 w/ NYY, 2008 w/ LAD) and Dusty Baker (2003 w/ Chc, 2016 w/ Wsh, 2020 w/ Hou)...courtesy Elias.

- 2025 marked his 12th Posteason as a Major League manager.
- Became the 12th different manager in Major League history to lead 3 or more teams to the Postseason.

TITO 2K: In the Reds' 4-2 victory over the Rockies on 7/13 at Great American Ball Park manager Terry Francona earned his 2,000th win as a Major League manager.

- He became the 13th manager to reach the 2,000-win milestone and the second active manager in the majors with 2,000 wins (Tex' Bruce Bochy 2,252).
- 10 of the 13 managers with 2,000 career wins are in the Hall of Fame...
   Dusty Baker (just became eligible in 2024), Bochy (active), and Francona (active) will likely join the other 10 in Cooperstown.
- Francona joined Baker (2,183) and Sparky Anderson (2,194 wins) as the only 2,000-win skippers to manage the Reds.
- Francona (1987) and Leo Durocher are the only 2,000-win managers to play for the Reds (1930-33).
- Francona is the fourth manager to earn his 2,000th win for a team he
  once played for (1987), joining Bochy (SF), Bucky Harris (Det), and
  John McGraw (NYG)...courtesy Elias.

**ROSTER RUNDOWN:** <u>53</u> players appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds in 2025, their fewest in a full regular season since using just 47 players in 2019.

- <u>28</u> pitchers, including position player C Jose Trevino (2 times), appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds in 2025.
- <u>15</u> rookies played in at least 1 game for the Reds in 2025.
- 7 Reds players made their Major League debuts in 2025 (Will Banfield, Chase Burns, Tyler Callihan, Zach Maxwell, Luis Mey, Chase Petty, Sal Stewart).
- At 21 years, 268 days on 9/1, Sal Stewart became the eighth-youngest player to make his Major League debut in 2025 and the youngest Reds player to debut since Elly De La Cruz in 2023 (21 years, 146 days).

FREE AGENTS, PENDING OPTIONS, ARB ELIGIBLE: Reds players with at least 6 years of Major League service who are eligible to become free agents at the conclusion of the World Series include: Miguel Andujar, Zack Littell, Nick Martinez, Wade Miley, and Emilio Pagán.

- Reds players who are eligible for salary arbitration include: Graham Ashcraft, Will Benson, Santiago Espinal, TJ Friedl, Ian Gibaut, Nick Lodolo, Gavin Lux, Matt McLain, Sam Moll, Tony Santillan, Brady Singer, Spencer Steer, and Tyler Stephenson.

NATIONAL LEAGUE ALL-STARS: SS Elly De La Cruz and LHP Andrew Abbott both appeared in MLB's All-Star Game on 7/15 at Atl's Truist Park.

- Abbott on 7/8 was named to the NL All-Star team as a replacement for LAD's Yoshinobu Yamamoto...it marked his first career All-Star selection and he became the first Cin <u>LHP</u> selected as an All-Star since Aroldis Chapman in 2015.
- Abbott pitched a perfect 6th inning in the National League's 7-6 win (Jazz Chisholm Jr lineout, Riley Greene flyout, Randy Arozarena ground out; 13 total pitches).
- De La Cruz was selected as an All-Star for the second consecutive season, becoming the first Reds player to earn back-to-back honors since Joey Votto in 2017 & 2018.
- Was the sixth Reds shortstop to make consecutive All-Star Games, the first since Barry Larkin (1988-91, '93-'97, '99-2000).
- De La Cruz joined Johnny Bench (4, 1968-71), Frank Robinson (3, 1956-59), and Vada Pinson (2, 1959-60) as the only players in Reds history with multiple All-Star selections before turning 24.
- De La Cruz entered the game as a defensive replacement for NYM's SS Francisco Lindor...he went 0-for-2 with a strikeout.

#### NATIONAL LEAGUE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:

- OF Will Benson was NL Player of the Week for 5/12-5/18.
- OF/INF Spencer Steer was NL Player of the Week for 6/23-6/29.

#### AWARD TOUR:

- LHP Brent Suter was selected as the Reds' 2025 nominee for the prestigious Roberto Clemente Award and was named a finalist for the Marvin Miller Man of the Year Award.
- CF TJ FriedI was recognized as the Reds' 2025 recipient of the annual Heart & Hustle Award.

**SWEEP DREAMS:** The Reds were swept in the 3-game series at **Dodger Stadium** from <u>8/25-8/27</u>...it was the first time Cin was swept in a series of at least 2 games since <u>9/24-9/25, 2024</u> at **Cle** (2g), a span of 43 straight series without getting broomed.

- The 43-series sweepless streak ranks as the fourth-longest in franchise history (Elias).
- The Reds entered that **Dodgers** series having not been swept in any of their previous <u>42 series played in 2025</u>...it was the longest in-season run in club history, eclipsing the <u>1970</u> National League championship team, which opened its season with <u>32</u> straight series without being swept.
- On 8 occasions during the streak, avoided being swept with a win in the final game of a series (4/23 at Mia, 5/15 vs CWS, 6/22 at StL, 7/2 at Bos, 7/23 at Wsh, 7/30 vs LAD, 8/17 vs Mil, 8/24 at AZ).
- Cin <u>had been</u> the only ML team not to have been swept to that point.
- The Reds avoided being swept in all <u>26</u> of their series this season at Great American Ball Park.
- Went an entire season without being swept at home for the sixth time in franchise history (not counting the 2020 COVID-19 season).
- Only the Reds teams of 1940, 1943, 1944, 1994, and 2012 ran the home schedule without being swept (Elias).

MLB SPEEDWAY CLASSIC: The Reds fell to the Braves, 4-2, in the inaugural MLB Speedway Classic on 8/3 at Tennessee's Bristol Motor Speedway.

- Originally scheduled for 8/2, the start of the game was delayed by rain for 2 hours, 17 minutes...when play finally began at 9:41 PM, 4 outs were recorded before another rain delay stopped action for 27 minutes...the game was eventually suspended at 10:25 PM, with Cin leading 1-0 in the bottom of the 1st inning...it was completed the next day..
- The MLB Speedway Classic broke MLB's all-time regular season attendance record, attracting 91,032 fans to the first American League or National League game ever played in Tennessee.

**TROUBLE OUT WEST:** Since joining the National League's West Division in 1969 and through the 2025 season, the Reds have posted a 486-546 (.471) regular season record in **California**...this includes games at **Dodgers**, **Giants**, **Padres**, **Angels**, and **A's**.

- Cin went 3-2 in series and 6-9 in games played this season in California (LAA, SF, LAD, SD, Ath)...entered this year having lost each of their previous 4 series and 9 of their previous 13 games in the Golden State.
- 2025 marked the Reds' 16th losing season in California since 2000, having posted winning records in the 31st state in 2023, 2018, 2012, 2011, 2010, 2001...finished with a tying record in 2014 and 2004.
- The Reds suffered just 2 series sweeps this season, both in California (at LAD 8/25-8/27 & 9/12-9/14 at Ath)...this does not include the 2-game sweep at Dodger Stadium in the Wild Card Series.

**HOUSEKEEPING:** The Reds went 45-35 (.563) in 80 games this season at **Great American Ball Park**...it was their fourth-best record in stadium history (beginning in 2003), behind only the 2012 (50-31, .617), 2013 (49-31, .613) and 2010 (49-32, .605) clubs.

- The Reds played 1 "home" game at **Bristol Motor Speedway** on 8/3 (completed on 8/4; 4-2 loss vs **Atl**).
- In 80 home dates this year, the Reds attracted 2,079,931 fans to GABP...
  marked the first time Cin drew over 2M fans in 3 straight seasons since
  doing so in 6 consecutive seasons from 2010-2015.
- Reds pitchers posted a 3.88 ERA this season at **GABP**, the fifth-lowest staff ERA in the ballpark's 23 seasons and the lowest since 2020 (3.84).
- The Reds spent 15 hours, 37 minutes in weather delays this season at **GABP** and 19 hours, 49 minutes total.

A HIGH QUANTITY OF QUALITY: Reds starting pitchers posted 69 quality starts this season, tied for fourth-most in the majors...(Phillies 84, Red Sox 72, Astros 70, Braves 69).

- The Reds last received 69 or more quality starts from their rotation in 2014 when the staff produced 103.
- Reds starters pitched to a 3.79 ERA after the All-Star break, eighth-best in the majors during that time and the best by the club since 2014 (3.45).

BLANKETY BLANK: The Reds were shut out 13 times this season.

- From Opening Day 2025 through 5/31, the Redlegs and **Pirates** were shut out 9 times apiece, most in the majors...the Reds then went 56 straight games without being shut out until 8/7.
- Cin was the only Major League team to avoid a blanking from 6/1-8/6.
- That 56-game streak of avoiding a shutout marked the eighth-longest by any team this season.
- Were held to <u>1 run or none</u> 34 times this season.

1-0: After scoring 14 times vs **Tex** on 3/31, the Reds suffered <u>3 consecutive</u> <u>1-0 losses</u> from 4/1-4/3 for the first time in franchise history (courtesy Elias).

- It marked the sixth time in Major League history that any team dropped 3 straight games by a 1-0 score, the first since the **1960 Phillies** (Elias).
- No Major League team has ever lost 4 straight games by a 1-0 score.

**COMEBACK KIDS:** The Reds posted 33 comeback wins from the beginning of June through the end of the season, only the American League Champion **Blue Jays** (34) had more during that time...from Opening Day through 5/31, the Redlegs produced 7 comeback wins, fourth-fewest in the majors.

- The Reds posted 40 comeback wins this season, fifth-most in the National League and tied for seventh-most in the majors...produced 33 of those come-from-behind victories from 6/1 through the end of the regular season, second to only the Blue Jays (34) for most among Major League teams.
- · This season combined to hit 7 grand slams, fourth-most among Major League teams, behind the Diamondbacks (9), Yankees (9), & Mariners (8).
- The Reds' 7 grand slams were also tied for their fourth-most in a single season in team history, per Elias (11, 2018; 9, 2002; 8, 2017).
- The Reds from 4/1 vs Tex to 4/3 at Mil suffered 3 consecutive 1-0 losses for the first time in franchise history, according to Elias...also, per Elias, marked the sixth instance of any team losing 3 straight games by a 1-0 score in MLB history, also done by the 1960 Phillies, 1917 Pirates, 1909 Washington Senators, 1909 St. Louis Browns, and 1908 Brooklyn Superbas
- From the 8th inning on 3/31 vs Tex through the 7th inning on 4/4 at Mil, the **Reds** went 35 straight innings without scoring a run...was their longest scoreless innings streak since 9/8-9/12, 1946 (37 innings; courtesy Elias).
- On 4/20 at Bal, the Reds set a modern-day club record (since 1900) for times on base safely in a single game with 38 (25 hits, 11 walks, 2 HBP), surpassing the previous best of 37 done twice (last: 5/19/99 at Col).

- Cin's starting staff posted 69 quality starts this season, tied with Atl for fourth-most in MLB, behind only Phi (84), Bos (72), and Hou (70)...were also its most in a season since recording 103 quality starts in 2014.
- Allowed 1,260 hits in 2025, second to only the 1942 club (1,213h) for their second-fewest in a full season in the live-ball era (since 1920), excluding the COVID-shortened 2020 campaign & strike-shortened seasons of 1981 & '94.
- On 3/27 vs SF tied a modern-day franchise record (since the mound was moved to its current distance in 1893) for strikeouts in a season opener with 17, matching the mark originally set on 4/1/13 vs LAA (13 inn.), per Elias.

- Cin's bullpen from the 3rd inning on 4/30g2 vs StL to the 7th inning on 5/2 vs Wsh retired 37 consecutive batters...per Elias, marked the Reds' longestsuch run and third-longest streak by a Major League bullpen in the expansion era (since 1961), behind the 1966 Orioles & 1977 Mariners (38 each).
- LHP Andrew Abbott on 5/30 at Chc (7ip, 1h, 1bb, 8k) and LHP Nick Lodolo on 5/31 at Chc (6ip, 5h, 2bb, 5k) became the second pair of Reds left-handed pitchers since 1893 to each post a scoreless start of at least 6.0 innings in back-to-back team games, joining Still Bill Hill (9ip. 10/2/1898 vs St. Louis Browns) and Bill Dammann (9ip, 10/3/1898 vs St. Louis Browns).
- Reds pitchers combined for 38 strikeouts in the 3-game series victory from 6/23-6/25 vs NYY, tied for their third-most in a single 3-game set since 1900, according to Elias (46k, 7/24-7/26, 2020 vs Det; 42k, 6/14-6/16, 2021 at Mil).
- Issued 1 walk in the 3-game series victory from 8/11-8/13 vs Phi, marking the fifth time they allowed fewer than 2 walks in a series of at least 3 games against any opponent in the expansion era (last: 9/6-9/8, 2013 vs LAD).
