STAY INFORMED

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RAYS REPORT—The Rays continue their final road trip of 2025 tonight at Oriole Park, a six-game trek through Baltimore (0-1, two to play) and Toronto (3G)...have split their last six games (3-3) after dropping nine of their previous 11 contests (Sept. 5-16), which came on the heels of a season-high seven-game winning streak (Aug. 22–Sept. 4)...are 1-5 over their last six games on the road...have gone 7-16-1 over their last 24 series since a 16-8-2 start...are fourth in the AL East for the 75th consecutive day dating back to July 11, 14.0 GB the first-place Blue Jays...have a 2.0-game lead over the fifth-place Orioles with five games to play...including off days and the All-Star break, they have spent two days in first, 37 in second, 32 in third, 105 in fourth and four in fifth.

- ★ The Rays were shut out, 6-0, in last night's series opener, mustering only a pair of hits...it was their fifth time this season being held scoreless while tallying two hits or fewer, second most in franchise history behind 2010 (6G).
- ★ Tampa Bay's 13 shutout losses are fifth most in the AL and the club's most since being blanked a team-record 18 times in 2014.
- ★ The loss ensured the Rays will finish .500 or worse, marking their first time going back-to-back seasons without a winning campaign since 2014-17 (4 seasons).
- ★ Tampa Bay's pitching staff has registered a 3.21 ERA (257.2IP, 92ER) over the last 29 games since Aug. 22, third in MLB behind Pittsburgh (2.91) and Cleveland (2.99)...currently ranked ninth with a 3.86 ERA, the Rays are seeking their ninth consecutive season with a top-10 ERA in the majors (since 2017).
- ★ With a major league-leading 188 SB, the Rays are 6 SB shy of matching the 2009 team's franchise-record 194 SB...they have swiped 16 SB over their last 26 games since Aug. 17, ninth most in the AL/17th in the majors.
- ★ The Rays need to win tonight to avoid falling a season-high-tying six games below .500 (61-67 entering play Aug. 22)...they need to win the next two games to avoid dropping to 0-5-1 across their last six sets, which would mark their longest stretch of winless series since Sept. 8-28, 2017 (0-4-2).

THE GREAT YANDINO—Despite his 11-game on-base streak coming to an end last night, reigning AL Player of the Week **Yandy Diaz** has still hit safely in 19 of his last 25 games since Aug. 25, batting .418/.505/.626 (38-for-91) with 7 2B, 4 HR, 10 RBI, 16 BB, 11 SO, 18 R and a 1.131 OPS...during that timeframe, he paces the majors in average, ranks second in on-base pct. and hits, is third in OPS, and eighth in slugging pct. ...min. 100 PA, he is the third Ray to post a .500 on-base pct. or better over any 25-game span, joining **Carlos Peña** in 2007 (2x) and **Fred McGriff** in both 2001 (8x) and 1999 (11x).

- ★ He is one double away from joining **Ben Zobrist** (2011-14) as the only players in Rays history with four straight 30-double seasons.
- ★ Diaz's MLB-leading 53 multi-hit games tie his career high from 2023...he could become the first player in Rays history to pace the majors in multi-hit efforts.
- ★ He also has career highs in home runs (25), RBI (83) and games played (147)...his 173 hits match his career best from 2023, and his 55 XBH are two shy of his career high from the same season (57XBH).
- ★ Diaz (MLB-leading 256) and **Junior Caminero** (240) have recorded the two highest single-season totals of hard-hit balls (95 mph EV or faster) in franchise history, surpassing Diaz's 2023 campaign (234).

CHASING 300—**Jake Mangum** (295, 386AB) and **Chandler Simpson** (298, 399AB) are attempting to become the second and third rookies in franchise history to hit 300 or better with at least 400 AB, joining **Joey Wendle** (300, 487AB) in 2018...only five pairs of rookie teammates in MLB history have accomplished the feat, most recently **PIT Kevin Newman** (308)/**Bryan Reynolds** (314) in 2019...other instances involved BOS **Fred Lynn**/**Jim Rice** in 1975, DET **Dale Alexander**/**Roy Johnson** in 1929, STL **George Barclay**/**Homer Smoot** in 1902 and PIT **Ginger Beaumont**/**Jimmy Williams** in 1899.

- ★ Between Mangum, Simpson and **Yandy Diaz** (302), the Rays could have three players hit 300 or better (min. 400AB) for the first time in franchise history.
- ★ Paired with 2023 (.330), Diaz is attempting to join **Carl Crawford** (5x) as the only players in team history with multiple qualified seasons hitting .300 or better.

MAN OF STEAL—**Chandler Simpson**'s 43 SB are second in MLB to NYY **José Caballero** (48SB) and 10th most in a season in Rays history, 2 SB shy of joining **Carl Crawford** (6x, last: 47SB in 2010) as the only Rays to reach 45 SB...with a .298 average, he has a chance to become the ninth rookie since 1901 to hit 300 or better with 40 SB or more and the first since LAA **Mike Trout** (.326/.49SB) in 2012...the only Ray to meet those marks, regardless of rookie status, is **Carl Crawford** (5x, last: 2010 - .307/.47SB)...the only two players in the majors to do so since 2022 are LAD **Shohei Ohtani** (.310/.59SB) in 2024 and ATL **Ronald Acuña Jr.** (.337/.73SB) in 2023...the last AL hitter was KC **Whit Merrifield** (.304/.45SB) in 2018.

- ★ Simpson has tallied a hit in nine of his last 11 games, going 18-for-43 (.419) with 3 2B, 3 RBI, 2 BB, 7 R and 4 SB in those contests.

LA MÁXIMA—With five games to play, **Junior Caminero** (44HR) is 2 HR shy of tying **Carlos Peña**'s franchise-record 46-HR campaign in 2007...he has 17 HR in 45 games since Aug. 1, tying PHI **Kyle Schwarber** and NYM **Juan Soto** for the most in the majors...his 108 RBI are the most by a Ray since **Evan Longoria** (113RBI) in 2009 and are fourth most in Rays history (see table to the right)...his 72 XBH match **Ben Zobrist** (2011) for seventh most in a season in team history, one shy of Longoria in 2010 (73XBH) for sixth and two shy of Longoria in 2013 (74XBH) for fifth...Caminero has gone six straight games without an extra-base hit, tied for his second-longest drought this season behind March 29–April 6 (7G)...he is 3-for-18 (.167) with five walks and a .375 on-base pct. over those six games, matching his total walks from his previous 25 contests (Aug. 17–Sept. 14).

- ★ Caminero is two doubles shy of becoming the first player in franchise history with a 30-double, 40-homer season.

MILESTONE WATCH—**Junior Caminero**'s next game will mark the 200th of his career, and **Nick Fortes**' next appearance will be his 400th...**Josh Lowe** played his 400th career game last night...Lowe is 1 SB shy of tying **Randy Winn** (80SB) for eighth most in franchise history...**Yandy Diaz** is one double from matching **Aubrey Huff** (172) for fifth on the Rays all-time list...his 99 HR with Tampa Bay are tied with **Fred McGriff** for eighth in club history...**Brandon Lowe** is 3 RBI from tying **B.J. Upton** (447RBI) for sixth on the Rays all-time list and 5 RBI from the fifth-ranked Huff (449RBI)...**Edwin Uceta** is two strikeouts shy of 200 for his career.

- ★ **Kevin Cash** (895) can reach the 900-win mark for his managerial career if the Rays win each of their final five games.

BIRDLAND—The Rays and Orioles continue their fourth and final series of 2025 tonight, with Baltimore taking six of the first 11 matchups...the Rays need to win the next two games to secure their first season series win over the Orioles since 2022 (10-9)...after dropping nine of 13 games last year and eight of 13 in 2023, they have lost consecutive season series to Baltimore for the first time since 2014-16...despite holding a winning record across the last 13 meetings (7-6), they are still 9-17 in their last 26 games against the Orioles and 13-23 in their last 36...of the 11 games between the clubs this season, eight have been decided by four runs or more...Tampa Bay is 1-6-1 in eight series at Oriole Park since the start of 2022 and 5-9-3 overall vs. Baltimore over that timeframe.

- ★ The Rays, who are playing 13 straight games vs. AL East opponents to conclude the season, have lost 10 of 13, 16 of 22 and 21 of their last 30 intra-division games since a 10-7 start...their 19-28 (.404) record vs. AL East clubs would be their worst since going 29-43 (.403) in 2007.
- ★ **Junior Caminero** (16-for-40/.400), **Yandy Diaz** (17-for-41/.415) and **Brandon Lowe** (12-for-34/.353) are a combined 45-for-115 (.391) with 5 2B, 8 HR and 26 RBI vs. Orioles pitching this season.



DOWN ON THE FARM—Double-A Montgomery fell behind, 3-0, in the 1st inning and was unable to recover in a 7-3 loss to Birmingham (CWS) last night in Game 2 of the Southern League Championship Series, setting the stage for a series-deciding Game 3 tonight at 7:35 p.m. ET at Riverwalk Stadium...Rays Minor League Pitcher of the Year **RHP L.J. Nichols** will make his second postseason start for the Biscuits after working into the 6th inning of their series-clinching win over Biloxi on Sept. 18 (ND, 5.1IP, 7H, 2ER, 7SO, HR).

- ★ In the midst of their 10th consecutive postseason appearance and second straight championship series appearance, the Biscuits are one win away from their first league title since 2007 and fourth as a Rays affiliate (also: 2006, 1999).

TONIGHT'S START—Shane Baz will toe the rubber for his 31st start of the season and 54th of his career this evening at Oriole Park...marks his 15th road start this season and the 28th of his career...is 10 strikeouts shy of 300 for his career...has earned a decision in six of seven and 11 of his last 13 starts...the Rays are 3-11 in his last 14 starts compared to 12-4 in his first 16...was acquired from the Pirates as a player to be named later (Aug. 14, 2018) along with **RHP Tyler Glasnow** and **OF Austin Meadows** for **RHP Chris Archer**, July 31, 2018.

LAST TIME OUT—Making his final home start of the season, Baz worked five scoreless frames in a 4-0 win on Sept. 18 vs. TOR, facing two batters over the minimum (W, 5.0IP, 2H, 0R, BB, 4SO)...used a GIDP in the opening inning to strand a one-out single...yielded only a **Davis Schneider** walk in innings 2-4, setting down nine of 10 BF...struck out **Andrés Giménez** on six pitches to conclude the outing...did not permit an extra-base hit and did not allow a Blue Jays runner to advance into scoring position.

- ✦ It marked his second scoreless start in his last four outings (also: Sept. 1 vs. SEA) and was his second time allowing two hits or fewer over 5.0 scoreless frames or more (also: June 17, 2022 at BAL - 6.0IP, 2H).
- ✦ Baz finished his Steinbrenner Field tenure 7-5 with a 5.90 ERA (82.1IP, 54ER), including 2-0 with a 1.13 ERA (16.0IP, 2ER) across his final three starts at the venue.
- ✦ The outing dropped his overall ERA to 4.99...he is attempting to avoid becoming the first qualified Rays pitcher with a 5.00 ERA or higher since **Jeremy Hellickson** (5.17) in 2013.

BAZ VS. BALTIMORE—In two career starts against the Orioles, both in Baltimore, Baz is 0-1 with a 0.75 ERA (12.0IP, 1ER), 12 SO, 3 BB and a 0.58 WHIP while holding O's hitters to a .105/.186/.211 (4-for-38) clip...min. 10.0 IP, the ERA, WHIP, opp. average and opp. on-base pct. are all his lowest marks vs. any opponent in his career...Baz has gone 6.0 IP with two hits or fewer in both of his previous starts against Baltimore...he is the first Rays pither and third pitcher in Camden Yards history to record 6.0 IP or more with two hits or fewer in each of his first two career starts at the venue, joining CIN Andrew Abbott (2023-25) and OAK Tim Hudson (2000-01).

- ✦ Baz is 3-2 with a 4.58 ERA (39.1IP, 20ER) across eight starts vs. AL East opponents this season...the Rays are 6-2 in those games, backing him with 7.09 runs of support per 9.0 IP.

TRAVELING MAN—Baz is 0-3 with a 7.45 ERA (19.1IP, 16ER) across his last four road starts, taking the loss in each of his last three outings...his season-long ERA away from home has increased from 2.97 to 4.05 during that stretch...his 2.1 IP in his last road start on Sept. 12 at CHC tied the shortest outing of his career (3x, last: July 10, 2022 at CIN)...Baz is seeking his first win as a visitor since June 26 at KC.

- ✦ He has received zero runs of support in four of his last six starts on the road...the Rays are 1-6 in his last seven outings away from home compared to 6-1 in his first seven.

SEPTEMBER SHANE—In 11 career starts during the month of September, Baz is 6-2 with a 2.58 ERA (59.1IP, 17ER), holding opponents to a .178/.248/.298 (37-for-208) line—the opp. average and on-base pct. are the lowest in any calendar month of his career, and the ERA is his second lowest behind April (2.45)...the Rays are 7-4 in his September starts.

STRIKEOUT STUFF—Baz has recorded 9.59 strikeouts per 9.0 IP, fifth in the AL...he has fanned six batters or more in six of his last nine starts, striking out 57 of his 194 BF in that span (29.4%)...since recording 38 strikeouts in a 10-start span from April 19–June 9 (6.62 SO/9.0IP), Baz has averaged 10.60 SO per 9.0 IP in his last 17 outings since June 15.

- ✦ He has limited opponents to a .148 (51-for-345) average in two-strike counts, 10th best among qualified AL pitchers.

BEND IT LIKE BAZ—Min. 1,000 pitches thrown, Baz's 26.9 pct. usage rate on his knuckle curve is third highest in the AL behind TOR **Brendon Little** (46.6%) and TOR **Louis Varland** (37.8%)...opponents are batting .219 (48-for-219) with only 3 HR against the offering, and nearly half (84) of his 173 strikeouts have come on the pitch, including 15 of his 23 punchouts since the calendar flipped to September.

HELPING HANDS—When Baz receives three runs of support or more in his career (27GS), he is 15-2 with a 3.30 ERA (141.2IP, 52ER), and the Rays are 22-5 (13-3 in 2025)...this includes a 9-1 record and 3.31 ERA (89.2IP, 33ER) in 16 such starts this season...in 26 starts with two runs or fewer, he is 2-15 with a 5.32 ERA (140.1IP, 83ER), and Tampa Bay has gone 5-21 (2-12 in 2025)...in 14 such starts in 2025, Baz is 1-11 with a 7.06 ERA (72.2IP, 57ER).

- ✦ He has received zero runs of support in five of his last 12 starts, averaging 3.07 runs of support per 9.0 IP in that span (July 12–pres.), third fewest in the AL (min. 50.0IP), ahead of only HOU **Framber Valdez** (2.06) and HOU **Hunter Brown** (2.56).

10 FOR 10—Baz struck out a career-high 11 batters on April 14 vs. BOS...paired with his start on April 1 vs. PIT, he became the fifth pitcher since 1901 to record 10 SO or more with no walks in two of his first three starts of a season, joining MIL **Corbin Burnes** and CWS **Lance Lynn** in 2021, WSH **Stephen Strasburg** in 2010 and AZ **Randy Johnson** in 2000 (Stats Perform).

GOING STREAKING—Baz threw 6.0 IP or more with two runs or fewer in six consecutive starts from Sept. 17, 2024–April 14, 2025, tying the longest streak in franchise history (6GS, 5x, last: **Shane McClanahan**, June 20–July 26, 2022)...he was 4-0 with a 1.89 ERA (38.0IP, 8ER) and 0.74 WHIP during the streak, holding opponents to a .160/.218/.252 (21-for-131) slash line with 46 SO and 7 BB.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP DREW RASMUSSEN (10-5, 2.80)

LAST START—Limited to three frames after 76 pitches in an 11-7 loss on Sept. 17 vs. BOS (ND, 3.0IP, 4H, 2ER, BB, 2SO, HR)...it marked his 16th consecutive start yielding five hits or fewer, extending the longest streak in franchise history (excluding openers).

vs. ORIOLES—He is 2-1 with a 2.97 ERA (33.1IP, 11ER), 27 SO, 8 BB, a 0.96 WHIP and a .198 (24-for-121) opp. average across nine career appearances (6GS) opposite Baltimore...he has made one start against the Orioles this season, working into the 6th inning on June 19 in Tampa (L, 5.1IP, 4H, 2ER, 3BB, 5SO).
