AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will continue their seven-game road trip tonight with the second game of a three-game set at Milwaukee (0-1 thus far)...will also play a four-game series at Baltimore from Mon.-Thurs....went 4-3 on their recent homestand after winning two-of-three games vs. Tampa Bay and splitting a four-game set vs. Oakland.

Their 17 wins are tied for the third-most in the Majors,

- trailing only Atlanta (18) and Cleveland (18).
- Marks the second time in the last six years (since 2019) the Yankees have gone 17-10 or better to start a season (also 19-8 in 2022). The Yankees are in the midst of a 17-day stretch without
- an off day (4/19-5/5)...marks their longest stretch of the season without an off-day...are 4-4 so far.
 Eight of the Yankees' 17 wins are come-from-behind
- Are 6-3 following a loss this year.
- Have won or split seven of their eight completed series (6-1-1) this season.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees fell to the Brewers, 7-6, in 11 innings on Friday at American Family Field...RHP Luis Gil (5.0IP, 6H, 5R/ER, 2BB, 6K, 2HR) started and did not record a decision...RF Juan Soto (2-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI, 1BB) reached base three times and hit a solo HR in the first inning...**LF/CF Alex Verdugo** (1-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI, 1BB) hit a solo HR in the second inning...**CF Trent Grisham** (1-for-2, 1R, 1HR, 3RBI, 1BB) hit a go-ahead three-run HR in the fourth inning...**PH Giancarlo Stanton** (1-for-1, 1 double, 1RBI) hit a pinch-hit go-ahead RBI double in the 10th inning...**RHP** Ron Marinaccio (1.1lP, 1K), RHP Dennis Santana (0.2lP, 1H, 1K), LHP Caleb Ferguson (1.0lP, 1BB, 1K) and RHP Clay Holmes (1.0IP, 2K) were all scoreless in relief...RHP Michael Tonkin (1.1IP, 2H, 2R/0ER) made his Yankees debut and took the loss after allowing a "walk-off" single to Joey Ortiz in the 11th inning.

FOR STARTERS: RHP Luis Gil allowed 5ER on Friday at Milwaukee, marking the first time this season a Yankees starter allowed more than 4ER in a start... Yankees starters have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 23 of their 27 starts, 2ER-orfewer in 16 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in 11 starts.

Yankees starters have posted a 3.26 ERA (146.1IP, 53ER) in 27 starts this year, the fourth-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (2.15), Philadelphia (2.18) and Kansas City (2.89).

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers have posted a 3.01 ERA (245.0IP, 82ER) this year, the second-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (2.73)...their 3.01 ERA is the second-lowest through the Yankees' first 27 games of a season in the last 43 years since 1982 (2.60 ERA in 2022).

- ▶ Have held opponents to 3R-or-fewer in 17 of 27 games this year (are 12-5 in those games)...are 15-5 this season
- when holding their opponent to 4R-or-fewer.

 Rank fifth in the Majors in opponents' SLG (.348) and opponents' OPS (.648), and sixth in opponents' BA (.219).

BATTERS' EYE: Yankees batters lead the Majors with a 4.11 pitches per plate appearance ratio.

VERDAWGO: OF Alex Verdugo hit his third HR of the year with a solo HR in the second inning on Friday at Milwaukee...has hit .327/.441/.545 (18-for-55) with 11R, 6 doubles, 2HR, 6RBI, 11BB, 1HP, 1SB and 1SF in his last 17 games (since 4/8)...has reached base multiple times in five of his last six games (since 4/21) and 10 of his last 17 games.

► His 12.00 plate appearance per strikeout ratio (108PA/9K) is the second-best in the Majors this season (first in AL)... has struck out just once in his last 32PA (since ninth inning on 4/17)

RODOMINANT: LHP Carlos Rodón will make his sixth start of the year tonight...is 1-1 with a 2.70 ERA (26.2IP, 8ER) in five starts this year...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his five starts this season, including 2R-or-fewer in four of those starts.

CLOSE CALLS: The Yankees have had 18 of their 27 games decided by 2R-or-fewer, going 11-7 in those games...their 18 such games are the most in the Majors...11 of their last 12 games, 12 of their last 14 games and 13 of their last 16 games have been decided by 2R-or-fewer.

- Are 8-3 in one-run games this year...their 11 one-run games are tied with Oakland for the most in the Majors.
 The Yankees have had 21 of their 27 games decided by 3R-or-fewer, the most such games in the Majors.

PEN PALS: Yankees relievers have not allowed an earned run in their last 14.2 innings since 4/23 (4H, 2R/0ER, 3BB, 13K)...the Yankees bullpen owns the fifth-lowest ERA (2.65) in the Majors, trailing only Seattle (2.40), Cleveland (2.41), Detroit (2.50) and Milwaukee (2.60).

- The Yankees are 10-0 this season when they lead after six innings, 14-0 when leading after seven innings and 14-0 when leading after eight innings.
- RHP Ian Hamilton has not allowed a run in eight of his 10 appearances this year.
- LHP Victor González has not allowed a run in nine of 11 appearances this year.

HOLMES SWEET HOLMES: RHP Clay Holmes has not allowed an earned run in 13 appearances this season (13.0IP, 12H, 3R/0ER, 1BB, 12K, 2HP)... his 13.0IP are the most among Major League relievers who have not allowed an earned run this season.

- ▶ Has not allowed an ER in his last 16 appearances dating back to 9/25/23, the third-longest streak in his career (29G from 4/9-6/18-22 and 17G from 4/25-6/9/21).
- His nine saves are tied for the most in the Majors.

NOBODY BEATS THE RIZZ: INF Anthony Rizzo has hit 29 career home runs against the Brewers, the third-most among active players, trailing only Joey Votto (43) and Andrew McCutchen (39)...his 17HR at American Family Field are tied for his second-most at any ballpark as a visitor, trailing only his 24HR at Great American Ball Park.

• Has hit .385/.500/.538 (5-for-13) with 2 doubles, 2BB and 1HB his carear against Milwaykook PHB los Pages.

GRISHBOMB: OF Trent Grisham recorded his first hit as a Yankee with a go-ahead three-run HR in the fourth inning on Friday at Milwaukee...was his first HR since 9/8/23 at Houston with San Diego.

THE GREAT JUAN: OF Juan Soto reached base three times and recorded his 800th career hit with a solo HR in the first inning on Friday at Milwaukee...marked his team-leading seventh HR of the season...has reached base safely in 24 of his 27 games this season, hitting .324/.437/.588 (33-for-102) with 18R, 6 doubles, 7HR, 23RBI, 22BB, 15B and 25F...has reached base multiple times in 17 of those games.

Have scored at least 4R in 18 of 27 games this season, at least 5R in 15 games and at least 6R in 10 games...Friday marked just the third time this season the Yankees lost when scoring at least 4R.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP CARLOS RODÓN (1-1, 2.70 ERA)

LHP Carlos Rodón will make his sixth start of the season tonight at Milwaukee...the 31-year-old will make the start on regular four days' rest...made his fifth start of the season on Monday vs. Oakland, allowing just 1H over a season-high 7.0 scoreless innings without recording a decision (2BB, 4K, 2HP)...marked his first scoreless start as a Yankee and first since 9/29/22 vs. Colorado with San Francisco (0R in 6.0IP)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his five starts this season, including 2R-or-fewer in four of those starts...in his first season with the Yankees in 2023, went 3-8 with a 6.85 ERA (64.1IP, 65H, 51R/49ER, 28BB, 64K, 15HR) in 14 starts...missed 100 team games due to two injured list stints...since 2021, ranks fourth in the Majors with a 11.38 K/9.0IP ratio (min. 350.0IP), trailing only Blake Snell (11.78), Freddy Peralta (11.44) and Shohei Ohtani (11.39)...is tied for fourth in double-digit strikeout games (17) over that span, trailing only Gerrit Cole (23), Corbin Burnes (20) and Shohei Ohtani (20)... additionally, has recorded at least 10K and 0BB in seven games since 2021, tied for the fifth-most such games in the Majors during that stretch, trailing only Jacob deGrom (10), Gerrit Cole (nine), Corbin Burnes (nine) and Kevin Gausman (eight)...has played in parts of 10 Major League seasons with Chicago-AL (2015-21), San Francisco (2022) and the Yankees (2023-24)...has finished in the top-six of Cy Young voting twice (fifth in 2021 and sixth in 2022)...is a two-time All-Star (2021 and 2022)...has made six Opening Day rosters (2016, '19-22, '24)...began the 2017, 2018 and 2023 seasons on the injured list...was originally selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 16th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft but did not sign and went on to play three seasons at North Carolina State University (2012-14)...was selected by the Chicago White Sox in the first round (third overall) of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft...signed a six-year Major League contract with the Yankees extending through the 2028 12/21/22.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his fifth start of the season on Monday vs. Oakland, allowing just 1H over a season-high 7.0 scoreless innings without recording a decision (2BB, 4K, 2HP)...did not allow a hit to his first 16 batters faced before allowing a two-out single to Nick Allen in the fifth inning.
