SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

LAST GAME: The D-backs won last night, 5-0, @ Nationals. ◆ Marked their fourth shutout of the season and first since May 22 @ Dodgers (6-0).

- ◆ Slade Cecconi set a new career high with 6.0 scoreless innings (previous: 5.0 on Aug. 27, 2023 vs. Reds) and tied his career high in innings pitched (previous: 2x; last: April 27 @ Mariners).
- ◆ Corbin Carroll (2-3, 3B) and Ketel Marte (2-4, HR) each recorded 2-hit games and combined for 4 RBI.

MAKE OUR SNAKES ALL-STARS: Ketel Marte, in second place among NL second basemen (608,807 votes), leads D-backs vote getters in first balloting update for 2024 MLB All-Star Game.

- ◆ Christian Walker currently sits at sixth among first basemen (112,385 votes) while Joc Pederson sits at sixth among designated hitters (81,340 votes).
- ♦ Phase 1 balloting ends on Thursday, June 27 at 9:00 a.m. AZ with finalists announced later that day at 3:00 p.m. AZ on MLB Network.

KETEL MAKING A STRONG CASE: Ketel Marte collected his sixth first-inning home run of the season last night (second in June, also: June 2 @ Mets)...his 6 homers in the first frame are tied for fourth in the Majors (also: Tyler O'Neill/BOS and Kyle Tucker/HOU), behind Aaron Judge/NYY (10), Gunnar Henderson/BAL (8) and Kyle Schwarber/PHI (7).

.500 OR BETTER: With a victory tonight, the D-backs would improve to a record of .500+ for the first time since April 16 (.500, 9-9).

SERIES-LY: The D-backs can secure their third straight series victory tonight...they have won or split their last 5 series dating back to May 30.

♦ The D-backs have won their last 5 series-opening games (June 3-18) after going 3-15 in their previous 18 to start the season (March 28-May 30).

FIRST-INNING STRIKERS: The D-backs' 16 games this season with 2+ runs scored in the first inning are second most in the Majors, behind the Yankees (18).

- ♦ The D-backs' 55 total runs plated in the first frame are the most in the NL, ahead of the Phillies (54), Padres (49) and Doders (42).
- ♦ In the opening frame, the D-backs have scored 1 run in 11 games, 2 runs in 8 games, 3 runs in 6 games, 4 runs once and 6 times once.

THE NL CHAMPS: The 2023 National League Champion **VS. NATIONALS:** The D-backs have won 6 straight road D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made games @ Nationals and are 13-9 on the road since 2017.

- ♦ Went 5-1 vs. Nationals last season, including a 3-game sweep @ Nationals last June 6-7 & 22 (June 22 was the makeup of the June 8 game postponed due to "clearly hazardous air quality conditions").
- ♦ Are 10-2 vs. Nationals since April 20, 2022.

NL'S BEST: Ketel Marte's 4.2 bWAR leads the NL and is fourth in the Majors, behind Aaron Judge/NYY (5.2), Gunnar Henderson/BAL (5.0) and Juan Soto/NYY (4.3).

◆ Marte leads all second basemen with a 4.0 bWAR, an .863 OPS, 32 extra-base hits, 144 total bases, 42 RBI, 12 defensive runs saved and 1.5 dWAR, is tied for first with 15 homers, 15 doubles and 111 times on base and third with 80 hits.

CORBIN'S CAREER BEST STREAK: Corbin Carroll is currently riding a career-high 18-game on-base streak (since May 29), the longest active on-base streak in the NL.

♦ Is batting .314 (22-for-70)/.865 OPS with 5 doubles, 2 triples, 6 RBI, 12 walks (9 strikeouts), 1 HBP and 4 stolen bases...previous high was 15 straight (April 3-19).

WALKER, TEXAS RANGER ALL-STAR: Christian Walker's 2.0 bWAR is third among all first basemen, behind Freddie Freeman/LAD (2.9) and Bryce Harper/PHI (2.6)....his 16 home runs are second, behind Josh Naylor/CLE (17), and .812 OPS is third, behind Bryce Harper/PHI (.906) and Freddie Freeman/LAD (.905).

• Defensively, his 6 DRS and 0.3 dWAR are tied for the best marks among first basemen with Joey Gallo/WSH.

JUNE BOOM: The D-backs are 11-5 (.688) in June, tied for the third-best winning pct. in the Majors (also: Yankees), behind the Mariners (.750, 12-4) and Mets (.733, 11-4).

♦ The D-backs' 96 runs scored in June are the most in baseball, ahead of the Mets (94), Yankees (93) and Red Sox (92).
