## RHP Max Scherzer (8-2, 1.93) vs. RHP Jake Odorizzi (4-4, 3.80) <br> SNY - WCBS 880 AM • ESPN 1050

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves, $5-0$, last night...The Mets have lost two in a row...The Mets are in a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (14-5)...The Mets are 59 continue a 10 -game, nine-day road trip to Atlanta (0-2), Philadelphia (four games) and New York-AL (two games).

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK: Brett Baty, the Mets' No. 2 prospect and MLB's No. 18 prospect (MLB Pipeline) has appeared in 95 games this year between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse and combined to hit .315/.410/.533 with 76 runs, 22 doubles, 19 home runs, 60 RBI with a . 943 OPS...In six games with Triple-A Syracuse, the 22 -year-old was batting 364 (8-22) with three runs and an RBI...He was named the July MiLB Player of th Month for the Eastern League, hitting, . $365 / .435 / .688$ and leading the league in home runs (eight), RBI (27), total bases (66), slugging percentage (.688) and OPS (1.123)... He finished second in hits (35), third in average (.365), fifth in on-base percentage (.435) and sixth in runs (17)...The 22-year-old was selected by the Mets in the first round (12th overall) of the 2019 MLB Draft out of Lake Travis High School in Austin, Texas

LET'S NOT GO STREAKING: The Mets have lost back-to-back games...The Mets have lost a season-high three games twice this season from June 26-29 and again from July 17-23.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 11 straight games against the NL East (2-3)...Overall, the Mets are 39-17 against the East this year...They have not lost a series in the division all season long and have already clinched the season series vs. Philadelphia, Washington and Miami...New York must win two of its five remaining games against Atlanta to lock up all four season series vs. division foes (last accomplished by the ets in 2015) Since May 27 , the team has gone $26-10$ in the division...Overall, the Me have posted a 3.21 ERA against the East, while hitting .259/.334/.411...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents, 274-188.

RETURN OF THE MAX: Since returning from the IL on July 5, Max Scherzer has gone 3-1 with a 1.36 ERA ( $8 \mathrm{ER} / 53.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in eight starts...That is the lowest ERA in the NL and
 for the major leage with 67 strikeouts apiece since that date Scherzer' 530 innings since his return rank third in the majors... He leads the majors with a $11.17 \mathrm{~K} / \mathrm{BB}$ ratio since July 5 .

MAX K'S, MIN WALKS: Scherzer's clubs have won each of his last four starts against the Braves, a stretch during which he has piled up 38 strikeouts without issuing a single walk. He has fanned at least nine batters in each of those four starts. No other pitcher in major league history has struck out nine or more and walked none in four , allowing just one run on seven hits.

DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer ranks fourth all-time with 109 double-digit strikeout game in his career, one more than Pedro Martinez...Roger Clemens (110) is next on the list... Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212) are the top two

TWENTY-TWENTY, TWENTY-FOUR HOURS TO GO: Brandon Nimmo has reached bas safely in 24 straight road games, the longest stretch of his career...He is batting . 37 (37-100) with 23 runs, six doubles, five home runs, 16 RBI, 10 walks with a .439 OBP a . 580 SLG and a 1.019 OPS in that span that dates to June 12...Overall, he is batting .318/.408/.507 with 46 runs, 11 doubles, two triples, nine home runs, 31 RBI and 27 walks in 57 road games this season...This compares to a .209/.286/.311 slashline with 24 runs in 51 games at Citi Field in 2022...Nimmo's 407 road OBP is second in the National League and fourth in the majors

STARTING OFF: Since the start of July, Mets starters have posted a MLB-best 2.45 ERA (64 earned runs/235.1 innings) in 41 games with 259 strikeouts and 56 walks The Dodgers are second in that period with a 2.62 ERA, followed by the Braves with a 3.13 ERA...New Yorks' 259 strikeouts in that span lead the NL and are second in the majors...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.46 in that span...The Mets rank fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a 3.45 ERA from their starters.

TO THINE OWN SELF BE TRUIST: Jeff McNeil has hit . 359 (23-64) with eight runs, eight doubles, a Braves...Tyler Naquin has hit . 292 (7-24) with four runs, two doubles, a home run, fou RBl and a walk in eight games at the yard...Darin Ruf owns a . 316 (6-19) mark with three runs, a home run, two RBI and four walks in six games

ATL-ONSO: The Mets have eight wins against Atlanta this year and Alonso has driven in the game-winning run in six of those games....Manny Machado (five vs. San Francisco) is the only other player with five or more game-winning RBI against one team this year...Only four players have had more than six game-winning RBI against a single opponent in on ason since game-winning RBI started being tracked in 1974: Michael Cuddyer (2009 (2002 Braves vs. Phillies), Andy Van Slyke (1990 Pirates game-winning RBI,

GO AHEAD AND MAKE MY DAY: Pete Alonso leads the majors leagues with 31 goahead RBI this year...That is nine more than the next player, Francisco Lindor...Lindor tied for second in the majors with 22 go -ahead RBI...Alonso's 31 RBI are tied for the eighth in 2019...Keith Hernandez owns the both the franchise record and the number two spo with 36 go-ahead RBI in 1985 and 35 in 1984.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets need to win two of its five remaining games against Atlanta to lock up the season series...It would be New York's first season series victory since 2017.

SWEET 16: According to Elias, New York has either won or tied each of their 16 series this season against the NL East...That is tied for the second-longest streak by a team to start a season since the MLB implemented divisions in 1969...lt's the longest since the Braves also went 16 straight in the NL East to start the 1999 season...The Cincinnati Reds own the longest streak, an 18-series streak in the NL West to start 1970.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 35-23 on the road this year...The Mets have surpassed their 2021 road wins total (30-51)...Their . 603 road winning percentage is the second-best in MLB....New York is batting .258/.325/.411 away from Citi Field.... 32 OBP on the road.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets are second in the majors with 1,111 strikeouts this season...The Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game eight times this year, which is the d-most in the majors...The team has struck out 10 or more in a game 60 times thi second-fewest time in the Senior Circuit.

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 75 games this season, second-most in the NL and tied for the second-most in the majors...Their .641 winning percentage is second in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a $75-42$ record through the team's first 117 games...Only the 1986 (76-41) team posted a better record through the first 117 games of the season.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets are 17-7 in the second-half...The team's 17 wins are the second-most in the majors, and their .708 winning percentage also ranks second. The team is batting $.278 / .346 / .441$ following the All-Star break...They lead the major in average and OBP and are fourth in SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 116-83 following the break.

JUST SHORT: Francisco Lindor has hit 20 home runs this season (19 as a shortstop).. Asdrúbal Cabrera set the franchise record with 22 home runs as a shortstop in 2016... He is seeking to become the first shortstop in Mets history to record 20 home runs in mames this son...L ( 80 b Mams history sixth the majors and fourth in the NL with 82 RBI.

30 FOR 20: Pete Alonso has hit 29 home runs this season... He is seeking to become the fifth player in Mets history to record multiple seasons with 30 or more home runs...Mike Piazza is the franchise leader, recording four such seasons... Howard Johnson, Darryl Strawberry and Dave Kingman have all recorded three seasons with at least 30 or mor home runs...Alonso ranks seventh in team history with 135 home runs...Alonso is second in the majors and leads the National League with 97 RBI

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is seeking to record 100 RBI in a season for the second time in his career...Alonso recorded 120 RBI in 2019, his rookie year...He is seeking to become the eighth player in franchise history with multiple seasons with 100 or more RBI...He would be first Met to do so since Carlos Beltrán and Carlos Delgado

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Edwin Diaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 9 strikeouts...That is 19 strikeouts more than the second place reliever.... He has struck ou $52.2 \%$ of batters faced (94/180), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 4 appearances of a season in MLB history.... His 17.87 strikeouts per nine innings is the bes in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00 ... Overall, he is $2-1$ with 27 saves, a 1.33 ERA (seven earned runs/47.1 innings), allowing 27 hits and 14 walks...The Mets are 41-6 when Díaz appears in a game this year

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Díaz has not allowed a run in his last 20 outings dating back to June 22, covering 20.0 innings, establishing a career-high scoreless streak... 40 of Diaz last 56 outs have been recorded via the strikeout... He was won back-to-back NL Reliever of the Month awards and since the start of June, Díaz has posted a 0.34 ERA (one earned runs/ 26.2 innings) with 11 hits, four walks and 56 strikeouts... He has converted all 16 saves in that period.

100 STRIKEOUTS OF SOLITUDE: Díaz has struck out 94 batters in 47 games this season...He is seeking to become the seventh reliever in franchise history to strike ou 100 batters in a season...The last player to do that was Seth Lugo in 2019... His careerhigh best is 124 strikeouts in 73 games in 2018...His record with the Mets is 99 strikeout in 66 games in 2019...Diaz is eighth on the Mets all-time strikeouts list for relievers...The late Pedro Feliciano is seventh with 350 strikeouts with the Mets.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 78 times this year...lt's tied for their third-highest total in franchise history...The 2019 Mets set the record with 95 HBP...The Mets were plunked 94 times last year...Mark Canha (14), Brandon Nimmo (13) and Pete Alonso (10) all rank in the top 10 in hit by pitches this season.

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed one earned run on nine hits over 7.0 innings with six strikeouts and one walk on August 12 against Philadelphia...Left with the score tied at 1-1...The Mets eventually fell in extra innings, 2-1.

RETURN OF THE MAX: Since returning from the IL on July 5, Scherzer has gone 3-1 with a 1.36 ERA ( $8 \mathrm{ER} / 53.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in eight starts... That is the lowest ERA in the NL and the secondlowest mark in the majors (Dylan Cease, 1.32)...He and Gerrit Cole are tied for the major league lead with 67 strikeouts apiece since that date...Scherzer's 53.0 innings since his return rank third in the majors...He leads the majors with a $11.17 \mathrm{~K} / \mathrm{BB}$ ratio since July 5 ...Scherzer made five starts in July, going 1-1 with a 1.39 ERA ( 5 ER/32.1 IP) while striking out 45 and walking just four, making him one of just eight pitchers ever with a sub-1.50 ERA, at least 45 strikeouts and fewer than five walks in a calendar month... His 1.39 ERA in July ranked seventh in the majors, while his 45 punchouts were tied for third...His $11.25 \mathrm{~K} / \mathrm{BB}$ ratio was the best in MLB last month.

MAX K'S, MIN WALKS: Scherzer's clubs have won each of his last four starts against the Braves, a stretch during which he has piled up 38 strikeouts without issuing a single walk... He has fanned at least nine batters in each of those four starts...No other pitcher in major league history has struck out nine or more and walked none in four consecutive starts against one opponent . He has faced Atlanta twice with the Mets (July 11 in Atlanta and August 6 at Citi Field) and has racked up 20 strikeouts over 14.0 innings, allowing just one run on seven hits.

DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer ranks fourth all-time with 109 double-digit strikeout games in his career, one more than Pedro Martinez...Roger Clemens (110) is next on the list...Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212) are the top two.

DIG DEEP: Opponents are 4-28 (.143) with RISP in his last four starts and 7-38 (.184) in eight games since Scherzer came off the IL...Over the last two seasons, opponents are slashing .175/.243/.256 against Scherzer with runners in scoring position....That .499 OPS against ranks third in the majors behind Shohei Ohtani (.400) and Ranger Suárez (.476).

TWO MORE: Scherzer has 198 career wins, two away from joining an exclusive club of active pitchers with 200+ victories...Justin Verlander (241) and Zack Greinke (223) are the only active hurlers who have won more than 200 games in their career...He is 198-99 in his career...If he wins his next two decisions, he will reach 200 career wins before losing 100 games...Elias says there are only five pitchers in the modern era whose 200th career win came before their 100th loss: Pedro Martinez (200-84), Juan Marichal (200-97), Whitey Ford (200-79), Lefty Grove (200-83) and Grover Cleveland Alexander (200-96).

THE 7.0 LINE: Scherzer has thrown 7.0 innings seven times in 16 starts this season...Each time Scherzer has thrown 7.0 innings this season, he has finished his outing with one or no runs allowed and has allowed three hits or fewer four times...Despite missing seven weeks on the Injured List, those seven outings of 7.0+ innings while allowing one or no runs are still tied for the fifth-most in the majors.

CLIMBING THE LEADERBOARD: Scherzer entered the 2022 season as the active leader in strikeouts... He has since been passed by Justin Verlander, who has moved up to 14th on the all-time list...Scherzer currently ranks 15th on MLB's all-time strikeout list, having passed Curt Schilling $(3,116)$ and Bob Gibson $(3,117)$ on July 22...Scherzer is still within striking distance of a few pitchers above him this season...He is eight behind Pedro Martinez... He currently trails Verlander by five strikeouts...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

HAPPY SCHERZDAY: Scherzer started his 38th birthday, July $27 . .$. He was the 30th pitcher to start on his birthday at 38 or older...He threw 7.0 shutout innings against the Yankees, making him the second pitcher ever to toss 7.0 or more scoreless frames on his birthday at 38 or older, joining Sad Sam Jones, who threw a shutout on his 42nd birthday in 1934... Scherzer lowered his ERA on his birthday to 0.82 ERA ( 3 ER/33.0 IP)... He has never allowed more than two runs in a start on his birthday.
