The Mariners and Rangers are set to square off 13 times during the 2026 regular season, 7 times in Arlington, Texas and 6 times at T-Mobile Park...the Rangers swept Seattle in a 3-game series from April 6-8, already matching their regular season win total in a season from each of the past 2 years:

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners welcome the Rangers to T-Mobile Park for a 3-game series...the Mariners will also welcome the Athletics (3 G, 4/20-4/22) on the homestand...tonight's game will be televised live exclusively on FOX with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Eric Karros** on the call...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped yesterday's homestand opener to the Rangers by a 5-0 final.

- **Take A Hike** - Seattle's 11.7% walk rate ranks 3rd in the AL and 5th in the Majors.
- **Same Old Baz** - **Eduard Bardo** has allowed just 1 run in 9 appearances this season, tossing 8.1 IP with 8 strikeouts.
- **Arkade Games** - LHP **Kade Anderson**, the No. 3 overall pick in the 2025 MLB Draft and the Mariners No. 2 ranked prospect (*MLB Pipeline*) is 1-0 with a 0.64 ERA (1 ER, 14.0 IP), 4 walks and 22 strikeouts over his first 3 professional games after tossing 5.0 innings allowing 1 run with Double-A Arkansas last night.

KIRBY MESSES WITH TEXAS...right-hander **George Kirby** gets the start for the Mariners today...in 4 starts so far this season, Kirby is 2-2 with a 3.25 ERA (10 ER, 27.2 IP), 6 walks and 22 strikeouts...he has pitched into the 8th inning in back-to-back starts (4/7-c)...in 11 career starts against the Texas Rangers, he is 8-1 with a 1.31 ERA (10 ER, 68.2 IP), 7 walks and 55 strikeouts...among active pitchers who have made at least 10 career starts against an opponent, Kirby's 1.31 ERA trails only Jacob deGrom, who holds a 1.20 ERA against the Rockies and a 1.28 ERA against the Padres...Kirby's 1.31 ERA against the Rangers is the best of any pitcher (min. 10 GS), ranking ahead of Juan Pizarro (1.80) and Pedro Martinez (1.87).

FIVE CHEESE BLEND...Mariners starting pitchers have been excellent to start the 2026 season, with the rotation of **Logan Gilbert**, **George Kirby**, **Bryan Woo**, **Emerson Hancock** and **Luis Castillo** combining to go 5-9 with a 3.35 ERA (46 ER, 123.2 IP), 27 walks, 116 strikeouts and a 1.08 WHIP...among MLB rotations, the Mariners rank 1st in fWAR (3.1), 1st in IP, T-1st in quality starts (12, also: Dodgers), 1st in fewest BB/9 (1.96), SO/BB (4.30), 3rd in WHIP and 8th in ERA...the Mariners have a trio of starters (Hancock, Kirby and Woo) who each have 3 quality starts this season, the most pitchers with at least 3 quality starts in the American League and tied for the most in MLB (also: Dodgers).

HOME SWEET HOME...the Mariners have drawn 403,238 fans in 12 games at T-Mobile Park this season, averaging 33,603 fans per home game...the Mariners average home attendance ranks 4th-highest in the American League so far, trailing only the Yankees (average attendance: 40,310), Blue Jays (39,241) and Angels (35,511) and ranking 9th overall in the Majors.

HIGHLIGHTING THE HOMESTAND...remaining promotions and events on the current homestand include **'70s Weekend** (April 17-19), which includes giveaways, **Cal Raleigh '70s Jersey Night** (tonight), **'70s Pin Day** (April 19), as well as three **Mariners Value Games** (April 20-22) for the Athletics series.

JULIO HEATING UP...**Julio Rodriguez** has reached base in 14 consecutive games (4/3-c), the 5th-longest streak of his career (his career-high on-base streak via H, BB, or HBP is 27 games from July 1-Aug. 2, 2023)...over his last 8 games (4/11-c), Julio is batting .320 (8x25) with 3 runs, 3 doubles, 1 homer, 4 RBI, 1 stolen base and 4 walks, slugging .560 with a .993 OPS.

LUKE USES THE FORCE...**Luke Raley** is batting .317 (20x63) with 8 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs, 12 RBI, a .368 OBP and slugging .603 for a .971 OPS in 19 games this season...over his last 8 games, Luke is batting .414 (12x29) with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run and a 1.141 OPS...he began his season homering in each of his first 3 games, joining Robinson Canó (2016) as the only players in Mariners history to homer in each of his team's first 3 games of the season.

RANDY REACHES...in 21 games this season, **Randy Arozarena** is batting .284 (21x74) with 16 runs, 4 doubles, 1 home run, 7 RBI, 12 walks and 5 stolen bases with a .404 OBP, slugging .378 for an .783 OPS, reaching base safely in 17-of-21 games...over 15 games in April, he is batting .296 (16x53) with 2 doubles, 1 home run, 5 RBI, 7 walks, 4 stolen bases and an .786 OPS.

BRENDAN GETS US STARTED...in 17 games this season, **Brendan Donovan** is batting .304 (17x56) with 7 runs, 3 doubles, 3 home runs, 8 RBI and 9 walks, getting on base at a .437 clip, slugging .518 with a .954 OPS in 71 plate appearances...to **start games** out of the leadoff spot, Donovan has posted a .615 on-base percentage, reaching base 8 times in 13 plate appearances in the first inning.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners are tied for the MLB lead with 12 quality starts so far this season (also: Dodgers), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that the Mariners also **lead MLB** in quality starts dating back to the 2024 season (171), dating back to the 2023 season (245), dating back to the 2022 season (324) and dating back to the 2021 season (379)?

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - APRIL 18

- **1996** - Alex Rodriguez' grand slam highlighted an 11-3 win vs. Detroit that tied the franchise record of eight straight wins.
- **1998** - Joey Cora goes 0x4 to snap his season-opening hitting streak at a club-record 16 games.
- **2001** - Ichiro Suzuki's homer in the 6th inning against Texas gives him a 13-game hitting streak, setting a new Mariners record for longest hitting streak by a rookie.
- **2003** - With the victory in Anaheim, Jamie Moyer becomes just the second Mariners hurler to reach 100 career victories with Seattle.
- **2015** - Félix Hernández allowed 1 run on 2 hits while striking out 12 over 7.0 innings in a 3-1 victory over Texas. The win over Texas was the first by Hernandez since July 14, 2012.

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- The 28-year-old right-hander is making his 5th start of the season and 2nd against the Rangers...is making the 117th start of his career and his 12th career start against Texas.

LAST TIME OUT...W#2 on April 13 vs. Houston, tossing 7.2 innings and allowing 2 runs (2 ER) on 7 hits and 1 walk while striking out 6 batters...

HISTORICALLY GOOD...across 11 career starts against Texas, he is 8-1 with a 1.31 ERA (10 ER, 68.2 IP) and 55 strikeouts to just 7 walks and 3 HR allowed while tossing 6.0+ IP in 9 of those 11 starts...

"He's dominated a lot of teams. I've watched him for a couple years now...we do have trouble against him. I've seen the numbers. I've seen the matchups against our some of our really good hitters...He's just a complete pitcher, and always a tough matchup."

CRUISE CONTROL...tossed 8.0 innings in his last start vs. the Rangers becoming the first Mariners pitcher to toss 8.0+ IP since Logan Gilbert did so twice in 2024 (last: 9/7/24 at STL)...

IT'S BEEN DECIDED...has factored into the decision in his last 7 consecutive starts (4-3 since Sept. 14, 2025), currently tied for the 5th-longest streak in MLB...

MESSING WITH TEXAS...across 21 career starts against both Texas teams (Astros and Rangers), he is 13-2 with a combined 1.71 ERA (24 ER, 126.2 IP) and 109 strikeouts to just 13 walks allowed...

HEATED RIVALRY...is 25-6 with a 2.58 ERA (70 ER, 244.0 IP) with 245 strikeouts to just 33 walks allowed across 41 career starts against AL West teams...

MORE VS. THE WEST...across 18 career home starts vs. AL West teams, he is 10-2 and owns a 1.65 all-time ERA (20 ER, 109.1 IP) with 117 strikeouts to 14 walks allowed...

14:0 (x2)...tossed a career-high 14 strikeouts without a walk twice during the 2025 regular season, on June 8 at Los Angeles-AL then on Sept. 14 vs. Los Angeles-AL at home...

NO FREE PASSES...has not allowed more than 3 walks in any start over his first 116 career games, the 2nd-longest such streak in MLB history to start a career by a starting pitcher...

FEW FREE BAGS...has allowed 2-or-fewer walks in 108 of 115 career regular season starts, which are the most such games in MLB through a starting pitcher's first 116 career starts...

GOING THE DISTANCE...since 2025, the Mariners are 11-6 (.647) when he pitches 6.0+ innings compared to 4-6 (.400) when he tosses fewer than 6.0 innings...

BEST IN ALL THE LAND...among starting pitchers since 2022 (min. 500 IP), he leads the Majors in fewest walks allowed (99), strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.49), walks-per-nine innings (1.34), and walk rate (3.7%).

FOR THE M'S HISTORY BOOKS...leads the Mariners franchise (min. 100 GS) in walks-per-nine innings (1.3), ahead of Hisashi Iwakuma (1.9) and Logan Gilbert (1.9)...
