THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their
second NL pennant and made their second trip to the second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

ROSTER MOVES: The D-backs reinstated RHP Ryne Nelson from the 15-day injured list (right elbow contusion) and optioned LHP Brandon Hughes to Triple-A Reno following last night's game.

VS. PADRES: Last season, the D-backs took the season series vs. Padres 7-6 (3-4 @ home, 4-2 on the road), outscoring them 26-16 (+10 run differential).

- The D-backs won 5 of their last 6 games vs. Padres.

LAST GAME: The D-backs fell to the Padres 13-1 last night. - Ketel Marte hit safely in his sixth straight game.

- Gabriel Moreno collected his sixth multi-hit game of the season, tallying the lone RBI of the night.
-Brandon Pfaadt tossed his second consecutive quality start (L; 3 ER in 6.0 IP).

LINEUP PRODUCTION: D-backs' 1-4 batters have compiled 70 walks and a . 354 OBP, which ranks second and third in the NL, respectively, while batters 6-9 rank first in the NL with fewest strikeouts (102) and second in RBI (69).
