TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their final road trip of the regular season with the 2nd of 3 games against the Texas Rangers ( $0-1$ )...Seattle opened the trip with a 3 -game sweep of the Oakland Athletics... following tomorrow's series finale, the Mariners return home for the final homestand of the regular season, with 3 games vs. Houston (Sept. 25-27) and 4 games vs. Texas (Sept. 28-Oct. 1)...tonight's game will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS with Dave Sims and Mike Blowers on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on Seattle Sports (710 AM) and Mariners.com with Rick Rizzs and Aaron Goldsmith. ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners fought back from an 8-0 deficit to score 5 unanswered runs in an eventual 8-5 loss to Texas last night...despite the loss, Seattle has won 3 of its last $4 \ldots$..the Mariners are 21-14 over their last 35 games, 29-17 over their last 46, 31-18 over their last 49, 34-19 over their last 53, 37-21 over their last 58 and 46-27 over their last 73 contests...the Mariners are $65-25$ when scoring at least 4 runs and 19-44 when scoring 3-or-fewer...the Mariners are 41-33 at T-Mobile Park and 43-36 on the road this season...they are 28-26 in day games and 56-43 at night.

- Sunday Programming Note - Tomorrow's game (Sunday) will be broadcast live on AM 770 KTTH
- Since July 1 - Seattle is 46-27 (.630) since July 1, 2nd-best record in the AL over that span and 3rdbest in the Majors, trailing the Dodgers (.667/48-24) and Orioles (.635/47-27).
- Power Generators - The Mariners have hit 201 home runs this season...Seattle has hit 200+ home runs in a season 8 times in franchise history: 1996-99, 2016-17, 2019 \& 2023.
- Déjà vu? - Seattle, which has 2 regular season road games left, owns a 43-36 (.544) road record this season...in both 2021 and 2022, Seattle finished with a road record of 44-37 (.543).
- Against Lefties - The Mariners are 21-16 (.568) against left-handed starting pitchers this season. PLAYOFF PICTURE...the Mariners have 9 regular season games remaining (2 at TEX, 3 vs. HOU, 4 vs. TEX)...Seattle enters play on Saturday 1.0 game back of the AL West Division lead and a half-game back of the 3 rd and final AL Wild Card spot...the Astros have 8 games remaining ( 2 vs . KC, 3 at SEA, 3 at ARI), the Rangers have 9 games remaining ( 2 vs. SEA, 3 at LAA, 4 at SEA) and Toronto has 8 games remaining ( 2 at TB, 3 vs. NYY, 3 vs. TB).
THE J-ROD SHOW HAS SILVER IN ITS FUTURE...Julio Rodríguez shares the American League lead in hits (176) with Marcus Semien-TEX...Julio leads AL outfielders in fWAR (6.0) by over a full "win", ranking ahead of Luis Robert Jr.-CWS (4.9) and Kyle Tucker-HOU (4.6)...among AL outfielders, Julio ranks 1st in stolen bases (36), 2nd in batting average (.283), 3rd in home runs (31), 2nd in runs scored (98), 3rd in RBI (100), 3rd in slugging percentage (.495), 3rd in OPS (.836), 2nd in wRC+ (131), T-5th in doubles (35), 1st in total bases (308) and T-2nd in extra-base hits (68)...in 2022, Julio won an AL Silver Slugger Award in his rookie season, alongside outfielders Aaron Judge-NYY and Mike Trout-LAA.
CRAWFORD'S CAREER YEAR...J.P. Crawford went 2 -for-5 with a pair of runs scored last night...in 2023, the Mariners shortstop has set career-highs in home runs (16) and RBI (57) and is on pace to set additional highs in on-base percentage (.379), slugging (.428) and OPS (.807)...J.P. ranks 4th in the American League in walks (88) and 4th in OBP.
ON THE MOUND...the Mariners are the only team in the Majors to have 3 pitchers with 17+ quality starts this season...tonight's starter Logan Gilbert (17 QS), Luis Castillo (18) and George Kirby (18) make up the trio...as a pitching staff, Seattle ranks 1st in MLB in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.54), T-1st in walks-per-9 innings (2.55), 2nd in ERA (3.73), T-2nd in WHIP (1.18), 2nd in FIP (3.84) and 2nd in fWAR (20.3).
IT'S GOLD, IT'S GOLD, IT'S GOLD...Julio Rodríguez's 12 Outs Above Average rank T-2nd among American League outfielders...Eugenio Suárez' 9 OAA rank 2nd among AL third basemen...Cal Raleigh's 21 catcher caught stealings rank 2nd among AL catchers.
LA PIEDRA: AMONG THE BEST...Luis Castillo has been one of the best pitchers in the American League this season...Castillo is 14-7 with a 3.06 ERA ( $64 \mathrm{ER}, 188.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ) with 50 walks and 207 strikeouts in 31 starts...the right-hander has gone $5.0+$ innings in all 31 of his outings...Castillo has gone $6.0+$ innings in 22 of them, recording 18 quality starts...he is the 8th Mariners pitcher (and 3rd right-hander) to tally 200+ strikeouts in a season in franchise history...among AL pitchers this season, Castillo ranks in the top-5 in ERA (4th), wins (T-3rd), strikeouts (4th), opponent batting average (1st, .211) and WHIP (3rd, 1.05).
IT'S NICE OUT, I'D RATHER WALK...Jarred Kelenic went 1 -for- 1 with 4 walks and a double last night.. he became the first Mariners player to draw 4+ walks in a game since Kyle Seager drew 4 on July 17, 2021 at Los Angeles-AL...he became the first Mariners player to draw 4+ walks and record a hit in a game since Edgar Martinez went 2-for-4 with 5 walks and a home run in an 18-inning game on June 24, 2004 at Texas. JULIO \& GEORGE: A DYNAMIC DUO...Julio Rodríguez has produced 6.0 FanGraphs Wins Above Replacement this season, 3rd-most in the American League behind Shohei Ohtani-LAA (6.6) and Corey Seager-TEX (6.1)...George Kirby's 3.9 fWAR places him 7th among AL pitchers...the second-year stalwarts produced 5.4 and 3.0 fWAR, respectively, during their 2022 rookie campaigns...Rodríguez and Kirby became the first position player/pitcher rookie duo to accumulate $5.0+$ and $3.0+$ fWAR, respectively, as teammates since Alvin Davis and Mark Langston did it for the 1984 Mariners...Rodríguez and Kirby are the first teammate duo in Maior Leaque history to follow up those rookie performances with 5.0+ and 3.0+ fWAR, respectively, in their follow-up season of their rookie campaigns.
A CHANCE TO LEAD THE LEAGUE IN HITS...Julio Rodríguez is tied for the American League lead in hits (176)...if he finishes with the league lead in hits, he will become just the 3rd player in franchise history to lead the AL in hits, joining Alex Rodriguez (1998) and Ichiro Suzuki (7x, 2001, 2004, 2006-10) and just the 9th player age 22-or-younger to lead the AL in hits...he would join Ty Cobb-DET (3x, 1907-09), Dick Wakefield-DET (1943), Harvey Kuenn-DET (1953), Al Kaline-DET (1955), George Brett-KC (1975), Rickey Henderson-OAK (1981), Cal Ripken Jr.-BAL (1983) and Alex Rodriguez-SEA (1998).

he 26-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 31st start of the season and 2nd against Texas...he will also make the 87th start of his MLB career and 9th career star against the Rangers.

- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummau.
- Spent 3 seasons at Stetson (FL) University, 2016-18...in 2017, was ASUN Pitcher of the Year and ASUN 1st-Team All-Conference.
- Was named the 2022 Mariners Most Valuable Pitcher by the Seattle Chapter of the BBWAA.

LAST TIME OUT...L\#6 in 30th start of the season agains LAD on 9/17, tossing 5.0 innings and allowing 5 runs on 7 hits (2 HR) and 1 walk with 6 strikeouts.

WINNING AWAY FROM HOME...is making his 46th career start on the road...Logan has a $22-4$ road record with a 3.60 ERA ( 252.2 IP, 101 ER ) with 68 walks and 253 strikeouts...his . 846 away winning percentage is the highest in MLB history among pitchers with at least 40 road games started...since he joined the league in 2021 Gilbert's 22 away wins are the 7th most in the Major Leagues
WHIP IT...Gilbert currently ranks 10th in the majors among qualified starting pitchers with a 1.078 WHIP...three Mariners pitchers make up the top 10 with Luis Castillo (2nd, 1.046) and George Kirby (4th, 1.058) also ranking in the top 10 in the Major Leagues.
FINDING HIS GROOVE...over his last 14 starts (July 4-c) Gilbert has a 3.32 ERA (32 ER, 86.2 IP) with 13 walks and 89 strikeouts...in that span he has recorded 8 quality starts and has allowed 2 -or-fewer runs in 9 of those 14 starts...his 3.32 ERA over that span ranks 10th in the American League.
K MORE WALK LESS...his 5.69 strikeout-to-walk ratio ranks 5 th in the Major Leagues and 2nd on the Mariners among qualified pitchers...he trails only George Kirby (8.94) who currently leads the Major Leagues.
QUALITY AND QUANTITY...has recorded 17 quality starts this season which ranks 3rd on the team behind Luis Castillo and George Kirby (18)...his 17 quality starts this season are a new career high for a single season...he beat his previous record of 16 quality starts that he set in the 2022 season...his 17 quality starts this season rank tied for the 8th most in the American League
