PITTSBURGH PIRATES (11-16) vs. LOS ANGELES DODGERS (16-10)

April 26, 2025 - Dodger Stadium - Los Angeles, CA - 6:10 PDT - Game #28/Road #15

RHP Mitch Keller (1-2, 4.18 ERA) vs. RHP Roki Sasaki (0-1, 3.20 ERA)

THE PIRATES: shut out the Dodgers, 3-0, last night and are 3-1 through the first four games of their six-game road trip (won two of three against the Angels in Anaheim from Tuesday-Thursday)...Would secure their first winning road trip of more than three games since July 9-14, 2024 (2-1 at Milwaukee, 3-0 at Chicago-AL) with a win tonight...Arrived in SoCal following a 3-4 homestand from April 14-20 against Washington (3-1) and Cleveland (0-3)...Will return to Pittsburgh for an off day on Monday, followed by a six-game homestand where they'll face Chicago-NL (April 29-May 1) and San Diego (May 2-4).

BUCCO BLANKINGS: Pittsburgh's pitching staff has three shutouts this season, all of which have come over the team's last eight games (April 17 vs. Washington, Wednesday at Los Angeles-AL, Friday at Los Angeles-NL)...The three shutouts in that span are most in Major League Baseball (the Dodgers and Yankees each have two during that stretch), while they're tied for fourth-most in all of MLB in 2025...The only teams with more shutouts than Pittsburgh are San Diego (7), Milwaukee (4), New York-NL (4) and Texas (4).

ABOUT TONIGHT'S STARTER: Mitch Keller will get the start here tonight in the second game of this weekend series against the Dodgers in Los Angeles...Keller allowed two runs in 5.0 innings, but had a no-decision in the team's 5-4, 10-inning loss in his last start on April 20 vs. Cleveland...Since allowing seven runs across 3.2 innings on April 4 against New York (AL), the 29-year-old Keller has a 2.45 ERA (18.1ip/5er) in his last three starts (the Pirates have not scored a run when Keller was in the game in each of those three starts).

A PIRATE'S LIFE FOR ME: Oneil Cruz stole his 12th base of the season in the first inning of Friday's win, tied with Chicago (NL)'s Pete Crow-Armstrong for most in all of Major League Baseball...Cruz has successfully stolen 32 consecutive bases since last being caught on April 22, 2024 (by Milwaukee's William Contreras), tied with Tony Womack (April 6-July 4, 1997) for the longest streak of successful steals by a Pirates player since caught stealings were first officially tracked in the National League in 1951...Cruz' streak is the longest-active streak in all of Major League Baseball (Milwaukee's Christian Yelich, 22 steals, ranks second).

BETTER CALL PAUL: Paul Skenes struck out nine Dodgers and didn't issue a walk over 6.1 scoreless innings in Friday's win at Dodger Stadium, making him one of only three Pirates pitchers since the start of 2024 to post those stats or better in a game (Mitch Keller, last August 20 at Texas and Jared Jones, last May 4 vs. Colorado)...Skenes' 1.24 earned run average (80.0ip/11er) through the first 14 road starts of his career is the lowest by any Major League pitcher through his first 14 road starts since ERA became an official stat in both leagues in 1913.

PUNCH 'EM OUT IN BUNCHES: Pirates pitchers combined to strike out 11 hitters in Friday's win and have punched out 11-plus in three of their last four games (struck out 12 batters in each of their wins on Tuesday and Wednesday in Anaheim)...Pittsburgh has struck out 48 batters over its last five games...The Pirates' seven games with 11-plus strikeouts are tied for fourth-most in the National League...Only New York (11), Los Angeles (10) and Philadelphia (10) have more.

NINE LIVES: Adam Frazier singled in the sixth inning of Friday's win, extending his hitting streak to nine straight games (since April 16 vs. Washington)...It's Frazier's longest hitting streak since also hitting safely in nine consecutive games with Seattle from July 10-23, 2022...During the streak, Frazier is batting .360 with three doubles, two RBI, five walks, three steals and four runs scored.

PACED BY PITCHING: Over its last 15 games (since April 9 vs. St. Louis), Pittsburgh's pitching staff has posted a 2.78 ERA (136.0ip/42er), the fourth-lowest mark in all of Major League Baseball, trailing only San Diego (2.20), Detroit (2.47) and New York-NL (2.76)...Since April 9, the Pirates have won four games in which they scored three runs or fewer (including last night), tied with San Diego for the most-such wins by any Major League team during that span.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

April 26, 2016: Andrew McCutchen joined Ralph Kiner, Willie Stargell and Roberto Clemente as the only players in club history to record multiple three-homer games. His performance helped guide Pittsburgh to a 9-4 win at Colorado, extending the Pirates' winning streak at Coors Field to a club-record seven games. Starling Marte hit his third homer of the season in the sixth inning.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected by the Pirates in the 2nd round of the 2014 Draft.

STARTING OFF: The 29-year-old Keller is in his seventh Major League season...He signed a five-year contract extension through the 2028 season on February 23, 2024... He earned Opening Day honors in both 2023 and 2024, which made him the first Pirate to do so since Francisco Liriano started three straight season openers from 2014-16... He was selected by the Pirates in the second round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Keller allowed two runs in 5.0 innings and was in line for the loss, but had a no-decision in the team’s 5-4, 10-inning loss against Cleveland on April 20.

AGAINST THE DODGERS: Keller will make his sixth career start tonight against the Dodgers...He has lost each of his last two starts against Los Angeles, which both came here at Dodger Stadium (August 9, 2024 and July 3, 2023)...He has one win at Dodger Stadium, which came on May 31, 2022, when he allowed two runs over 5.0 innings.

IN NEED OF SUPPORT: Keller has not received a run of support when he has been in the game in each of his last three starts...Before that, his last run of support came on April 4 against the Yankees, when the Pirates scored one run when he was in the game.

THE 700 CLUB: With his strikeout of St. Louis’ Pedro Pagés in the seventh inning of his start on April 9, Keller notched his 700th career strikeout...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the fastest pitcher in club history to reach 700 strikeouts with Pittsburgh by innings (718.1)...The previous record was held by Bob Veale (740.0 innings)...Per Elias, he also became the third-fastest pitcher in team history to reach the 700-strikeout mark with Pittsburgh by games (136), behind Gerrit Cole (126) and Veale (135).

KEEPING IT 100: Heading into the 2024 All-Star break, Keller was 10-5 with 105 strikeouts in 114.1 innings pitched...He became the fourth pitcher in club history to have 10-plus wins, 100-plus strikeouts and 100.0-plus innings pitched prior to the All-Star break, along with Gerrit Cole in 2015, Bob Veale in 1966 and Bob Friend in 1960.

AS A PIRATE: The Pirates selected Keller in the second round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of Xavier High School in Cedar Rapids, Iowa...He was rated by Baseball America as Pittsburgh’s No. 1 prospect in each season from 2018-20...He was also recognized by the same publication as a top-100 prospect in the game from 2017-20.

SIGN HERE PLEASE: The Pirates signed Keller to a five-year contract extension through 2028 last year on February 23...He became the third member of the current team to sign a long-term contract extension, along with Ke’Bryan Hayes and Bryan Reynolds.
