TRANSACTION

C Ryan Lavarney, who was designated for assignment Sunday, today cleared waivers and was outrighted to Louisville...he made 5 apps and 4 starts for the Reds while all 3 catchers on the **Opening Day roster - Tucker Barnhart (IL), Curt Casali (IL) and Kyle Farmer (concussion)** - were unable to play...on 7/19 vs StL, **Lavarney** became the **first player** with **2 HR** in his first game with the Reds, the first player with **more than 3 RBI** in his first game with the Reds and only the **fourth Major League player**, since **RBI** became a statistic in 1920, to produce in his debut for a team at least **3 hits, 2 HR and 6 RBI**.

2ND HALF

Since the All-Star break the Redlegs are **8-9**, lead the Major Leagues in **batting average** (.299) and lead the National League in both **slugging percentage** (.502) and **on-base percentage** (.360)...are tied with the Dodgers for the NL lead, tying for fourth-most in the majors, in second-half **runs scored** (101, 5.94 r/g)...Reds pitchers rank 13th in the NL in second-half **ERA** (5.06).

FIRST WATCH

In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in **runs scored** (85), **HR** (30), **RBI** (82), **batting average** (.304), **slugging percentage** (.583) and **on-base percentage** (.368)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, **85-51**, and are **25-8** when leading after the first inning...**5 times** this season scored at least **4 runs** in the first...**3B Eugenio Suárez** is hitting **.333** in the first frame, leads the Major Leagues with **10 HR** that inning and is tied for the lead with **20 RBI**.

Eugenio Suárez leads the team with **28 HR**, tied for seventh-most in the Major Leagues, and joins National Baseball Hall of Famer **Tony Pérez** as the only Reds third basemen ever to produce at least **25 home runs** in **3 seasons** or more...**Suárez** hit **34 HR** last season and **26 HR** in 2017.

The Redlegs enter today's games facing a **6.5-game deficit** in the National League **Central Division** and a **6.5-game deficit** in the **Wild Card** standings...per @EliasSports, the **2003 Twins** and **2011 Rays** are the only teams, since the inception of the **Wild Card** in **1995**, to make the playoffs after being **6.5 games** or more out of a playoff spot on **July 30**.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (1-0) of a 3-game series vs **Jim Trdinich's Pirates** and **Game 5** (3-1) of a 6-game homestand that included a **2-1 series win** vs the **Rockies**...following this series, the Redlegs will visit **Atl's SunTrust Park** (4g) before returning to **Great American Ball Park** for a 7-day, 6-game homestand vs the **Angels** (2g) and **Cubs** (4g).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are **48-47** since the bench-clearing incident on **4/7 at PNC Park** that led to the ejections of **David Bell, Amir Garrett** and **Yasiel Puig**...from **4/4-4/7** the Pirates swept a **4-game series** from the Reds for the first time since **7/11-7/14, 1991 at Riverfront Stadium** and did it in **Pittsburgh** for the first time since **8/22-8/24, 1969 at Forbes Field**...from **3/31-4/5** the Reds were shut out by the Pirates in **3 consecutive games** (5-0, 2-0, 2-0) for the first time since **7/31-8/2, 1931** (5-0 & 1-0 losses at Pit, 3-0 loss at Cin).

BRAVES UP NEXT: The Redlegs lead the season series, 2-1 (4/23-4/25 at GABP)...haven't lost a season series to the Braves since **2014** (2-5) and since then are **4-0-1** in **5 season series** and **17-13** in **30 games**...the Reds went **2-1** in both of their series in Atlanta at **SunTrust Park**, including a 5-3 win on **8/18/17** in their inaugural game at the new park...from **1997-2016** Cin went **27-42** at **Turner Field** and didn't win a series there after **9/4-9/6, 2009 (0-3-4** in 7 series, **8-14** in 22 games)...in the final 2 exhibition games of 2019 spring training, the Braves earned 8-5 and 7-5 wins at **SunTrust Park**.

CATCH A BREAK: The Reds have used **5 catchers** this season, including **Tucker Barnhart, Curt Casali, Kyle Farmer, Juan Graterol** and **Ryan Lavarney**...the **3 catchers** on the club's **Opening Day roster - Barnhart (IL), Casali (IL) & Farmer** (concussion) - simultaneously were unable to play for **8 days (7/18-7/25)** until **Barnhart** came off the injured list prior to Fri night's game...**Barnhart** and **Farmer** have returned to the active roster...**Barnhart** on Fri filled the roster spot vacated by **Graterol**, who went on the **7-day concussion list**...**Farmer** was reinstated from the 7-day concussion list prior to Sun's game...he replaced **Lavarney**, who was designated for assignment...per @EliasSports, the Reds used **6 catchers** in a season just **7 times** in their history, most recently in **1992 (Troy Afenir, Scott Bradley, Joe Oliver, Jeff Reed, Dan Wilson, Rick Wrona)**...also used **6 catchers** in **1963, 1961, 1937, 1925** and **1895**...the **1909 Reds** used a club-record **8 catchers (Tommy Clarke, Tom Downey, Emil Haberer, Mike Konnick, Larry McLean, Si Pauxtis, Duck Pearce, Frank Roth)**.

2-WAY PLAYER: **RHP Michael Lorenzen** has appeared in 65 of the Reds' 104 games so far this season, including 44 times solely as a **pitcher**, twice as a **pinch hitter/pitcher**, once as a **pitcher/LF/RF** (7/22 at Mil), once as a **pitcher/LF** (6/2 vs Wsh), 3 times as a **CF**, 3 times as a **LF**, 7 times solely as a **pinch runner**, once as a **pinch runner/CF** (3/28 vs Pit, CF), once as a **pinch runner/LF** (5/9 at Oak) and once as a **pinch runner/RF** (5/24 at Chi) and once as a **CF/P** (7/17 at Chi)...**9 times** in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...**5 times** in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...**Lorenzen** this year became the **first player in Reds history**, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in **each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)**...is the first Reds player with more than 380 career innings pitched (382.1) to play center field since **Hal Jeffcoat** (474.1ip) in **1958**...**Ron Mahay** was the last Major League pitcher with at least 300 innings also to play CF...**Mahay** played in 5g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 300th inning in 2006 for the Rangers.

BLACK & BLUE: **Derek Dietrich** has been hit by a pitch **22 times**, the most in the Major Leagues and third-most in Reds history (Shin-Soo Choo, 26, 2013 & Jason LaRue, 24, 2004)...was hit by a pitch **6 times** in the 4-game series at Mil from **6/20-6/23** and was hit by a pitch **4 times** in the 3-game series at Chi from **7/15-7/17**...he is the only player in **modern Major League history** to get hit by a pitch **6 times** in a series of any length...was hit by a pitch twice in that series opener vs the Brewers, a 7-1 Reds win...in the 11-7 win in Game 2 became the first Reds batter in the modern era to be **hit by a pitch** 3 times in a game, tying the **Major League record** accomplished many times, and the first Reds batter ever to be hit at least twice in consecutive apps...in 15 apps this season vs the Brewers, **Dietrich** has been **hit by a pitch 8 times**...he has been hit by a pitch **115 times** in his career...notes courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

RED HOTS

Tanner Roark's last name is pronounced RO-arc...tonight is making the sixth start of his career and second of this season vs the Pirates...over 4 apps from 6/8-6/26 didn't issue a walk over 22 innings...from 4/24-6/1 didn't allow a home run in 36.1 innings, the second-longest homerless streak of his career (45.2ip, 8/7-9/23, 2013)...on 6/8 at Phi, in the third inning reached **1,000 career innings pitched** (Rhys Hoskins' GDP) and in the fourth inning recorded his **800th career strikeout** (Scott Kingery)...on 7/13 at Col made the **200th appearance** of his career...in the 5-2 loss on 6/1 vs Wsh drove in both Reds runs on a suicide squeeze bunt and the first home run of his career (solo off Eric Fedde)...made his Reds debut in the third game of the season.

66 YASIEL PUIG, of 2nd Half: 17g, 16-62 (.258), 5 2b, 2hr, 8rbi

- Name is pronounced yah-SEE-el PWEEG.
- Ranks 19th in the NL in hitting with RISP (.319, 29-91).
- Leads the team and ranks 11th in the National League with 13 stolen bases, 2 shy of his career high (15sb, 2017, 2018).
- With 22 HR and 60 RBI through 104 team games is on pace to produce 34 HR and 93 RBI...his single-season career highs for HR and RBI are 28 and 74, both in 2017.
- Produced his last HR on 7/15 at Cubs (13g).

15 NICK SENZEL, cf 2nd Half: 13g, 10gs, 15-42 (.357), 2 2b, 2 3b, 2rbi, 1sb

- Last name is pronounced sen-ZELL.
- Before he was ejected in Sun's 3-2 win vs Col went 0-for-3, snapping his 4-game hitting streak (6-13, .462, .995ops)...hit safely in 8 of his 13 second-half apps.
- Is the only player in franchise history, and 1 of only 21 players in Major League history, to produce 3 HR in his first 4 Major League apps.
- Went hitless on 6/2 vs Wsh, snapping a 9-game hitting streak (14-41, .341, 5 2b, 1hr, 5rbi, .378obp) and a 20-game on-base streak (26-86, .302, 6 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 8rbi, 4sb, .358obp)...is the longest hitting streak by any Reds batter this season and ties Joey Votto's for the longest on-base streak by a Reds hitter.
- Began the season on Louisville's injured list with a right ankle sprain suffered on 3/25 during a spring training game in Goodyear...came off the IL on 4/23 and in 8 apps for the Bats prior to his 5/3 promotion hit .257 (1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi).

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf 2nd Half: 17g, 18-59 (.305), 8hr, 15rbi

- First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh.
- Since the All-Star break leads the National League in slugging percentage (.763), is tied with StL's Paul Goldschmidt for the lead in HR (8) and ranks among the NL's second-half leaders in BA (.305, T11th), RBI (15, T6th) and extra-base hits (10, T8th).
- In the first inning, leads the Major Leagues with 10 HR and is tied for the lead with 20 RBI...also in the first frame ranks T12th in the National League in hitting .333 (27-81).
- Beginning 6/30, homered in 10 of his last 24 apps (12hr, 24rbi).
- Twice this season homered in 3 consecutive plate apps (7/1-7/12, 7/22-7/23).
- Joins Tony Pérez as the only third basemen in franchise history to hit 25 or more HR in 3 or more seasons...his 11 HR this month are the most by a Reds batter in July since Adam Dunn hit 12 HR in July 2008...no Reds batter has hit more than Dunn's 12 HR in July since Frank Robinson hit 13 HR in July 1961.

17 JOSH VANMETER, inf/of 2nd Half: 11g, 7gs, 13-29 (.448), 2 2b, 4hr, 6rbi

- In his last 10 apps beginning 7/19 is hitting .464 (13-28, 2 2b, 4hr, 6rbi, .964slg, .516obp)...from Wed-Sat homered in 3 straight apps, a streak snapped in Sun's 3-2 win vs Col...was the third Reds player to homer in 3 straight games this season (Derek Dietrich, Eugenio Suárez twice).
- On 7/18 was promoted from Louisville as 1 of 7 roster moves...since then has made 11 apps (13-29, .448, 2 2b, 4hr, 6rbi, .931slg, .515obp), including 5 starts in LF, 1 start at 2B and 1 start at 3B.
- Is his fourth stint on the Reds' roster...from 5/5-5/16, in his first Major League apps, went 2-for-14 (1rbi) in 8 apps and 2 starts...from 5/21-6/18 made 20 apps, including 5 starts (7-27, .259, 2 2b, 2rbi, .375obp)...in his third stint, from 7/4-7/7 went 1-for-4 with a 2-run double in 2 apps (PH, PH-LF-2B-1B-LF).
- Has made 13 starts for the Reds (9gs in LF, 2gs at 3B, 1gs at 2B, 1gs at DH).
- His solo HR off RHP Jhoulys Chacín on 7/24 at Mil traveled 463 feet per Statcast, the longest by a Reds batter this season and the second-longest by any player at Miller Park in 2019 (Travis Shaw, 465 feet, 6/23 vs Cin)...was the longest home run by a visiting player at Miller Park since StL's Marcell Ozuna hit a 479-foot HR on 4/3/18.
- Is a 2019 International League All-Star...in 49 apps for the Bats hit .348 (14 2b, 1 3b, 14hr, 43rbi, 8sb, 1.097ops)...started at 1B (10g), 2B (20g), 3B (10g) and LF (3g).
- In April was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month and the International League's Player of the Month...in April hit .358 and led the IL in games (26), hits (34), runs (24), HR (11), RBI (28), total bases (24), slugging percentage (.758) and OPS (1.204)...his 11 HR and 28 RBI are RiverBats/Bats records for April (since 2000).
- In spring training came over from minor league camp to make 10 apps for Reds (1-13).
- Is a native and resident of Ossian (AH-see-in), Indiana, a town of about 3,400 located near Fort Wayne...graduated from Norwell High School.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b 2nd Half: 17g, 17-70 (.243), 4 2b, 1hr, 10rbi

- For the fifth straight season, was voted by managers, scouts and executives the batter with the best strike zone judgment in the National League.
- Has at least 1 RBI in 5 of his last 7 apps (7rbi) and in 7 of his last 11 apps (9rbi).
- In his last 52 apps beginning 5/24 is hitting .308, raising his season BA from .208 (62-201, 14 2b, 5hr, 24rbi, .378obp).
- From 5/8-6/4 reached base safely in 20 consecutive games, a season-high that ties Nick Senzel's (5/10-6/1) for the longest by a Reds batter this season.
- Beginning 5/8 made his last 62 starts batting second in the order...made 15 starts this season batting leadoff (last, 5/7 at Oak)...entered this year with 1 career start batting leadoff (6/18/08 vs LAD).
- In his career has hit 63 HR on the first pitch.

33 JESSE WINKER, of 2nd Half: 17g, 14-46 (.304), 3 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 7rbi

- Among National League leaders since the All-Star break ranks T6th in on-base percentage (.421) and 13th in batting average (.304).
- In his last 11 apps is hitting .333 (11-33, 3 2b, 1hr, 4rbi, .515slg, .450obp).
- Hit safely in 9 of his 12 starts and in 10 of his 17 apps in the second half.
- In the 4-3 win on 6/18 vs Hou hit his second career leadoff HR (off Justin Verlander).
- Has 14 HR, a new single-season career high (7hr, 2017 & 2018)...his career high for RBI in a season is 43 (2018).
- Hit his eighth HR, his new career high, in his 28th appearance and 23rd start.
- Has made 77 starts, including a team-high 52 starts in LF (15gs in CF, 9gs in RF, 1gs at DH).
