TOUCHING ALL BASES

FINAL HOMESTAND @ **CHASE FIELD:** The D-backs are hosting their final homestand of the regular season...tonight features the first-ever D-backs Golf Night presented by WM Phoenix Open, which celebrates the iconic "The People's Open" and "The Greenest Show on Grass" and will recognize The Thunderbirds and Thunderbirds Charities for their incredible work in the community, specifically with the Special Olympics...tonight also features "Passing the Torch Night", which celebrates the 2024 Summer Games with special appearances by Arizona's own Gold medal gymnast Amanda Borden, Gold medal volleyball player Whitney Dosty and 2024 Olympics skateboarder Paige Heyn and BMX Racer Cam Wood.

11TH ANNUAL D-BACKS RACE AGAINST CANCER: On Sunday, September 29, the D-backs will host their 11th annual "D-backs Race Against Cancer" presented by Dignity Health Cancer Institute...proceeds from the event will support local patient care and cancer research projects such as screening tools to assist with earlier diagnosis, innovative treatment options for those currently facing cancer, and creating and maintaining support systems for patients' families...registration ends after September 28 and no race day registration will be available...for more info, visit dbacks.com/race.

SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth (1999, 2001, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

LAST GAME: The D-backs lost, 10-9, yesterday @ Brewers, taking the series 3 games-to-1.

- ◆ **Ketel Marte** (1-for-4, HR, RBI, BB) hit his 13th first-inning homer, which are third most in the Majors, behind Aaron Judge/NYY (18) and Kyle Schwarber/PHI (15) and ahead of Gunnar Henderson (12) and Shohei Ohtani/LAD (11).
- ◆ Josh Bell (1-for-3, HR, 2 RBI) and Eugenio Suárez (2-for-5, HR, RBI), in the third inning, hit the D-backs' 14th back-to-back home runs...their franchise-high 14 occurrences are the most in the Majors, ahead of the Dodgers (12).

IN THE STANDINGS: The D-backs are tied for the second spot in the NL Wild Card with the Mets [who hold tiebreaker], 3.0 games behind the Padres (first WC), and 2.0 games over the Braves (fourth in WC).

♦ The D-backs are in third place in the NL West, trailing the Dodgers by 6.0 games and the Padres by 3.0 games.

87 WINS & COUNTING: The D-backs' 87 wins, which surpass their total from last year (84-78) with 6 games to go, are their third-most wins since 2008, behind 93 in 2017 and 94 in 2011...have reached 90+ wins 6 times (1999/100 W, 2002/98 W, 2011/94 W, 2017/93 W, 2001/92 W and 2007/90 W).

THE FINAL SPRINT: The D-backs face the Giants and Padres for their final 6 games of the regular season...the D-backs are a combined 11-9 against the two teams (6-4 vs. Giants and 5-5 vs. Padres).

- ◆ The D-backs are averaging 5.60 runs per game vs. Giants (+10 run diff.).
- ◆ The D-backs are averaging 5.40 runs per game vs. Padres and will face off to determine the season series.

STARTING PITCHING: Over their last 5 starts (since Sept. 18), D-backs starting pitchers are 4-1 with a 3.25 ERA (10 ER in 27.2 IP)...their 40 strikeouts in the span are the most in the Majors while their 4 walks allowed are tied for second fewest (also: Rays).

◆ The D-backs' 34 post-All-Star wins when starting pitchers toss 5.0+ innings are second most in the Majors, behind the Mets (35).

DINGER SEASON: The D-backs reached 200+ homers in a season for the first time since 2019 (220)...their 206 homers are fifth most in a single season in franchise history, 2 shy of 2001 (208) for fourth all-time, and behind 2017 (220 HR), 2019 (220 HR) and 1999 (216 HR).

- ◆ The D-backs' 206 homers this season are tied for fourth most in the Majors with the Braves, behind the Yankees (229), Dodgers (225) and Orioles (225).
- ♦ The only time the D-backs have finished a season in the Top 5 in home runs is 1999 (5th, 2016), behind the Mariners (244), Athletics (235), Rangers (230) and Rockies (223).

MLB'S BEST SINCE JULY 1: Since July 1, Arizona leads the Majors with an .848 OPS, .355 OBP .492 SLG, 697 hits, 126 homers, 262 extra-base hits, 467 runs, 6.49 R/G, 32 sacrifice flies and 22 sacrifice hits.

HOME SWEET HOME: The D-backs' .625 win pct. (20-12) @ home since July 1 is the third highest in the Majors, behind the Mets (.714, 25-10) and Dodgers (.676, 25-12).

♦ Since Aug. 1 @ home, the D-backs are averaging an MLB-best 7.26 runs per game, ahead of the Mets (5.32), Rockies (5.27), Dodgers (5.13) and Pirates (5.12).

RUNS PER GAME: The D-backs have plated 5+ runs 5 straight games (4-1 record)...their 5.52 runs per game this season lead the Majors, ahead of the Dodgers (5.15) and Yankees (5.02), and rank second in club history (5.60 R/G in 1999) [the last Arizona team to have 5.00+ R/G was in 2019 (5.02)].

- ♦ Since Aug. 1, the D-backs' 32 games with 5+ runs (25-7 record) are the most in MLB, ahead of the Dodgers (27, 24-3) and Cubs (27, 23-4).
- ♦ The D-backs 861 runs this season are second in franchise history, behind 1999 (908 runs) a difference of 47 runs.

FIRST & NINTH-INNING OFFENSE: In the first and ninth innings combined, the D-backs' offense leads the Majors with a .300 AVG, .364 OBP, .532 SLG, .896 OPS, 333 hits, 62 homers, 209 runs, 1.34 runs per game and 125 XBH.

FIRST-INNING FANS: The D-backs have homered in the first inning in 3 straight games (and 4 of their last 5) and scored in 9 of their last 12 games (Sept. 10).

- ♦ The D-backs lead the Majors with a franchise-high 37 occurrences of scoring 2+ runs in the first inning [previous high: 34 in 2018], ahead of the Yankees (31) and Marlins (26).
- ♦ In the first inning, the D-backs lead MLB with a franchise-best .324 AVG, .383 OBP, .563 SLG, .945 OPS and 207 hits as well as their 121 runs.

FIRST-INNING HISTORY: The D-backs are the first team to boast a first-inning average of .324+ since the 2000 Cardinals (.336) and are just 1 of 9 teams since 1979 to have a first-inning average of .320+:

NEXT STARTER: RHP BRANDON PFAADT (10-9, 4.66)

- ♦Won his last start on Sept. 19 @ Brewers (W; 1 ER in 7.0 IP, 2 H, 0 BB, 12 K) and recorded a career-high 12 strikeouts over a career-high-tying 7.0 innings...it also marked his third career start of 100+ pitches.
- ♦In 2 starts vs. Giants, is 0-1 with a 1.50 ERA (2 ER in 12.0 IP) with 12 strikeouts...last faced on Aug. 3, 2023 @ Giants (L, 1 ER in 7.0 IP, 7 K).

SNAKEBITES

AT A GLANCE: In his ninth MLB season...has spent seasons with the Red 2023 RECAP: In his second season with Detroit, went 13-9 with a 3.30 Sox (2015-21) and Tigers (2022-23).

• Signed to a 4-year contract by the D-backs as a free agent on Dec. 1.15 WHIP over 26 starts. 8, 2023.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Is making his ninth start, fifth home start since being reinstated from the 60-day IL on Aug. 6 (strained left shoulder).

• The D-backs are 5-3 in his 8 starts...has worked 5.0+ innings and • Marked the fourth time in his last 5 seasons to win 13+ games and yielded 2 walks or fewer in 6 of his 8 starts.

LAST START: Improved to 3-1 on the road after tossing a season-high 6.1 innings with 2 runs allowed on 5 hits and 11 strikeouts.

- His 11 strikeouts were the most in a game since Sept. 14, 2019 @ Phillies when he had 12 strikeouts.
- · First career start of recording double digit strikeouts and walking iust 1 batter.

VS. GIANTS: Second career start vs. Giants.

• Won his lone start with Red Sox on Sept. 19, 2019 (1 ER in 6.0 IP, 3 H, 2 BB, 10 K).

AMONG LEFT-HANDED STARTERS: Since 2018, his 66 wins rank fourth among left-handed starters, behind Maax Fried/ATL (71), Clayton Kershaw/ LAD (68) and Framber Valdez/HOU (67) while his 795 strikeouts rank 12th.

• From 2018-23 while in the AL, his 63 wins were the most among lefty starters, ahead of Marco Gonzales/SEA (60) and Framber Valdez/HOU (53)...his 131 starts in the span were the second most in the AL, behind Gonzales (141).

NO LOVE LOSS FOR LEFTIES: From Aug. 7-28, did not allow a hit to the first 16 left-handed batters faced this season and allowed just 2 walks.

ROAD TOUGH IN '23: In his final 13 road starts last season, went 8-3 with a 2.91 ERA (25 ER in 77.1 IP), opponent .238 AVG (68-for-286)/.638 OPS, 76 strikeouts and 21 walks.

INSIDE THE NUMBERS: In 2023, limited hitters to a .200 AVG (17-for-85) off his cutter (19.3% usage) with 18 strikeouts...limited opponents to a .233 AVG (28-for-120) off his changeup (18.9% usage) with 22 strikeouts and a 31.7% whiff.

ERA (56 ER in 152.2 IP), 143 strikeouts, .227 opponent average and

- Posted career bests in ERA, opponent average and WHIP, while tossing 150.0+ innings for the third time in his career.
- Made his second consecutive Opening Day start for the Tigers and led the team in starts, quality starts (14), wins and strikeouts.
- seventh in his last 8 to notch 20+ starts.
- His 13 wins were the most by a Tiger since Justin Verlander won 16 in 2016.
- Tossed 8.0 shutout innings with 4 hits allowed, no walks and 10 strikeouts in Game 2 of the doubleheader vs. Guardians on April 18...became just the third pitcher in franchise history to throw $\dot{8.0}+$ scoreless frames with no walks and 10+ strikeouts (also: Bill Donovan on June 27, 1908 vs. St. Louis Browns and Max Scherzer on June 17, 2012 vs. Rockies).
- Retired the first 20 batters @ Orioles on April 23 to become the first Tiger to accomplish the feat since Jordan Zimmermann (6.2 IP) @ Blue Javs in 2019.
- Recorded 6 consecutive starts with 5.0+ innings and 1 run or fewer allowed from April 12-May 10, the longest streak of his career... tied Michael Fulmer (May 21-June 17, 2016) and Al Benton (April 19-May 20,1945) for the second-longest streak in Tigers history... over that stretch, went 4-0 with a 0.43 ERA (2 ER in 41.2 IP) and 41 strikeouts...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, his 0.43 ERA tied Doug Fister for the second-lowest by a Tigers pitcher over a 6-start span since 1913, trailing only Al Benton (0.33 ERA in 1945).

POSTSEASON PRESENCE: Appeared in the Postseason 3 times with Boston: 2017 Division Series (1 G); 2018 Division Series, League Championship Series and World Series (7 G-1 GS); 2021 ALDS and ALCS (3 GS).

• Was a member of the 2018 World Champion Red Sox and made the start in Game 4 @ Dodgers...posted a no-decision after allowing 4 runs over 5.2 innings with 6 strikeouts in the 9-6 win.

HOW IT STARTED: Signed by Orioles as a non-drafted free agent in 2010.

Made his Major League debut on May 28, 2015 for the Red Sox @ Rangers...became the first pitcher in Red Sox history to pitch at least 7.2 innings and allow no runs, yield 3 hits or fewer and strikeout 7+ in a debut.

- ♦Became the 10th D-back starting pitcher all-time to record a quality start in his MLB debut (last: Drey Jameson, Sept. 15, 2022 vs. Padres...his 83 pitches marked the fewest thrown among D-back starters all-time who threw at most 6.0 innings in a debut (previous low: John Patterson, 85 on July 20, 2002 @ Padres).
- ♦ Earned his first Major League win in his second career start on July 13 vs. Blue Jays (1 ER in 6.0 IP).
