## PITTSBURGH PIRATES (67-89) vs. CINCINNATI REDS (80-76)

Sept. 23, 2025 - Great American Ball Park - Cincinnati, OH - 6:40 EDT - Game #157/Road #76  
RHP Johan Oviedo (2-0, 3.52 ERA) vs. RHP Brady Singer (14-10, 3.86 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** had the day off on Monday and will finish the 2025 season with this six-game road trip to Cincinnati and Atlanta...Have won back-to-back games (Saturday-Sunday vs. the Athletics) after dropping 12 of 13 games from September 5-19...Are 55-63 since Don Kelly made his managerial debut on May 9 vs. Atlanta...Have recorded at least one extra-base hit in 55 consecutive games (since July 22 vs. Detroit), the second-longest active streak in all of Major League Baseball (the Athletics, 73 games, rank first) and their longest single-season streak since a 64-game streak from June 1-August 14, 2019...Have played in a Major League-high 58 one-run games (are 24-34 in those games), their most in any season since 2014 (60).

**SHUT 'EM DOWN:** Pittsburgh recorded its Major League-best 19th shutout of the season in Sunday's 11-0 win vs. the Athletics...It was the Pirates' largest shutout victory since a 14-0 win on August 24, 2019 vs. Cincinnati...It was their second straight shutout (they defeated the Athletics, 2-0, on Saturday)...It marked the third time this season that they recorded shutouts in consecutive games, along with June 30-July 2 vs. St. Louis (three straight games) and July 26-27 vs. Arizona (back-to-back games)...Their 19 shutouts are the most by any Major League team in a season since New York-NL (also 19) in 2022...The last teams to have at least 20 shutouts in a season were Chicago (NL) and Los Angeles (NL), which recorded 21 shutouts apiece in 2015...The 19 shutouts are also tied with 1968 for Pittsburgh's second-most in any season during the Live Ball Era (since 1920), trailing only the 1992 season (20 shutouts).

**PITCHING PROWESS:** The Pirates have allowed zero runs and zero walks in each of their last two games (Saturday-Sunday vs. the Athletics)...The only other times in the Modern Era (since 1901) that Pittsburgh did that in back-to-back games came from May 2-5, 1920 and July 12-13, 2001...The only other Major League team to do that this season was Texas from April 1-2 at Cincinnati...The only Major League team in the Modern Era to do that in three straight games was Los Angeles from September 18-20, 1988...Prior to this current instance, the last time Pirates pitchers issued zero walks in back-to-back games came from May 3-4, 2024 vs. Colorado...Pittsburgh has pitched at least three consecutive games without issuing a walk only 16 times in the Modern Era...That last happened from July 8-13, 2001 (three straight games).

**BARC UP THAT TREE:** Hunter Barco, who is currently rated by MLB Pipeline as the No. 82 prospect in baseball (rated as the No. 4 prospect in Pittsburgh's organization), went a combined 4-1 with a 2.81 ERA (99.1ip/31er), 116 strikeouts and a .196 batting average against (70-for-358) in his 27 appearances (23 starts) split between Double-A Altoona and Triple-A Indianapolis this season...He recorded a 1.86 ERA (9.2ip/2er) over his final four outings (one start).

**FOUR THE RECORD:** Jared Triolo and Joey Bart each doubled, homered and recorded three RBI in their respective four-hit performances on Sunday vs. the Athletics...It marked each player's second career four-hit game (Triolo also did that on September 23, 2023 at Cincinnati, while Bart also did it on May 10 vs. Atlanta)...The only Pirate other than Bart with multiple four-hit games this season is Nick Gonzales (three games)...Pittsburgh only had one other game in the Modern Era (since 1901) where multiple players recorded at least four hits (including a double and a home run) and three RBI in the same game...That also happened on August 1, 1970, when Jose Pagan, Bob Robertson and Willie Stargell all accomplished that in a 20-10 win at Atlanta.

**THE GIVING TRI:** Jared Triolo has gone 49-for-166 (.295) with 10 doubles, two triples, four home runs, 14 RBI, 21 walks, seven stolen bases, 28 runs scored and an .830 OPS over 46 games since being recalled from Triple-A Indianapolis on August 1...He is also hitting .306 (33-for-108) with an .884 OPS since August 22 vs. Colorado...Triolo's 13 multi-hit performances since August 22 are tied with Tampa Bay's Yandy Díaz, Chicago (NL)'s Nico Hoerner and Washington's Daylen Lile for the most in all of Major League Baseball during that stretch...His 33 hits during that span are tied for the ninth-most in the National League.

### ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

September 23, 2013: Pittsburgh secured its first postseason berth since 1992 with a 2-1 win over Chicago at Wrigley Field, as well as St. Louis' 4-3 win over Washington at Busch Stadium. Starling Marte broke a 1-1 tie with his two-out, solo home run off the Cubs' Kevin Gregg in the top of the ninth inning. Chicago's Nate Schierholtz was thrown out at home plate to end the game.

HOW ACQUIRED: From St. Louis in a four-player trade on August 1, 2022.

**AS OF LATE:** Oviedo allowed a season-high four runs on five hits and three walks (he had three strikeouts) over 5.0 innings in his last start on September 17 vs. Chicago (NL), having a no-decision in an 8-4 loss...He has a 3.03 ERA (29.2ip/10er) and a .179 batting average against (19-for-106) over his last six starts (since August 20 vs. Toronto) after allowing two runs across 1.0 inning in his season debut on August 4 vs. San Francisco.

**THE MORE YOU JO:** Oviedo has made five starts with Pittsburgh where he’s pitched at least 5.0 innings, allowed two or fewer hits, one or zero runs and struck out at least five batters (last on August 20 vs. Toronto)...His five such starts since making his Pirates debut in 2022 are the second-most during that span, behind only Paul Skenes (seven).

**AGAINST THE REDS:** Oviedo is 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (26.2ip/16er) in eight career appearances (five starts) against Cincinnati...He is also 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (10.0ip/6er) in two career starts against the Reds as a member of the Pirates...Oviedo pitched 5.0 scoreless innings on September 13 (G1), 2022 here at Great American Ball Park, winning a 6-1 decision...He also allowed six runs over 5.0 innings on August 11, 2023 at PNC Park, losing a 9-2 decision...In his four career outings (three starts) here in Cincinnati, he has recorded a 4.20 ERA (15.0ip/7er) with a .185 batting average against.

**ON THE FARM:** Oviedo was optioned to Triple-A Indianapolis following Pittsburgh’s win on August 4 vs. San Francisco...In two starts with the Indians (August 9 vs. Omaha and August 15 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre), he allowed four runs (three earned) while striking out 15 batters over his 8.2 innings of work before being recalled on August 20.

**THE LONG ROAD BACK:** Oviedo missed all of 2024 while recovering from right elbow surgery (December 6, 2023)...In 2025 spring training, he was placed on the 60-day injured list on March 3 due to surgery recovery/a right lat strain...Oviedo returned to a Major League mound for the first time since September 27, 2023 at Philadelphia with his start on August 4 vs. San Francisco (he threw 43 pitches in his 1.0 inning of work).

**ON THE MEND:** On his rehab assignment, which was split between the rookie-level Florida Complex League Pirates, Low-A Bradenton, Double-A Altoona and Triple-A Indianapolis, Oviedo posted a 3.12 ERA (17.1ip/6er) and 21 strikeouts across six starts.

**2023 IN REVIEW:** Oviedo went 9-14 with a 4.31 ERA (177.2ip/85er) while making a team-high-tying 32 starts (also Mitch Keller) during the 2023 season...He had 15 starts where he allowed one or zero runs, tied with Miami’s Braxton Garrett and Minnesota’s Sonny Gray for the second-most starts in all of Major League Baseball, trailing only San Diego’s Blake Snell (17)...Those 15 starts were also the most by any Pittsburgh pitcher in a season since Francisco Liriano in 2013 (Paul Skenes has 17 this year)...Oviedo’s .237 batting average against was the eighth-lowest among all qualified pitchers in the National League...He had a career-high, 15.1-inning scoreless streak from April 3-14.

**YOU COMPLETE ME:** Oviedo tossed his first career complete game on August 28, 2023 at Kansas City, allowing two hits and two walks while striking out five batters and throwing a career-high 112 pitches in Pittsburgh’s 5-0 win...The 112 pitches thrown by Oviedo that evening were the most by a Pirates pitcher in a complete game since Edinson Volquez threw 114 pitches in his complete game on July 10, 2014 at St. Louis.

**LAND OF THE FREE:** Oviedo defected from Cuba at the age of 15, living in Ecuador and the Dominican Republic before settling in Jacksonville, Florida, when he was 18...He brought his family from Cuba to the United States of America in the 2022-23 offseason.
