### Detroit Tigers (48-28) at Tampa Bay Rays (41-34)

**BACK NEAR WHERE IT ALL BEGAN:** Fresh off a series win vs. the Pittsburgh Pirates this week, the Detroit Tigers tonight kick off a three-game series with the Tampa Bay Rays at Steinbrenner Field, a hop, skip and a jump across I-4 from the club's spring training facility in Lakeland ... the Tigers tonight look to improve upon their 20-4 record in series openers, including a seven-game winning streak in said contests into tonight.

- At 48-28, the Tigers have the best record in the majors, 2.0 games ahead of the Cubs and Dodgers, and 4.0 games ahead of the Yankees for tops in the A.L. ... the Tigers are off to their best start through 76 games in 19 years when they began 51-25 in 2006 ... the Tigers are 30-16 in their last 46 games starting April 30.
- The Tigers have posted a 48-25 record, a .658 winning percentage, in their last 73 games starting March 31 since enduring a three-game sweep to start the season at Dodger Stadium ... their 48-25 record, which is a 107-win pace over 162 games, starting March 31 is the best in all of baseball in that span and 6.5-games up on the Astros, the next closest A.L. team.
- After this quick stay in Tampa, the Tigers return to Comerica Park on Tuesday for a six-game homestand vs. the ATH and the Minnesota Twins, as the Tigers will ultimately play 15 of 21 games at home to end the month of June.

**BEASTS OF THE EAST?:** The Tigers enter this series in Tampa Bay having gone 17-3 in their last 20 games against A.L. East foes ... only one other time since divisional play began in 1969 have the Tigers had a better stretch than this vs. their former division, and it was a mere 52 years ago when they went 18-2 against the A.L. East from June 26-August 1, 1973 ... thanks to Elias.

**IT'S NOT EASY BEING GREENE:** Riley Greene now has 25 RBI in his past 28 games starting one month ago today on May 20, the third-most RBI in the A.L. behind only Tampa Bay's Junior Caminero and Seattle's Cal Raleigh, who each have 28 RBI in this one-month span.

- Greene is the first Tiger to wake up on June 20 with at least 55 RBI since Miguel Cabrera had 57 RBI in 2014 ... on June 20 last season, Greene had 37 RBI to date.
- Greene has 15 homers, 55 RBI and 33 extra-base hits this season, joining Aaron Judge and Cal Raleigh as the only three players in the A.L. to reach those totals.
- Greene has 18 doubles to go along with his 15 homers and 55 RBI through 76 team games, which puts him on pace for 38 doubles, 32 homers and 117 RBI in a 162-game season ... last year in his first All-Star campaign, Greene finished up with 27 doubles, 24 homers and 74 RBI.

**THIS IS QUITE THE PRODUCTION:** Spencer Torkelson (16 homers, 48 RBI) and Riley Greene (15 homers, 55 RBI) are the most dynamic duo on offense in the A.L., as they are the only set of teammates in the A.L. (and one of two in the majors) to have each reached 15 homers and 48 RBI.

**POWER TORK CLUTCH:** Spencer Torkelson has hit 10 of his 16 homers with two strikes this year, the most in the majors ... Torkelson also leads the A.L. and is tied for second in the majors with 19 RBI with runners in scoring position and two outs ... his seven extra-base hits with RISP/two outs lead the A.L. and tie for most in the majors.

- Overall, Torkelson ranks fifth in the A.L. in homers and tied for sixth in RBI ... Torkelson's .333 on-base percentage is currently 38 points higher than last year's .295 mark and his .477 slugging is 103 points higher than last year's .374 mark.

**GLEYBER PARTY:** Gleyber Torres, who leads all A.L. second basemen in All-Star voting, has posted a .806 OPS this year, the best OPS by any second baseman in the A.L. ... Torres also leads all A.L. second basemen with a .380 on-base percentage and a .281 batting average, and is second in the A.L. with 38 RBI ... [www.tigers.com/vote](http://www.tigers.com/vote).

**HERE'S THE CATCH:** Dillon Dingler begins the day with a 2.0 WAR this season, according to Fangraphs ... it leads Tigers position players, is the fourth-highest mark among A.L. catchers and 39th best among all major league position players ... Dingler ranks third among A.L. catchers with a .272 batting average (55-for-202/min. of 200 plate apps.) ... [www.tigers.com/vote](http://www.tigers.com/vote).

**WHAT A RELIEF!** Will Vest (12 saves, 2.57 ERA) and Tommy Kahnle (eight saves, 1.45 ERA) are one of only three sets of teammates to each have eight saves this year, joining San Francisco's Camilo Doval and Ryan Walker as well as New York's Luke Weaver and Devin Williams.

- Kahnle also has nine holds, making him the only pitcher in all of baseball with at least eight saves and eight holds this year.

**WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?:** The Tigers begin the day with the best record in the majors on the strength of a +87 overall run differential this year, trailing only the Yankees (+101) for the best mark in the A.L. ... in the A.L. Central, the Tigers have a +111 edge on the second-place Guardians (-24), are +76 on the third-place Twins (+11) and are +104 on the fourth-place Royals (-17).

**AND FINALLY:** Tarik Skubal yesterday ran his winning streak to eight games, the longest streak by a big league pitcher this season and longest single-season streak by a Tigers southpaw in 30 years since David Wells had a nine-game run from May 23-July 26, 1995.

- Had four straight quality starts from May 22 - June 8, going 3-1 with a 1.46 ERA (4ER/24.2IP) over that span...came one out shy of a quality start on May 16 against Toronto, allowing two earned runs over 5.2 frames.
- Struck out José Ramírez to end the first inning on May 22 for his 1,000th career strikeout, becoming the 567th player in MLB history to record 1,000 strikeouts.
- Lost a career-high five straight games from April 15 - May 10 this year.
- Flaherty returned to the Tigers this offseason by signing a two-year contract...was with Detroit to start last season before being sent to the Los Angeles Dodgers for catcher Thayron Liranzo and infielder Trey Sweeney on July 30.
- Won the World Series with the Dodgers in 2024...went 1-2 with a 7.36 ERA in five postseason starts and started the final game of the World Series.
