## CHICAGO CUBS (23-17) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (18-22) May 12, 2024 at PNC Park, Pittsburgh, PA - 1:35 EDT - GAME \#41/HOME \#21 RHP KYLE HENDRICKS ( $0-3,12.00$ ERA) vs. LHP BAILEY FALTER ( $2-2,4.34$ ERA)

THE PIRATES:...scored a season-high 10 runs in their comeback win yesterday against the Cubs...Are 4-4 heading into the finale of their nine-game homestand against the Rockies (2-1), Angels (1-2) and Cubs (1-1)...Are 9-20 in their last 29 games after winning nine of their first 11 to begin the year...Have gone 15-2 when scoring at least four runs in a game this season (their only losses came on April 25 against Milwaukee and Wednesday vs. the Angels).
IN DEEP THOUGHT: The Pirates hit a season-high home runs yesterday, which was the seventh time the team went deep five times in a game in PNC Park history...Prior to yesterday, the last time Pittsburgh hit five homers in a game at PNC Park came on June 30, 2022, vs. Milwaukee...The Pirates are one of five National League teams this season to go deep five times in a game along with the Dodgers on May 4 against the Braves, Phillies on April 26 against San Diego, and Giants on April 13 against the Rays.

DIGGING THE LONG BALL: Yesterday was just the second time in club history that the Pirates scored 10-plus runs in a game with all the scoring coming via home run (two three-run homers, one two-run, and two solo)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the only other time that happened in a game in Pirates history came on August 16, 1947 vs. St. Louis (seven homers).

CRUZING ALONG: Oneil Cruz is hitting at a 357 clip (20-for-56) with five doubles, three home runs and 10 RBI in his last 17 games dating back to April $22 . .$. Cruz' . 357 average since April 22 is tied for the fifth-highest in all of MLB in that time, trailing only Max Kepler (.424), Alec Bohm (.406), Rafael Devers (.375) and Josh Rojas (.375).

BAILEY AT THE BEST BALLPARK IN AMERICA: Bailey Falter gets the start this afternoon in the finale of this three-game series and nine-game homestand for the Pirates...This is Falter's second start of the current homestand after coming away with a no-decision (5.1ip/3r) in the team's 5-3 win last Sunday against the Rockies...Dating back to his appearance on September 6 of last year, Falter is 2-0 with a 1.61 ERA (28.0ip/5er) and .156 batting average against ( 15 -for- 96 ) in five appearances (four starts) at PNC Park.

LET'S SET UP A MEETING FOR LATER THIS WEEK: The Bucs and Cubs will meet again on Thursday night for the beginning of a four-game series at Wrigley Field...It's the first of three trips to Chicago in 2024 for the Pirates...The Pirates will also return to Chicago from July 12-14 to close out the first half with a three-game series against the White Sox and again from September 2-4 at Wrigley Field.

AND THE WHIFF: Paul Skenes struck each of the first two and seven batters total in 4.0-plus innings in MLB debut Saturday...According to Baseball Reference, that was the second-most strikeouts by a Pirates starter age 21 or younger in their debut behind Nick Maddox (11) in 1907.

GO JOE: Connor Joe hit the third three-run home run of his career yesterday and is now hitting
.404 (21-for-52) with runners on base this season...The only four players in MLB to produce a higher average with runners on base are Salvador Perez (.443), William Contreras (.439), Mookie Betts (.423) and Jurickson Profar (.411).

KNOW WHEN TO HOLDERMAN: Colin Holderman extended his scoreless streak to 10.1 innings on Saturday while earning his first win of the season (Martín Pérez owns the team's longest scoreless streak this season at 12.0 innings)... Holderman comes into today with the fourth-lowest batting average against (.128) among all National League relievers behind
