PITTSBURGH PIRATES (52-48) vs. NEW YORK YANKEES (55-44)
July 20, 2026 - Yankee Stadium - Bronx, NY - 7:05 EDT - Game #101/Road #50
RHP Braxton Ashcraft (9-3, 3.49 ERA) vs. LHP Ryan Weathers (3-7, 4.15 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won two of the first three games on this six-game road trip to Cleveland (2-1, Saturday-Sunday) and New York-AL (Monday-Wednesday), including a 7-1 win on Sunday at Progressive Field...Will have the day off on Thursday before starting a six-game homestand vs. Chicago-NL (July 24-26) and Arizona (July 27-29), which will begin a stretch of 17 games in 17 days...Have hit 129 home runs this season after hitting just 117 home runs all of last season...Have the most hits (914) in all of Major League Baseball (Colorado, 875, ranks second)...Have scored the second-most runs (533) in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Washington (545), after scoring just 583 runs all of last season...Have struck out the fourth-most batters (917) in all of Major League Baseball, trailing Philadelphia (976), Milwaukee (950) and New York-NL (918)...Have posted their best record through the first 100 games of any season since they were also 52-48 through 100 games in 2016.

HIGH FIVE: Pittsburgh is looking to move to a season-high-tying five games over .500...The Pirates were 16-11 after a win on April 25 at Milwaukee, 33-28 after a win on June 2 at Houston and 34-29 after a win on June 4 at Houston...They are currently four games over .500 this late in a season for the first time since being 80-76 after a win on September 25, 2018 at Chicago (NL)...They have not been five games over .500 this late in a year since they were 67-62 after a loss on August 29, 2016 at Chicago (NL).

AMERICAN SPIRIT: The Pirates have won five consecutive series against American League opponents for the first time since interleague play began in the 1997 season...Pittsburgh swept a three-game series from May 29-31 vs. Minnesota, won two of three games from June 2-4 at Houston, won two of three games from June 15-17 at the Athletics, won two of three games from June 23-25 vs. Seattle and won two of three games from Saturday-Sunday at Cleveland...The Pirates have also won three straight interleague series away from home for only the fourth time since interleague play started...Pittsburgh swept a three-game series from June 21-23, 2013 at Los Angeles, swept a two-game series from June 25-26, 2013 at Seattle and swept a three-game series from September 8-10, 2013 at Texas...The Pirates also swept a three-game series from March 30-April 1, 2018 at Detroit, swept a two-game series from May 8-9, 2018 at Chicago and won two of three games from July 23-25, 2018 at Cleveland...Pittsburgh also swept a two-game series from April 16-17, 2019 at Detroit, swept a two-game series from April 30-May 1, 2019 at Texas, won two of three games from June 25-27, 2019 at Houston and won two of three games from August 12-14, 2019 at Los Angeles.

THE MAGICIAN: Esmerlyn Valdez hit a two-run home run in the ninth inning of Sunday's 7-1 win at Cleveland...He has become one of only three Major League players (since RBI became an official stat in 1920) with at least 12 home runs and 32 RBI through his first 31 career games, joining Philadelphia's Rhys Hoskins in 2017 (14 HR/32 RBI) and Cincinnati's Aristides Aquino from 2018-19 (14 HR/33 RBI)...Valdez has collected at least one RBI in seven straight games (since July 9 vs. Atlanta) and is looking to become the first Pirate to do that in eight straight games since Kevin Young (May 1-8, 1999)...He has also recorded at least one extra-base hit and one RBI in seven straight games...The only Pirates (since 1920) to do that in at least eight straight games were Paul Waner (11, June 3-16, 1927), Dale Long (eight, May 19-28, 1956) & Willie Stargell (eight, June 20 [G1]-27 [G1], 1971).

COOK'S KITCHEN: Billy Cook had a career-high three hits (including his first Major League triple), two RBI, a stolen base and two runs on Sunday at Cleveland...He became only the third Pirate in the last 40 years (since 1987) to post those stats in a game, joining Bobby Bonilla (September 16, 1988 at Philadelphia) and Bryan Reynolds (May 26, 2023 at Seattle)...Cook's last home run came here at Yankee Stadium on September 28, 2024 (off Luis Gil).

ROAD WARRIORS: Pittsburgh has won or split three straight series away from PNC Park...The Pirates split a four-game series from June 29-July 2 at Philadelphia, won two of three games from July 3-5 at Washington and won two of three games from Saturday-Sunday at Cleveland...The last time they did that in four consecutive series came during the 2023 season, when they swept a three-game series from April 3-5 at Boston, split a four-game series from April 13-16 at St. Louis, swept a three-game series from April 17-19 at Colorado and won two of three games from April 29-30 at Washington...The Pirates are 25-24 on the road this year (they went 27-54 on the road in 2025).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

July 20, 2002: Adam Hyzdu went 4-for-5 with two home runs, a career-high seven RBI and three runs in Pittsburgh's 15-6 win over St. Louis at PNC Park. Hyzdu, who posted his second career multi-homer game, hit a grand slam and had three runs in a win on July 19 vs. St. Louis. He became the first Pirate (since RBI became official in 1920) with a home run, four RBI and three runs in back-to-back games.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2018 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Ashcraft had a no-decision after allowing five runs and striking out six batters over his 5.0 innings of work in Pittsburgh’s 7-6 win on July 11 (G1) vs. Milwaukee...He has won four straight decisions (since June 17 at the Athletics) for the second time in his career (also May 9-31)...The last Pirates pitcher to win at least five straight decisions was lefthander Bailey Falter (he did that from May 9-June 22, 2025).

INTER-ESTING: Ashcraft has gone 4-0 with a 2.03 ERA (31.0ip/7er) and 41 strikeouts in five interleague starts this season...He has posted the sixth-lowest interleague ERA among all Major League pitchers (minimum 30.0 innings pitched), behind Washington’s Foster Griffin (0.79), Cleveland’s Parker Messick (1.02), Philadelphia’s Zack Wheeler (1.42), New York (AL)’s Cam Schlichtler (1.54) and the A’s J.T. Ginn (1.79).

ON THE ROAD: Ashcraft has gone 5-2 with a 3.29 ERA (54.2ip/20er) and 59 strikeouts in his nine road starts this season...The Pirates have won in seven of those nine starts, with the only losses coming on March 30 at Cincinnati (2-0) and June 6 at Atlanta (6-3).

HEY NOW: Ashcraft was named to his first career All-Star team this season, joining Paul Skenes as Pittsburgh’s representatives (he replaced Skenes on the roster)...Skenes (130) and Ashcraft (128) became just the second pair of Pirates teammates to both have at least 115 strikeouts prior to the All-Star break in a single season (the first All-Star Game was held in 1933), joining Francisco Liriano (125) and Gerrit Cole (116) in 2015...They were also only the third pair of Pittsburgh starters to be named to the All-Star team in the same season, along with Bob Friend and Vernon Law (1960), as well as A.J. Burnett and Cole (2015)...Ashcraft’s 128 strikeouts prior to the All-Star break were the sixth-most in Pirates history, behind Bob Veale (137) in 1965, Veale (134) in 1966, Skenes (131) in 2025, Skenes (130) this year and teammate Mitch Keller (129) in 2023.

TWICE AS NICE: Ashcraft has made multiple starts where he recorded at least 10 strikeouts and did not issue a walk...He struck out 11 batters on May 31 vs. Minnesota and 10 batters on June 24 vs. Seattle...Ashcraft became the only Pittsburgh pitcher during the Modern Era (since 1901) to post multiple such starts during a single season.

RISPY BUSINESS: Ashcraft has limited opposing hitters to a .167 batting average against (13-for-78) with runners in scoring position this season...He has also allowed just three hits in 35 at-bats (.086 average) with runners in scoring position & two outs.

MR. CONSISTENT: Ashcraft pitched at least 6.0 innings, struck out at least five batters and walked two or fewer batters in six consecutive starts from May 3-May 31...He became one of five Pirates (six instances) during the Modern Era (since 1901) to do that, joining Rick Reuschel (six starts, September 4-October 1, 1985), Jon Lieber (six starts, June 15-July 13, 1998), Gerrit Cole (six starts, April 14-May 11, 2017 and six starts, July 30-August 26, 2017) and Paul Skenes (seven starts, June 11-July 23, 2024).

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Ashcraft did not allow a first-inning run in any of his first 20 Major League starts (from last year on June 23 at Milwaukee to May 31 vs. Minnesota)...The streak was snapped on June 6 at Atlanta (allowed two runs in the first inning)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he was one of three Major League pitchers in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to allow zero first-inning runs in at least each of his first 20 career starts, along with Rollie Sheldon (20, 1961) & Dennis Rasmussen (22, 1983-84).
