

**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Snakes, 4-3, yesterday...New York has dropped four of their last five games...New York is in a stretch of 17 straight games without an off-day (1-3)...The Mets continue their penultimate homestand (0-1), a seven-game stand against Arizona (0-1) and Cincinnati (three games).

HOME. SWEET HOME: The Mets are in the midst of their penultimate homestand of the season...The Mets are 35-34 at Citi Field in 2023...This compares to a 30-44 record on the road.

MLB STARLIGHT ACTIVATION AT NYP: The New York Mets proudly partnered with Major League Baseball and the Starlight Children's Foundation to donate a new Virtual Reality headset to New York-Presbyterian Morgan Stanley Children's Hospital...In honor of Childhood Cancer Awareness Month, José Quintana and Mr. Met visited the hospital to present the new headset and visit pediatric cancer patients and their families.

EL JEFF-E: Jeff McNeil is batting .314 (11-35) with five runs, one double, one triple, two home runs, three BRI with a .351 OBP and a .571 SLG in nine games in September...In 53 games following the All-Star break, Jeff McNeil is batting .292 (61-226) with 30 runs, nine doubles, two triples, five home runs, 24 RBI, nine walks with a .338 OBP and a .426 SLG...This compares to a .253/.331/.328 slashline with 37 runs, 13 doubles, one triple, three homers, 26 RBI and 27 walks in 89 games prior to the break.

I DON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ: Over his last 19 games, DJ Stewart is batting .324 (22-68) with 12 runs, five doubles, 10 home runs, 21 RBI and a 1.217 OPS...In 42 games this year, Stewart is batting .266 (29-109) with 15 runs, seven doubles, 11 home runs, 24 RBI, 11 walks, a .347 OBP and a .633 SLG... Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021

30-FOR-30: Lindor has recorded 32 doubles and 26 home runs this season... He is looking to become the 12th player in franchise history to record a 30/30 season...The last player to accomplish that feat was Pete Alonso in 2019...He has stolen 26 bases this year...He is looking to become the fourth player in franchise history to record 30 doubles, 30 home runs and 30 steals in a single-season.

LINSANITY: Over his last 72 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .288 (78-271) with 55 runs, 15 doubles, two triples, 14 home runs, 41 RBI, 30 walks, 20 steals with a .369 OBP, a .513 SLG and an .882 OPS...Lindor has stolen a career-high 26 bases this season.

I DECLARE fWAR: Francisco Lindor ranks eighth in the majors and fifth in the National League with a 5.4 fWAR...Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 16.3 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (19.0), Mookie Betts (18.3) and Trea Turner (16.8) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit...His 16.3 fWAR since 2021 is sixth in the majors.

CONNECT FOUR: The Mets now feature for players who have hit 20 or more home runs this season: Pete Alonso, Francisco Álvarez, Francisco Lindor and Brandon Nimmo...The 2023 Mets are one of five teams in franchise history to accomplish this feat...This includes the 2019 Mets who had a franchise-high five players who recorded at least 20 home runs.

🂯: Pete Alonso became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry also recorded three seasons each...Alonso's 483 RBI since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues...He is tied for second in the majors and tied for second in the NL with 103 RBI.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1984, Doc Gooden threw a complete games shutout as the Mets defeated the Pirates, 2-0, at Shea Stadium...Gooden allowed five hits and struck out 16 in the victory...This included his 246th strikeout of the season, surpassing Herb Score's rookie strikeout record...Gooden would win the NL Rookie of the Year Award and finish second in the Cy Young race, going 17-9 with a 2.60 ERA (63 ER/218.0 IP) with 73 walks and 276 strikeouts.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Yesterday, INF/OF Jett Williams was promoted to Double-A Binghamton...Williams is currently ranked as MLB Pipeline's No. 3 prospect in the Mets' organization and the No. 78 overall prospect in baseball...He was selected by the Mets with the 14th overall pick in the first round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Rockwall-Heath High School in Heath, TX...The 19-year-old, in the midst of his first full professional season, has hit .299 with seven home runs, nine doubles, 33 walks, 12 stolen bases, 18 RBI, and a 1.018 OPS in 36 games with High-A Brooklyn before his promotion... He has drawn a total of 102 walks across the two levels, which is tied for the third-most walks in all of Minor League Baseball.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Threw a career-high 6.1 innings against Washington at Nationals Park on September 6, his first quality start in the majors...Allowed two earned runs on six hits and one walk...Fanned a career-high six batters in a 3-2 Mets loss.

**BUTTO VS. THE D-BACKS:** Butto will face the Diamondbacks for the first time in his career...Will also be facing an NL West opponent for the first time in his career

**SLINGIN' IN SYRACUSE:** Butto has made 19 starts in Syracuse this season, pitching to a 3-7 record with a 5.93 ERA (60 ER/91.0 IP)...In his last start on August 27 against the Buffalo Bisons, Butto suffered the loss after throwing 5.0 innings, during which he allowed four earned runs on seven hits and four walks while striking out three batters...Butto's last win came on August 10 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre against the Railriders, during which he tossed 5.2 scoreless innings, allowing four hits and one walk while fanning four batters... Butto leads the Syracuse Mets in strikeouts this season with 82.

**DEBUTTO:** RHP José Butto made his season debut on April 16 at Oakland in his last start...He threw 5.0 innings and allowed one run on five hits with four walks and two strikeouts...He did not factor into the decision as the Mets won in 10 innings, 4-3.

**PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Butto made two starts during the first week of the season for Triple-A Syracuse, going 1-1 with a 1.86 ERA (2 ER/9.2 IP) to go along with eight strikeouts and five walks...For his efforts, he was named International League Pitcher of the Week...He also earned the honor during the final week of the 2022 season after throwing 7.0 shutout innings, allowing two hits and fanning 11 in a September 21 start at Worcester.

**2022:** He made his major league debut on August 21 last season in a start at Philadelphia...In that start, he threw 4.0 innings and allowed seven runs on nine hits with two walks and five strikeouts...New York came from behind to win, 10-9, thanks to a pair of late-inning home runs by Mark Canha.
