TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their 6-game homestand today with the first of 3 games against the Atlanta Braves...Seattle has also hosted the Kansas City Royals (0-3) on the current homestand... following an off-day on Thursday, Seattle will open a 7-game road trip with the Chicago White Sox (3 G, May 8-10) and Houston Astros (4 G, May 11-14)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Dave Valle** on the call with **Angie Mentink** serving as field analyst...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners fell to the Royals last night by a 4-1 final...Seattle is 6-4 over its last 10 games and 8-6 over its last 12 games.

- **Brave Heart - Julio Rodríguez's** 1.048 OPS in 12 career games against the Braves is his 2nd-highest against any opponent trailing only his 1.144 OPS in 20 games against the Tigers.
- **Putting the K in Kade** - Mariners prospect LHP **Kade Anderson** has a 0.37 ERA (1 ER, 24.1 IP), 4 walks and 38 strikeouts in his first 5 professional outings...he ranks 1st in all of minor league baseball (min. 20.0 IP) in ERA and 3rd with a 43.2% strikeout rate.
- **Yesterday's Roster Moves** - Yesterday, the Mariners claimed LHP **José Suarez** off waivers from the Atlanta Braves...in a corresponding 40-man roster move, OF Rhyllan Thomas was designated for assignment.

J-ROD SHOWING OFF...over his last 21 contests (4/11-c), **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .345 (29x84) with 12 runs, 7 doubles, 4 home runs, 14 RBI, 6 walks and is 3-for-3 in stolen base attempts, getting on base at a .396 clip, slugging .571 with a .967 OPS in 91 plate appearances.

RANDY JOHNSON'S NUMBER 51 RETIRED...**Randy Johnson's #51** was retired on Saturday, joining fellow Hall of Famers **Ken Griffey Jr. (#24)**, **Edgar Martinez (#11)**, **Ichiro Suzuki (#51)** and Jackie Robinson (#42) as the only numbers retired by the Mariners...Johnson became the 14th player in MLB history to have his number retired by multiple teams, as his and Ichiro's #51 became the 8th number to be retired by the same team for multiple players (in addition to #42 which is retired across Major League Baseball)...Randy was inducted into the Mariners Hall of Fame in 2012 and the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 2015...the Arizona Diamondbacks retired his #51 in 2015.

- **Johnson Statue Coming In 2027** - Mariners Chairman & Managing Partner **John Stanton** announced Saturday that **Randy Johnson** will be honored with a statue at T-Mobile Park in 2027...Johnson will join **Dave Niehaus** (2011), **Ken Griffey Jr.** (2017), **Edgar Martinez** (2021), and **Ichiro Suzuki** (2026), as well as **Mike Cameron** and **Mark McLemore** raising the American flag in 2001 statue, set for later this year, as Mariners legends to be immortalized with a statue at T-Mobile Park.

HE'S GOT THE COLE WORLD...over his last 16 games (4/16-c), **Cole Young** is batting .322 (19x59) with 8 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run, 10 RBI, 3 walks and 2 stolen bases...the 22-year-old ranks T-9th among all position players with 1.8 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*) this season, along with Mike Trout-LAA and 5 other players...Young also leads second basemen and ranks 2nd in MLB with 8 defensive runs saved (*Sports Info Solutions*).

ABS CHECK-IN...the Mariners have a 66% success rate in ABS challenges as the fielding team, T-7th best in MLB and a 45% success rate in challenges as the batting team, the 18th-best in MLB...individually, **Mitch Garver** has been the best catcher in MLB at defensive ABS challenges (min. 10 challenges), going 10-for-11 (91%), while **J.P. Crawford** has had 12 ball calls changed to strikes (catcher challenges while batting), the most of any player in MLB.

WALTER TIME...**Logan Gilbert** is making his 8th start of the season in tonight's game...over his last 5 starts he has a 2.96 ERA (9 ER, 27.1 IP), 5 walks and 26 strikeouts...Logan's 4.88 SO/BB mark for his career ranks 6th among pitchers with at least 500.0 IP since 1900.

THE FOURTH IS WITH US...today is May 4, which is informally recognized as Star Wars day...the Mariners are 5-1 in games played on the same day a Star Wars film has been released in theaters: A New Hope, May 25, 1977 (L, 1-2 at CLE), The Empire Strikes Back, May 21, 1980 (W, 6-5 vs. MIL), Return of the Jedi, May 25, 1983 (W, 2-1 vs. CLE), The Phantom Menace, May 19, 1999 (W, 7-0 vs. MIN), Attack of the Clones, May 16, 2002 (W, 15-2 at TOR), Revenge of the Sith, May 19, 2005 (did not play) and Solo: A Star Wars Story, May 25, 2018 (W, 2-1 vs. MIN)...all other Star Wars films have been released in the MLB offseason.

HAMMER AND NAYLZ...over his last 12 games (4/17-c), first baseman **Josh Naylor** is batting .367 (18x49) with 2 doubles, 2 home runs, 10 RBI, 5 walks and 4 stolen bases, slugging .531 with a .949 OPS...since Naylor made his Mariners debut on July 25, 2025, he is 23-for-25 in stolen base attempts, ranking T-7th in the Majors and 5th in AL in stolen bases over that span.

K KINGS...the Mariners have had 4 of the last 5 pitchers to record 13+ strikeouts in a game: **Emerson Hancock** (14, 5/2/26 vs. KC), **George Kirby** (14, 9/14/25 vs. LAA), **Bryan Woo** (13, 9/13/25 vs. LAA) and **Logan Gilbert** (13, 8/24/25 vs. ATH)...Max Fried-NYY (13, 9/18/25 at BAL) is the last non Mariner with 13+ SO in a game.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Rick Rizzs** is retiring following the 2026 season after 41 seasons broadcasting Mariners games and 50 seasons in professional baseball, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that during his time with the Mariners, Rick has seen 910 different players wear a Mariners uniform, including 9 Hall of Famers and 64 Mariners All-Stars?...additionally, Rick has seen 87% of all players to appear in a game with the Mariners (910-of-1,047) and 300 MLB debuts.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - MAY 4

- **1985** - Toronto's George Bell broke up Matt Young's shutout bid with a 9th inning home run as the Mariners defeated the Blue Jays, 8-1.
- **2015** - In a 3-2 win at Anaheim, Nelson Cruz's home run was his 14th of the season, matching the most by a player after 26 games...Félix Hernández recorded 8 strikeouts to become the all-time strikeout leader by a Venezuelan-born pitcher with 1,995...Hernandez earned the win to move to 5-0 for the first time in his career.
- **2015** - Nelson Cruz selected as American League Player of the Month for April. In 22 games in April, Cruz hit .322 (28x87) with 10 home runs, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 22 RBI and slugged .724.
- **2016** - Dae-Ho Lee recorded the first multi-homer game of his career.
- **2021** - Kyle Lewis ties Alvin Davis as the fastest Mariner to record his 20th home run in his 88th career game.

ABOUT LOGAN GILBERT...

- Gilbert, 28, is making his 8th start of the season and 1st against the Braves...it is the 154th start of his career and 3rd career start against Atlanta.
• Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummau on June 16, 2018.
• Spent 3 seasons at Stetson (FL) University, 2016-18...in 2017, was ASUN Pitcher of the Year and ASUN 1st-Team All-Conference.
• Named the 2022 and the 2024 Mariners Most Valuable Pitcher by the Seattle Chapter of the BBWAA.
• Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2024.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on April 28 at Minnesota, pitched 5.0 innings of 1-run ball (1 ER), allowing 6 hits and only 1 walk while striking out 4 batters...he threw 93 pitches and 64 strikes...his 89 career starts with 1-or-fewer walks over 5.0+ IP are the 2nd most since 2021, trailing Logan Webb (89) and ranks 3rd in Mariners history.

BRAVING T-MOBILE PARK...tonight's start marks Gilbert's first time facing the Braves at home...in his 2 starts against the Braves in their home ballpark, he owns a 2.25 ERA and a 8.00 K/BB...is 1-of-3 pitchers in the AL to have allowed 1-for-fewer walks and strikeouts 7+ batters over 6.0+ IP in multiple starts against Atlanta since 2023.

HOME IS WHERE THE K IS...has recorded 7+ strikeouts in 24-of-34 home starts since the beginning of the 2024 season...his 24 games are the most in MLB over this span, just ahead of Dylan Cease-TOR/SD (22) and Garrett Crochet-BOS/CWS (22)...has thrown 7+ strikeouts in 36 home starts over his career to rank 4th in Mariners franchise history behind Randy Johnson (100), Félix Hernández (96), and Mark Langston (45)...also owns the 6th most strikeouts at home in Mariners history with 482.

LEFTY SPLITS...ranks 4th in K/9 (11.1) against left-handed batters in the AL in 2026 (min 15.0 IP) while his 21 strikeouts against lefties at home rank T-2nd most in MLB this season...ranks 1st in strikeouts, T-4th (.218) in opponent batting average, 5th in K% (27.7) and T-4th in WHIP (1.07) against lefty batters among AL pitchers since 2021 (min. 200.0 IP).

HEY BATTER BATTER SWING...his 91 swing and misses in 2026 are the 7th most in the AL while his 2,000 career swing and misses rank 5th in MLB since 2021...owns a 43.7 career whiff rate on his splitter, ranking 3rd among pitchers with 1000 splitters thrown since 2021.

QUALITY CONTROL...has thrown a quality start with 1-or-fewer walks issued in 57 career games (last: 4/12 vs. HOU), tied for the 4th-most such games in MLB since 2021, matching rotation-mate George Kirby...his 26 quality starts without a walk are 6th-most in MLB since 2021.

IN COMMAND...his 3 outings with 7+ strikeouts and 1-or-fewer walks are tied for the 2nd most in 2026 with Jesús Luzardo-PHI...among pitchers with 39+ strikeouts this season, Gilbert is tied for the 5th fewest walks, just behind Paul Skenes-PIT (7 BB), and Jacob DeGrom-TEX (7 BB).

K MORE WALK LESS...among all-time starting pitchers with over 900 strikeouts, he ranks 6th in K/BB (4.88)...ranks 9th in the AL in 2026 with a 4.88 K/BB (min. 5 GS)...is 1-of-3 pitchers to have finished the season in the top-10 in the AL in K/BB multiple times in the last 3 seasons (23,25) alongside Bryan Woo (24,25) and Tarik Skubal (24,25).

AMONG THE LEAGUE...his 923 strikeouts since 2021 lead the American League while his 873.1 innings pitched are 3rd most and his 153 starts are T-2nd in the AL across that span.

KEEPING COOPERSTOWN COMPANY...ranks 12th in WHIP (1.068) all-time among starting pitchers in MLB that have recorded over 900 strikeouts, trailing Hall of Famer Moredcai Brown's 1.066 WHIP...his base runners allowed per 9 innings (9.90) ranks 15th among all-time starting pitchers with 900+ strikeouts, behind Walter Johnson (9.84) and just ahead of Pedro Martínez (9.94).

WHERE IT RANKS...his 11.9 K/9 last season is the 4th-best mark among starters in a single season in Mariners history (trailing Randy Johnson's 1995, '97, '98 seasons) while his 9.512 career K/9 is 3rd-best in franchise history (min. 500 IP), trailing James Paxton's 9.545 and Randy Johnson's 10.585 career K/9 mark...his 4.884 K/BB ranks 2nd in franchise history only behind George Kirby (6.373).

AMONG THE GREATS...his 3.6 career ERA (348 ER, 868.1 IP) is 7th-best among starters in Mariners history (min. 500 IP), trailing Randy Johnson, Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton who each hold a 3.42 career ERA, Luis Castillo (3.59), and George Kirby (3.55)...his 923 career strikeouts are 6th-most in Mariners history, behind Mike Moore's 937 strikeouts...he also ranks 1st in WHIP (1.068).

150 FOR THE M'S...made his 150th career start with the Mariners on April 12 vs. Houston Astros...he is the 7th pitcher to make 150 starts in a Mariners uniform...his 909 strikeouts rank second among Mariners pitchers' first 150 career starts, only behind Mark Langston (916 K)...ranks 9th in wins with 48 over a players' first 150 games pitched with the Mariners.
