**11TH ANNUAL D-BACKS RACE AGAINST CANCER:** On Sunday, September 29, the D-backs will host their 11th annual "D-backs Race Against Cancer" presented by Dignity Health Cancer Institute...proceeds from the event will support local patient care and cancer research projects such as screening tools to assist with earlier diagnosis, innovative treatment options for those currently facing cancer, and creating and maintaining support systems for patients' families...registration ends after September 28 and no race day registration will be available...for more info, visit [dbacks.com/race](https://dbacks.com/race).

### SNAKEBITES

**THE NL CHAMPS:** The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth (1999, 2001, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

**LAST GAME:** The D-backs lost, 8-2, last night @ Rockies.

- ◆ **Pavin Smith** went 2-for-3 with 2 doubles and 1 walk... has reached base in a season-high 11 straight starts.
- ◆ **Christian Walker** slugged his 26th homer of the season (solo in 8th inn.).

**FOX TV BROADCAST TOMORROW @ BREWERS:** Tomorrow night's game @ Brewers will be exclusively televised on FOX Baseball Night in America with Adam Amin & A.J. Pierzynski.

**PAVIN'S PROMINENCE:** Since Sept. 8, **Pavin Smith's** 1.043 SLG, 1.595 OPS and 13 RBI lead the Majors while his .478 AVG and .552 OBP are second to Victor Robles/SEA (.545 AVG, .643 OBP).

◆ Smith is riding a 4-game hitting streak at a .583 clip (7-for-12)/1.500 OPS with 3 doubles, 3 RBI and 3 walks.

**IN THE STANDINGS:** The D-backs are in third place in the NL West, trailing the Dodgers by 6.0 games and the Padres by 2.5 games...currently are tied for the second spot in the NL Wild Card (also: Mets, who hold tiebreaker), 2.5 games behind the Padres and 2.0 games ahead of the Braves (4th).

**STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE:** Out of the NL contending teams vying for a Postseason berth, the D-backs remaining schedule (.531) is third toughest:

**VS. LEFTY STARTERS SINCE AUG. 1:** **Eugenio Suárez** is batting .414 (12-for-29)/1.348 OPS with 1 double, 4 homers, 8 RBI and 5 walks in his last 24 games.

◆ **Randal Grichuk** is batting .375 (12-for-32)/1.206 OPS with 2 doubles, 4 homers and 10 RBI over 20 games.

**HISTORICAL RUN:** The D-backs' 6.37 runs scored per game post-All-Star break are currently the second most by a NL team in MLB history [behind the 1953 Dodgers/6.41], and eighth overall, behind the Yankees (1936/6.67, 2007/6.65, 1994/6.54, 1939/6.47), Astros (2019, 6.42) and Athletics (2001, 6.40).

**MOST WINS SINCE JULY 1:** Since July 1, Arizona leads MLB with an .847 OPS, .356 OBP .492 SLG, 432 runs and 6.45 R/G.

◆ The D-backs' 42 wins (42-25, .627; 20-12 home, 22-13 road) are second most in MLB to the Mets (43), ahead of the Tigers (41) and Padres (40).

**WITH A WIN:** With a win today, the D-backs will match their victory total from last year (84-78) with 11 games remaining in the regular season.

◆ The D-backs last reached 85+ wins in a season in 2019 (85) and 90+ wins in a season in 2017 (93)...Arizona has only reached 85+ wins on 8 occasions all-time.

**STRIKEOUT & WALK RATE:** The D-backs' 20.0 pct. strikeout rate is fifth lowest in the Majors [behind the Padres (17.4), Royals (18.9), Astros (19.3) and Guardians (20.0)], while their 8.9 pct. walk rate is fifth highest [behind the Yankees (10.6), Brewers (9.8), Dodgers (9.5) and Mariners (9.4)].

**VS. ROCKIES:** The D-backs have gone 8-4 in their last 12 games vs. Rockies and 18-7 in their last 25 since 2023.

◆ **Christian Walker**, in his last 22 games, is hitting .386 (32-for-83)/.480 OBP/.759 SLG/1.239 OPS with 4 doubles, 9 homers, 22 RBI and 14 walks...has homered 6 times in 8 games @ Coors Field.

**POWER UP:** **Christian Walker's** 1.239 OPS since 2023 vs. Rockies is highest in the Majors [min. 10 G], ahead of Seiya Suzuki/CHC (1.214) and Matt Chapman/SF (1.187) while his 9 homers are tied for the most with Jorge Soler/MIA-SF-ATL.

◆ Walker is currently riding a 17-game hitting streak vs. Rockies [since May 31, 2023], hitting .406 (26-for-64) with 8 homers and 18 RBI in the span.

◆ In 43 career games @ Coors Field, he is hitting .335 AVG/1.072 OPS with 14 homers...since 2018 (min. 30 G), Walker leads all visiting players @ Coors Field with a .665 SLG, 1.072 OPS, 14 homers, 26 extra-base hits and 109 total bases.

**HUCKIN' PUK:** Since Aug. 3, **A.J. Puk** is 1 of 3 relievers to go scoreless [min. 15.0 IP]...owns a current career-best 20 straight scoreless games (18.2 IP) with 7 hits and 3 walks allowed and 29 strikeouts.

◆ Puk is 1 of 4 D-back relievers all-time to reach 20 consecutive scoreless appearances...the franchise record for consecutive scoreless appearances by a reliever is 26 by Yoshihisa Hirano (May 6-July 3, 2018, 22.2 IP)...the franchise record for consecutive scoreless innings pitched by a reliever is 25.0 IP by Brandon Lyon (April 9-June 12, 2008, 24 appearances).

**MARTE 1 HOMER SHY:** **Ketel Marte** is 1 homer shy of a new career high...his 32 are tied for the most of his career (also: 2019, when he finished fourth in NL MVP voting).

**MARTE 2ND TO NONE:** **Ketel Marte** leads all second basemen [min. 100 G] in OPS (.917), OBP (.365), SLG (.552), homers (32), RBI (87), XBH (55) and bWAR (5.8).

**GO, GO GENO!:** Since July 1, **Eugenio Suárez's** 64 RBI are the most in the Majors, while his 22 homers are tied for second most (also: Aaron Judge/NYY and Shohei Ohtani/LAD), behind Brent Rooker/OAK (23), and 40 extra-base hits are tied for second (also: Vladimir Guerrero Jr.) to Bobby Witt Jr./KC (43).

◆ His 1.291 OPS since Sept. 1 leads MLB while his 7 homers are tied for the most in the month with Kyle Schwarber/PHI.

### NEXT STARTER: RHP BRANDON PFAADT (9-9, 4.81)

◆ Will make his third career start (second regular season) vs. Brewers [last: Sept. 14 @ Chase Field].

SNAKEBITES

**AT A GLANCE:** In his ninth MLB season...has spent seasons with the Red Sox (2015-21) and Tigers (2022-23).

- Signed to a 4-year contract by the D-backs as a free agent on Dec. 8, 2023.

**WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:** Is making his eighth start, fourth road start since being reinstated from the 60-day IL on Aug. 6 (strained left shoulder).

- The D-backs are 4-3 in his first 7 starts...has worked 5.0+ innings and in 5 of his 7 starts and yielded 2 walks or fewer in 5 of his 7.

**LAST START:** Retired 12 of his 22 batters faced on Sept. 13 vs. Brewers (2 ER in 5.0 IP, 5 H, 3 BB, 7 K).

- Two runs allowed came on a Rhys Hoskins 2-run home run in the fourth inning.

**VS. ROCKIES:** Fourth career start vs. Rockies...in 3 career starts (2 with Red Sox and 1 with D-backs), is 1-0 with a 6.19 ERA (11 ER in 16.0 IP) and 20 strikeouts.

- Won his lone start @ Coors Field on Aug. 28, 2019 (3 ER in 5.0 IP, 9 H, 3 BB, 5 K).

**AMONG LEFT-HANDED STARTERS:** Since 2018, his 65 wins rank fourth among left-handed starters, behind Max Fried/ATL (70), Clayton Kershaw/LAD (68) and Framber Valdez/HOU (67) while his 784 strikeouts rank 12th.

- From 2018-23 while in the AL, his 63 wins were the most among lefty starters, ahead of Marco Gonzales/SEA (60) and Framber Valdez/HOU (53)...his 131 starts in the span were the second most in the AL, behind Gonzales (141).

**NO LOVE LOSS FOR LEFTIES:** From Aug. 7-28, did not allow a hit to the first 16 left-handed batters faced this season and allowed just 2 walks.

**ROAD TOUGH IN '23:** In his final 13 road starts last season, went 8-3 with a 2.91 ERA (25 ER in 77.1 IP), opponent .238 AVG (68-for-286)/.638 OPS, 76 strikeouts and 21 walks.

**INSIDE THE NUMBERS:** In 2023, limited hitters to a .200 AVG (17-for-85) off his cutter (19.3% usage) with 18 strikeouts...limited opponents to a .233 AVG (28-for-120) off his changeup (18.9% usage) with 22 strikeouts and a 31.7% whiff.

**2023 RECAP:** In his second season with Detroit, went 13-9 with a 3.30 ERA (56 ER in 152.2 IP), 143 strikeouts, .227 opponent average and 1.15 WHIP over 26 starts.

- Posted career bests in ERA, opponent average and WHIP, while tossing 150.0+ innings for the third time in his career.
- Made his second consecutive Opening Day start for the Tigers and led the team in starts, quality starts (14), wins and strikeouts.
- Marked the fourth time in his last 5 seasons to win 13+ games and seventh in his last 8 to notch 20+ starts.
- His 13 wins were the most by a Tiger since Justin Verlander won 16 in 2016.
- Tossed 8.0 shutout innings with 4 hits allowed, no walks and 10 strikeouts in Game 2 of the doubleheader vs. Guardians on April 18...became just the third pitcher in franchise history to throw 8.0+ scoreless frames with no walks and 10+ strikeouts (also: Bill Donovan on June 27, 1908 vs. St. Louis Browns and Max Scherzer on June 17, 2012 vs. Rockies).
- Retired the first 20 batters @ Orioles on April 23 to become the first Tiger to accomplish the feat since Jordan Zimmermann (6.2 IP) @ Blue Jays in 2019.
- Recorded 6 consecutive starts with 5.0+ innings and 1 run or fewer allowed from April 12-May 10, the longest streak of his career... tied Michael Fulmer (May 21-June 17, 2016) and Al Benton (April 19-May 20, 1945) for the second-longest streak in Tigers history... over that stretch, went 4-0 with a 0.43 ERA (2 ER in 41.2 IP) and 41 strikeouts...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, his 0.43 ERA tied Doug Fister for the second-lowest by a Tigers pitcher over a 6-start span since 1913, trailing only Al Benton (0.33 ERA in 1945).

**POSTSEASON PRESENCE:** Appeared in the Postseason 3 times with Boston: 2017 Division Series (1 G); 2018 Division Series, League Championship Series and World Series (7 G-1 GS); 2021 ALDS and ALCS (3 GS).

- Was a member of the 2018 World Champion Red Sox and made the start in Game 4 @ Dodgers...posted a no-decision after allowing 4 runs over 5.2 innings with 6 strikeouts in the 9-6 win.

**HOW IT STARTED:** Signed by Orioles as a non-drafted free agent in 2010.

- Made his Major League debut on May 28, 2015 for the Red Sox @ Rangers...became the first pitcher in Red Sox history to pitch at least 7.2 innings and allow no runs, yield 3 hits or fewer and strikeout 7+ in a debut.

- ◆ Recalled from Triple-A Reno on Sept. 12 (second stint with Arizona).
- ◆ Made his first career relief appearance on Sept. 14 vs. Brewers (2 ER in 4.0 IP, 2 K).
- ◆ In 4 career starts (2 quality), is 1-1 with a 4.05 ERA (9 ER in 20.0 IP), 4 walks and 7 strikeouts.
- ◆ At age 23-324, became the fifth youngest D-back starting pitcher to toss 6.0+ innings in their debut, behind Tyler Skaggs (21-040, 2012), Archie Bradley (22-244, 2015), Bryan Augenstein (22-306, 2009) and Enrique González (23-318, 2006).
- ◆ Became the 10th D-back starting pitcher all-time to record a quality start in his MLB debut (last: Drey Jameson, Sept. 15, 2022 vs. Padres...his 83 pitches marked the fewest thrown among D-back starters all-time who threw at most 6.0 innings in a debut (previous low: John Patterson, 85 on July 20, 2002 @ Padres).
- ◆ Limiting lefties to a .231 AVG (9-for-39) with 8 strikeouts.
- ◆ Earned his first Major League win in his second career start on July 13 vs. Blue Jays (1 ER in 6.0 IP).
- ◆ At the age of 17, he drew interest from Major League teams after converting from a position player to a pitcher...but at age 18, he was unable to sign due to a wrist injury from basketball, so he quit baseball...he moved out of Venezuela looking for a better life, going to Ecuador, Colombia and Peru where he sold energy drinks and strawberries with whipped cream at traffic lights and cleaned windshields.
- ◆ Was a try out player in the Dominican Republic in 2020...in March 2020, the country and the airports closed and was 1 of 14 Venezuelan players who could not return to their country...12 were already signed but Yilber and one more remained at try-outs.
- ◆ Spent 8 months training, focused on gaining weight, eating well with a focus to be signed...in October 2020, Venezuela finally opened the border and he returned home.
- ◆ On February 5, 2021, at 20 years old, he signed his contract.

- ◆ His 67 appearances are tied for sixth most among NL relievers (also: 3 others).
- ◆ Did not allow an earned run in 15 of his 17 games from Aug. 5-Sept. 11, going 2-1 with a 1.62 ERA (3 ER in 16.2 IP), 1.08 WHIP, opponent .203 AVG (12-for-59)/.595 OPS, 6 walks and 22 strikeouts.
- ◆ Has allowed just 4 of his 27 inherited runners to score (14.8%).
- ◆ His 8 wins this season (last: Sept. 8 @ Astros) are 1 shy of tying his career-high 9 set in 2023.
- ◆ Has struck out 2+ batters in 8 of his last 17 appearances.
- ◆ Issued 8 walks in his last 36 games since June 25 (144 BF, 35.2 IP).
