METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action last night and fell to the Nationals, 5-0, last night...New York has lost three-straight games, which ties a season-high (also, April 3-5)...The last time the team lost four straight games was when they lost five straight from September 21-26, 2021...The Mets continue a seven-game homestand (1-0) against the Nationals (1-0) and Braves (four games).

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets are 4-3 at Citi Field this year...The team's seven home games are the fewest in the major leagues...The team won 54 games at home last year...That was their highest total at Citi Field in franchise history...The last time the team won more than 50 games in New York was in 2000 when they went 55-26...Overall, the Mets went 54-27 at Citi Field...The team's .667 winning percentage was the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of seven straight games against the National League East...Overall, the Mets are 5-3 against the division this season...New York went 50-26 against the East last year, including 26-11 at home.

CONNECT FOUR: Brett Baty is on a four-game hitting streak, batting .313 (5-16) with a run, a double, and an RBI in that span...This comes after he went 1-8 in his first three games with the club.

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: Brandon Nimmo is batting .387 (12-31) with four doubles and four walks against left-handed pitching this year...Pete Alonso has hit .333 (10-30) with a double, five home runs and five walks against southpaws in 2023...Overall the Mets are 5-5 when facing a left-handed starter this year.

NICE TO D.C. YOU: The Mets take on the Washington Nationals for the first time this season...New York went 14-5 against D.C. last year including 7-2 at Citi Field...The Mets posted a 2.68 ERA against Washington in 2022, while batting .291/.366/.460...The team's 2.68 ERA was the lowest against any team within the division.

KODAI SENGA: Has 25 strikeouts through his first four major league starts...The most by a Mets pitcher through his first four major league starts is 26 strikeouts by Tylor Megill (2021), Matt Harvey (2012) and Dwight Gooden (1984)...The only two Japanese pitchers with more strikeouts through their first four major league starts are: Masahiro Tanaka (35) and Kazuhisa Ishii (26)...Four Mets pitchers have won their first four major league decisions: Colin Holderman (2022), Steven Matz (2015), Vic Black (2013-2014) and Grant Roberts (2001-2002).

A HIT'S A HIT: The Mets have collected 34 infield hits this season, which is the second-most in the majors...Last year, the Mets collected 186 infield hits, which was the fifth-most in franchise history and the third-most in the majors in 2022.

WAR, WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?: Brandon Nimmo is second in the major leagues with a 1.7 fWAR...Over the last 14 games, Nimmo is batting .421 (24-57) with 10 runs, five doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI, six walks, one steal with a .477 OBP and a .614 SLG...He has raised his batting average from .192 to .349 in that span...The Wyoming native is second in the majors with a .456 OBP, fifth in batting average (.349) and is tied for 10th in the majors with 16 walks this season.

PHAM-TASTIC: Tommy Pham has played 17 career games against the Nationals and is a .397 (23-58) hitter with 19 runs, four doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, 10 walks with a .478 OBP and a .621 SLG...He has reached base in 10 straight games against Washington, batting .514 (18-35) in that stretch that started on July 6, 2021.

WASHINGTON D.C., IT'S PARADISE TO ME: Jeff McNeil has hit .332/.394/.471 with 32 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, five home runs, 27 RBI and 20 walks in 64 games against the Nationals...Pete Alonso owns a .325/.418/.675 slashline with 44 runs, 16 doubles, a triple, 22 home runs, 49 RBI and 32 walks in 67 games against D.C...Alonso has 22 career home runs vs. Washington, fifth-most among active players...His 1.093 OPS against the Nats is the second-best among active players.

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: The Mets relief staff has posted a 3.25 ERA (32 ER/88.2 IP) with 33 walks and 92 strikeouts in 24 games this season...Their 3.25 ERA ranks eighth in the majors and third in the National League.

NATIONALS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won the season series against the Nationals in four of the last five years.

WALK, DON'T STRIKE: The Mets are second in the majors with 101 walks this season...As a team, New York has struck out 180 times this season, the fourth-fewest in the majors...Brandon Nimmo has drawn 16 walks and struck out just 12 times this season...Jeff McNeil has 13 walks and has also struck out only eight times.

GUESS WHO'S BACH?: Over the last eight games, Daniel Vogelbach is 7-20 (.350) with two runs, a double, a home run, five RBI, three walks with a .435 OBP and a .550 SLG...He has posted a .407 OBP in 18 games this season, which is only behind Brandon Nimmo (.456) for the team lead.

BROTHERS IN ARMS: Together, Adam Ottavino and David Robertson have combined to post a 1.58 ERA (3 ER/17.1 IP) with five walks and 19 strikeouts...They have converted seven of eight save opportunities...They are one of six pairs of teammates who have each recorded multiple saves this season (also, Devin Williams and Bryse Wilson of the Brewers, Carlos Estévez and José Quijada of the Angels and Jason Foley and Alex Lang of the Tigers and Craig Kimbrel and José Alvarado of the Phillies and Duane Underwood Jr and David Bednar of the Pirates).

JEFF McHITS: Jeff McNeil had his eight-game on-base streak snapped last night...He is batting 394 (13-33) with six runs, two doubles, a home run, three RBI, three walks with a .474 OBP and a .545 SLG since April 16...He has raised his batting average from .212 to .282 in that span and his OBP from .359 to .402.

APRIL, SHE WILL COME: Pete Alonso has become the first player in Mets history with 10 home runs before May 1...The last time a player hit 10+ home runs in his team's first 21 games of a season was in 2019, when Christian Yelich (11), Cody Bellinger, Khris Davis and Eddie Rosario all accomplished the feat.

KING OF QUEENS: Pete Alonso has hit 66 home runs at Citi Field...That is tied with Michael Conforto for the second-most in the history of the ballpark...Only Lucas Duda (71) has hit more.

D-FENCE: The Mets have committed seven errors in 24 games this season, the second-fewest in the majors...The team's .992 fielding percentage is the third-best in the majors.

SENGA NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Senga earned his third win in four starts at San Francisco on April 20... He allowed four runs on five hits, including two home runs, and recorded four walks and four strikeouts.

PUTTING THE K IN FORK: Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 17 of his 25 strikeouts through three starts...The pitch has a 54 percent whiff rate and a 30 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just three hits in 25 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .120 batting average.

ALL I DO IS WIN: Tonight, Senga will look to become the second Mets starting pitcher ever to begin his career 4-0...Steven Matz holds the record, winning his first four career decisions...Senga is the only Japanese-born pitchers to start their career 3-0... Additionally, he is the fourth player in franchise history to earn the win in their first two career major league starts, joining Steven Matz, Mike Pelfrey and Gary Gentry... Additionally, he joins Kazuhisa Ishii, Hideki Irabu and Koji Uehara as the only Japanese-born pitchers to win each of their first two career major league starts.

MLB DEBUT NOTES: Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his major league debut...His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their major league debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their major league debut.

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a 87-44 record with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1,089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0)...He was also a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019 and 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019 and 2020).

2022: Last season, Senga went 11-6 with a 1.94 ERA (31 ER/144.0 IP), 156 strikeouts, a 1.06 WHIP and a 0.4 HR/9 rate over 22 appearances.

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION: Senga appeared in four games in the 2017 World Baseball Classic for Team Japan...He posted a 0.82 ERA, throwing 11.0 innings and allowing one run on seven hits with 16 strikeouts and one walk...He also pitched in two games during the Tokyo Summer Olympics, throwing a total of 3.0 scoreless innings as Japan won the gold medal on its home turf.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP JOEY LUCCHESI (1-0, 0.00)

LAST TIME OUT: Lucchesi made his season debut against San Francisco on April 21, throwing 7.0 scoreless innings and allowing just four hits and two walks against nine strikeouts...His nine strikeouts tied for the second most in an outing in his career.

SLINGIN' IN SYRACUSE: Lucchesi has made three starts so far this season for Triple-A Syracuse...In his three starts at Syracuse, he has pitched to a 2.30 ERA (4 ER/15.2 IP) and has tallied 16 strikeouts...Lucchesi has held opponents to a .196 average thus far, while pitching to a 1.15 WHIP.
