NEW YORK METS (4-3) AT MIAMI MARLINS (1-3-3) MARCH 2, 2024 - 1:10 PM ROGER DEAN CHEVROLET STADIUM - JUPITER, FL LHP SEAN MANAEA (0-0, -.--) VS. RHP EURY PÉREZ (0-0, 5.40) WCBS 880



PREVIOUSLY ON...: Yesterday, the Mets fell to the St. Louis Cardinals, 3-2, in Jupiter...RHP Luis Severino made his first Grapefruit League start and threw 2.0 hitless innings...INF Mark Vientos launched an opposite-field solo home run in the second to put the Mets on the board...Minor league RHP Blade Tidwell allowed three runs over 1.2 innings and tallied four strikeouts...The right-hander struck out Jordan Walker, Nolan Gorman, Nolan Arenado and Matt Carpenter...C Tomás Nido recorded an RBI single in the eighth...RHPs Sean Reid-Foley, Eric Orze and Cam Robinson each threw 1.0 scoreless inning in relief.

ARMS APLENTY: Through seven games this spring, Mets pitchers have posted a 2.36 ERA (16 ER/61.0 IP), the best mark in the majors...The staff's 1.18 WHIP is the third-lowest in the majors, while their .219 opponent batting average is the fourth-lowest mark...Mets starting pitchers have pitched to a 2.13 ERA (3 ER/12.2 IP), the second-best mark in Grapefruit League play and the sixth-best mark in the majors...Mets relievers have pitched to a 2.42 ERA (13 ER/48.1 IP), the lowest mark in the majors.

ROCCO'S UNCLE: Over his last three games, OF Trayce Thompson has reached base safely in six of his eight plate appearances...On February 26 at Washington, Thompson went 2-3 with a grand slam and an RBI single...Two days later, Thompson went 2-2 with a double and a home run vs. St. Louis...Yesterday at St. Louis Thompson went 0-1 with two walks.

VS. MIAMI: Today the Mets will play their first of seven Grapefruit League games against Miami...Last season, the Mets went 9-4 against the Fish, their best record against a division foe...Mets pitchers posted a 2.51 ERA (32 ER/114.2 IP) against Miami last season, their second-lowest mark against a single opponent behind only Arizona (2.14)...This season, the Mets take on the Marlins at Citi Field from June 11-13 and August 16-18...New York will play at loanDepot Park from May 17-19 and from July 19-22.

MENDOZA LINES: Carlos Mendoza will begin his first season as the 25th manager in franchise history...The 44-year-old spent the previous 15 seasons with the Yankees organization, including the last four as the club's bench coach...From 2018-2019, Mendoza served as the Yankees' quality control coach...Prior to joining the big league coaching staff, Mendoza served as a manager and coach in the Yankees farm system...A native of Barquisimeto, Venezuela, Mendoza is the second full-time Venezuelan-born manager in big league history, joining Ozzie Guillén.

DOC AND DARRYL: This season the Mets will retire Dwight Gooden's #16 and Darryl Strawberry's #18...Gooden will be honored in a pregame ceremony on April 14, while Strawberry will be honored prior to June 2's game...Gooden won the 1984 NL Rookie of the Year Award while setting a major league rookie record with 276 strikeouts and was the youngest player ever named to an All-Star team at age 19...In 1985 Doc became the youngest pitcher ever to win Cy Young honors when he captured the "Triple Crown" of pitching, leading the majors in wins (24), strikeouts (268) and ERA (1.53)...Gooden was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in 2010 and ranks second in franchise history in wins (157) and strikeouts (1,875)...Strawberry was a seven-time All-Star with the Mets and earned National League Rookie of the Year honors in 1983...He is the Mets all-time leader in home runs (252), ranks second in RBI (733) and walks (580), third in extra-base hits (469) and runs (662) and fourth in slugging (.520)...Strawberry was also elected to the Mets Hall of Fame in 2010.

SPEAKING OF STRAW: Darryl Strawberry will be a guest instructor in camp until March 2.

CLOVER PARK: The Mets will call Clover Park home for their 36th season...Opened in 1988, Clover Park seats 7,000 fans and also serves as the regular season home to the Mets Class-A affiliate St. Lucie Mets...The ballpark also donned the name Thomas J. White Stadium (1988-2004), Tradition Field (2004-2009, 2012-2016), Digital Domain Park (2010-2012) and First Data Field (2017-2019).

MR. SMILE: Last season, Francisco Lindor became the Mets' fourth member of the 30-30 club (also, David Wright, Howard Johnson and Darryl Strawberry) as he established a career high with 31 stolen bases to pair with his 31 home runs...He joined Barry Larkin (1996), Alex Rodriguez (1998), Jimmy Rollins (2007), Hanley Ramirez (2008) and Bobby Witt Jr. (2023) as the only shortstops in major league history with a 30-30 season...The 30-year-old was among National League leaders in stolen bases (31, t-seventh), hit by pitches (12, t-13th), RBI (98, 14th), home runs (31, 14th), extra-base hits (66, t-14th), total bases (283, 15th) and doubles (33, t-16th last season).

POLAR POWER: Pete Alonso finished the 2023 season third in the majors in homers (46) and second in RBI (118)...He became the fifth player in major league history with three or more seasons of 40 or more homers in their first five years, joining Ralph Kiner (four), Ryan Howard, Albert Pujols and Eddie Mathews (three each)...His 192 career home runs are the most in the majors since his MLB debut in 2019 and are the third-most in major league history by a player in their first five major league seasons trailing Kiner (215) and Pujols (201)...Alonso currently ranks tied for fourth with Howard Johnson on the Mets all-time home run list...Mike Piazza is next (220).

INVADER NIM: Last season, Brandon Nimmo established career highs in many offensive categories including, games played (152), hits (162), homers (24), XBH (60) and RBI (68)...Nimmo's six triples were tied for eighth in the NL and his 13 triples since 2022 are tied for the most in the NL during that span...Since 2018, Nimmo has sported a .382 OBP, the fifth-highest mark in the NL and the 10th-highest mark in the majors during that time frame (min. 2000 plate appearances...His 24 home runs from the lead-off spot were the tied with Tommie Agee (1970) for the second-most by a Met in a single season.

ATTABOY ALVAREZ: In his rookie season, Francisco Alvarez slugged 25 home runs, the third-most by a Mets rookie trailing only Pete Alonso (2019) and Darryl Strawberry (1983)...Alvarez's 25 home runs last season were the second-most ever by a catcher age 21 or younger only behind Hall of Famer Johnny Bench (26, 1969)...Research courtesy of Sarah Langs...The Guatire, Venezuela native was named National League Rookie of the month for July.

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES: The 2024 Mets enter the season with several new players on the roster...These include: free agent signings OF Harrison Bader, LHP Jake Diekman, RHP Shintaro Fujinami, RHP Jorge López, LHP Sean Manaea, RHP Luis Severino, RHP Michael Tonkin and INF Joey Wendle; trade acquisitions RHP Adrian Houser, RHP Yohan Ramirez and OF Tyrone Taylor; waiver claims RHP Max Kranick and INF Zack Short; and minor league free agents: RHP Austin Adams, C Austin Allen, INF Rylan Bannon, INF Ji-Man Choi, RHP Kyle Crick, OF Ben Gamel, INF Jose Iglesias, OF Taylor Kohlwey, RHP Cam Robinson, INF Yolmer Sánchez, RHP Chad Smith, RHP Cole Sulser, OF Trayce Thompson, INF Luke Voit and LHP Danny Young.

EXPECTED TO START

LHP SEAN MANAEA: Will make his first Grapefruit League start today...On January 12, Manaea signed a two-year contract with the Mets...Last season, Manaea appeared in a career-high 37 games (10 starts) with San Francisco and went 7-6 with a 4.44 (58 ER/117.2 IP)...From July 29 through the end of the season, he posted a 2.61 ERA (15 ER/51.2 IP), the third-best mark in the NL and ninth-best in the majors (min. 50.0 IP)...In 2022, Manaea went 8-9 with a 4.96 ERA (87 ER/158.0 IP) in 30 games (28 starts) as a member of the Padres...The southpaw spent his first six major league seasons with Oakland and went 50-41 with a 3.86 ERA (312 ER/727.0 IP) over 129 outings...In 2021, Manaea tied for the American League lead in starts with 32 and was one of five pitchers in the majors to record two shutouts...That season, Manaea established career highs in innings (179.1) and strikeouts (194)...On April 21, 2018 Manaea threw a no-hitter vs. Boston, the first by an A's pitcher since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010...A native of Valparaiso, Indiana, Manaea was originally drafted by the A's in the first round (34th overall) of the 2013 First-Year Player Draft out of Indiana State University.

OUR PROSPECTS ARE GOOD: New York enters the season with four prospects in *MLB Pipeline's* top 100...Three of the four are here in major league camp with the Mets...They are: INF Jett Williams (No. 45), OF Drew Gilbert (No. 53) and INF Luisangel Acuña (No. 66)...The other is OF Ryan Clifford (No. 97)...Williams was a first-round selection (14th overall) by the Mets in 2022 and was named the Mets Player Development Hitter of the Year last season as a 19-year-old...Gilbert, Acuña and Clifford all joined the organization last summer via trade...Acuña was acquired from Texas in exchange for Max Scherzer...Gilbert and Clifford came to New York in the Justin Verlander deal with Houston.

THE CREAM OF THE CROP: Seven of New York's top 10 prospects (according to Baseball America) are in camp with the big league club...In addition to Williams, Gilbert and Acuña, RHP Christian Scott, RHP Mike Vasil and C Kevin Parada are participating in major league Spring Training (INF Ronny Mauricio, on the 60-Day IL recovering from a torn right ACL, is in Port St. Lucie as well).
