TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue the 7-day, 6-game homestand with the second of 3 games against the Los Angeles Angels (1-0)...tomorrow, the Mariners and Angels will have a rare mid-series off-day due to a FIFA World Cup game in Seattle...beginning Friday, the Mariners will also host the Toronto Blue Jays for a 3-game set on the homestand...Seattle is coming off a 6-game road trip against the Pirates (1-2) and Guardians (1-2)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call and **Angie Mentink** serving as field analyst...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners beat the Angels by a 6-2 score in last night's series opener...Seattle is 29-12 (.707) when scoring 4+ runs and 37-21 (.638) when they hit a home run.

- **Going Yard** - The Mariners have hit 528 home runs since 2024, the 3rd most team home runs in the Majors during that span behind only the Yankees (633) and Dodgers (593).
- **1,000 - J.P. Crawford** is 2 games away from reaching 1,000 career games played...his 926 career games with the Mariners rank 9th in franchise history, trailing the next closest Raúl Ibañez (1,110 G).
- **On the Move** - **Josh Naylor's** 45 stolen bases since 2025 rank 8th most among all MLB infielders.
- **Future** - Major League Baseball is set to announce its All-Star Futures Game rosters on Wednesday, July 1 at 8:30 a.m. PT...the game will be played in Philadelphia on Sunday, July 12.
- **Recent Moves** - The Mariners yesterday announced that INF **Buddy Kennedy** reported to the club...in a corresponding move, OF **Rob Refsnyder** was placed on the 10-day Injured List (right knee inflammation, retroactive to June 27)...Kennedy was acquired from the San Francisco Giants in exchange for cash considerations on Sunday.

HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...the Mariners continue their 7-day, 6-game homestand against the Los Angeles Angels (3 G, 6/29-6/30, 7/2) and the Toronto Blue Jays (3 G, 7/3-7/5)...highlights on the homestand include **Cal Raleigh 3-day Pop! Collectible Giveaway** during each game of the Angels series, **Patriotic Fireworks Night** on July 3, **Fourth of July Patriotic Bucket Hat Giveaway** on July 4 and Kids Run the Bases on July 5.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR...Major League Baseball is set to announce its All-Star rosters on **Saturday, July 4** at 4:30 p.m. PT on FOX for the 96th Midsummer Classic...the 2026 MLB All-Star Game takes place on Tuesday, July 14 at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia.

YOUNG & POWERFUL...**Cole Young** last night went 3-for-3 with 2 runs, 2 home runs and 3 RBI for his first career multi-homer game...he became the 10th player in Mariners history age 22-or-younger with a multi-homer game, and the first since **Julio Rodríguez** (3x, 9/11/22 vs. ATL, 7/25/23 at MIN and 9/5/23 at CIN)...in 18 games since June 10, Young is batting .304 (21x69) with 9 runs, 2 doubles, 5 home runs, 9 RBI and just 6 strikeouts, reaching base at a .333 clip and slugging .551 (.884 OPS).

WOO IN ELITE COMPANY...right-hander **Bryan Woo** (0.992 career WHIP) is 1 of 4 starting pitchers in Major League history to have a sub-1.00 WHIP and at least 400 innings pitched, along with active starters Jacob deGrom-TEX (0.988) and Paul Skenes-PIT (0.952), and Hall of Famer Addie Joss (0.968 WHIP), who pitched for Cleveland from 1902-10 and threw the second perfect game (1908) in American League history after Cy Young (1904).

TOTALLY DOM-INATING...**Dominic Canzone** last night hit his 13th home run of the season, his 6th in the month of June...in 24 games this month, Canzone is batting .314 (22x70) with 12 runs, 3 doubles, 1 triple, the 6 homers, 11 RBI and 7 walks in 78 plate appearances, reaching base at a .385 clip and slugging .643 for a 1.028 OPS...among AL batters with at least 70 plate appearances this month, he ranks 5th in slugging and 4th in OPS...overall this season, 'Dom' is batting .273 (53x194) with 30 runs, 13 doubles, 1 triple, 13 home runs, 34 RBI and 20 walks with an .899 OPS in 219 plate appearances...his OPS ranks 9th in the AL among players with 200+ plate appearances this season, just behind Aaron Judge-NYY (.907).

ARAZARENA: ALL-STAR WORTHY...**Randy Arozarena** is batting .280 (80x286) with 49 runs, 19 doubles, 1 triple, 8 homers, 36 RBI, 30 walks and 19 steals, posting a .369 on-base percentage, .437 slugging percentage and an .806 OPS...among American League outfielders this season, he ranks 7th in bWAR (2.5), 6th in OBP, 4th in doubles and T-1st in stolen bases...Randy is looking to become the 9th back-to-back All-Star position player in Mariners history, joining OF Ichiro Suzuki (2001-10), OF Ken Griffey Jr. (1990-99), DH Edgar Martinez (1995-97 & 2000-01), INF Alex Rodriguez (1996-98), INF Robinson Canó (2016-17), OF Nelson Cruz (2017-18), INF Harold Reynolds (1987-88) and teammate OF **Julio Rodríguez** (2022-23).

MUÑOZ MOVING UP THE LEADERBOARD...**Andrés Muñoz** has 93 career saves (92 with Seattle), tied with Aurelio López for the 3rd-most saves by a Mexican-born pitcher and trailing only Roberto Osuna (155 SV) and Joakim Soria (229 SV)...Muñoz's 92 saves with the Mariners also rank 5th in franchise history, behind Mike Schooler (98 SV), J.J. Putz (101 SV), Edwin Díaz (109 SV) and Kazuhiro Sasaki (129 SV).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**George Kirby** was outstanding last night, tossing 8.0 innings and allowing 7 hits (1 HR), 2 runs (2 ER) and 1 walk with 7 strikeouts...**YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...Kirby also tossed 8.0 innings on April 7 at Texas, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Kirby is one of 5 starters in the American League to have multiple 8.0+ inning starts this season?...he joins Tanner Bibee-CLE, Max Fried-NYY, J.T. Ginn-ATH and Ranger Suárez-BOS, who have each recorded 2 such games...of those starters, Kirby and Fried are the only players to not allow a walk in at least one of those 8.0+ inning games.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - JUNE 30

- **1995** - Edgar Martinez finishes the month of June with 8 HR, an MLB-high 32 RBI, and a .402 average en route to being named American League Player of the Month.
- **2014** - Kyle Seager is named the American League Player of the Week for the period June 23-29...Seager batted .583 (14x24) with 5 runs, 3 doubles, 2 home runs, 8 RBI and a 1.542 OPS. It was the second weekly award of Seager's career.
- **2014** - James Jones went 4-for-5 with 3 stolen bases, becoming the second player in club history to record 4 hits and 3 steals in a game. He joins Ichiro (7/20/04 vs. BOS) who went 4-for-5 with a club-record tying 4 steals.
- **2025** - The Mariners won 6-2 against the Royals with **Randy Arozarena** homering twice, hitting his 100th career home run and becoming the 3rd Mariner to reach 100 career homers in the season (also: **Cal Raleigh** and **Mitch Garver**)...marked the 2nd time in Mariners history 3 players have reached 100 career home runs in the same season...Raleigh also homered and became the 5th player in MLB history to reach 33 home runs before the end of June, joining Ken Griffey Jr. (1998), Sammy Sosa (1998), Mark McGwire (1998) and Barry Bonds (2001).

ABOUT BRYAN WOO...

- The 26-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 17th start of the season... Selected by Seattle in the 6th round (174th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft... Spent 3 seasons at Cal Poly before being drafted...

LAST TIME OUT...L#6 on June 24 at Pittsburgh, tossing 4.0 innings and allowing 5 runs (5 ER) on 6 hits and 2 walks with 4 strikeouts...he threw 86 pitches (57 strikes) in his 9th road start of the year.

HOME SWEET HOME...returns home for his 8th home start of the season...has not allowed an earned run in each of his last 4 home starts since May 6, combining for 35 strikeouts to just 9 hits and 5 walks across 26.0 innings pitched...

IN EXCLUSIVE COMPANY...is 1 of 3 pitchers in MLB since 1954 with 25.0+ IP, 35+ strikeouts, fewer than 10 hits allowed and no earned runs allowed across a 4-game span at home, joining Shohei Ohtani-LAA (9/17/22-4/21/23) and Nolan Ryan-HOU (7/22/86-9/8/86).

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE...has thrown 6.0+ innings in all 7 of his home starts this season, including 6 quality starts...his 20 games of 6.0+ innings pitched at home since 2025 lead MLB, ranking ahead of Sandy Alcantara-MIA (19 G)...in addition, he has not allowed a home run in 6 of his 7 home starts this season and is limiting batters to a .154 average at home which ranks 2nd among qualifying pitchers this season...

AGAINST THE ANGELS...is making his 2nd start against the Angels this season, last throwing 7.0 scoreless innings with 6 strikeouts and just 1 hit and 1 walk allowed on April 3 at Angel Stadium...in his last home start against the Angels (9/13/25), Woo threw a career-high 13 strikeouts...Mariners starters threw 13+ strikeouts in 4 games last season (also: George Kirby 2x and Bryce Miller) which led MLB...in addition, Woo has thrown 6.0+ IP in 6 of his 9 prior starts against the Angels, including 5 quality starts...the Angels will become just the 2nd team Woo has faced 10+ times in his career (also: Athletics, 10 GS).

KEEP OFF MY BASE PATHS...has thrown 7.0+ IP with 3-or-fewer baserunners allowed in 3 career games, including twice this season (5/30 vs. ARI and 4/3 at LAA)...is 1 of 7 AL pitchers with 3-or-more such games since 2025, joins teammate Luis Castillo who did so 3 times last season...has thrown 6.0+ innings with 5-or-fewer baserunners allowed in 6 starts this season, tied for most in MLB (also: Shohei Ohtani-LAD, Jacob Misiorowski-MIL, Paul Skenes-PIT, and Zack Wheeler-PHI)...his 17 such starts since 2025 are tied for 2nd most in MLB across that span (also: Paul Skenes-PIT)...Woo's 9.68 base-runners per nine innings this season is T-11th among qualified players, while his 9.25 career BR/9 ranks 5th-best since 2023.

SHUTTING THINGS DOWN...has thrown 7.0+ IP without an earned run allowed in 3 games this season (last: 6/18 vs. BAL)...is 1 of just 10 pitchers in MLB with 3-or-more such games this season...has recorded 6.0+ innings without an earned run in 5 starts this season, tied for most in MLB alongside Drew Rasmussen-TB and Cam Schlichter-NYY...Woo's 10 such starts since last season are 4th-most in MLB while his 16 such starts across his career are T-11th-most in franchise history.

ONE-HIT WONDERS...has tossed 6.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer hits in 2 starts this season (4/3 at LAA and 5/6 vs. ATL) and in 5 starts since 2025, which is tied for the most such games in MLB across that span, (also: Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD)...Woo and Emerson Hancock are 2 of 13 pitchers with multiple games of 6.0+ IP and 1-or-fewer hits allowed this season...the Mariners pitching staff has combined for 6 such games this year (also: Bryce Miller and Luis Castillo), which ties for the lead in MLB and for the most in a single season in franchise history (also: 2015 and 2023).

NEARING 500 x 2...is approaching both 500 career innings (488.2 IP) and 500 career strikeouts (484 SO)...would become the 19th pitcher in Mariners history to record 500+ career innings and 500+ career strikeouts with the club, joining teammates Logan Gilbert, George Kirby, and Luis Castillo.

COMMANDING THE ZONE...is 1 of 4 pitchers with 450+ strikeouts and fewer than 100 walks allowed since 2023 (484 SO, 98 BB), joining teammate George Kirby (579 SO, 95 BB), Tarik Skubal-DET (637 SO, 90 BB), and Paul Skenes-PIT (500 SO, 98 BB).

WATCH ME WHIP...his 0.99 career WHIP is tied for 5th-best in MLB among qualified pitchers since 2023, alongside Drew Rasmussen-TB and trails Tarik Skubal-DET (0.91), Jacob DeGrom-TEX (0.94), Paul Skenes-PIT (0.95) and Zack Wheeler-PHI (0.98)...his 0.99 career WHIP is also the lowest in franchise history (min. 400 IP), ranking ahead of teammate Logan Gilbert (1.053).

GOING THE DISTANCE...has thrown 6.0+ innings in 11 of his 16 starts this season and in 55 career starts...his 38 starts of 6.0+ IP since 2025 are most in MLB while his 279.2 IP since 2025 are 9th-most in MLB...has also thrown 9 quality starts this season and 30 total QS since 2025, most in the American League and 3rd-most in MLB across that span.

CRUISE CONTROL...has thrown 6.0+ innings with 9+ strikeouts in 5 games this season, tied for most such games in MLB, also: Jacob Misiorowski-MIL, Cristopher Sánchez-PHI and Chase Burns-CIN...his 11 such starts since 2025 are 3rd-most in MLB trailing Garrett Crochet-BOS (13) and Tarik Skubal-DET (14).

FEW FREE PASSES...among qualified pitchers since 2025, he ranks 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.37), 2nd in walks-per-nine (1.74), and 2nd in walk percentage (4.9%)...in addition, he has tossed 6.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer walks in 11 of his 16 starts this season and in 38 total starts since 2025, which leads MLB across that span.

WOO HOLDS THE TRIDENT...his 3.41 career ERA (185 ER, 488.2 IP) is a franchise-best mark among Mariners starters (min. 75 GS), ranking ahead of Randy Johnson, Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton who each hold a 3.42 career ERA.

- **SV#1** - Recorded first career MLB save on 6/9 at BAL, tossing 1.0 inning in the 10th inning and allowing 1 hit and 1 run (0 ER) with 1 strikeout...was recalled from Triple-A Tacoma earlier that day.
- **Streak!** - Has not allowed an earned run in his first 12 MLB appearances...his 12-game streak without an earned run to start his career is the 5th-longest in franchise history, 1 game behind the 4th-longest.
- **Welcome to the Show** - Made his Major League debut tossing 1.0 IP with a walk and a strikeout on May 3 vs. KC.
