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THE TWINS: After completing their six-game, seven-day homestand with a record of 4-2 (2-1 vs. the Athletics and 2-1 vs. the Royals), the Twins began their nine-game, 10-day roadtrip by splitting the first two games in Seattle...today, they will continue the trip with the three-game series finale at T-Mobile Park...after today's game, they will fly to Kansas City to spend an off-day tomorrow...they will continue the trip with three against the Royals (Tuesday-Thursday), followed by three at Milwaukee (next weekend).
☞ Twins have gone 12-7 in rubber games this season...they are 8-2 in their last 10 rubber game chances...they won their last such instance, on Thursday vs. Kansas City.

PACIFIC NORTHWALK-OFF: The Twins were walked-off by the Mariners yesterday afternoon, losing by a score of 4-3...it was their second time being walked off in 2026, the other was on May 29 at Pittsburgh...Connor Prielipp was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing three runs on four hits in 5.1 innings pitched...he allowed all three runs in his first two innings, but retired 11 of his final 13 batters...Andrew Morris (4-3) was dealt the loss, allowing Randy Arozarena to score on a fielder's choice groundout to first base...the offense recorded seven hits, two being home runs from Trevor Larnach (9) and Luke Keaschall (5).

SEATTLE SOUND: The Twins and Mariners are playing for the sixth and final time this season...these two will meet for six games in 2027, three from April 30-May 2 at T-Mobile Park and three from August 20-22 at Target Field.

☞ Each of the last four games between these two teams at T-Mobile Park have been decided by two runs-or-fewer, Twins going 1-3 in those four...all three losses have been by one run.
☞ Trevor Larnach is hitting .382 (21-for-55) with three doubles, one triple, five home runs, 14 RBI, a .443 on-base percentage, a .745 slugging percentage and a 1.188 OPS in his last 14 games vs. Seattle pitching.
☞ Brooks Lee has reached base safely in all 10 career games vs. Seattle, hitting .317 (13-for-41) with two home runs and seven RBI in those games.
☞ This season vs. the Ms, Luke Keaschall is 7-for-17 (.412) with two doubles, one home run and three walks in five games.

KREMER ENTERS THE ROOM: The Twins have optioned right-handed pitcher Jack Anderson to Triple-A St. Paul...Anderson appeared in four games for the Twins, going 1-0, 0.00 ERA (4.1 IP), one save, two hits allowed, one walks and six strikeouts.
☞ Kremer, who was acquired in a trade from the Orioles on Friday, has gone 1-4, 6.50 ERA (36.0 IP, 26 ER), 11 walks, 38 strikeouts and a 1.36 WHIP in seven starts for the Orioles this season...the 30-year-old has made 133 career major league appearances (130 starts) — all with BAL.

SERIES CONVERSATIONS: With a win today the Twins will earn their 19th series victory of the season...they have gone 18-15-2 in series play, 11-5-1 at home and 7-10-1 on the road.
☞ Twins began the season going 8-13-1 in their first 22 series through June 11, but have gone 10-2-1 their last 13 series overall, dating back to June 12-14 vs. St. Louis.
☞ Twins have gone 4-1-1 in series play on the road over their last six chances, but 0-1-1 in their last two...their last road series win was July 3-5 at Yankee Stadium.
☞ Twins are seeking their first series win over the Mariners since taking two of three at T-Mobile Park, from June 28-30, 2024...they have gone 0-2-1 head-to-head since.

LARNING TO FLY: Over his last 34 games, since June 14, Trevor Larnach is hitting .336 (39-for-116) with nine doubles, six home runs, 22 RBI, a .394 on-base percentage, a .569 slugging percentage and a .963 OPS.
☞ In his last 18 road games, he is hitting .388 (26-for-67) with four doubles, five home runs, 17 RBI, a .453 on-base, a .672 slugging and a 1.125 OPS.

AMERICA'S NEXT TOP JEFF: Ryan Jeffers has reached base safely in a career-high 22-straight games...over those 22 games, he is hitting .304 (24-for-79) with six doubles, six home runs, 15 RBI, 11 walks, a .396 on-base percentage, a .608 slugging percentage and a 1.003 OPS.
☞ 22-straight games reaching base is the longest on-base streak for a Twin since Ty France's 24-gamer from May 16-June 13, 2025.
☞ It is the second-longest active streak in baseball, trailing Josh Naylor (23).

ON POINT 'PEN: The ninth inning run yesterday snapped the bullpen's scoreless inning streak at 17.0...it was their first run allowed since the ninth inning last Sunday vs. the Athletics...in their last nine games, dating back to the series finale at Cleveland on July 23, they have posted a 2.20 ERA (32.2 IP, 8 ER) with a .195 average and a .581 OPS.

TWINS MILB WEEKLYS: Twins have named High-A Cedar Rapids infielder Danny De Andrade as their minor league Player of the Week...Low-A Fort Myers right-handed pitcher Matt Barr and High-A Cedar Rapids left-handed pitcher Dasan Hill have been named co-Pitchers of the Week.
☞ De Andrade, 22, hit .385 (10-for-26) with four doubles, two home runs, six RBI and a 1.176 OPS...the Valencia, VZ native was signed by the Twins as an international free agent in January of 2021.
☞ Barr, 20, made the start on Friday vs. Palm Beach, pitching 4.0 shutout innings, with three hits allowed, no walks and five strikeouts...the Buffalo, NY native was selected by the Twins in the fifth round of the 2025 MLB Draft out of Niagara County Community College.
☞ Hill, 20, made the start on Friday vs. Peoria, pitching 3.0 shutout innings, with two hits allowed, no walks and six strikeouts...the Grapevine, TX native was selected by the Twins in the second round of the 2024 MLB Draft out of Grapevine High School.
