**TODAY IS THE GREATEST:** The Mets are set to open their 62nd season when they take on the Marlins today in Miami...In the history of Major League Baseball, the Mets (40-21, .656) have the best winning percentage on Opening Day...Research courtesy of Elias.

**OPENING DAY:** After losing their first eight Opening Day contests, the Mets have won 40 of their last 53 Opening Day games (.755)...New York took nine straight openers from 1975-1983 to tie a major league record...The Mets have won 13 of their last 17 openers, including five of the last six.

**WAY, AWAY FROM HERE:** The Mets are 17-12 when starting the season on the road...Dating back to 2001, New York has won eight of its last 12 games when beginning the year on the road...This is the third straight year the Mets have opened the season on the road.

**MAX OPENING:** Scherzer today will toe the rubber for his first Opening Day start with the Mets and the seventh of his career...He started the opener in six of his seven seasons with Washington (2015-2016, 2018-2021) posting a record of 1-3 with a 2.72 ERA (12 ER/39.2 IP)...Scherzer twice started Opening Day against the Mets, opposing Bartolo Colon in 2015 and Jacob deGrom in 2019...He will be the first pitcher to start both for and against the Mets on Opening Day in his career...Elias notes that Madison Bumgarner (Arizona) is the only other active pitcher who has started a season opener for and against the same club.

**THE CY YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS:** The Mets have faced the defending Cy Young Award winner on Opening Day twice before...Both instances involved Tom Seaver and Steve Carlton...The first time occurred on April 6, 1973 vs. Philadelphia and the second on April 5, 1983 vs. Philadelphia.

**STARTING OFF WITH A BANG:** The Mets have only had one player to record a leadoff home run on Opening Day...Kaz Matsui began the first game of the 2004 season with a home run off Russ Ortiz on April 6 in Atlanta.

**GRAND SLAMS:** Collin Cowgill and Todd Hundley are the only two Mets to hit a grand slam on Opening Day...Cowgill went deep on April 1, 2013 off San Diego's Brad Brach...Hundley's slam came on April 26, 1995 at Colorado off Billy Swift.

**TWO HOME RUNS:** Robin Ventura, Bobby Bonilla, Cleon Jones, Darryl Strawberry and Kevin McReynolds are the only five players in club history to hit two home runs in an Opening Day tilt...Ventura was the last to accomplish the feat on April 3, 2001 at Atlanta.

**EXTRA, EXTRA ON OPENING DAY:** The Mets have played seven extra-inning games on Opening Day...They are 5-2 in those contests...The last extra-inning affair was in 2014, a 9-7 loss to the Nationals...The last Mets Opening Day win in extras was a 6-4, 10-inning victory on April 3, 2001 at Atlanta.

**A SHOW ABOUT NOTHING:** The Mets have recorded 10 shutouts on Opening Day...Before 2021, the Mets won back-to-back Opening Days via shutout, a 2-0 win at Washington in 2019 and a 1-0 win against the Atlanta Braves in 2020...The Mets have been shut out only once (7-0, April 9, 1963 vs. St. Louis) on Opening Day...Research courtesy of Elias.

**QUICK CHANGE:** Tim Locastro has changed to uniform #26.

**IT WAS IN THE CARDS:** The Mets were in the Postseason for the first time since 2016 and for the 10th time in franchise history...Last year marked the fourth Wild Card berth in team history...Also in 1999, 2000 and 2016.

**MARLINS-METS NOTES:** The Mets are opening the season in Miami for the first time since 2011...The Mets fell to the then Florida Marlins, 6-2, at Sun Life Stadium...This marks the fourth time that the Marlins and Mets will face each other on Opening Day...The Mets are 2-2 against the Fish on the first day of the season...The two teams played each other also in 2010, 2008 and 1999.

**WHEN I WAS 22:** The Mets finished 2022 going 101-61 and finished in second place in the National League East...It was a 24-win improvement from the 2021 season...The Mets have recorded 100 wins in a season four times in franchise history: 1986 (108), 2022 (101), 1988 (100) and 1969 (100)...The team's 101 wins were the second-most in franchise history...Only the 1986 team (108-54) finished with a better record.

**THREE'S COMPANY:** The 2022 Mets joined the 1972 club as the only teams in franchise history that never had more than a three-game losing streak...The last such National League team to not lose more than three-in-a-row prior to 2020 was the 2014 Dodgers (three games)...Courtesy of Elias.

**THE BUCK STARTS HERE:** Buck Showalter owns a 1,652-1,578 (.511) career record as a manager...His 1,652 wins place him 19th all-time in major league history...Showalter has now managed four teams to the Postseason...He is the fourth manager to accomplish that feat in major league history, joining Dusty Baker (five teams) and Billy Martin and Davey Johnson (four teams)...Showalter is the first manager in Mets history to record 100 victories in his first season with the club...He also joins Yogi Berra as the only managers to guide the Mets and Yankees into the playoffs.

**JEFF McHITS:** Jeff McNeil won the 2022 National League batting title, finishing atop the major leagues and the NL with a .326 batting average...José Reyes (.337 average in 2011) is the only other player in Mets history to be crowned an NL batting champion...McNeil is the first Mets player to lead the majors in average...His .326 batting average places him sixth on the franchise's single-season list...It was the highest average by a Met since Reyes' .337 mark in 2011.

**HITTING THE ROAD:** New York finished the 2022 season going 47-34 on the road...Their .580 road winning percentage placed them third in the majors and second in the NL...It was tied for the fourth-best road record in team history and the highest road-winning percentage since 2007...Overall, they hit .265/.334/.424 away from Citi Field...Their .265 road average was second in the majors and the best in the NL, while their .334 OBP led The Show...They ranked fourth in MLB and second in the Senior Circuit with a .424 SLG...Brandon Nimmo (.406), Jeff McNeil (.399) and Mark Canha (.378) ranked three through five in road OBP in the National League.

**THE EAST IS A BEAST:** The Mets went 50-26 against the NL East this year...Their .658 winning percentage against the NL East was the best mark in club history...They lost only three series in the division all season long (against Atlanta, August 15-18, Washington, September 2-4 and September 30-October 2 at Atlanta)...They won the season series vs. Philadelphia, Washington and Miami...Overall, the Mets posted a 3.38 ERA against the East, while hitting .262/.335/.425...The Mets outscored their divisional opponents, 380-272.

**MORE MAX:** In his age-37 season, Scherzer posted a 2.29 ERA with 173 strikeouts...Since the earned run became an official statistic in 1913, only three pitchers have posted an ERA that low with as many strikeouts at age 37 or older: Roger Clemens (1.87 ERA, 185 strikeouts at age 42 for the 2005 Astros) and Hall of Famer Dazy Vance (2.09 ERA, 200 strikeouts at age 37 for the 1928 Brooklyn Dodgers)...Justin Verlander (1.75 ERA, 185 strikeouts at age 39) also accomplished this feat in 2022.

**SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT:** Francisco Lindor hit 26 home runs last season...That surpasses Asdrubal Cabrera's 23 home runs in 2016 for the most by a Mets shortstop in a single season...He set the single-season record with most RBI by a Mets shortstop, recording 107 this season...He led major league shortstops in RBI, ranked third in walks (59), was third in home runs, tied for third in triples (five), fifth in OBP (.337) as well as OPS (.782) and ninth in SLG (.445)...Lindor led all shortstops in the majors, ranked seventh in MLB and fifth in the National League with a 6.8 fWAR.

**ONLY A FEW CAN COM-PETE:** Pete Alonso set a franchise single-season RBI record with 131 last year...His 131 RBI were tied for the major league lead and led the National League...Only once before in franchise history has a Met finished the season with the most or tied for the most RBI...Howard Johnson recorded a career-best 117 RBI in 1991 to lead the National League...He had 27 game-winning RBI season, the most since the stat was first tracked in 1974...His 35 go-ahead RBI were tied for the second-most in a single season in Mets history...Keith Hernandez had 36 go-ahead RBI in 1985.

- Posted a 1.047 OPS in 12 spring training games, going 10-34 (.294) with four home runs, seven RBI, seven runs scored and five walks.
- Represented the United States in the 2023 World Baseball Classic...Went 2-14 with an RBI and a run scored in five games for Team USA.
- In 2022, set a Mets record, co-lead the majors and paced the NL with 131 RBI...Tied for third in the majors and ranked second in the NL with 40 home runs... Placed eighth in the NL MVP voting, his second career top-10 finish (also, 2019)...Named an All-Star for the second time in his career...Reached the semifinals of the Home Run Derby...Missed just two games all season...Led the majors with a major league-record 27 game-winning RBI (first tracked in 1974), nine more than any other player...Also led MLB with 35 go-ahead RBI.
- Has 22 career homers vs. the Marlins, tied for third-most among active players and tied for 13th all-time...David Wright (26) is the only Met with more.
- Ranks seventh on the Mets all-time home run list with 146 homers in 530 career games...Carlos Beltrán (149) is sixth...Attempting to become the second-fastest player in major league history to reach 150 career home runs...Ryan Howard got there in 495 games and Aaron Judge is currently second-fastest (552 games).

- In 2022, his first season with the Mets, started at all three outfield positions and totaled at least 140 appearances for the second straight season...Made 113 starts in left field, seven in center field and four in right field...Also appeared at first base and third base (one game each)...Ranked sixth in the NL with a .367 OBP...Finished 16th in the NL in pitches per plate appearance (4.10).
- Led the majors last year with a Mets-record 28 HBP...Was hit by 14 pitches over his final 36 games.

- Was 4-34 (.118) in 12 spring training games with a double, two RBI, two runs scored and four walks.
- Played in three games for Team Venezuela at the World Baseball Classic, going 1-10 with a solo home run.
- Last season, was named the NL Player of the Month in September after he finished among NL leaders in batting average (.340, second), SLG (.649, second), OBP (.393, ninth), OPS (1.042, first), hits (33, t-second) and HR (eight, third)...Hit for the cycle on June 6 at San Diego, driving in six runs...Was the first Mets cycle in 10 years (Scott Hairston, April 27, 2012 at Colorado).

- In 2022, the first year of his 10-year contract extension with New York, Lindor set Mets records for home runs and RBI by a shortstop with 26 homers and 107 runs batted in...Asdrúbal Cabrera (23 home runs in 2016) and José Reyes (81 RBI in 2006) held the old marks.
- Finished ninth in the 2022 NL MVP vote...Ranked seventh in the majors with 6.8 fWAR...Led all shortstops in that category...Had a career-high 107 RBI, tied for fifth in the majors and third in the NL...Tied for ninth in MLB with 25 go-ahead RBI...Ranked 13th in the majors and 10th in the NL with 98 runs scored...Was seventh in the NL with 170 hits.
- Tied for third in the majors with 161 games played...Sat out June 2 at Los Angeles-NL after suffering a fractured right middle finger...Was back in the lineup the next day and played in every one of the Mets' remaining 109 games.
- Had seven home runs, 19 RBI and a 1.055 OPS in 19 games against Miami in 2022...Robin Ventura (21 in 1999) is the only Met ever with more RBI in a season against the Marlins...Pete Alonso and Michael Conforto (eight each) are the only Mets with more home runs in a year vs. Miami...Lindor has nine homers and 29 RBI in his last 27 games against the Fish.

- Had six stints with the Yankees in 2022, appearing in a total of 38 games in the majors.
- Stole 29 consecutive bases to begin his career before being caught for the first time, the longest stolen base streak to start a career since 1951.

- In 2022, was named an All-Star for the second time in his career (also, 2016)...Placed 19th in the NL MVP vote...Missed the final four weeks of the regular season after suffering a non-displaced fracture of his right middle finger caused by a hit by pitch on September 6...Ranked seventh in the NL in batting average...Tied for fourth in the NL and tied for ninth in the majors with five triples...Tied for 13th in the NL with 18 steals.

- Enters the season on a 10-game hitting streak, the longest active streak in the majors...Is also riding a career-high 11-game streak without a strikeout.
- In 2022, became the first Met ever to lead the majors in batting average...Was the first Met to the NL batting title since José Reyes hit .337 in 2011...Was awarded his first career Silver Slugger, placed 15th in the NL MVP vote and was named the starting second baseman for the NL All-Star squad...Joined Ron Hunt (1964) as the only Mets 2B to start the All-Star Game.
- Finished eighth in MLB and fourth in the NL in OBP (.382) last year...Had 53 multi-hit games, tied for fourth in the majors...Ranked 11th in MLB and fifth in the NL with 174 hits...Tied for eighth in the NL with 39 doubles...Surged to his batting title with a .378/.425/.528 line from July 30 through the end of the season.
- Led the majors in road average in 2022 (.356)...Tied for sixth with 23 doubles on the road...Batted .411 (51-124) with a 1.009 OPS over his last 30 road games.
- Batted .387 (92-238) in 67 games against NL East foes last season...Went 21-54 (.389) against the Marlins.

- Was a Gold Glove finalist in 2022...Set career-high marks in games played (98), hits (68), doubles (15), RBI (28), runs (31) and walks (14)...Caught a career-high 96 games, including 86 starts...Had a strong finish to the season, batting .333/.340/.608 in September with nine RBI and nine runs scored in 15 games...All three of his home runs last year came in September.

- Last season, ranked sixth in the majors and fourth in the NL with a career-high 102 runs...Also had a career-high 159 hits, 64 RBI and 30 doubles...Tied his career-high with 53 extra-base hits...Finished fifth in the NL with a .367 OBP and 12th in the league with 71 walks.
- Tied for first in the NL and tied for second in the majors with seven triples.

- Reached the 100-home run milestone on April 27 last season...Also scored his 500th career run in 2022.
