Homers!

Ronald Acuña Jr., Ozzie Albies and Matt Olson all went deep in the third inning for Atlanta last night, the Braves' first three-homer inning of the season.

Atlanta last had three homers in a single inning on June 27 of last season versus Minnesota, when Acuña Jr., Austin Riley and Sean Murphy all homered in the first.

The Braves have six homers in their last two games, after also hitting three on Wednesday versus Boston. Atlanta totaled just nine homers over the 15 games prior to Wednesday, with one multi-homer game in that span.

TODAY'S GAME: The Braves and Mets today continue a three-game weekend series with what is the fifth of 13 total games between the teams this season... The two next meet for a four-game set back here at Citi Field, July 25-28.

A The teams are 2-2 in four games this season after Atlanta's win last night...New York was the first team to take a series from Atlanta this season, winning two-of-three games at Truist Park, April 8-11...The Braves' 16-4 defeat in the rubber game is their largest loss this season.

A Atlanta went 10-3 in 13 games with New York last season, a .769 winning percentage...Since the Mets were founded in 1962, the best single-season winning percentage the Braves have logged against New York is .778, going 14-4 in 18 games with the Mets in both 1964 and 1966.

A The Braves have won 18 of the last 24 games with New York dating to the 2022 season, outscoring the Mets 159-104 (+55) over the stretch.

A The Braves have taken the season series from their N.L. East rivals for six consecutive seasons...Prior to last year's 10-3 mark, they went 10-9 in both 2022 & 2021, 7-3 in 2020, 11-8 in 2019 and 13-6 in 2018...Since the start of the 2018 season, Atlanta is 63-40 (.612) against New York overall.

A Atlanta went 5-2 against New York here at Citi Field last season, including a 21-3 victory in the first game of a doubleheader here, August 12.

A LH Max Fried is set to make the 23rd appearance and 18th start of his career versus New York, and is 8-5 with a 2.65 ERA (30 ER/102.0 IP) over his first 22 games...The 6-foot-4, 190-pound left-hander made just one start against the Mets last season, and tossed a rain-shortened 5.0-inning shutout...Fried has allowed no more than two earned runs in each of his last 11 starts against New York dating to the 2020 season, going 6-4 with a 2.47 ERA (17 ER/62.0 IP).

A RH Christian Scott is set to make just the second start of his major league career, and his first versus Atlanta...The 6-foot-4, 215-pound native of Coconut Creek, FL, made his debut on May 4 at Tampa Bay and allowed five hits and one run over 6.2 innings...He is rated as New York's No. 5 prospect per MLB.com.

WIN: Atlanta scored four runs in last night's third inning and held on to beat New York, 4-2, last night... The Braves have won three straight games after going 1-5 on their last road trip.

A Atlanta improved to 22-4 (.846) this season when scoring at least four runs, and have won eight straight such games and 15 of their last 16.

A The Braves' seven hits last night came from seven different batters...Michael Harris II and Orlando Arcia were the only Atlanta batters without a base hit last night.

BACK-TO-BACK: Ronald Acuña Jr. and Ozzie Albies hit back-to-back home runs last night, and the Braves have gone back-to-back in consecutive games after not doing so at all in their first 33 games of the year... Marcell Ozuna and Orlando Arcia did so on Wednesday vs. Boston.

A Dating to the start of the 2019 season, no team in baseball has hit consecutive home runs more often than Atlanta...The Braves have 59 pairs of back-to-back homers in that span, four more than Houston (55) and seven more than any other National League team (Los Angeles - 51).

A Acuña Jr. and Albies went back-to-back together for the third time in their careers last night...They did so for the first time on September 18, 2020 against the Mets, and again on July 1, 2023 vs. the Marlins.

PITCHING: Charlie Morton pitched 7.0 one-run innings in the start last night, and the Braves staff combined to allow just four hits and two runs in the win.

A In the Braves' last 24 games dating to April 12, their 2.86 ERA (69 ER/217.1 IP) is third best in baseball behind just the Mariners (2.44) and Dodgers (2.65)...Atlanta is allowing just 3.08 runs per game in that span.

A Atlanta's starting staff since that date has pitched to a 2.97 ERA, seventh best in baseball, while the bullpen owns a 2.63 mark, fifth lowest.

A Atlanta has gone 16-8 in these 24 games, despite its offense batting just .233/.306/.381 and averaging 4.29 runs per game.

A Raisel Iglesias earned the 200th save of his career last night, becoming the 54th player in baseball history to reach the milestone...His 200 saves rank fifth among all active pitchers.

A A.J. Minter earned his fifth hold of the season and the 110th of his career, extending his own franchise record.

MICHAEL HARRIS II: Went 0-for-4 last night and is hitless in his last 29 at-bats, dating to a second-inning single on April 30 at Seattle...It is the longest skid of his career.

A The skid spans his last seven games, also the longest drought of his career...He went six games without a hit last May.

A The run has dropped his average by 56 points, from .304 after play on April 30 to .248 entering tonight.

A Harris II has struck out just five times during his hitless streak...Of the 24 balls he has put in play during the drought, 12 have been hard hit (95+ mph exit velocity) and seven have been hit over 100 miles per hour...He made outs last night at 106.8 and 95.9 miles per hour.

A For context, the major league average for balls hit over 95 mph is .486...On balls hit over 100 mph, the average is .584.

Today's Game

- A Set to make his eighth start of the season and first of the year against New York (NL).
 - A His 17 starts against the Mets are the most against any single opponent.
 - A Sporting a 2.65 ERA when facing New York, the lowest mark against any team he has faced more than seven times.
 - A Is 3-3 with a 2.89 ERA in nine starts and four relief appearances at Citi Field.
- A Suffered the loss on May 5 in his last start against Los Angeles (NL); his first in a calendar year.
 - A Prior to his last start, his last loss was on May 5, 2023 against Baltimore.
 - A Ended an eight-game win streak that began on August 4, 2023.
- A Opponents are being held to an average exit velocity of 83.1 against Fried; the second lowest among qualified pitchers.
- A Pitching to a 16.20 ERA in the first frame and a 1.71 ERA in all other innings this season.
 - A Allowed a combined nine runs in the first inning between his first two games in 2024.
- A Sporting a 2.16 ERA in five starts after allowing a combined 10 earned runs through 5.0 frames tossed between his first two starts of the season.
- A Producing a 67.9% groundball rate this season; the highest rate in the majors among qualified starters.
 - A His 74 groundballs induced are the most in MLB among lefties.
- A Earned his second win of the season while throwing a three-hit shutout against the Marlins in his last start; the fourth of his career and the third of the nine-inning variety.
 - A Each of those four outings have qualified as a "Maddux" (a shutout on fewer than 100 pitches).
 - A Since pitch tracking began in 1988, Hall-of-Famers Greg Maddux (11) and Tom Glavine (5) are the only Braves pitchers to log more "Maddux" outings.
 - A It's the first 9.0-inning shutout by a Braves pitcher since RHP Bryce Elder on September 26, 2022 at Washington.
- A Struckout Christian Walker looking in the top of the second inning to reach 700 punchouts on his career.
 - A Fried became the sixth left-handed pitcher in franchise history to reach the milestone.
 - A Joins Hall-of-Famers Warren Spahn and Tom Glavine along with with Denny Lemaster, Lefty Tyler and Steve Avery as the only lefty Braves pitchers to do so.
- A Had the shortest start of his career against Philadelphia on March 30, 2024.
 - A Lasted 0.2 innings while allowing three earned runs and two hits, issuing three walks on 43 pitches.
- A His 62 wins over the past five seasons are most in the National League, and most by any left-hander in baseball.
 - A Only one pitcher, the Yankees' Gerrit Cole, has more wins than Fried since the start of 2019...Cole has 71 wins.
 - A Additionally, the Braves have 86 wins in games started by Fried since the beginning of 2019, the most such wins by a pitcher in the National League... Only Cole and José Berríos, whose teams have won 94 and 87 of their starts respectively, have more in the majors.
- A Fried's 25 successful pickoffs since debuting in 2017 are the most in baseball and five more than the next closest pitcher, Washington's Patrick Corbin.
 - A Corbin has attempted 468 pickoffs in that time, compared to Fried's 186.
 - A Fried has successfully nabbed a runner on 13.5 percent of his career pickoff attempts, drastically higher than the MLB average since his debut (1.7 percent)...Since 2017, 1.6 percent of MLB's successful pick attempts have been executed by Fried.

2023 Recap

- A Completed his fifth full major league season and went 8-1 with a 2.55 ERA (22 ER/77.2 IP) in 14 games, all starts.
- A He was placed on the 15-day injured list with a left forearm strain after his only loss of the season.
 - A Missed 73 games after being placed on the 15-day IL.
- A Fried's 2.55 ERA in 2023 was the second lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 14 starts.
 - A Fried went 6-0 with a 2.79 ERA in nine starts after being reinstated from the injured list on August 4.
- A Became just the fifth pitcher since 1901 to only allow one run through March and April with at least four games started.
 - A Joined Hall-of-Famer Walter Johnson, Roger Clemens, Fernando Valenzuela and Minnesota's Pablo López as the only other pitchers to do so (since 1901).
